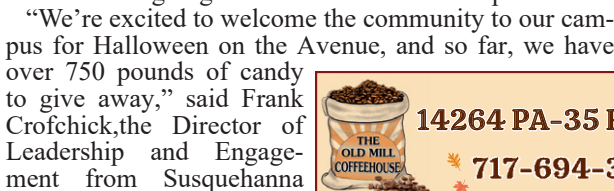

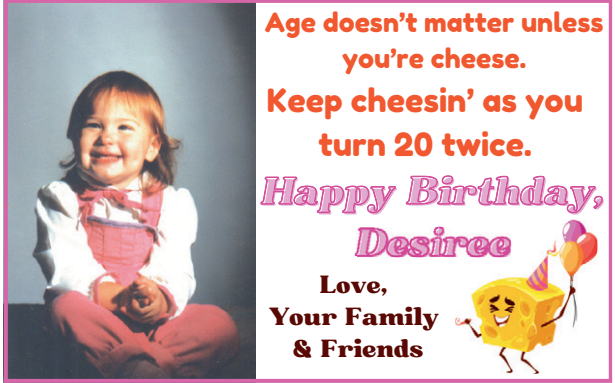

is the track super late model champion, his first ever at Bedford. Jeff Rine leads all drivers with nine track titles and is tied with Scott Haus for most career feature wins at 37. Last Saturday the show drew a field of 34 super late models 12-limited late models which was won by Gunner Walls for his first career feature win at Bedford. Path Valley closes out its season with a two-day show this Friday and Saturday for the Bullring Nationals, six divisions will be in action over the two days, 270and 600-micro sprints, Limited late models, UMP style Modifieds, 4-cylinder thundercar, and 4-cylinder strictly stock. The Limited late models will be racing for \$2,400 to win and \$250 to take the green, Modifieds \$1,200 to win and \$200 to take the green. 270-micros \$1,000, 600-micros \$750, 4-cylinders thunder cars \$700, and 4-cylinder strictly stock \$600. For some of the divisions this purse is based on a 12 car or more per class.

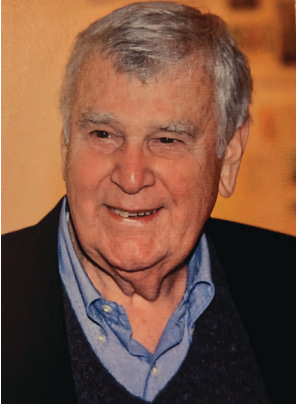

## Donald Housley, 84, Selinsgrove



Donald passed away on October 19, at Geisinger Medical Center, Danville surrounded by family.

He was a great man in an old-fashioned way, teaching generations of students at Susquehanna University, leading the construction of a new science building in his role as Dean of Arts and Sciences, and writing

Several books about local history. He was also kind, funny, beloved by his family, friends, and the Susque-

hanna community.

He was born on June 3, 1940, to Donald and Rosina Housley in Indianapolis, Indiana. He received an undergraduate degree from Houghton College in western New York, his Masters in History from the University of Con-

necticut, and his Ph.D. in History from the Pennsylvania State University.

He joined the faculty of Susquehanna University as a history professor in 1967, serving as Assistant Dean of the Faculty for four years and Dean of Arts and Sciences for eight years. He was elected Professor of the Year by students in 1971, and received the Lind back Foundation Award for distinguished teaching in 1972. He was appointed the Degenstein Distinguished Professor of History in 1998 and retired from the position in 2004.

While at Susquehanna, Don started the university's first "teaching cell"—a small, cross-disciplinary, multi-generational group of faculty who met regularly to discuss pedagogy. This led to the creation of Susquehanna's Center for Teaching and Learning.

Don memorized the names of all of his students by the second or third day of class, and could still remember many of them even after twenty years of retirement. He took his role as an advisor seriously and helped many students during his decades at the University.

In 2007, the Donald D. Housley Scholarship Fund was established by W. Talbot Daley '76 in recognition of the impact of Don's teaching and his ability to inspire generations of students and convey the importance of history in a diverse and interconnected world. Don was an extraordinary and highly respected teacher as well as a great mentor to other teachers.

In recognition of this, Don was the first recipient of the Susquehanna University Teaching Award in 1972, and it was named in his honor 45 years later as the Donald D. Housley Teaching Award.

