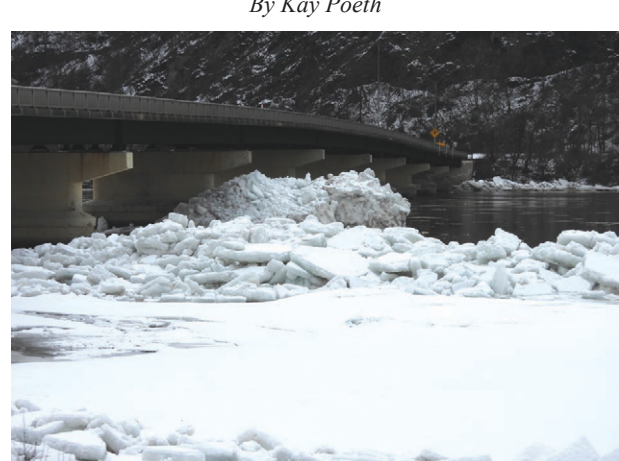

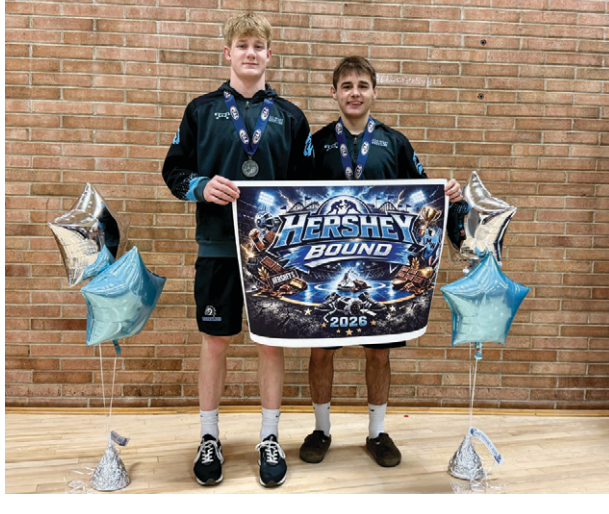

THE VIEW FROM HEAR

What month is the best month for sports? I've been hearing a lot of chatter lately that March is right up there near the top. October will always be the best month perennially with baseball's post-season, the NFL and college football in full swing and the NBA and NHL starting their seasons. The high volume of diverse, high stakes games makes October premier.

April would have to be a strong but distant second with baseball games that count and playoffs in the NBA and NHL. What separates April from March is The Masters and the NFL Draft.

March is a sneaky third all due to college basketball's March Madness. College hoops has lost a bit of its luster these last few years but the NCAA tournament always delivers. Wives, daughters and co-workers all fill out a bracket and thus have a dog in the fight.

Locally, Line Mountain had a very strong showing at the 2A regional wrestling tournament by taking the team title. Mifflinburg finished sixth and has four wrestlers going to Hershey. Midd-West finished a strong tenth and Lewisburg 13th and both schools are sending two wrestlers to States.

The Cats Bradley Wagner and Landon Tucker brought home gold medals and neither were really challenged. Ben Straub placed third and Lane Kenamond fourth to complete the state's contingent.

Midd-West will be represented by Evan Maneval with his runnerup finish and Charley Paige's third place. The L&L boys from Lewisburg, Landon Michaels and Landen Wagner both took bronze.

Selinsgrove's Alex Kadryna and Jack Peters will be in Hershey for the 3A championships. I foresee our four schools will be bringing home a total of five medals from Hershey.

Mifflinburg's Taylor Stewart is the lone girls wrestler from our schools going to States. Stewart finished fourth at 190.

Two bowlers qualified for the state tournament by finishing in the Top 12 at the East Regional singles competition in Mount Joy. Midd-West's Madison Herrold and Grove's Gabrielle Heckman will return to Leisure Lanes next week.

The Midd-West and Selinsgrove boys team qualified for the state team title as did the girls from Lewisburg, Mifflinburg and Selinsgrove. They will compete this Saturday in Lancaster.

The Lewisburg girls finished third and the Grove girls sixth at the D4 swimming championships. Morgan Shannon took first place in the 500 free and Jillian Mutchler won the 100 back for Lewisburg. The Green Dragons also won the 400 free relay with Emma Hopkinson, Claire Graver, Shannon and Mutchler.

