Women's Meet Up Hike at RB Winter State Park on March 21

The Friends of R. B. Winter State Park will host a Women's Meet-up Hike on Saturday, March 21 at the Environmental Learning Center (ELC) at noon. Meet in the parking lot. The group will head out promptly at 12:10 pm.

This will be an approx. 5-mile loop with several moderate inclines. If you would like to attend, but prefer less of a hiking commitment, an alternative route that will cut mileage down to approx. 3 miles will be provided. The hike will be a rain, snow, or shine event.

This is a Women's Meet-up Hike (no young children, ages 11-17 must be accompanied by a guardian). Bring your own reusable water bottle and nutritious snacks. Make sure to wear shoes with appropriate tread and it is recommended to wear insect repellent. Please use your best judgment regarding layers, hat, gloves, yak tracks, rain poncho, and hiking poles. March weather can be very finicky.

You do not need to be an experienced hiker to attend, but you should be comfortable with walking/running a steady pace for 2-3 hrs. There will be short breaks along the way. The exact route will be provided before the group heads out, but the group should plan to stay together.

The Women's Meet Up Hike is done in conjunction with Women's Month. Last year, 40 women attended the hike!

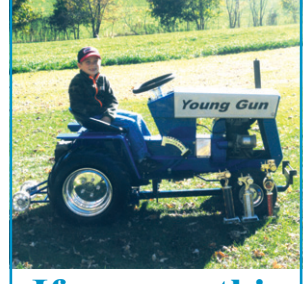

THE VIEW FROM HEAR

The Lewisburg boys basketball team continued their undefeated ways this calendar year in making a deep run in the PIAA state playoffs. The Green Dragons beat Pope John Paul 64-59 in Pottsville. Lewisburg was down ten points late in the first half when senior Rebiria Jemama changed momentum in a big way.

Jemama picked off a pass and threw down a dunk to wake his team and the fans up. Lew went on and out-scored PJP 40-35 in the second half. The Dragons scored only 24 points in the first half. Jemama led the Green with 19 and LJ Tucker had 18 and Cooper Mowry 10. Next up was Bishop McDevitt in the quarterfinals.

Unlike their previous game, Lewisburg was leading their 4A quarterfinal foe McDevitt by eighteen points 40-22 in the third quarter. Dragon coach Leon Tucker knew the game wasn't over and that McDevitt would make a run. Make a run they did after the hot-shooting LJ Tucker left the game with a twisted ankle.

Tucker returned after a few minutes but the Crusaders had clawed back during his absence. McDevitt took their first lead since the first quarter 54-53 with 1:31 to play. Nazir Meredith scored the go ahead basket seventeen seconds later and Lewisburg finally made some free throws to seal the win 60-58 to move on. Tucker hit six treys and totaled 23 points that led all scorers. Meredith had 13 and Jemama 10.

Lewisburg moved on to face Devon Prep on Tuesday and their magical season came to a loss 73-49. Defending state champ Devon Prep has lost twice the number of games it has won 9-18. Never let records fool you as they play out of the Philadelphia Catholic League which has open recruitment for talent.

The outcome was never in doubt and the speed and size of Prep was different than the Dragons saw all year. The three starting seniors for Lewisburg... Cooper Mowry, Nazir Meredith and Rebiria Jemama left their marks on this program.

Coach Leon Tucker said "What this group accomplished this year; no other group at Lewisburg that's put on this uniform has done the things this group has done." Well done Lewisburg.

Mifflinburg's Malachi Moyer ended his outstanding high school swimming career by winning his first state

medal. Moyer finished fourth in the 100 butterfly with a personal best of 51:26.

Selinsgrove graduate Shaela Kruskie won the 5K meter PSAC title at the league's indoor Track and Field championships. The Shippensburg sophomore won easily by more than thirty seconds with a time of 17:16. Kruskie also took second place in the 3K meters.

We have another Grove grad that was recently honored. Kimberly Spiegel who graduated from Selinsgrove in 2011 and West Chester in 2016 is the first female to ever be inducted into the District 4 wrestling Hall of Fame. While at Selinsgrove Kimberly was a multiple Cadet national champ and a Junior Nationals champ. While at West Chester she was a member of the US Women's freestyle team and later won the NCWA Folkstyle title twice. Congratulations Kimberly on a well deserved honor.

We have three local grads competing in this week's NCAA wrestling championships in Cleveland. Midwest's Avery Bassett will take the mat for Lock Haven at 174. Grove's Nate Schon (Drexel) and Mifflinburg's Emmanuel Ulrich (American) could possibly have a rematch at 285.

How dominant has Penn State been at the wrestling championships? You cannot place a bet on what school will win the team title because all the bookmakers know that it will be Penn State. I have never seen this happen before. Normally they will lay odds for a heavy favorite at minus 2,000. This means you would wager \$2K to win \$100, that's a foolish risk but sports books are always looking for action. You can place a bet on who you think will finish in second place.