In addition to his many years of service to the university, Don was also a benefactor, regularly supporting the Department of History, the Dr. John H. Longaker History Prize and the Housley Archive Fund, as well as campus lectures and student scholarships.

As a professional historian his focus was local, and he wrote books about Snyder County (Snyder County: From Pioneer Days to the Present), Susquehanna University (Susquehanna University: 1858-2000: A Goodly Heritage), and The Geisinger Health System (Make it the Best: A History of Geisinger Health System, 1912 to 2001). He published articles in the Snyder County Historical Society Bulletin and Pennsylvania Heritage. He also served as secretary of the Lutheran Historical Society of the Mid-Atlantic. He was an active member of the Selinsgrove History Association, and recently gave a lecture on the history of the Selinsgrove Fair at the Susquehanna University Downtown Center. He wrote the historical information about many buildings in Selinsgrove, which can be accessed through QR codes for a self-guided historical tour of the downtown area.

Don's faith guided him throughout his life. He was an active member of Sharon Lutheran Church for close to 50 years, serving on the board, assisting services and spearheading efforts to help those in need. He served proudly on the social ministry committee, acting as the chairman for many years. He participated in mission trips to Costa Rica and Nicaragua for Susquehanna students and led historical walking tours each year for Selinsgrove elementary students. He sang with the Susquehanna Chorale and performed with the group at Carnegie Hall. He worked for many years with Habitat for Humanity, serving both in leadership roles and with hammer in hand building homes for local families. Don believed in putting his faith into action in many large and small ways that truly defined his character. He was both a great leader and a humble servant.

He is survived by his beloved wife Grace, children Dave and Debbie, grandchildren Kate Curran, Peter Cooper, Nick Cooper, and Benny

Housley, daughter-in-law Lori Wieder, son-in-law Joe Cooper, and sister Judy Brandi. He was preceded in death by brothers Tom Housley and Tim Housley.

He was an avid fan of golf, baseball, and the world champion Boston Celtics. His dog Callie made him laugh every single day.

There will be a visitation at the Susquehanna University Downtown Center at 111 North Market Street in Selinsgrove on Friday, October 25 from 5:00 to 7:00.

Funeral services will be held at Sharon Lutheran Church on Saturday October 26, with a visitation from 1:00 to 2:30 and service to follow at 3:00.

# 1974 PIAA State Soccer Champions Celebrate Winning Title 50 Years Ago

On Saturday, October 5, 2024, the 1974 PIAA State Soccer Champions from Middleburg High School gathered at the Middleburg Fire Hall to celebrate winning the state title 50 years ago!

As former players, managers, cheerleaders, spouses and friends arrived, there was a lot of catching up to do, but not before asking, “Who are you?” As people reintroduced themselves to each other, lively conversations, handshakes, hugs, and stories from

that momentous season filled the room.

Coach Jim Aurand began the night’s program by remembering those from the soccer team who had passed away in the last 50 years. Those individuals included seniors Bruce Bolig and Bob Mengle, junior Mark Franchina, and freshman Fred Steimling. Coach Aurand also mentioned his assistant coach Charles Zimmerman, principal at the time, Jim Howell, and former athletic directors Bill Herman and Robert Apple.

Reliance Hose Fire Co. Auxiliary then served a delicious meal and Dough C Dough Bakery and Caterer provided scrumptious cupcakes for dessert.

Following the meal, Coach Aurand began his speech by saying, “I don’t know if you realize the impact of what you did in 1974 has had on this school and community. I’ve always emphasized how the actions of our teams set an example for the young people who look up to them and what happened this year still reverberated today.”

He shared his memories of the 1974 soccer season, acknowledging that these fine young men were 4th, 5th, 6th, and 7th graders when he began coaching and that the soccer players in the grades ahead of them set great examples and inspirations for them.

Coach Aurand went on to say that the players in 1974 were very skilled and motivated. Before the days of organized youth soccer, these young men could be found on the athletic field every Wednesday and Sunday nights in vigorous soccer pick-up games. He recalled, “If you didn’t get there early enough, you had to wait to get a spot on a team,” showing just how dedicated and determined they were to become better and better soccer players.

In 1973, Middleburg won the TVL Championship but lost in a playoff game to West Snyder High School who went on to win the first State Soccer Championship.