The Mifflinburg boys finished fifth at Districts with Elliott DeLuca claiming the 100 back title. Lewisburg's Colin Shannon won the 500 free.

All of our basketball teams that played last week in Districts are still playing, all five teams have advanced to States.

Top seeded Warrior Run held off a game Mifflinburg squad 64-48 in the boys 3A district semis. Every time Miff got close to Warrior Run the Defenders went on minor runs of 6-0, 9-0 and 7-0 for breathing room. The Wildcats were led by Grady Brubaker and his 16 points.

Mifflinburg had a chance to go onto States by beating Loyalsock for third place. Miff wasted no time in turning the page and the game was over at halftime with the Cats up 33-8. The game ended 55-25 with the mercy rule in place. Chad Martin had 14 points, Cheeky Griffith 12 and Brubaker 11. The Wildcats will travel to Riverside this Saturday to take on the D2 champs.

The Lewisburg boys jumped out early 24-9 against Mt Carmel and went on to win their D4 4A opener 58-42. Lew has had a balanced offensive attack all year and this game was no different with five players scoring at least eight points. Leaders were Nazir Meredith with 15, Rebera Jemama 13 and Cortland Michael's 11.

Preliminary 2026-27 Hunting Seasons and Bag Limits Approved

The Pennsylvania Board of Game Commissioners today gave preliminary approval to the 2026-27 hunting and trapping seasons and bag limits.

All 2026-27 season proposals include the Sundays that fall within the listed start and end dates. Also, seasons that previously ended on Saturdays largely would end on Sundays, providing one additional day of opportunity.

Migratory game bird seasons are set later and not included on this list. It has not been determined at this time whether those seasons will include Sundays.

The Board thoroughly discussed a preliminary 2026-27 season proposal that would have moved the firearms deer season a week earlier, causing the firearms bear season and others to shift as a result. That proposal was part of the Board's prepared agenda. However, the Board voted 6-3 to reject that plan and move ahead with a proposal that largely mirrors last year's seasons.

The preliminarily approved 2026-27 seasons include several significant changes:

For wild turkeys, a bag limit of one spring gobbler is proposed to offset possible additional harvest due to the inclusion of Sundays and ensure that harvest rates remain within sustainable levels.

For white-tailed deer, minor adjustments to date structures of extended firearms, flintlock, and late archery seasons are proposed to reduce complexity and to ensure season lengths correspond to sporting arm efficiency and management objectives.

For black bears, in WMU 3D, a longer archery bear season (overlapping with the entire first segment of the archery deer season) is proposed to increase harvest in response to high levels of bear-human conflict in this area.

For elk, a new early October firearms season segment is proposed to limit crowding and maintain hunter satisfaction under current and potential future increased license allocations. The late firearms elk season is proposed to be moved later in January to avoid conflicts with major holidays.

For small game, the squirrel, ruffed grouse, rabbit, pheasant, bobwhite quail and woodchuck seasons all are proposed to remain open during the firearms deer season.

For furbearers, WMU 5A is proposed to be opened to bobcat hunting and trapping, and WMUs 2G, 3A, and 4C are proposed to be opened to river otter trapping. Habitat and population data indicate that these units can support sustainable harvest for these species.

The public may offer comments on all proposed 2026-27 seasons and bag limits, as well as other board actions, between now and the board's April meeting, when 2026-27 seasons and bag limits will be finalized, and antlerless deer license allocations will be presented.

The board is scheduled to meet April 10 and 11 at the Game Commission's Harrisburg headquarters.

PHEASANT: Special season for eligible junior hunters, with or without required license, and all mentored hunters, regardless of age - Oct. 10-18 (2 daily, 6 in possession). Male and female pheasants may be taken in all WMUs. There is no open season for taking pheasants in Wild Pheasant Recovery Areas, except as authorized by executive order.

PHEASANT: Oct. 24-Dec. 24 and Dec. 26-Feb. 28, 2027 (2 daily, 6 in possession). Male and female pheasants may be taken in all WMUs. There is no open season for taking pheasants in Wild Pheasant Recovery Areas, except as authorized by executive order.

BOBWHITE QUAIL: Sept. 1-Dec. 24 and Dec. 26-March 31, 2027. No limit. There is no open season for the taking of bobwhite quail in the Letterkenny Army Depot Bobwhite Quail Recovery Area.

