## HIGH LIMIT SPRINT CAR SERIES NOW OWNS THE ALL-STAR SPRINT SERIES

What has been a rumor for quite some time now has become a reality with the High Limit sprint car series owned by Kyle Larson and Brad Sweet have taken the reins of the Tony Stewart Owned All-Star sprint series for the 2024 season. Tony took over the series in the 2015 season and was only the third owner of the series which was started back in the 1970 season by Bud Miller, then Bret and Brigitte Emick and after that Guy Webb. This year Kyle Larson and Brad Sweet had their first full season of High Limit sprint car racing with twelve shows run on week nights, with most events paying the winner \$23,023 to win, eleven were run with one rain out. Kyle Larson won the points and the \$30,000 top prize money with Rico Abreu second in points, Abreu won four races with Larson winning three, other winners were Gio Scelzi, Anthony Macri, Justin Peck and David Gravel. Stewart who has three NASCAR championship and owns a drag race teams, still involved with owning NASCAR teams, and owns Eldora speedway, knows the series will be in good hands with Larson and Sweet in control. Information regarding the 2024 schedule and more announcements to be coming soon. Now the All-star's usually start their season in the South at tracks like Golden Isle in Georgia and East Bay and Volusia raceways in Florida. Usually, two shows at Volusia owned by the World racing Group, now will that change the schedule for the All-Stars since the World racing group run the WOO sprint and late model series, time will tell how this works out, hopefully all involved will keep the early season races at Volusia on the Schedule. Next question will it be on series, or will there still be the High Limit with their Midweek shows, with the All-Stars separate or will it be one combined series. This year Zeb Wise scored his first ever All-Star sprint car series title winning nine races during the season, 2022 series champ Tyler Courtney also scored nine wins but missed part of the season with an injury, 49 feature events were run this year, with Larson winning twice and Brad Sweet once. Local drivers Brett Marks and Lance Dewease each had two wins with Danny Dietrich and Anthony Macri one each.

Bedford speedway finished up their season with the Keystone Cup for the super late models paying \$23,000 to win, with Kyle Hardy becoming the fifth different winner in the six years the race has been run. A questionably move by Hardy on the last lap moving up the track and clipping Dylan Yoder who had ran down the leader in the late stages after being back by about five-seconds. Hardy was commented as saying its \$23,000 to win I did what I could to get the win, but I guess Dylan will owe me one next time and I expect it. Up this weekend for the super late models is a \$7,000 to win two-day show at Georgetown speedway in Delaware. Qualifying is on Friday night with the 40-lap feature on Saturday, other divisions will be in action also over the weekend, including Big and Small Block Modifieds. Hidden Valley Speedway in Clearfield is also running super late models for a one-day show on Saturday paying \$3,000 to win, back in May, Ryan Montgomery scored the super late model win over 22-other drivers, and like Georgetown several other divisions will be in action. November 17-18 the super late models will have one last show at Delaware International speedway, with a yet to be announced purse, BIG and Small Block Modifieds and some other local divisions will be racing over that weekend. The Limited late models had two races last weekend with Devin Frey winning over the 18-car field at Path Valley on Saturday night, the class was a part of an six-division show that had a total of 140-race cars on hand. Sunday at Bedford, Shawn Shoemaker scored his third win of the season at his third different speedway, Shawn has had wins at BAPS and Clinton County, before his win at Bedford on Sunday night. Kyle Lear who participated in the Steel Block at Eldora, but did not qualify, made up for it by driving back from Eldora to race Sunday night at Bedford placing third in the feature. This Saturday is the last local show for the limited late model class back at Path Valley, again along with five other divisions.

This weekend the 410-sprints race for a \$15,000 pay check on Saturday, and they will also have a non-winners race on Saturday with the east Coast wingless sprints also racing. Last Saturday BAPS speedway had a nice field of 37 410-sprints for a \$15,000 to win show with Troy Wagaman

scored the win his third of the season, with the other two coming at Williams Grove, Danny Dietrich, Chase Dietz, Anthony Macri back in his Family-owned car #39M, and Kyle Reinhardt fifth. November 11th will be another major race for the 410-sprints at Baps this time paying the winner \$25,000 to win. With the race at Bridgeport and Baps still left on the schedule Freddie Rahmer leads the way with 17-wins, AJ Flick has 15 with most of them coming at Western Pa. tracks, Brent Marks has 12 wins. Rahmer is in a tight battle win Danny Dietrich for the Central Pa sprint car series points title.

