The members of the Middleburg Chapter of Beta Sigma Phi once again shared the spirit of the season by contributing gifts to the U.S. Marine Corp. Toys for Tots Program. The members have been providing toys to this program for many years. Every child deserves a Merry Christmas. Christmas morning should be a time of great joy for children. Beta Sigma Phi members do their very best to help make the dreams of the children come true.

"Christmas is a time of giving. It is inspiring that so many people are happy to give," said Beta Sigma member, Nancy Stull.

According to the website, "The mission of the U. S. Marine Corps Reserve Toys for Tots Program is to collect new, unwrapped toys during October, November and December each year, and distribute those toys as Christmas gifts to less fortunate children in the community in which the campaign is conducted."

Local campaigns are conducted in over 350 communities covering all 50 states, the District of Columbia and Puerto Rico. The Toys for Tots Program began in 1947 when Maj. Bill Hendricks USMCR and a group of Marine Reservists in LA collected and distributed 5000 toys to needy children. Then Walt Disney designed the Toys for Tots logo which is used

today. The initial goal that remains the hallmark of the program is to bring the joy of Christmas to America's needy children. The goal of the program is to send a message of hope that will build self-esteem and in turn motivate needy children to grow into responsible, productive, patriotic citizens and community leaders.

Locally, the Toys for Tots Program helps children in a five-county area including Snyder, Union, Northumberland, Columbia and Montour. All toys stay in this area. The Program distributes toys to boys and girls from newborn to age 18. Each year the Toys for Tots Program grows with more toys given to more children. Due to generous donations, last year the 2024 Toys for Tots Program was able to make a difference by distributing 26,417 toys to 3,729 children. In addition to toys each child also received a game, a book, and stocking stuffers.

Penny Billheim, a Toys for Tots volunteer and Beta Sigma Phi member states, "Our hope is that through all of our efforts every child in the Valley will have a Merry Christmas. Please help us help the children. Donate a new, unwrapped toy, cash or your time this holiday season."

This year the Middleburg Chapter of Beta Sigma Phi, a small but mighty group donated a total of 167 items including 142 toys, 20 books, and 5 stocking stuffers to this worthwhile program. 

Former Middleburg Woman Sentenced To Twenty-Four Months In Jail For Welfare Fraud

(Middleburg, PA) — District Attorney Heath W. Brosius has announced the sentencing of 51-year-old Holly Hoffman of Turbotville (formerly of Middleburg) by President Judge Lori Hackenberg on December 5th 2025. Hoffman was given a sentence of six (6) months to twenty-four (24) months less one day. Hoffman will serve her sentence in the Clinton County Correctional Institution until she is paroled. Hoffman pled guilty in July 2025 to obtaining public assistance by fraud and admitted to owing \$2,444.00 in wrongfully paid welfare benefits. The crime is a felony of the third degree. Hoffman collected benefits over an eighteen (18) month period after intentionally misrepresenting her financial information on state forms.

President Judge Hackenberg heard arguments at sentencing from Hoffman's attorney that because Hoffman came to sentencing with the \$2,444.00 in cash to pay off the debt the Court should consider a home confinement sentence. Hoffman paid the \$2,444.00 the day of the sentencing hearing.

"I want to thank the Office of State Inspector General and the very thorough investigative work of the Special Agent assigned", said DA Heath Brosius. He went on to say, "These cases require a lot of investigation into financial records and review of countless state forms to catch individuals who are misusing the welfare system. Despite all of that work, the State Inspector General's Office attempts to negotiate a payment arrangement prior to filing charges on these cases. Folks who do not take advantage of that option end up in Court for sentencing."

ATM Jackpotting

Snyder/Union County-Between September 30 and October 1, PSP Milton, PSP Selingsgrove, and PSP Rockview began investigating theft incidents that occurred at four Central Penn Bank & Trust locations, specifically theft from ATM's. During a five hour span, the actor removed a total of \$43,000.00 from three separate ATM's in Snyder and Union Counties. On October 1, the same actor removed \$58,000 from an ATM in Titusville, PA. In total the actor stole \$101,000.00.

The actor was identified as Antoni Jesus Garcia-Cordoba, of Raleigh, North Carolina, 42, was charged with corrupt organizations and theft by unlawful taking. He is currently in custody in Boone County Jail, Missouri and awaiting extradition back to Pennsylvania.





THE VIEW FROM HEAR

I'm going to talk about Big Ten football without ever mentioning that school an hour to the west of us. There are two schools that I cannot figure out how events happened. How has Indiana become the top ranked team this year and have a 24-2 record over the last two years?

All the credit goes to coach Curt Cignetti who came from James Madison two years ago. He went 52-9 in his four years at JMU. Previous to JMU he was head coach at Elon and IUP. Cigs was 14-9 in two years at Elon and 57-13 over six years in his first head coaching stint at IUP. Cignetti was recruiting coordinator for ten years at NC State and Alabama. The man can coach and recruit at all levels.

The first thing he noticed at Indiana was how bad they were up front on both the offensive and defensive lines. With the transfer portal and NIL he addressed this issue first. This was clearly evident when they handled Ohio State up front in the BIG championship game. Cigs brought 13 players with him from JMU and has recruited the portal and high schools for his type of players.

This year's Heisman Trophy winner Fernando Mendoza was a 2-star recruit for Cal. Cignetti saw his potential and brought him in this year to lead the Hoosiers. Cigs brought in another fifteen key transfers for the 2025 season, including offensive lineman Pat Coogan from Notre Dame. The coach knows exactly what he wants and needs and gets it done.

