## Rain on Saturday Wipes out Big Racing Event, Lucas Oil did Race on Sunday at Hagerstown

What was to be a big weekend of racing fell victim to rain and cold weather; it all started on Friday night when an unexpected shower for Williams Grove Speedway officials to call the race after a couple of heat races were run. The show will not be made-up and. With the Grove back in action this Friday with 410 sprints and 358 sprints it should be a great show. Saturday was the real washout with BAPS cancelling the first ever appearance by the Lucas Oil super late model series with no plans for a make-up date this year. Hopefully they can get back on the schedule for the 2027 season. Saturday the Keith Kauffman Classic was postponed due to the weather but will be made up on Saturday May 16th. The event will pay the winner \$15,000 to win. A number of other tracks were rained out on Saturday Lincoln speedway, Path Valley speedway, Winchester Va speedway, Potomac speedway, Marion Center and Stateline speedways in the western part of the state.

Friday night Selinsgrove got their third show in of the season with the second event for the 410-sprint, in a race that was dominated by Chase Dietz, but he got a flat tire with three laps to go but did come back to get second to winner Mark Smith. Dietz was so much in control that he had lapped up to fourth place. So on the restart, he was put in front of the lapped cars which gave him some laps to get the lead back, but Smith was up to the challenge, and Mark scored his first 410-sprint win of the season. It was his third overall 410 sprints win his last coming in March of the 2003 season. Mark does own 30 limited sprint car wins third on the all-time list at Selinsgrove only behind Pat Cannon with 49 and Blane Heimbach with 41.

The race last Friday at Selinsgrove was to honor the late Ray Tilley a four-time track champion at Selinsgrove who has the most wins in the division with 60 career wins. Ray's career was cut short from a racing accident at Langhorne speedway back in 1969, he passed away in August 11, 2011, at the age of 77. Jake Karklin of Beavertown again showed speed setting fast time of 15.951 off the track record held by TJ Stutts with a time of 15.428 which he did in the 2024 season. Lane Snook scored the Limited late model feature win over a quality field of 25 limited late model drivers. For Lane it was his sixth overall win at Selinsgrove in the class winning five races there last year. Lane is hoping to get back in his super late model soon a division he plans to be a regular, but some mechanical problems have kept him from racing in the class more. This Friday the super late models are back for their third racing program of the season, so far Gregg Satterlee has been the dominated driver winning both features. The PASS 305-sprint will be on hand for their second event of the year, with the first one won by Beavertown's Drew Young, the four-cylinders will make their first of two appearances also.

At Clinton County a race for the lead in the IMCA 305-sprint feature resulted in both Matt Tebbs and Timmy Bittner flipping into the first and second turns. Timmy was taken to the hospital to be checked out, but everything was good for the Beach Creek Pa driver. Jacob Gomola of Sarver Pa went on to win the race. Jacob will be away from the area for a month. He and his team will head to Texas to run a number of tracks that have put together a Speedweeks program and later will have an event that will pay the winner \$5,000 to win. In Pro-stock action defending champ AJ Hoffman of Richfield scored the feature win over two-time feature winner from Selinsgrove Cory Long. This Friday the limited

late model will be back in action for their second race of the year. George Dixon of Shirleysburg Pa won the feature in the first event for the division.

The Lucas Oil series did get the event in on Sunday night held at Hagerstown speedway, along with Crate late models the second division. A nice field of 30-crate late models and 31 Lucas Oil series late models, with 18 signed drivers on hand from the series, and 13 local and regional drivers on hand. Hagerstown had the track in great shape and the racing was good all night, even with the dominating performance by Brandon Shepard who led all but the first two laps of the forty lap feature. The racing thru the field was top notch with Hudson O'Neal coming from 11th starting spot to a third place finish and was closing in on second place when the checkers fell. Brandon Overton started the night by setting fast time with a clocking of 17.428, and he also went out and won his heat and led the first two laps of the feature before settling for a second-place finish. For winner Brandon Sheppard it was the first time in the last two races that he was leading and lost the led in lapped traffic, it was not the case this time for the New Berlin ILL driver he maneuvered his way around the traffic to score the win. His 35th over with the Lucas series and third win with the series this year. Shepard was finally glad to get a win at Hagerstown and credited Josh Richards for some of his help in getting around the Hagerstown oval. "Josh was always good here and was glad for some of his advice along with his dad and my car owner Mark Richards, this place is fun to race, and the track was in good shape". Noted Brandon. Hudson O'Neal was wishing the race was a fifty lapper as he was gaining on the top two later in the race, but settled for third, with current series points leader Devin Moran and Max Blair in the top five. Mason Ziegler of Chalk Hill made his first start of the season with his #25Z Rocket chassis and got as high as battling for fifth the races only caution came out on lap seven. After that Mason was hanging on and later the race was still eight, but over the last lap fell to a tenth-place finish. Other locals in the finish were Gregg Satterlee who so far this year in local racing has three wins and three second placed runs. Satterlee was 12th against the Lucas series followed by Matt Cosner 13th Justin

