Everyone's Playground Comfort Station Construction Making Excellent Progress



Recently, Andy Russell Charitable Foundation Advisory Council Vice Chair, former PA State Representative Russ Fairchild, his wife Carol, Priscilla Cromwell, an Everyone's Playground advocate and benefactor, Don Remy and Fritz M. Heinemann visited the Playground to view the progress being made by D.B. Bowersox Construction Company on the soon to be available comfort/changing station next to the playground.

"We were very pleased with the work being done by the Bowersox Company and especially the pace with which they are moving forward towards completion as quickly as possible," Fairchild said. "Side walls are up and the roof is almost in place and it was obvious the work crew was being diligent and very meticulous in the manner in which they performed their tasks and I'm happy with what I saw."

When completed the comfort station, an ADA compliant facility, will accommodate two persons and provide a safe, sanitary, and totally private space for those with special or different needs or may have physical or cognitive challenges. "It will be spacious enough to allow caretakers to assist those using the facility and absolutely enhances the value of the playground. A family pavilion is next to it and fresh drinking water is already available. The building will be monitored by security cameras and inspected daily," Fairchild explained.

A ribbon cutting ceremony will be at the end of October and will be announced at a later date. According to Fairchild contributions are still being sought and may be sent to: Russell Charitable Foundation, 71 Peachtree Road, Selinsgrove, PA 17870.

The night started off with Brian Brown getting his time below the fifteen second bracket of 15.959, the track record is 15.544 set by Anthony Macri back on September 26th 2020, and Brown got an extra \$300 from Fast tees for his effort. Chase Dietz had a time of 16.057, Danny Dietrich 16.086 Heat race went to Devin Borden, Dylan Cisney and Justin Peck won the heat races, dividing up \$1,200 for their efforts or \$400 a piece. Brett Marks of Myerstown, Pa., got the halfway bonus which was \$2,600 leading at lap 22 for the fuel stop then another 22 laps, he took the checkers and the \$26,000 for the win a total of \$28,600 for his nights work it was his fifth overall career 410-sprint feature win at Selinsgrove and his 9th overall win this season over a field of 26 other drivers at Selinsgrove. Justin Peck was second with Danny Dietrich, Devin Borden, and Brian Brown. A good field of 305-sprints were on hand with Kenny Heffner of Watsonstown, Pa. getting the feature win over Kreamer's Kruz Kepner and Selinsgrove's Ken Duke. 36 drivers signed in for the special night for them with the winner getting \$800 for the win normal pay is \$450. Heat winners got a \$50 bonus from the Snyder family, to honor their dad Jimmy, Jim was a push truck driver at Selinsgrove for over 50-years. The Roadrunners with 16-drivers on hand rounded out the show with Jake Jones making a last lap pass of Jason Davis to get his third feature win of the season and 21st of his career, which ties him with Ricky Bender for fourth place on the all-time Roadrunner win list, Jake also owns three track titles. Bob Bussey who says it was his last race in a racecar Saturday night has 27-career feature wins, and Bob owns two track titles in the 2011 and 2012 seasons. Keith Bissinger is the Roadrunner leader with six track titles and 62 career wins, and you can add another 19-win from the Daredevil class that ran Selinsgrove from 1993 till the 1997 season.

Sunday events were rained out that would have seen the 360/358 sprint challenge race Wingless Sportsman, and Limited Late models. The Limited lates and Wingless Sportsman have been added to this Saturday night show along with the IMCA Modifieds. The super late models will take center stage with the Ron Keister Memorial race paying the winner \$5,200 and \$520 to start. The extra money is being put up by Keister and Larry Bear, with bonus money for heat wins, fast time, hard charger and other bonuses for certain laps and finishes. The race that was first run in the 2019 season with Rick Eckert beating Mason Zeigler for the win, with Dylan Yoder, Gregg Satterlee and Jard Miley in the top five, since that time the race has had problems getting another race in with rain and covid-19 postponing the race a few times. Labor Day 2022 it was run again with Rick Eckert again getting the win over Jeff Rine, Jim Bernheisel, Brett Schadel and Coleby Frye.

Baps speedway last Saturday night had an interesting thing happen with limited late model feature winner Sean Merkel and second placed Jacob Piper refusing tech which gave the win to third place Travis Mease who did lead the early part of the feature. For Merkel it would have been his second feature win in four races he has run at the track. Kyle hardy won a race there back in May and Tyler Emory was declared the winner of the Speedweek show in June when winner Cory Overton's car did not have proper Droop rule limiter in his car.