Linda's speedway had a successful 34th annual Micro-Sprint national open with 85 270-micro sprints and 50-600-wingless micros in action. Christian Bruno won the 600 micros feature and \$3,000 with Ross Perchak winning the 270-micro part of the weekend and \$3,000. Greenwood Valley action track runs its final race of the season this Saturday along with regular Micro sprint racing they are having an event for the four-cylinder class if they can get enough drivers signed in.

This is the last racing column for the 2023 season I want to thank all the sponsors for the ads and all the hard work put in by the Snyder and Union County staff that make this column look good. Look forward to the 2024 season with all the good racing, we are fortune to have in our area, and all the different tracks and divisions to choose from to check out and go watch over the weekend.

# 19 Career Programs at SUN Area Tech

"SUN Tech's 19 programs offer individuals a valuable opportunity to gain practical skills and knowledge that are directly applicable to the workforce. By combining classroom instruction with hands-on training, our programs prepare students for a wide range of careers, everything from healthcare and information technology to automotive repair and culinary arts," explains Executive Director at SUN Tech, David Bacher. "This form of education not only equips students with job-ready skills but also helps bridge the gap between education and employment, fostering economic growth and enabling individuals to pursue fulfilling and lucrative careers."

17 students are enrolled in the Advertising Art & Design Program. "From Day 1 to now the progress and growth the kids have made is amazing. I am excited to see what they accomplish by the end of the year. This is a very talented group of kids," said instructor, Mrs. Chelsea Cook.

Brooklyn Scholl from SASD was airbrushing a masonry figurine. "I like the freedom to be creative."

"I like that the program gets us ready for being graphic designers in the real world," said Halie Shnyder from Lewisburg.

Mrs. Robin Harvey instructs students enrolled in the Health Professions & Related Sciences program. The students will earn their PA State approved Nurse Aide certificate. Mersaydie Sledge enjoys the hands-on aspect of the course such as "learning how to lift and transport patients using a mannequin." Haley Gantt is excited to learn all the medical terminology and abbreviations. She also enjoys sterilizing the medical instruments. For Karissa Kepner she liked the fresh start she got by attending classes at SUN Tech.

This is the second year Sun area Technical institute is offering Mechatronics as a program. Mechatronics is a fusion of Mechanical systems, Industrial Motor Controls, Electrical Systems, Electronics, Programmable Logic Controllers, Hydraulic, and Pneumatics. It is a great program for students who enjoy working with their hands and their minds. Students can jumpstart a career into technology of the future of automation and robotics.

According to instructor Kevin Yakamook, "Our focus is on Engineering and Designing, Building, Repairing and Troubleshooting of Mechanical, Electrical, and Fluid Power Systems within Industry. The student will work on labs and hands on projects several hours every day. The student will be able to go into the workforce in many different directions and start making competitive wages upon graduation. The student also can go into post-secondary education and earn a degree in more advanced areas like electrical and mechanical engineering and programming of machines and Robotics."

The Criminal Justice program teaches entry-level skills and knowledge required for employment in careers including EMS, police officer, security officer, correctional officer, 911 dispatcher, store security and military police. The program offers job shadowing experiences, featured guest speakers, and field trips. The program also uses

state of the art law enforcement equipment to create real life experiences.

"In the Criminal Justice program, students not only receive classroom instruction but hands-on experience with current criminal justice employees in the tri-county area," explained instructor, Kale Geiswite.

The class focuses on law enforcement skills from traffic stops and handcuffing to corrections where "we discuss cell searches and inmate transport" added Geiswite. Other instruction highlights courtroom procedures and legal knowledge regarding PA laws.

"I like how in-depth the program is. Mr. Geiswite teaches all the things you need to know for all the various public safety occupations," said Thomas Toth from SASD.

Kaitlyn Jefferys of Midd-West agreed. "What Mr. Geiswite teaches is more than what is required for the test without teaching to the test. I like how he challenges us to perform beyond what is required. He wants us to succeed and to do our best!"

For Thomas Maurer his favorite aspect of the program is the hands-on experience especially the simulations for use of force activities.

"In the Computer & Networking Technology Program students study how PC's work and how to make them work together on a computer network," explained instructor Terry Boonie.