Weaver 14th with Jamie Lathroumm 18th. Trevor Feathers who was also racing in this group dropped out of the race. The Crate late model feature that was run at Hagerstown was cut short by too many cautions and with the time limit up the race was checked on lap seven with Kyle Hardy of Winchester Va. The winner over Brady Neff and Devin Brannon. For Hardy it was his third crate late model feature win of the year, he also has two limited late model feature wins this year at Winchester speedway.

Just a few weeks away from the other National traveling series the World of Outlaws will be in the area with races at Georgetown speedway on Wednesday May 13th followed by Selinsgrove on Thursday. Then a two-day show at Marion Center, wrapping things up with a Sunday night show at Bedford, for five nights of WOO series super late model racing. Georgetown, Selinsgrove and Bedford will all pay \$20,000 to win. Marion Center will have two semi-features on Friday paying \$6,000 to win with the final on Saturday paying \$30,000 to win. Right now, the series has 16 contracted drivers that will be racing. These included Bobby Pierce, Nick Hofman, Ryan Gustin, Tim McCreadie, Dennis Erb Jr, Tyler Erb, Drake Troutman, Ethan Dotson, Dustin Sorenson, Brent Larson, Tristan Chamberlain, with four rookie drivers Trey Mills, Logan Zarin, Eli Johnson and Daulton Wilson. But before that happens the World of Outlaws sprint car series will be in the area for three shows, one at Lincoln Speedway on Wednesday May 5th and two at Williams Grove on Friday and Saturday May 8th and 9th.

This Sunday BAPS motor speedway will run its fourth 410-sprint car event along with the tracks regular Super Sportsman division. Anthony Macri won the first race there back on March 15th, of course Macri is still on the mend from his T-5 vertebra accident at Williams Grove. Troy Wagaman Jr and Chase Dietz have also scored feature wins. In three events the tracks are averaging 27 sprints. They have had a high of 30 and a low of 26 so far, after this event they still have five other shows for the 410-sprint during this season.

# Beaver Springs Dragway-Family Affordable Fun for All Ages

Beaver Springs Dragway is nestled among the scenic rolling hills of the heart of central Pennsylvania, midway between Selingsgrove and Lewistown.

Located in Benfer near Beaver Springs, 2026 will be fully operated this year by Mike and Emily McCracken taken over for Mike Sr. Who wants to step back but will still be there to help them take over the reins. The track was purchased in 2017 by Mike Sr. It was originally the Cameron Airport and became a dragstrip on May 30, 1971 under the then ownership of Bob McCardle.

