Fatal Crash on Rt. 522 Emergency Incident on Route Midd-West Football Team's Lift-A-Thon Outside of Middleburg 522 in Frankin Township

A fatal crash occurred on Monday, August 25, 2025 at 5:25 pm outside of Middleburg in Franklin Township. Joshua Herrold of Beavertown was killed in the crash.

According to Selinsgrove State Police Officer Derek Gill, Joshual Herrold, 44, of Beavertown, was traveling southbound on Route 522 at approximately 50 mph. He traveled off the north side of the road. After traveling about 100 feet, Herrold then hit a house head-on. The vehicle came to rest in the front yard of the residence.

Herrold was pronounced dead at the scene by the Snyder County Coroner's office. The police report stated that Herrold was not wearing his seatbelt.

Assisting on the scene were Reliance Hose Company #1, EMS, Ebright's Towing, and members of the coroner's office.

On August 18, 2025 at 2:32 pm, on Route 522 Highway, 1368 feet east of Paxton Street in Franklin Township, an emergency incident occurred. 



If you're building a football program it's a good start to have someone from Mt Carmel leading your team, just ask the KC Chiefs. Jeff Janovich is in his second year as coach of Midd-West and grew up in coal country where football is king.

The Mustangs will look to run the ball with Kyle Shupp and Landon Hartman in the backfield. They will be running behind an experienced and stout offensive line. Joe Gabel, Graydon Van Horn and Garrett Hostetler are all returning starters. They will be joined by Jared Devine and Gannon

Linebackers will lead the Mustang defense led by Samuel Jordan and Ronnie Johnson. Midd-West got off to a fast start by beating Central Columbia 27-7 in this year's opener. That puts them one up on Mt Carmel Lewisburg is coming off one of its best years since the 1981 team led

Miff is on the road for their next four games against teams that were a combined 39-14 last year. When I asked coach Botts how he was going to handle this tough stretch he said "they want to be challenged week in and week out as this will only make us better." No pressure, no diamonds.

In college football, I cannot believe that Texas has never been ranked number one pre-season. After the games this weekend they will no longer be #1. 