Students learn about A+ Computer Maintenance and how to build, repair, upgrade and troubleshoot computers. They learn how install processors, RAM, solid state hard drives, DVD drives, and video cards. In Computer Networking they learn how to use equipment such as switches, hubs, routers, firewalls, bridges, to connect PC's together to function in a computer network.

Other components of the course include Networking Administration and Web Page Development. Another aspect involves CTECH Copper and Fiber Optic Cabling. "We get the chance to learn how to install and terminate both copper and fiber optic cables. We learn how to install connectors on fiber optic cable, how to polish the fiber, how to test the fiber using lasers and optical power meters," noted Boonie

And best of all, there is Dual Enrollment Option with Penn College. "Students have the opportunity to enroll at Penn College while at SUN Tech and take EET 145 Introduction to Networking right here in our class. Students can earn 4 college credits for free, saving them over \$2000.00 in tuition. Penn College also offers every student a 2000.00 scholarship just for attending SUN Tech," Boonie pointed out.

"It's important to note that rounding out your high school education at SUN Tech does not suggest that you have earned a terminal degree. Rather it serves as a solid foundation for further education and professional growth offering opportunities for individuals to advance their skills and qualifications as they progress in their careers. Ultimately the goal is that our students are career and college ready," states Bacher.



Obedience exhibitors were also given a chance to improve their canine companions' skills in responding correctly to voice and hand commands as they completed basic exercises such as heeling and retrieving.

The Mid-Susquehanna Valley Kennel Club sponsored the Best of Breed (BOB) Match Show at the Middleburg Firemen's Fairgrounds. The Match included Breed judging, Puppy Sweeps, and Junior Show. There was also CGC Testing and Eye Clinic. There were 18 dogs entered in the match on Sunday.

"There are a lot of new faces, new breeds, and lots of puppies! People are getting more involved with their dogs. They are watching televised dog competitions. They are also paying attention to how the dogs are shown and what's involved," said Pickett. "We are trying to make the matches fun and friendly as well as educational."

Nancy Haupt is club member who came to support of this event. "It is a great opportunity for these people in the Conformation sport."

10-year old Ashton Kling of New Columbia and her 4-month old Yorkie, Gemma, participated in the Puppy Sweepstakes. Ashton has put a lot of work into her puppy; training and taking care of her. She loves spoiling Gemma. Ashton also is very involved in the Mid Susquehanna Valley Kennel Club as well.

"It's fun to show my dog. I am happy how she did on ribbons. She got 2nd place," said Ashton "I hoped we would be in the middle so Gemma would find a dog to chase. But, she was first... but she did really good." There was just a little hiccup near the end when Gemma didn't want to move. But, when the other dogs started trotting, Gemma gaited around the ring like a champ.

Avery Dreese, 10, was showing her pup Odin, 4-months old. It was the first time for both handler and pup. They were entered in Junior Showmanship. "I feel a little nervous but excited too."

"This is my first time showing too," added her mother, Tiffany Dreese of Hughesville. "We are both showing Odin. He earned 3rd prize in the Puppy Ring. I am going to show in the Open Class."

11-year old Leah Graham is a veteran junior handler who has been participating in dog shows for 6 years. In this match she is showing 5 times with various dogs including a long coat Chihuahua and several Australian cattle dogs.

Leah handles the Australian cattle dogs for owner Lisa Pontius. Pontius mentors Leah. "I help Leah train and give her dogs to show."

"I personally like the training and education of the sport," said Leah. "I like training the dogs and getting along with my dogs. They are my best friends."

"Leah is the future of handlers in the sport of dog shows (Conformation)," said Kristen Deblasio. "Kids and dogs are a great mix if the children are properly trained to be around dogs."

A MSVCK Eye Clinic sponsored by the club with certified veterinary ophthalmologist, Dr. Amanda Corr, provided specialized exams. Local people were also given the opportunity to take advantage of this clinic.

"The matches that offer eye clinics give breeders the opportunity to get their show and breeding dogs additional health clearances such as CERF eye exams with a certified canine ophthalmologist," noted Marilyn Pickett, Co-Chair of the Mid-Susquehanna Valley Kennel Club Match Show. "As a Kennel Club we promote and encourage health testing of any breeding dogs because a well-bred dog from tested stock generally costs owners less in the long run."