# Sunbury's Mark Smith Takes 410 Win-Snook and Miller also Take Checkers

Drama was everywhere Friday night at the Selingsgrove Speedway, as a dominant run turned into one of the closest finishes of the season. Late cautions added to the intensity fans expect at Selingsgrove, with Sunbury's Mark Smith scoring his first High Caliber Cranes 410 Sprint Car win of 2026, Port Royal's Lane Snook winning the Creekside Auto Sales Limited Late Models opener, and Tower City's Troy Miller claiming his first Gator's Guns Street Stocks feature of the year. Twenty 410 Sprint Cars signed in for the Ray Tilly Classic presented by Icon Legacy, honoring the all-time feature win leader with 69 victories. York's Chase Dietz and Smith led the field to green, and for nearly the entire 25-lap feature, Dietz was untouchable. In one of the most dominant performances in recent memory, he lapped up to fourth place in a non-stop event—until disaster struck. Entering turn three on the final lap, Dietz's right rear tire exploded, forcing him to pit and bringing out the caution. The incident set up a one-lap shootout, with Smith inheriting the lead over Austin Bishop. The restart nearly turned chaotic again when Jake Karklin's engine failed, bringing out another caution and tightening the field. That set up a final one-lap dash. Smith got the jump, Bishop challenged high, and Dietz surged back into contention. Off turn four, Dietz made a last push, but Smith held him off by less than half a car length to secure his third career 410 win—and first since the 2018 Ray Tilly Classic. Dietz, Bishop, Ryan Taylor, and Kody Lehman completed the top five. "We got lucky there," Smith said in victory lane. "I'd rather be lucky than good. I've lost more races being good." Dietz added, "I over drove and overheated the right rear. I thought I had a great shot to win. It's disappointing for us, but exciting for the fans." In the Limited Late Model feature, 25 cars signed in for their season opener. Snook and Andrew Yoder started on the front row, but the race was quickly halted by a red flag when Nathan Long flipped in turn three. Long was uninjured. Once racing resumed, Snook pulled away to a commanding lead until a caution reset the field. Behind him, Yoder and Ryan Zook battled for second, exchanging positions in the closing laps. Yoder appeared poised to challenge for the win, but mechanical issues ended his night, bringing out another caution. On the final restart, Snook held off Zook to claim his first win of the season. Daulton Bigler, Shaun Miller, and George Dixon rounded out the top five. "I was waiting to get passed when that last caution came out," Snook said. "We've been good, just needed some luck—and we got it tonight." The Street Stocks saw 13 cars take the green, with Tommy Dawson leading early before Troy Miller worked his way into contention. After a caution slowed the field, Miller found speed on the high side and tracked down Dawson. Miller made the winning move entering turn three, taking the lead as the race reached halfway. Brad Mitch gave chase in the closing laps, but a slight misstep in turns one and two sealed the outcome. Miller captured his 21st career Street Stock win at Selingsgrove, finishing ahead of Mitch. "The car was really good on the bottom," Miller said. "I can't thank Jason and Tina Geesaman enough—it's their stuff. I just help work on it and have fun." A special thanks went out to the Susquehanna University football team for bringing energy throughout the night. Selingsgrove Speedway returns to action Friday, May 1, featuring the Super Late Models, PASS 305 Sprint Cars, and SCDRA Northeast 4-Cylinders.

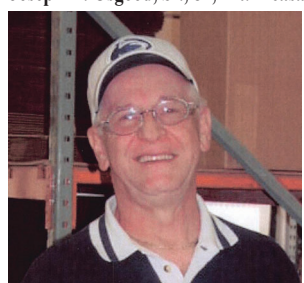

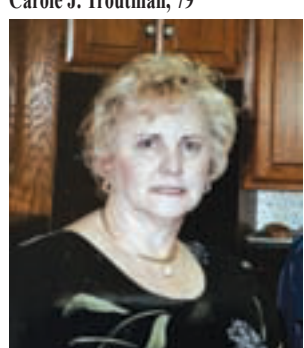

It is time for a little house-cleaning from the just concluded NFL draft. The city of Pittsburgh was a great host and the weather was ideal for at least the first two days.

No matter what Rams coach Sean McVay says after the fact, he was not happy when his GM picked Alabama QB Ty Simpson with the 13th overall pick in the draft. McVay wanted a player that would help his team win a Super Bowl this year.

Philadelphia Eagles GM Howie Roseman proved again why he is one of the best general managers in the NFL. He stole USC wide receiver Makai Lemon from the Steelers who were going to select him with the next pick. Roseman traded up for the Cowboys pick just in front of Pittsburgh. The Cowboys actually helped their bitter rivals by agreeing to swap draft positions.

The other great GM is KC Chiefs Brett Veach from Mount Carmel. He instantly brought the Chiefs back to Super Bowl contention with his first four picks on the defensive side.

Despite the Steelers being duped by the Eagles, they had a really good and interesting draft overall. Drew Allar is going

to be a very good QB in the NFL. His talents were wasted at Penn State with the offensive schemes they played and the suspect coaching.

Pittsburgh drafting Navy running back Eli Heidenreich with their last pick was one of the highlights of the draft. He is a local kid from Mount Lebanon with size and speed that compare favorably with 49er Christian McCaffrey which should bode well for the Steelers. The man with the ginger mullet, Gennings Dunker, will be a fan favorite and linemen coming from Iowa are always good.

I have been railing on gambling in sports for some time now and once again we have a major story of a star college player betting on his sport and many others. Brendan Sorsby was to be the Texas Tech starting QB this year after transferring from Cincinnati. It's questionable if he will be eligible to play pending further investigation. He is currently in a residential treatment program for gambling addiction.

His college career started at Indiana where he placed wagers on their games as a freshman. Much like Pete Rose, he claims to have only bet on the Hoosiers to win while he was there. He didn't bet on the one game that he played in, a 45-17 loss to Penn State.

Sorsby transferred to Cincinnati after two years where he set passing records for the Bearcats and went 13-17 in those two years. That production made him the most sought-after NIL transfer this year. He signed a \$5-6M deal to play his final season at Texas Tech. Cincinnati is suing him for \$1M for breaking the NIL deal he had with them.

