On Saturday morning, August 9, 2025, Beavertown Community Library hosted its first Chalk Festival for artists of all ages. Free chalk, a blank sidewalk canvas, and creative imaginations brought the front of the library to a life with a rainbow of artworks.

The family-friendly gathering offered encouragement

and compliments to one another. Parents and grandparents joined children to create masterpieces.

Reuben Foor, 12, was busy sketching a monster truck, a car and an airplane for a transportation themed creation "for the fun of it. I like drawing and competing with my brother and friends." He even helped his 4-year-old sister, Kendall, with her drawings with encouragement and suggestions.

Chris Foor was enjoying a fun morning with the kids. He advertised his business, The Skidster Guy, on his drawing.

Dani Hoffmaster laughingly revealed the secret to her creative process. "I looked up pictures on my phone and this one looked easy" she said referring to her ribbiting frog masterpiece! Well, it worked as she won first place in the adult division.

Lori Foor focused on a motivational message, "Today is a good day!" She adorned her drawing with a stained-glass window-design, balloons, and a sun. "I came to the support the library," she said.

In the four-cylinder class Larry Beachel of New Columbia is on top with 2570, 110 in front of Coty Maines of Jersey Shore at 2460, Garrett Lucas is 200 out with 2370. In the 270 Micro-Sprint class Mac Wert of McVey town is on top with 2600 with last year's champ, Cory Stabley Blancherd 2470. Andrew Yoder of Middleburg clinched the limited late model title with his win last week his second win of the season Yoder finished with 710, a 200 margin over Jennifer Leshar at 510 then Joe Lusk with 490, Lane Snook 480 and Maddox Smith 470. Racing last Friday at Clinton County had their first ever appearance by the Winged Sportsman class with Jay Fannasy scoring the 20-lap feature win over Scott Dellinger who was 3.345 second back in second place. Two of the area's best Limited Late Model drivers put on a show for the fans on Friday night at the Clinton County Speedway. A late race pass in lapped traffic secured the win for Andrew Yoder of Middleburg, edging out Lane Snook of Port Royal. Jay Fannasy of Mechanicsburg won the Winged Sportsman feature, Cory Long of Selingsgrove won the Pro Stock, Jeffrey Weaver of Lock Haven won the 270 Micro Sprints and Matt Weaver of Madisonburg won the 4-Cylinders.

Andrew Yoder started on the outside of the front row for the start of the annual Len Stroud Jr. Memorial 25-lap race for the Limited Late Models. They say two is better than one. Selinsgrove Speedway put that to the test on Friday night with First Responders Night presented by Heister House Millworks, Len Krauthem Auto Sales and Aurand's Towing featuring twin 20's for the High Caliber Cranes 410 Sprint Cars. Twice was just as nice for Gettysburg's Danny Dietrich sweeping both 20 lap feature events and walking out of Selinsgrove Speedway with \$10,500 in winnings and a guaranteed starting spot in the Living Legends Dream Race at Port Royal Saturday night. Warrington, PA's Mike Melair to become the 6th different winner in 6 races for the Keller Auto Body PASS 305 Sprint Cars at Selinsgrove in 2025.

19 High Caliber Cranes 410 Sprint Cars signed in for action Friday night. Dietrich and Medford, NJ Justin Whittall set the front row. Whittall one week removed from a hellacious wreck at the Knoxville Raceway. Knocked off the rust early by getting a \$100 quick time bonus from Finch Moser in qualifying.

"Just my Luck" Whittall said. The bleeder line came apart and just screwed us. But found some speed at the end of it and going to build off it. "

Dietrich was given four options in victory lane. First was to invert the finish of the top 7. Second was to pull an invert of a 4 6 8 or 9. Third \$300 to start 8th and invert the top 7. Fourth \$400 to start 10th and invert the top 9.

After consideration. Dietrich chose to take the \$300 and start 8th. With that putting Selinsgrove's Mike Walter and Enloa's Kody Lehman on the front row for twin 20 number 2.

Green flag dropped on the second feature. Selinsgrove's Mike Walter would take the lead. Just past halfway. Walter was struggling with lap traffic and opened the top up for Dietrich to get the momentum and use a slide job to get around Walter to take the lead. Dietrich would slide up. Walter would try to get back under him but the 48's momentum was too great as he would clear and start to pull away from the field and that was all she wrote.

