## A River Rat's Ramblings: 1957 Valentine's Day PennDOT Driver License, Photo Centers Closed for Presidents Day Holiday

The sport is called football for a reason. The right legs of Seahawk punter Michael Dickson and kicker Jason Myers had as much to do with the Super Bowl win as Kenneth Walker III and the Hawks defense. Dickson punted seven times and placed three of them inside the six yard line. That is why he is the highest paid punter in the NFL at over \$4M per year. Myers set a Super Bowl record with five field goals.

In a 43-26 win over Central Mountain Merrell scored 24 and surpassed 1,000 points for her career which covers two seasons at Danville and two seasons at Selinsgrove. Grove finished their second half of the season going 7-4 and finished 8-14.

Mifflinburg (10-9) exploded for 21 points in the third quarter to beat Montoursville 52-31. Brooke Gessner had 16 points with Avery Reibsome and Parice Shuck chipping in with 10 points each.

The Reibsome freshmen twin-towers that are Avery and Mia combined for 25 points, 16 boards and 5 steals to lead Miff to an easier than expected win over Milton 40-27. The Lewisburg defense failed to show up for the second half as they gave up 41 points to undefeated Central Columbia. The final score was 64-35 as Teagan Osunde had 10 points for the Green Dragons. Later in the week Lewisburg lost to defending state champion Loyalsock 37-31.

Mifflinburg boys (14-8) finished their regular season by doubling up Line Mountain 68-34. Cheeky Griffith led all scorers with 26 and Grady Brubaker had 12 and Hunter Bolick 11.

Selinsgrove destroyed Hughesville 71-29 as Xavier Jackson became the first Seal to score 1,000 career points in 25 years. Jackson finished with 20 and Mac DeFazio 14, Noah Walter 13 and Griffin Parker 12. Grove outscored the Spartans 39-8 in the second half.

Grove was upset by Danville 66-62 in spite of Jackson's 23, Mac's 12 and Jack Piecuch's 11. The Seals finished their regular season at (15-7) by dusting off Big Spring 53-45 with Jackson notching 23 and DeFazio 18.

Lewisburg continued to roll as they handled Loyalsock 66-37. Cooper Mowry led all scorers with 23 and Nazir Meredith and Rebra Jemama added 12 each. The Green Dragons outscored Sock 35-11 in the middle two quarters. The Dragons had no issues in beating Berwick 81-22. It was 58-9 at halftime! Mowry hit on six treys and Jack Siegal had 10 points.