There have been four teams that crowned a record five individual wrestling champs in a single season. Iowa (1986), Oklahoma State (2005) and Penn State twice in 2017 and 2022. I think seven Penn Staters will wrestle in the finals but only four will win. I might be underestimating them again, but I think the chatter among all the other schools of how great the Nittany Lions are has become suffocating and will push the challengers.

Several FFA Chapters, the future of agriculture, attended the Community Ag Breakfast sponsored by Rep. David Rowe including Mid-West, Selingsgrove, and Big Valley. Jaylene Everhart and Sam Parks, State FFA officers, also participated and spoke eloquently to the attendees.



Snyder and Union County 4-H were some of many area youth groups that attended the Community Ag Breakfast hosted by Rep. David Rowe. Alyssa Cook, 4-H State Outreach officer from Schuylkill County, also attended and was a speaker.

"Let's raise a glass of milk - to dairy farmers, to family traditions, and to the hardworking people who make it all possible. Cheers!" The meal was catered by T&C Catering with cinnamon buns by Joanne Shaffer.

On March 6, 2026, approximately 150 residents attended the Community Agriculture Breakfast hosted by Rep. David H. Rowe. The opportunities for Pennsylvanians pursuing careers in agriculture and agribusinesses are boundless. The breakfast highlighted members and supporters of the area's thriving agricultural community and celebrated the rich farming heritage of its residents. The placements at each setting included a poignant quote, "Once in your life you need a doctor, a lawyer, and a policeman. But every day, three times a day, you need a farmer."

"Farmers account 600,000 jobs and contribute \$132 billion dollars to Pennsylvania's economy. But more than that, they are the multi-generational foundation of our communities. They cultivate not just the food we eat every day, but also the values that are central to Pennsylvania's rich ag heritage; hard work, personal responsibility, and a commitment to faith and family," said Rep. Rowe.

Several young people spoke during the Community Ag Breakfast. They were all articulate and eloquent in their speeches. The program began with the Pledge of Allegiance led by Mid-West FFA Chaplain Ethan Bobb. Ethan is overseeing the repairs and restoring of the Snyder County Veterans Memorial for his Eagle Scout project. He has dedicated many hours of labor to the project which is nearing completion.

Beaver Community Fair Queen Danika Renninger sang the National Anthem accompanied by Zachary Peterson on piano. Danika had the opportunity to compete for PA State Fair Queen against 65 other girls. "I had tons of fun and I met lots of amazing girls." She invited the attendees to the Beaver Community Fair on September 20-27. "Come have some amazing fair food and while you're eating you can watch the tractor pulls or go through our many exhibit barns. Or you could watch the 4-H and FFA kids show their projects."

Selingsgrove FFA Chaplain FFA Chapter Coy Arnold gave the Innovation. Coy is a sophomore and recently earned his Eagle Scout Award. He is also an officer in the Future Business Leaders of America, a member of the PMEA District Band and Orchestra, and plays baseball for Selingsgrove High School.

SUN Area Dairy Princess Madyson Reich gave a speech about her dairy farm experience growing up on Hillbottom Farms. "Dairy farmers live by a schedule that never really stops. Their mornings begin before daylight, and their nights often end long after most people are asleep. There are no true days off, because animals depend on you every single day. That kind of responsibility takes dedication, strength, and a deep sense of purpose.... My dad is the heart of our operation and by watching him, I've learned lessons about commitment and leadership that go far beyond anything taught in a classroom."

Madyson also learned lessons about teamwork, patience, and the importance of showing up when it matters. She also learned how farmers adapt and problem-solve. "That mindset has shaped how I handle challenges in my own life and reminds me that perseverance truly makes a difference." She also talked about how dairy farming has taught her about stewardship. "Farmers don't just work the land-they care for it. They make decisions today with future generations in mind. Along with that comes a strong sense of community, where neighbors help neighbors and farmers support one another."

Then all the attendees raised a glass of milk for the Milk Toast. "Let's raise a glass of milk - to dairy farmers, to family traditions, and to the hardworking people who make it all possible. Cheers!" Rep. Rowe introduced Christian Herr, Executive Vice President of PennAg, who spoke about PennAg and their ag partners Kreamer Feed, Horizon Farm Credit, Pennsylvania Strategic Investment Program, and their energy partners Energy Transfer, Range Resources, Seneca Resources! "We are pleased to support these breakfasts to help educate our law makers and their constituents! Ag and energy are both essential to all Pennsylvanians. Working together just makes sense. Central Pennsylvania is lucky to be represented by lawmakers like Representative Rowe. He has watched out for the needs of farmers and agribusinesses in Harrisburg!"