His practices are different from the norm as well. Indiana's football team practices only six hours per week on the field. That is significantly less than the 20-hour maximum, focusing on strategy over physical drills. Cignetti believes in "working smarter, not harder" and "Drill to the point of proficiency and not a second more."

Cignetti has completely turned around the school that has the most losses in the history of college football. The man who was leading the school two weeks ago that has the most wins in the history of college football has plunged Michigan football into chaos.

Sherrone Moore was fired for cause by the university for an inappropriate relationship with a staff member. Moore was later jailed on suspicion of assault, stalking and home invasion.

This isn't a college football story anymore. It's agony in Ann Arbor, a cautionary tale unfolding in real time. These are serious, troubling allegations, far removed from the on-field game and pageantry that defines college football.

This is an article about sports and I'm not going down the road of rumors. The Michigan head coaching position is one of the best in all of football. Michigan has always thought of themselves and their school a notch or three above other schools as far as reputation and elitism. Their recent infractions have brought them down to or below other BIG schools.

Former Michigan coach Jim Harbaugh got out of town to coach the LA Chargers just before the Connor Stalton's sign-stealing penalties came down. Moore was an assistant to Harbaugh at the time and inherited the Michigan head job after Harbaugh. Moore was also found to be complicit with the sign-stealing scandal. Michigan erred two years ago when they handed the job to him on a platter.

Big names are being thrown around as to who the next coach should be. DeBoer from Alabama. Fisch from Washington and Dillingham from Arizona State. Any big name coach would be crazy to jump to Michigan right now. Michigan football has big issues right now and should just name an interim coach for a year. Allow the dust to settle and hire a school president before hiring their next "Michigan Man."

I'm sure Nebraska wouldn't mind if their coach Matt Rhule took the Michigan job. Rhule signed a hefty contract extension around Halloween this year. Rhule has a 1-3 record since that signing and his just completed recruiting ranking was second to last in the BIG. His star quarterback Dylan Raiola just entered the transfer portal.

Injuries in the NFL are a given and will prevent teams from making it to the Super Bowl. There was none bigger than Micah Parsons ACL tear last week. Green Bay had a legitimate chance to win it all, not so much now.

The Chiefs never had a good chance but I feel sorry for Patrick Mahomes. No one plays the game harder or with more determination to win than Mahomes. He will be back later next year but the NFL and their fans are going to miss him.

If not this year then when for Josh Allen and the Buffalo Bills. With Mahomes and Burrows out and Lamar Jackson not playing well, Allen and the Bills not getting to the Super Bowl will be a huge disappointment.

Indy QB Philip Rivers did something last Sunday I didn't expect. The 44 year old grandfather who hasn't played in the NFL for five years was able to walk off the field after he played the entire game. He almost led his Colts to victory against a great Seahawk team.

The Broncos are in and the Bears should make the playoffs. Chicago has a difficult three game stretch to finish the season and an 85% chance of getting into the playoffs. The Broncos could be the #1 seed in the AFC playoffs and have all their games in Denver. They have won twelve consecutive games in the mile high air.

Your guess is as good as mine for our two PA teams. They both had resounding wins last week against inferior teams. Rodgers and Hurts both played really well. The Eagles are in but I'm not sure they can hang with the LA Rams. Tomlin will keep his consecutive non-losing season streak intact but miss the playoffs.

Grove surprised previously undefeated Lewisburg 53-47 behind Mac

DeFazio's 19 points and Xavier Jackson's 11. If Grove would have just shot 50% from the foul line they would have won by double digits. Lewisburg rebounded with a 64-62 win over Mifflin County. Nazir Meredith finished with 16 and Reбира Jemama added 14.

The Grove girls (1-5) beat Mifflinburg for their first win of the year 33-21. Madi Merrell had 17 points. They suffered a tough loss to Milton earlier in the week 33-28. Merrell scored 15 in the third quarter alone to briefly put the Seals ahead. Missed foul shots is an epidemic for both Grove hoop teams.

Mid-West girls are still looking for their first win. They fell 26-20 to East Juniata, 51-38 to Halifax and 42-15 to Mifflinburg. Wildcat freshman Avery Reibosome outscored Mid-West on her own with 19 and Brooke Gessner had 11 points.

Career highs in points from Green Dragons Addy Shedleski (19) and Ava Motto (17) weren't enough to hold off Mifflin County in a 50-40 loss.

The Selinsgrove grapplers won an exciting 33-32 dual meet over Montoursville with their big boys finishing strong. Crue Carter won his decision at 215 and Jack Peters pinned at heavyweight for the one point victory. The Grove girls wrestlers lost to Williamsport 49-24.

Lewisburg boys won all the contested matches by pins in beating Shamokin 60-18. Green Dragon Landen Wagner lost in the finals at the Carlisle Classic tourney. He got to the finals after two tech falls and a major decision.

What has happened at some other schools that were revered for their wrestling? Danville and Central Columbia used to be powerhouses, especially Danville. Mifflinburg rolled through both of them 70-0 and 68-6. I realize Mifflinburg is good but the disparity between the haves and have nots in local high school wrestling is alarming.

Did anyone watch the NBA Cup? I've been busy watching the women's college volleyball playoffs with an ex-college player who gave me great insight on the nuances of the sport. I know a lot of you follow the Penn State women's team but I learned a lot watching with someone who actually played. Thank you Sara.
