A Book Comes Alive!

Author Marsha Hubler hosts a monthly Tommi Pockets Friday Fun Night in her basement clubhouse for ages 8-13, based on her tween book, Tommi Pockets.

Three years ago, Marsha Hubler, local best-selling author of the Keystone Stables Series, had no idea how her twenty-first book, Tommi Pockets, would impact her life and the lives of eight-to-thirteen-year-olds she knows in her community.

Tommi Pockets, the first tween novel in the Tommi Pockets trilogy, takes place in the 1950s in Ashland, PA, where Marsha grew up. "My dad," she said, "was a pool shark, and he could have gone pro. He was that good. We had a pool table in our home where he taught me how to play the game. I still have that same pool table in my basement."

That pool table and her childhood experience were the inspiration for the Tommi Pockets series. In the first book, Tommi whose nickname is Pockets, is a lonely young teen from a broken home. She wants to be a champion pool player, but gals aren't allowed in pool rooms. Pockets then dresses like a boy, and she and her dad beat everyone. However, Pockets runs with a gang, gets into trouble, and is sent for counseling at the Salvation Army. There she meets her match in Captain Arlene Masters who loves her unconditionally. Fiery "Captain Ar" shares with Pockets what's really important in life- loving God and loving others, and the woman helps Pockets become a success at home and at school.

One thing immediately catches Pocket's eye at the post, causing her to love going there with Captain Ar: a game room with a pool table where all the counselees have pizza, shoot pool, and play games once a week on Friday Fun Night.

Once the tweens had read the book, Tommi Pockets, they remembered that Marsha had a pool table. Of course, the tweens wanted to learn how to shoot pool! One by one, they came for at least three lessons. Then one day, a girl was standing by the pool table with a pool stick in her hands and asked, "Why can't we have a Friday Fun Club just like in the book?"

"It was just like angels singing and the heavens opening up. What a great idea!" exclaimed Marsha. Then one thing led to another, and Tommi Pockets Friday Fun Night started.

"My basement has been transformed into a clubhouse with the pool table, ping-pong table, and card games. There are chairs and couches for lounging. We meet once a month on a Friday night with a limit of 15 clubbers at a time. We always have pizza, snacks, and soda. Then we have a short devotional before the games begin. It's amazing how fast some of the clubbers have picked up the billiard skills!" explained Marsha.

Then Marsha added, "My dad would be thrilled to know how this pool table is being used now...to teach young kids how to shoot pool."

In addition to learning to shoot pool, the clubbers learn to play ping-pong and chess, win prizes, participate in Bible drills, have picnics, and go on field trips. They also get a free T-shirt that has their name on the front. A large black billiard ball with the words, "Christian's my name. Pool's my game" is imprinted on the back.

Along with all the fun the club members have, they're reminded of the underlying theme, "Others," and they're asked to learn the club verse, Proverbs 20:11: "Even a child is known by his doings, whether his work be pure, and whether it be right." They are encouraged to be the best example they can be at home and school and to look for ways to be an encouragement to those around them.

The Tommi Pockets club members have participated in several projects to benefit others. Over the last two years, the clubbers have made 'Thank you' cards for veterans and for people who've supported the club financially. They will soon be packing gift boxes for Franklin Graham's Operation Christmas Child, a project that sends school supplies and small gifts to thousands of children in need all over the world. The children will each bring in a small gift to include in the box.

"We're teaching them it's more blessed to give than to receive," said Marsha.

On August 18th, the clubbers met for their snacks, had a devotional by one of the club leaders, and enjoyed a hymn sing led by a talented friend playing his guitar. Then the group enjoyed games, pool, and prizes. During their September meeting, the clubbers went on a hayride in addition to all of the other activities. Two years ago, after reading the third book in the series Double Trouble at the Pioneer Tunnel, they took a field trip to Ashland where the book takes place. They toured the coal mine with a tour guide and rode the Lokie around the mountain followed by a picnic in the park.

"I had no idea this club was coming into my life. It's been a thrill!" said Marsha Hubler. "You never know what impact your thoughts and words will have on others. An author always hopes his or her book is going to touch readers' hearts and lives in a positive way." Then she added, "I'm very thankful my book has evolved into this ministry to help young people grow in their love for God and their fellow man."