What we have here is a newly minted multi-millionaire betting on thousands of games through on-line betting services. FanDuel, DraftKings and many other on-line services have to know who is gambling with them. There is an application process where you give them your name, address, date of birth and credit card number. FanDuel may not recognize the name of a backup guard that plays at Bucknell, but surely a Davey O'Brien semifinalist placing that number of wagers should raise a red flag.

The NCAA doesn't have the manpower to police all of their athletes that are gambling on sports, the betting services have to be more involved with this lack of oversight in sports betting. Game results will continue to be compromised further as bigger stars in both college and professional sports are revealed to have gambled on their sport.

I am not anti-gambling, the Kentucky Derby is this Saturday. Mrs. Bolt and I have placed a few dollars on crazy tri and quad-fecta's every year on the race. When you gamble big and win, the euphoria isn't as great as the despair when you lose because in your mind, you thought you were going to win or else you would not have placed the bet.

It's a good bet that Selinsgrove's Bella Furgison should place pretty high at this year's PIAA track and field championships. Furgison placed an impressive second place at the Penn Relays in Philadelphia. She was the top American finisher at this prestigious event.

The Lewisburg boys tennis team lost to Danville 3-2. They came back strong in shutting out Hughesville 5-0. Canyon Swartzentruber and Luke Azeredo continued their dominance at number one and two singles.

The Grove boys swept a rare double-header in tennis with identical 3-2 scores over Central Mountain. Mac DeFazio beat Milton's #1 singles and #8 seeded D4 player to win 4-1 over Milton. Seal's Lomond Rodgers lost in his first district match and DeFazio won his first district match but fell in the second round.

Grove's Riley Romig and Reid Kerstetter threw a combined

(6-8) 14-10 win over Milton. Wagner finished with 5 runs and 3 RBIs as did teammate Cole Grozier.



# Pennsylvania Farm Bureau and State Agencies Urge Caution When Driving on Rural Roads

As temperatures rise and planting season gets underway across Pennsylvania, drivers navigating rural roads should be prepared to share them with large, slow-moving farm equipment.

Pennsylvania Farm Bureau (PFB), along with state government partners, is encouraging driver caution during Rural Roads Safety Week, April 12-18. Each year, PFB partners with the Pennsylvania Department of Transportation (PennDOT), the Pennsylvania Department of Agriculture (PDA), and the Pennsylvania State Police (PSP) to raise awareness about staying safe on rural roads during the spring planting season.

"Farmers make the safety of other motorists a top priority when we must move equipment on the roadway and we ask that drivers help keep us safe as well," said Pennsylvania Farm Bureau President Chris Hoffman. "We don't want to cause an inconvenience to anyone and will often pull over to allow others to pass when it's safe to do so. We just ask that drivers remain patient when following farm equipment and keep a safe distance. By slowing down and using caution and commonsense, drivers can avoid costly crashes and save lives."

"Rural roads are a critical route for getting food to all our tables," Pennsylvania Department of Agriculture Deputy Secretary Lisa Graybeal said. "For your safety, and for the safety of everyone who must share our roads, please be alert and patient as you travel across Pennsylvania this season. Slow down and take time to enjoy the beauty of Pennsylvania and the bounty Pennsylvania farmers put on our tables every day."

According to preliminary PennDOT data, there were 85 crashes involving farm equipment last year, resulting in 1 fatality and 9 suspected serious injuries. Overall, there were more than 28,000 crashes on rural roads in 2025, resulting in 426 fatalities.

"Safety on our roadways is a shared responsibility," said PennDOT District 6 Executive Din Abazi. "We must all use caution when driving on rural roads, especially in the spring and summer months when farm vehicles are most common on these roadways. Please avoid distractions, never drive impaired, and buckle up for a safe drive."

### What drivers should know:

Farm equipment can legally operate on public roads, including at night, but must follow safety guidelines based on equipment size. Any vehicle traveling under 25 mph is required to display a Slow-Moving Vehicle (SMV) sign, an orange triangle with a red border, on the back of the vehicle. If you see that emblem, slow down immediately.

When following a tractor on the road, it's important to keep the following information in mind:

- Farm equipment may turn at unexpected places, into fields or farm lanes
- Large equipment pulling to the right may be preparing for a wide left turn
- Never pass unless the oncoming lane is fully clear and visible
- Never pass in a no-passing zone or within 100 feet of an intersection, railroad crossing, bridge, or tunnel