Alyssa Cook, 4-H State Outreach officer from Schuylkill County, addressed the attendees about how "Passion Sparks Opportunity" through

gle 4-H project opens up doors of opportunities. Those opportunities all being possible because of a passion sparked by 4-H. She concluded by saying, "Everyone here has a passion of their own. It might look different from mine, but it matters just the same. When you choose to follow that passion, work hard, and lean on the people around you, it can open doors and shape your future. Passion sparks opportunity."

Jaylene Everhart and Sam Parks, State FFA officers, also spoke powerfully to the attendees. Jaylene noted that "Students of agriculture education are our future leaders and they learn those leadership skills through FFA."


Sam Parks applauded the dedication of Ag teachers to the future generations of the agriculture industry. He also explained his role of leading student workshops on teamwork and communication. He highlighted conferences and conventions held to celebrate the accomplishments of members.

They concluded their presentation by noting "FFA is an organization that focuses on promoting premier leadership, personal growth, and career success through agriculture education" and inviting Rep. Rowe to attend their convention.

Many youth groups also attended the Community Ag Breakfast representing the future. Members of Mid-West FFA, Selingsgrove FFA, and Big Valley FFA chapters, FFA State Officers Jaylene Everhart and Sam Parks, Snyder and Union County 4-H Teen Council, Snyder and Union County 4-H Chapters, 4-H advisors Kathleen Weller and Barbara Franck S.U.N. Area Dairy Ambassador Madyson Reich, Beaver Community Fair Queen Danika Renninger, Ethan Howard, Snyder County Farm Bureau President: Snyder, Juniata, & Union County Conservation Districts and Penn State Extension. Local dignitaries in attendance included State Senator Lynda Schlegel Culver; Snyder County Commissioners Adam Ewig, Joe Kantz, and Chuck Steining; Union County Commissioners Jeff Reber and Preston Boop; Mifflin County Commissioner Rob Postal, Juniata County Commissioner Todd Graybill, Snyder County Prothonotary Stephanie Wolfand Snyder County Treasurer Larissa Hauck.

Rep. Rowe concluded with a legislative update that addressed the 2025-2026 state budget, which ended Pennsylvania's participation in the Regional Greenhouse Gas Initiative which would have imposed a \$1 billion tax on energy producers in the Commonwealth. RGGI, that was first implemented by former Governor Wolf in 2019, has deterred energy generators from investing in Pennsylvania resulting in no new thermal energy generation being built, contributing to the recent spike in utility bills. The 2025-2026 budget also included significant reforms in the permitting process, \$15.7 million for HPAI Recovery Grants, and \$4.1 million for Agriculture Excellence funding to support keeping Pennsylvania-raised meat in schools. On the Federal Level, the Whole Milk for Health Kids Act was signed into law, reversing a 2010-era restriction on dairy products schools could offer to students. This law will allow schools to now offer flavored and unflavored whole, 2%, 1%, and fat-free milk. This update will improve student nutrition and create more demand for milk products, benefitting Pennsylvania's dairy farmers.

Then the Community Ag Breakfast concluded with Rep. Rowe stating, "I am so grateful for the opportunity to celebrate hard-working farming families and show appreciation for the supporters and agri-businesses that contribute so much culturally and economically to our community. From the local FFA and 4-H chapters to the County Farm Bureaus and Conservation Districts, our annual Community Ag Breakfast is always a wonderful time of fellowship with all the wonderful people who make the ag industry a reality."

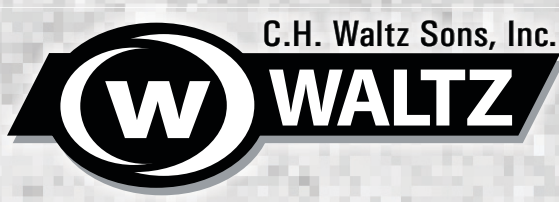



Wasted Tax Money

 Too much tax money is being wasted by government at all levels for the collection of tax revenue. At the local and county levels, real estate taxes are used; however, these fair taxes are collected by paid, elected tax collectors, and some other local and county taxes are collected by private tax collection businesses that add to the expense of the tax collection.

At the Pennsylvania State level there is a special Department of Revenue that is staffed by well-paid employees to collect its revenue, including taxes. The Federal Government also has a separate department (IRS) to collect its revenue. All taxes use government revenue to collect taxes; the more taxes that are used, the more revenue it takes.

If it is used properly, a graduated-income tax, without deductions or personal exemptions, is the fairest and least expensive tax to use at all levels of government. However, government is unfairly influenced by the wealthy and large corporations. As a result, low-income and working-class taxpayers unfairly bear most of the financial burden of government at all levels.

I've been voting since 1960, and nothing much really has changed to make taxation fairer, or to lower the expense of government tax collection.