Game Commission Dissolves RHD DMA

Following guidance within its Rabbit Hemorrhagic Disease (RHD) Management Plan, the Pennsylvania Game Commission has dissolved the RHD Disease Management Area (DMA) established last year in Fayette County.

Rabbit Hemorrhagic Disease can be caused by several viral strains but RHDV2 is responsible for the recent RHD outbreak in the United States. RHDV2 is a highly contagious, and often-fatal virus that can infect both wild and domestic rabbits, hares and other lagomorphs. The virus, which is a serious threat to Pennsylvania's wild rabbits and hares, also can persist in the environment and be carried great distances through contaminated equipment, tools, or other items.

The RHD DMA was created last fall after RHDV2 was detected at a domestic rabbit facility. The agency's RHD Management Plan recommends that any RHD DMA be dissolved following 12 consecutive months of no further RHDV2 detections.

While the RHD DMA has been dissolved, the public is reminded there's still a ban on importing into Pennsylvania any wild lagomorph, or any of their parts or products, including meat, pelts, hides and carcasses, from any state, province, territory, or country where RHDV2 has been detected in wild or captive lagomorph populations in the 12 months prior to the importation or where the virus has been declared endemic in domestic or wild lagomorph populations. This ban will remain in effect until further notice.

Hunters are strongly encouraged to contact the appropriate agriculture and wildlife authorities in non-endemic areas when hunting rabbits or hares outside of Pennsylvania to determine if the ban applies. Since its first detection in the United States in early 2020, RHDV2 has become endemic in wild lagomorph populations in 11 states (Arizona, California, Colorado, Idaho, Montana, Nevada, New Mexico, Oregon, Texas, Utah, Wyoming).

RHD is exclusive to lagomorphs and does not pose a public health concern. For more information about the disease, including recommendations on how you can help the Game Commission, please visit Rabbit Hemorrhagic Disease (pa.gov). The agency strongly encourages anyone who observes two or more dead hares or rabbits at the same location and time without an obvious cause of death to report those findings via the Wildlife Health Survey or by calling 1-833-PGC-WILD (1-833-742-9453).

other drivers will be looking at a big pay day if they win the Saturday feature which pays \$1,000 to win. This will be the final race at Clinton County for the 2023 season.



WILLIAMS GROVE ALL SET FOR NATIONAL OPEN WEEKEND WITH THE WOO SPRINTS

Last Friday was the final regular show of the season for the 410-sprint, and the final points show for the 358-sprints. Lance Dewease got the lead after Brent Marks dropped out of the feature while leading and went on to score his third win of the year and 114-overall at the Grove. It was his first win for Lance in the Macri #39M. Both nights this weekend will be points races for the 410-sprints with Freddie Rahmer leading Danny Dietrich by 125-points, the Hoosier Diamond series wrap up with Dietrich winning that title by 20-points over Lance Dewease. The 358-sprints had Chad Criswell cross under the checker flag first, but he came up light at the scale so the win went to Derek Locke for his second win of the season. Before last Friday the Grove had eight different winners. With his 7th place finish Doug Hammaker won his second 358-sprint Williams Grove title, by 70-points over Kody Hartlaub. This weekend kicks off Friday night with the WOO sprints against the PA Posse. WOO Points leader Brad Sweet has one win at the Grove this year along with Logan Schuchart, and Rico Abreu who is not a Woo regular but runs a number of these shows. Brent Marks leads all winners this year at the Grove with four wins, Danny Dietrich Freddie Rahmer, and Troy Wagaman each have two wins, with Zeb Wise an All-Star feature win. Chase Dietz, Steve Buckwalter and Lucas Wolfe each have one win. Friday nights winner will collect \$10,000 for the win which goes for 25-laps, with the Saturday 40-lap feature winner getting \$75,000. Lance Dewease won last year's race, while driving the Kreitz #69K which was his fifth national open title, he also won the Friday night preliminary race, this will be the 61st running of the open at Williams Grove.