WOODCHUCK (GROUNDHOG): July 1-Dec. 24 and Dec. 26-June 30, 2027. No limit.

HARE (SNOWSHOE RABBIT) OR VARYING HARE: Dec. 26-Dec. 31, statewide (1 daily, 3 season).

CROW: Aug. 20-March 21, 2027, on Thursday, Friday, Saturday and Sunday only. No limit.

STARLING AND ENGLISH SPARROW: No closed season, except during the regular firearms deer season. No limit.

WILD TURKEY, FALL (Male or Female): WMUs 1A, 2G, 3A, 4A, 4B and 4D - Oct. 31-Nov. 15; WMUs 1B, 3D, 4C and 4E - Oct. 31-Nov. 8; WMUs 2A, 2F, 3B and 3C - Oct. 31-Nov. 15 and Nov. 25-27; WMUs 2B, 2C, 2D and 2E - Oct. 31-Nov. 20 and Nov. 25-27; WMUs 5A and 5B - Oct. 31-Nov. 3; WMUs 5C and 5D - CLOSED TO FALL TURKEY HUNTING.

SPRING GOBBLER (Bearded bird only): Special season for eligible junior hunters, with required license, and mentored hunters 16 and under - April 24-25, 2027. Only 1 spring gobbler may be taken during this hunt.

SPRING GOBBLER (Bearded bird only): May 1-31, 2027. Daily limit 1, season limit 1. From May 1-16, legal hunting hours are one-half hour before sunrise until noon; from May 17-31, legal hunting hours are one-half hour before sunrise until one-half hour after sunset.

DEER, ARCHERY (Antlered and Antlerless) WMUs 2B, 5C and 5D: Sept. 19-Nov. 27 and Dec. 26-Jan. 24, 2027. One antlerless deer with each required antlerless license or permit. One antlered deer per hunting license year.

DEER, ARCHERY (Antlered and Antlerless) Statewide: Oct. 3 -Nov. 20 and Dec. 26-Jan. 24, 2027. One antlered deer per hunting license year. One antlerless deer with each required antlerless license or permit.

DEER, ANTLERLESS MUZZLELOADER (Statewide): Oct. 17-25. An antlerless deer with each required antlerless license or permit.

DEER, ANTLERLESS SPECIAL FIREARMS (Statewide): Oct. 22-25. Junior and Senior License Holders, Mentored Permit Holders, Disabled Person Permit (to use a vehicle) Holders, and Pennsylvania residents serving on active duty in U.S. Armed Services or in the U.S. Coast Guard only, with required antlerless license. BOBCAT (WMUs 2A, 2B, 2C, 2D, 2E, 2F, 2G, 3A, 3B, 3C, 3D, 4A, 4B, 4C, 4D, 4E and 5A): Jan. 9-Feb. 3, 2027. One bobcat per license year. Licensed furtakers may obtain one permit each.

PORCUPINE: Oct. 10-Nov. 27; Dec. 14-24 and Dec. 26-Jan. 31, 2027. (3 daily, season limit of 10).

Author Andrew Akers to Launch Array of Projects in 2026

2026 is shaping up to be an exciting year for Lewisburg author, Andrew Akers, as he has several projects underway. From a Teen/Young Adult novella, a thrilling Sci-Fi novel, a short story collection, Ranger's Almanac, a Video Game Demo, and being a presenter at a Writers' Conference... this year will be an exciting

one for him!

First in the list to be released is Bimble the Bear: The Case of the Missing Shoe. It was originally self-published in 2017. After extensive rewriting and revision to reflect Akers newly honed skills, the novella was published on February 10, 2026, by Cosmorama under the original title Bimble the Bear: The Case of the Missing Shoe. According to a synopsis of the book, "After a friend's croc goes missing, our hero travels into the unknown to retrieve it. As his journey progresses, he discovers that the world around him is unraveling. Are some mysteries better off unsolved?"

The seemingly faux pau children's book is geared to older teens/young adults due to its mature themes (depression, grief, and self-harm), writing style incorporates a pseudonym and footnotes and conversations between the character and alter ego using a shared Google Document. It also includes a choose-your-own-adventure format. Matt Lamourt is the illustrator of both the original and newly revised version.

"I am thrilled that Bimble the Bear is being published!" says Akers enthusiastically.

The gripping sci-fi novel, "Tapestry", will be released on April 18, 2026. The book was created as Akers played Dungeons and Dragons with friends to develop dialogue, plot lines, and events to bring an authentic tone to "Tapestry."