"Eyes are top clearance that dogs need for AKC events," added Lisa Kurtz, Match Co-Chairperson.

"In the last couple of years, dog sports and activities have exploded and matches like ours give the general public an opportunity to interact on a more relaxed basis with the dogs," explained Pickett. "It's also a great way for people to come out from the community to learn about responsible dog ownership and to learn about the different breeds."

# Community College Board Presents To Commissioners

On October 3, the Susquehanna Valley Community Education Project presented a passionate plea for support of a Regional Community College for our area. The overall message of the presentation was that the Regional Community College would be advantageous to the area by aligning their programs and services with the current and future needs of local economy and closely collaborate with local businesses and industries.

Hank Baylor emphasized that the tax would be an investment to the local economy and yield a return in economic growth. "Pay this investment for the future!"

Presenters also acknowledged that community colleges offer affordable and accessible opportunities for a diverse and often underserved population: low-income, first-generation, minority, rural and adult learners. Most of the courses would be taught at night and on weekends. Others would be online courses. They would teach needed trade skills at a reasonable cost and adapt to the needs of the Susquehanna Valley to assure success. The community college would help propel students upward out of poverty with opportunities for all.

"Community colleges play an important role in economic development by providing workforce training and local economic planning for various industries... Right now, our employers need welders, HVAC, machine, electrical technicians, troubleshooters, plumbers, building and trades," stated Kelly O'Brien, Executive Director of the Berwick Industrial Development Association. Later she pointed out, "We also need a focused post-secondary school that can not only provide these skills but adapt to the changes in those industries. We need welders that can run robots, we need plumbers that can hook up and program a residential smart system and understand the software. The technology component is huge in all these trade programs."

Montour County landlord and farmer, Mike Kuziak, rents to short-term contract workers who are imported to work at Geisinger. He noted that they are not committed to the local community or economy and send their money home. They have no input into the economy or taxed. He pointed out that training people here in the Susquehanna Valley for positions in the medical field would benefit the local economy.

Isabella Lapetina of Middleburg and Trinity Shannon of Selinsgrove, addressed the Commissioners from their personal perspectives. Both, recent high school graduates, described the challenges of working full-time retail jobs, attending a community college online or with a long commute in an effort to gain skills to become more successful. Local college opportunities were financially out of their reach. They supported a local regional community college to help them become more successful career-wise with a better financial future.

The Snyder County Commissioners supported the idea of a Regional Community College but not at the expense of the taxpayers. Chairperson Joe Kantz was very vocal that the property tax that taxpayers pay should not support it. He noted that the taxpayers are already burdened adding that many state and federal mandates are required to be funded.

"It was recently reported by the IFO that Snyder County has the lowest percentage of tax burden than any other county in Pennsylvania," stated Commissioner Kantz. "I will not support an additional \$15 (average) per household tax just so a couple dozen students can get a cheap college education. I'm very supportive of everyone being more educated, but there are only so many dollars available."

Then Kantz suggested that the local businesses and grants should help to fund and support the Regional Community College.

Commissioner Adam Ewig acknowledged the need for training in the trades and workforce. To create job growth and economic prosperity, he suggested building upon programs offered at SUN Area Tech. "Investing in SUN Tech would be a long-term benefit."

# Penn College Announces Spring EMT Course



An Emergency Medical Technician course, beginning the week of Jan. 8 and running through early May, will be offered at three locations by Workforce Development at Pennsylvania College of Technology.

Seating is limited, and the deadline is approaching: All registrations must be completed by 1 p.m. Dec. 15. Interested participants may register at [www.pct.edu/emtcert](http://www.pct.edu/emtcert).

The course meets National Emergency Medical Services Educational Standards and Instructional Guidelines and is intended to prepare students for National Registry cognitive and psychomotor examinations at the EMT level.

The course comprises 50 hours of lecture and 100 hours of practical learning. Students will select one of three sites: Penn College's main campus in Williamsport, Penn College at Wellsboro or Evangelical Community Hospital in Lewisburg.

The in-class portion will meet from 6 to 9 p.m. Mondays and Wednesdays (at Evangelical), and Tuesdays and Thursdays (in Williamsport or in Wellsboro). Some evenings will require 6-to-10-p.m. instruction.