How about the weekend Logan Seavey had at Eldora winning all three of the USAC races getting the midget feature win over Bryant Wiedeman and Rico Abreu, the sprint win over Justin Grant and Emerson Axson, and the champ car win over Matt Westfall and York, PA., Chase Dietz. Kyle Larson pulled the sweep off in the 2011 season, and Jack Hewitt is still the only driver to win four races, he added a UMP Modified feature win in the 1998 running of the Silver Crown Nationals. Seavey has won three silver crown events in a row at Eldora matching a feat that Jack Hewitt pulled off in the 1994,95,96 seasons. There is one point race left for the champ cars at Lucas Oil Indianapolis Raceway Park on Saturday October 14th. With Seavey leading Kody Swanson by 16-points. Logan Seavey is having a great season starting off with a Chili bowl win, then winning the Indiana midget Speedweek, the driver from Suter, California is having a big season in USAC action. This was the 41st running of the four-crown event with Seavey picking up over \$30,000 in prize monies. The All-Star sprint was the other division in action, that feature was won by Zeb Wise for his ninth win of the season; he was also crowned the 2023 series champion. The driver from Angola, IN. won the title by 220 over Chris Windom, with last year's champ Tyler Courtney third in points, Courtney also raced to eighth in the champ car feature, followed by Cowansville PA driver Syc Lynch and Brandon Fla., driver Conner Morrall. Tyler had to sit out several races from injuries suffered in crash this season, but still scored nine feature wins with the series. Car counts found 42-All-Star sprints 36 champ cars 38 wingless sprints and 18 USAC midgets Briggs Danner of Allentown placed fifth in the wingless sprint feature and was 12th in the midget feature, Cameron Perigo of Stoystown, Pa., was fourth in the Champ Car feature.

This Saturday the limited late models take center stage with the special \$2,000 to win and \$200 to take the green. It is one of the biggest races for this division at Clinton County speedway, and with most tracks shut down for the year a good field of drivers are expected to be on hand. Matt Adams, Andrew Yoder, and Jakob Piper have scored feature wins this year with five other races planned getting rained out. Points are close with Yoder holding a 20-point lead over Matt Cochran with Matt Adams third 70-markers back. Three other divisions will be in action with specials also, 270-Micro-sprints racing for \$500 to win and their final points event with Cory Stabley leading Jeff Weaver by 105-points. The Pro-Stocks will be racing for \$1,000 to win, with the rules a little modified for other tracks drivers to be able to run in the big events. Cory Long leads Johnny Bouse by 70-points in the final point show of the season, both drivers looking for their first ever track title, with Bouse having six feature wins and Long with four wins, other drivers with feature wins are Brandon Moser with two wins Tommy Dawson Shane Wolf, and AY Schilling each with one. Skylar Phillips has already clinched the Four-Cylinders track title, but he and several

Snyder County PASR Tours Penn Valley Airport

The Snyder County Pennsylvania Association of School Retirees (PASR) were flying high as they toured the Penn Valley Airport in Selinsgrove. Steve Bowers, Penn Valley Airport Manager, and Rodney Ries, Vice Chairman of the Penn Valley Airport Authority Board of Directors, conducted the enlightening and entertaining tour.

"Penn Valley Airport has been here since 1946 and over the years it developed and changed many times," pointed out Bowers. Penn Valley Airport is an uncontrolled airport with no control tower.

The first stop was the lobby of the terminal. Local artist and PASR member, Rodney Ries, who is also a former pilot, created the beautiful mural that decorated one wall of the lobby. "The airplanes represent local

people for the most part," explained Ries. He had lots of interesting stories to tell about the planes and pilots depicted in the mural.

Bowers pointed out the Link Trainer, a simulator used to train WWII aviation cadets in the United States, in another corner of the lobby. Then he took the group to see the present day Redbird Flight Simulator that was donated to Penn Valley Airport by Dr. Victor Vogel. It is a full motion simulator with various scenarios and options. On the screen there are views of local airports with actual topography of the flight path. "It's pretty realistic," added Bowers. "It's very unique for a smaller airport to have a simulator this advanced."

Dr. Vogel purchased the simulator "to interest young people in flying and aviation." Dr. Vogel has also created the STEM to Skies program.

In addition to 35 private planes, there are various other businesses that use the airport regularly. High Voltage Aviation, a private company, uses helicopters to check the power lines for breaks in the line, repair work, and maintenance of the power lines throughout the area.