According to Akers, Tapestry is a space opera set in an alternate history of the 1970s. What would have happened if Apollo didn't cut the mission to the moon? As astronauts search for water they learn, "We are not alone in our solar system" and discover that extraterrestrial life has been there all along. The novel evolves over 7 sections at different locations, each beginning with a "Space Shanty" performed by a real musician and embedded as a QR code. The sound track contains a variety of musical styles from artists Sinia, Soul, Psuke, The Interobang Experiment, and Youtuber Frank Watkinson.

According to the synopsis of Tapestry: "'The Heavens will arrive inside of the Tapestry.' Those were the words of the New

Catholic Church (NCC) as they conquered the solar system in the Millenium Crusade. Thirty years after their downfall, a cyborg, two 'pagans', and an insomniac mercenary discover the lie - and the truth - behind the proselytization. Beneath the colored sky of the Tapestry, a celestial event in deep space, this unlikely crew discovers truths about themselves, their peoples, and the war they inadvertently started. Maybe the Heavens really are arriving. Or maybe Hell has been here all along."

Andrew Akers' debut novel, Tapestry, is being published by Baynam Books on April 18, 2026. It will be available in audiobook, ebook, paperback, and hardcover anywhere books are sold.

"The Ranger's Almanac: Tales from the Trails" will be annual literary journal of stories, artwork, poetry, photography and music from rangers, conservationists and nature-enthusiasts across the country. Currently, Akers has partnered with 7 agencies across the country to give the public a glimpse into what park rangers see and experience in their day. "The submissions and support have been tremendous," notes Akers. Some of Akers' work will be included in the journal.

The Ranger's Almanac will be professionally formatted and placed in parks across the country by Memorial Day. It will also be available online. A portion of the proceeds will benefit the parks and a portion will fund the next publication of The Ranger's Almanac.

"The Gatebreaker Protocol" is a text-based video game that Akers has been collaborating on with Tye Sheets, Derek Day for most of 2025. It is "an interactive novel/choose-your-own-adventure game that combines D&D-style mechanics, Final Fantasy combat, and Solo Leveling-inspiration with my personal writing style," explains Akers. It'll also feature music and artwork from real life human artists. The Kickstarter and demo are out next month.

Adding credibility to talent as a sci-fi and fantasy author, Akers is a prolific sci-fi/fantasy writer with over 25 published short stories. His work has appeared in Book XI, The Daily Tomorrow, Metastellar, and many others. He is an active SFWA (Science Fiction and Fantasy Writers Association) member. SFWA is a non-profit professional organization for writers and other professionals in science fiction, fantasy, and related genres, founded to support, promote, and advocate for speculative fiction authors.

At the end of 2026, Akers is releasing his collection of sci-fi, fantasy, and horror stories called Cosmic Cul-de-sacs. "This will include (most of) my published stories to-date, plus several never-before-seen ones!"

Akers has been selected to be a faculty member for the WCoNA- The Writers Conference of Northern Appalachia in March. "Last year's conference was a career highlight for me. There were tons of incredible speakers, and I met so many people who were just as passionate about writing as I was. If you're into that kind of thing, or are even curious about how to get started, I highly recommend checking it out."

His presentation, "Stretching the Medium", will discuss ways that writers and other creative types can adapt to the rise of artificial intelligence. In the conference submission, Akers wrote, "Over the past year, I have sold a novel with a soundtrack embedded as QR codes, sold a faux children's novella with House-of-Leaves styled annotations, comments, and illustrations, and developed a demo for an interactive novel/video game. All of these projects have been collaborations with other humans, stretching what a novel/novella/app can be. The goal of this presentation is to embrace what makes us human and encourage writers to experiment and collaborate with other branches of creativity. Like it or not, AI is coming for all of us; artists need to stand together."

Akers has a busy and fulfilling life. By day his work as a forest ranger with the Department of Conservation and Natural Resources (DCNR) inspires him. He is a dedicated family man who devotes time and attention to his young sons. Then after their bedtime, he grabs his laptop and settles down for several hours of writing. When he isn't working, writing, or collaborating with others, Akers runs marathons, and plays Dungeons & Dragons.

What's next for Andrew Akers? Well, he has submitted his next novel, "A Tune to Chaos" to various agents.