Content will be delivered through a "flipped" mastery-learning model that employs internet-based, streaming-video education. Students will watch videos that support comprehension and reinforce key concepts.

Face-to-face learning includes case studies and skill drills to apply students' understanding with hands-on activities. Experiential learning during ambulance rotations affords real-world immersion into an environment of practice.

# Freeburg Fire Company Coverage Area May Be Split

A poll will be taken on Election Day, November 7 at the township building to assess public opinion on reassigning a part of Freeburg Fire Company's service area to Fremont Fire Company. The area is in the western portion of Washington Township, west of Summit Road and south to the Chapman Township line. Attend the November 14 meeting for the discussion on this issue.

The future of the Freeburg Fire Company's coverage area is in the hands of the residents and the Washington Township Board of Supervisors. At the November 14 meeting, the issue will be discussed with public input.

"The Supervisors of Washington Township are considering making a change to the primary fire company for the township. The Washington Township area would be split at Summit Road between the Freeburg Fire Company and Fremont Fire Department." The notice was posted in the October 20, 2023 issue of The Snyder County Times in the Legals and Classified section under Public Notice.

Residents who live in the township are encouraged to submit a preference. There will be a poll taken during the November 7th elections. A box will be available to submit your opinion at the township building. If you have any questions regarding this change, please call the township at 570-539-8768.

There has been no response to the repeated phone calls to the Washington Township Supervisors office to clarify the reasons for the coverage area change. At the March 7 meeting, the Supervisors notified the Freeburg Fire Company that they had received some complaints about not responding to calls and delay times. No specific details were provided.

Freeburg Fire Company is valiantly bringing attention to the proposal and asking for the community's support to save the Freeburg Fire Company. "For 75 years the Freeburg Fire Company has been serving the Freeburg Borough and all of Washington Township. In addition, the Freeburg Fire Company QRS has provided medical service for 50+ years," stated the Freeburg Fire Company in a letter to residents of Washington Township. Freeburg Fire Company also has a preplan in place that summons mutual aid help as needed for emergency calls to 911.

The area in question is in the western portion of the township; west of Summit Road and south to the Chapman Township line. The Washington Twp. Supervisors are considering assigning that service area to the Fremont Fire Department in Mt. Pleasant Mills.

Freeburg Fire Company is alarmed about the proposed change and its impact on all of the residents of Washington Township as well as the residents of Freeburg Borough. The letter states, "If our Fire Company loses a portion of the service area, it will also mean less funding for the company through government grants and other means. If our funding is cut, there is a very real possibility that in time the Freeburg Fire Company will have to close its doors."

This consideration has grave, future consequences that needs to be weighed carefully if funding to the Freeburg

Fire Company is reduced and the fire company must close. There would be a greater distance/response time for a company to respond to an emergency call. The responding company may not be as familiar with the area as the hometown Freeburg Fire Company would be. Another possibility would be an increase in homeowner insurance due to the longer distance to the fire station.

The Freeburg Fire Company also stated other concerns if the fire company were to disband. "Freeburg Fire Company does not bill for accidents, etc. but some companies do. If Freeburg were to close there is no guarantee that the newly assigned company would not bill for accidents. All Washington Township residents would no longer be served by the same company."

Fremont Fire Department was contacted about the proposed change by the Washington Township Supervisors for safety reasons in an emergency. Freeburg Fire Company and Fremont Fire Department provide mutual aid on calls. Fremont Fire Chief Jake Wagner explained that a portion of Washington Township is closer to Mt. Pleasant Mills and the Fremont Fire Department. "So, the Washington Township Supervisors are considering this (re-assignment) change to ensure that the closest fire department will be responding to the residents' emergencies. If the Washington Township Supervisors choose to move forward with this change, then Fremont Fire Department will provide service to all residents when called upon." Then Chief Wagner added, "We are all here for the residents that we serve."

The Washington Township Supervisors are taking an opinion poll of Washington Township residents on this issue of reassigning portions of Washington Township to Fremont Fire Company. On Election Day, Tuesday, November 7, the supervisors plan to have a box available at the township building for all Washington Township residents to submit their opinion. Make your opinion on this issue heard. All Washington Township residents are asked to participate whether a registered voter or not.

Residents are also urged to attend the Washington Township Supervisors meeting on Tuesday, November 14 at 7:00 pm. Come and share your opinion on the issue.