In the 1974 soccer season, the Middleburg Middies finished the season with 16 wins, 2 losses, and 1 tie. They finished second in the TVL to State College, won the PIAA District 4 Championship, and won the State Title over Tulpehocken High School by

a score of 4 to 0 in the PIAA State Championship game. Many of the players “were highly recruited by different colleges and continued to play and promote the game after high school.”

Along with praising the hard work, skill, and determination of the varsity squad, Coach Aurand also mentioned how instrumental the JV team was in pushing the varsity team to better themselves every night at practice. Under the coaching of Charles Zimmerman, the JV team finished the 1974 soccer season with a record of 8 wins, 0 losses, and one tie.

One part of the team that often gets overlooked are the managers of the team. The managers of the 1974 team were supportive in meeting the needs of the teams, having the necessary equipment ready and being available to help wherever and whenever needed.

Also recognized at the banquet were the cheerleaders and their coach, Mrs. Sue Fisher, for their rousing pep rallies, positive attitudes, and keeping the fans engaged during the games. They definitely helped to boost school spirit and maintain team morale. Other groups contributing to the success of the team were the parents, fans, and the administration. Whether it was a pat on the back, a congratulatory note, a phone call, and of course their appearances and support at the games, the fans, parents, and administration were appreciated and were an inspiration to the team. The evening ended with players and others sharing stories about the 1974 soccer season. They browsed the souvenirs and watched a video of the game. Gene Roush won the raffle taking home the state championship banner which at one time hung in the high school gymnasium. Then, the group gathered for a 1974 PIAA State Soccer Champions photo including everyone involved in making it a successful season.

# Susquehanna Valley Chorale Kicks Off Season With Bluegrass Music

The Susquehanna Valley Chorale (SVC) will kick-off its new season with a popular program presented several years ago. The World Beloved: A Bluegrass Mass will be performed on Saturday, Oct. 26 at 7:30 pm and on Sunday, Oct. 27 at 3 pm at Rusty Rail Brewery in Mifflinburg. SVC’s performance will also feature a collection of songs entitled “Dear Appalachia: Songs from My Mountain Home”. Minnesota-based bluegrass ensemble, Monroe Crossing, will join the SVC for this concert.

Patrons are encouraged to arrive early for a Happy Hour pre-concert reception, featuring a cash bar with Rusty Rail’s favorite brews, beginning at 6:30 pm on Saturday and 2 pm on Sunday.

“Bluegrass Mass” is a joyful affirmation of life expressed in sophisticated choral sound and jubilant bluegrass harmonies. The piece follows the traditional structure for a Mass; taking a very familiar thematic structure and setting it in a fresh and communal way. Composer Carol Barnett has been hailed as a writer of audacious and engaging music. The piece comprises parts for solos, choir, bluegrass band, and then movements that bring SVC and Monroe Crossing together.

Soloists will include Amy Caron of Selinsgrove and three scholarship recipients: Kirsten Weirich and Rob Speece from Susquehanna University and Rebecca Lipsky from Bucknell University.

Monroe Crossing is a popular bluegrass band from the Twin Cities. Named in honor of Bill Monroe, “The Father of Bluegrass,” Monroe Crossing sings around a single microphone in a style reminiscent of old-time radio shows. Monroe Crossing’s superb musicianship and on-stage rapport have entertained audiences for over 20 years. In 2007, Monroe Crossing was inducted into the Minnesota Music Hall of Fame and they have twice been selected to showcase at the annual World of Bluegrass convention hosted by the International Bluegrass Music Association (IBMA).

The SVC presented this work in the fall of 2010 at the Weis Center for the Performing Arts and soon became an audience favorite.

Music Director and Conductor Bill Payn said, “I am excited to return to Rusty Rail following the success of our Dylan concert two years ago! We are looking forward to collaborating once again with Monroe Crossing, one of America’s premiere Bluegrass bands.”

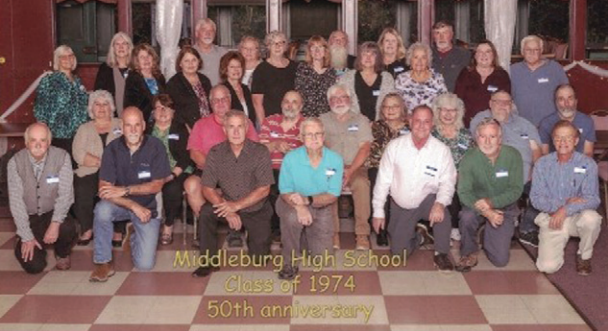