Another company uses helicopters to spray for gypsy moths and black flies. They use the airport for refueling. Weis Market and Ritz-Craft Inc. also have a hangar for their corporate aircraft.

Many Friday afternoons, Fort Indiantown Gap National Guard Group sends their Black Hawks unit for practice take and landings at Penn Valley Airport. Then, they use the airport for troop training and drills.

Part of the tour included the maintenance shed that is filled with hundreds of thousands of dollars' worth of equipment necessary to maintain the grounds. Bowers also mentioned that a portion of the funding for equipment comes from the aviation gasoline tax. Other funds come from the Airport Improvement Program (AIP). Those funds are currently being used for runway and taxiway improvements as well as tree mitigation around the airfield. The airport is also in the process of building a new hangar to house 6 more planes. Additionally, the airport is planning for runaway lighting upgrades that may cost about \$2.6 million.

The group then toured several hangars. Most are T-

hangars with 12 aircraft in each. As on cue a plane providing scenic charter rides landed nearby.

Many liked the Cirrus, a fast single-engine aircraft, because it has a whole-frame parachute to land the plane in case of emergencies. They also saw a Cessna which most pilots use while learning how to fly because of its ease of training.

Next stop was 3 In The Green, a maintenance division at the Penn Valley Airport. They stepped inside the doorway to see a plane that had been stripped down, primed, and top-coated. It was sleek and shiny. In another hangar area, was a plane that had arrived in 2 trailers and 5 boxes. It was in the final stages of being totally rebuilt. In was delivered in pieces and will be sold whole. Another interesting aircraft was the DAHR TBM 700. It is built for speed and holds up to 6 passengers.

"It is a real advantage to have 3 In The Green here," said Bowers. They also do engine, tire repair, and other plane maintenance repairs and services.

The group was very inquisitive and asked pertinent questions on a range of topics. Bowers was very knowledgeable and interjected interesting tidbits and insightful replies. He noted that iPads are now common in the cockpit and have increased safety by making navigation much more easy and accurate. "There are all kinds of career options in aviation. There is a great demand for pilots to skilled repair technicians."

As the group headed toward the hanger housing Life Flight, the helicopter took off. It was thrilling for the members to see the helicopter up-close and feel the air from the propellers whipping against their faces. Only one of nine Life Flight aircraft is housed at Penn Valley Airport. The crew is ready to respond 24/7 and takes-off within 7 minutes.

On Saturday, September 16, a huge emergency drill was held at Penn Valley Airport. It provided hands-on experience and realistic emergency scenario for area first responders. "It was quite an event," Bowers remarked.

The Penn Valley Airport Authority was established in 1947 as a joint municipal corporation. Currently, the following counties and municipalities comprise the Penn Valley Airport Authority: Selinsgrove Borough, Northumberland Borough, Snyder County, Union County, Penn Township, Monroe Township, Middleburg Borough, Shamokin Dam Borough, and the City of Sunbury. The Authority is governed by a Board of Directors comprised of eight members from the surrounding community.

I am happy to support the 2023 SVUW campaign."

The United Way focuses on "ALICE" which stands for asset limited, income constrained, employed, households. Statewide, 27 percent of households qualify as ALICE. Within the organization's five-county region, 32 percent of households are ALICE. If you combine our regions' households earning below the ALICE threshold with those living below the Federal Poverty Line, that's 44 percent of households facing financial hardship every day.

"These are households that are living just above the poverty line, so they don't get a lot of help," said Coleen Snover, SVUW Board President and VP of Training and Development at Service 1st Federal Credit Union. "They still don't have the money for basic needs. A sudden hospital bill or car repair will often set ALICE individuals or households behind as they are never really stable enough to make ends meet."

The two goals of this year's campaign are to increase awareness about the work United Way does in the community and implement a stronger emphasis on sustainable gifts. As part of their annual campaign, Susquehanna Valley United Way raises money for 57 nonprofit partners across Columbia, Montour, Northumberland, Snyder, and Union counties. Each year, residents receive assistance through SVUW and its funded partners. This underscores the vital role that SVUW plays in the local community and highlights the need for widespread community support.

"Funds raised in our community stay in our community to help people right here at home," said Adrienne Mael, president/CEO of the Susquehanna Valley United Way.