While in High Caliber Cranes Victory Lane. The promotional team of Colin Rice, Paula Schick and Jenna Mowery presented a surprise bonus of \$2,000 to Danny Dietrich for sweeping both features. Plus an extra \$200 for being the combine hard charger at +7 making it a \$10,500 payday for the Gary Kauffman 48 team.

"Was able to get a good start at the second feature." Dietrich said in High Caliber Cranes Victory Lane. "It was easy to take the \$300 and start 8th to keep Whittall back with us as he's been running really well. He was definitely the biggest competition tonight. Hats off to the track crew and this place is smooth. You could go anywhere you want. It's important to come up to Selinsgrove no matter when they race or who they race against up here."

To hold Danny off that long was a pleasure." Walter said. "We had a really good feature. Anything that could happen to me happens in the first feature. But happy to be up here and happy to beat Justin Whittall."

27 Keller Auto Body PA Sprint Series 305's signed in for action on Friday for their 6th race of the season at Selinsgrove. Most of the race was dominated by Beaver Springs Drew Young leading the first 13 laps. But lap traffic would slow up Young and that would let Melair close and get the lead off of Young in turns one and two. The fight was not over as Beech Creek's Timmy Bittner and Selinsgrove's Ken Duke Jr. Would make it a 4 car fight for the lead. "It started to get sketchy up on the top of three and four." Melair said in High Caliber Cranes Victory Lane. "I had a clean lane up top most of the race and used it to get around Young."

Known for his mechanical knowledge and ability to set up his own cars, Smith has been a threat to win anytime he unloads.

"This isn't an honor or award I ever thought of trying to win. Even up to getting chosen, I never thought of myself as a "Living Legend." I just unload the car and get ready to race every weekend."

Smith's career highlights include numerous United Racing Club (URC) victories, wins with the Empire Super Sprints and Patriot Sprint Tour, and a strong record in national events with the Lucas Oil ASCS Sprint Car Dirt Series.

SEDA-COG Expand Services with \$750K PHARE Funding

Prior to receiving the PHARE funding, the program could use only 18% of state weatherization funds to address health and safety initiatives. Now, the program will be able to address more health and safety concerns in homes.

The Pennsylvania Housing Finance Agency works to provide affordable homeownership and rental housing options for older adults, low- and moderate-income families, and people with special housing needs. Through its carefully managed mortgage programs and investments in multifamily housing developments, PHFA also promotes economic development across the state.

With this new investment, SEDA-COG will continue to preserve the region's aging housing stock, improve residents' quality of life, and maintain the overall vitality of local communities.

The Prothonotary is an elected Constitutional office in the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. These offices provide essential services that impact the daily lives of Snyder County residents and play a vital role in supporting the well-being of the community.

Wolf oversees all procedures across these offices. “I am responsible for managing and recording all procedures within each of these divisions under the Court of Common Pleas. This includes the filing, storage, and distribution of official documents, as well as the assessment, collection, and distribution of fines, costs, and restitution.”

Each office has their own responsibilities and duties. The Prothonotary’s Office maintains civil records, including complaints, divorce proceedings, custody matters, protection from abuse orders, mental health cases, liens, judgments and ensuring that court proceedings run smoothly. The Clerk of Courts manages all criminal and juvenile court records. The Orphans’ Court handles adoptions, termination of parental rights, marriage licenses, guardianships, estate accounts, small estates, and family settlements. In addition, their office is a certified Passport Facility, with five trained Acceptance Agents currently serving the public.

“Stephanie is the epitome of hard work and dedication as an elected public Official in Snyder County. I truly enjoy working with her and look at her as a mentor,” said Colin Devanney, Chief Probation Officer.

Wolf’s organizational skills and desire to improve operations is apparent. “When I assumed office in 2020, I set several goals—many of which I’ve been proud to accomplish in just five short years: Electronic filing capabilities for attorneys and the public, Credit card payment options, Online access to public records and performed a comprehensive effort to clean up and archive old records.”

Residents entering the office will also notice a change.The Office of Prothonotary, Clerk of Courts, and Clerk of Orphans’ Court has recently undergone a transformation, now offering a new, secure, and more convenient environment

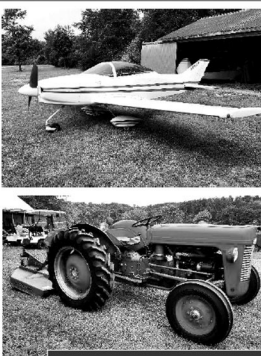