During the event, United Way leaders also spotlighted the organization's Community Impact work. As part of their ongoing youth and mental health initiatives, they advancing education for kids through their STEAM and Mobile MakerSpace programs.

Those who attended the kickoff had a chance to participate in a FUNdraising activity that connected their passion to the work United Way is doing in the community, so that together, they could be United in Purpose.

"This is more than a campaign - it is a call to action for us to come together with thoughtful intention to support local solutions in the communities where we live and work," Snover said. "To be United in Purpose is to recognize and amplify our power to make a meaningful difference, together."

The bulk of the fundraising happens between now and the end of February. The campaign cycle will conclude on March 31st, 2024, and is supplemented by their annual Day of Giving, a 24-hour virtual fundraising event every October 20.

They placed the note in the bottle, sealed the lid with wax, and the two of them set off for the train bridge that crossed the river. Tim and I thought we should go with them but Mom suddenly found some chores for the two of us to do. Linda and Chuck walked out on the bridge to the fourth pier and threw the bottle into the river watching it drift downstream until it was out of sight.

Now, I should explain that in the 1950's there were only glass bottles and thousands of them floated down river each time the river level came up. Finding a glass bottle with a note in it was like finding a needle in a hay stack. For the next two months Linda eagerly awaited the mailman to see if anyone replied to her note in the bottle.

Linda had pretty much given up hope when one day in October the mailman delivered a letter postmarked Havre de Grace, Maryland. It was a letter from a family who had been boating on the upper reached of the Chesapeake Bay when they saw the bottle floating in the water with what appeared to be a note inside. Linda couldn't wait to tell Chuck and she would see him that night at Teen Canteen over town. They were both the hit of the night as others found out that their bottle found its way to the Chesapeake Bay. There were other attempts by the Charles kids with notes in bottles but this was the only time there was a reply.



Benfer's Furniture Store Going Out of Business Sale

After decades of working in the family-owned business founded by his father H. Randall Benfer, Paul and Millie Benfer announce the closing of Benfer's Furni-

ture Store in Beaver Springs with a "going out of business sale" now going on.

The business was established by H. Randall Benfer after purchasing the building in April, 1927, from Charles C. Wetzel who was a fine cabinetmaker and furniture dealer. At the time of the purchase, Randall was serving as Principal of the Beaver Springs Elementary School grades one through eight. Randall was assisted in the store by his wife Estella, where they occupied the living quarters of the building and raised their four children-Evelyn, Dorothy, Gloria, and Paul. Within three years he gave up his school career to focus his attention to his growing furniture business. By 1938, improvements were made and an addition was built to enlarge the furniture store with approximately 1500 feet of floor space.

One of Paul Benfer's favorite treasures is a framed ad from June, 1938. He said, "I love the history of the 1938 ad about the grand re-opening of my Dad's business after he built an addition to the building." A young boy at the time, the ad announced the Grand Re-Opening of Benfer's Furniture Store now that considerable improving had been done for stocking a larger variety of furniture including living room, dining room, and bedroom suites as well as a full line of electric refrigerators, electric ranges, oil stoves, radios, floor lamps, electric washers, Bendix Home Laundry, and more. The ad also stated that "Every visitor will be presented with a useful gift." There were also two Grand Prize Drawings on Saturday evening. And, "every visitor will share in this free drawing beside the free gift."

Eventually two more buildings were purchased to provide more display areas and additional storage for this thriving business. These buildings located in the same vicinity of Benfer's Furniture Store brought with them their own historical significance to Beaver Springs. Known as Benfer's Warehouses, the block building was purchased in August, 1945, and formerly housed the Beaver Springs Electric Light Company and the Eidon Handle Company. The wooden building situated immediately west of it was purchased in September, 1958, and was the original I.O.O.F. Hall. Over the years it had other uses such as a movie theater and a sewing factory.

During its 96 years in business, quality and service at affordable prices has been a tradition at Benfer's Furniture Store. Paul said they always wanted to provide the best services, and added that sometime in the 1950s they even gave permission for a wedding to be held in their Victorian display room. A few of the store's various slogans over the years were: Quality Furniture

at Affordable Prices"; "Furniture of Quality for a Happier Life"; "Everything for the Home"; and "Bride and Groom Shopping Center."