This looks interesting for the 2024 season Big Diamond speedway located near Minersville Pa., is having a special race that includes the Diamond Roadrunners, Selinsgrove speedway Roadrunners and the Xtreme stock class at BAPS speedway for an event on this night with more details forthcoming.



A River Rat's Ramblings: Summer 1954

By Jim Charles; Vol. 3, Story 8

Fishy, Fishy Bite – Your Mommy says you might – Your Daddy says he doesn't care – So Fishy, Fishy Bite

Tim, Dad and I had just anchored the boat in the deep water above the bridge in line with 4th pier. There is a big solitary rock that lays in about six feet of water that often holds some bass during the hot, dog days of July. We had eaten supper early so we had a good two hours of daylight until darkness would close its curtain sending us back home.

Tim and I had gotten about two dozen Hellgies and three stonecats, our dad's favorite bait for smallmouth bass. Dad always fished with a split bamboo fly rod, Tim and I had fiber glass casting rods, we all had level wind reels spooled with 8lb black braided line and a #6 eagle claw snelled hook. We used lead split shot to weight the bait to the bottom, then propped the rod on the side of the boat, peeled off about two feet of line from the reel and hooked it in a small slit cut on the top of the wooden boat side. Hooking the line in the slit kept the current from taking the line down river but provided a quick release of the line when a bass grabbed your bait. When fishing live bait for bass, if a strike occurred we would pick up the rod, gently feed line from the reel until the fish stopped its first run, turned the bait for swallowing and at the start of the second run is when we would set the hook hopefully catching the fish.

That's what bass fishing was like in those days, two or three wooden flats anchored at their favorite fishing spots, talking, laughing and telling stories of the big one that got away last year at this very spot. No one fishes bass like that anymore, today we run around the river casting artificial bait and fishing eight to ten different spots in an evening's fish.

Think about this for a moment, a dad and two sons sitting in an anchored 16 ft. wooden flat, no cell phones, just talking about stuff. Suddenly, one of them says, "I think there's something looking at my bait!" The other two immediately start coaching the angler as to what he should or shouldn't be doing.

Our dad always smoked a pipe when we fished, mysteriously to this day I will be out fishing and suddenly I will get a waft of Prince Albert tobacco smoke and have to stop and smile knowing my Father's River Rat Spirit still visits his favorite fishing spots on the river.

Brother Tim and I often talk about fishing in those days, of singing Fishy, Fishy Bite but never memories of specific fish we caught just the memory of being on the river fishing with Dad.

Letters Written During WW1 From Jay A. Rigel to Family and Friends

Letter to: Mrs. P.F Rigel
Date: March 18, 1918
Location: Camp Sherman

Dear Parents and Bro,

Just got back from town and will write a few lines. I got the letter you wrote (Mother). Got it on Saturday eve. You say you still have some snow. The snow was all melted here about six weeks ago. We are having real nice weather and most of the mud is dried up.

Stock certainly is bringing some prices. It would be hard for a young man to start farming now.

There were five men from my company supposed to be transferred more than a week ago, but are still here. On the 29th the 2nd draft will be here. We will get more men then.

I wrote to Carrie and told them to send me a telegram. But never mention anything about it when you write. They do not send the letters here but something might happen that they would. I also told her not to say anything to anyone around home. We read in the paper that the men would not be taken away from here until next fall. We might be here until then unless they transfer a few at a time.

Some of the boys went on a 36 hour pass and stayed a few days longer. They get 15 to 20 days for it. That is one reason it is harder for the rest of us to get a furlough.

I had my pictures taken. I have 6 and ordered 6 more tonight. The others look like scarecrows beside these.

There are 20,000 men here at present. I wish I could be home over Easter. It might be that I can get a furlough, but there are new orders out every few days. Some of the boys got 4-day furloughs, but someone was sick or they would not get it.

It sure is hard for the boys (at the store in Ohio) to get help. They cannot pay as much as the big steel workers.

News is scarce so I will close. Hope to hear from you soon.

Wednesday morning: Am going to the hospital this morning. I have a case of the mumps. Probably will be a week or more before I will get out. Jay

I've been reading more of the Pennsylvania Dutch customs, especially Christmas in the "old days." Apparently the "Plain" Dutch, such as the Mennonites, Amish and Brethren groups, did no celebrating. Christmas was just another day to them. An 1867 newspaper here in West Chester reported that many congregations, even Methodist, Baptist and Presbyterian, made little of the Christmas festival, "nor did they hold religious services for Christmas, believing that the observance of any day than the Sabbath, is not enjoined by the Scriptures."

But most others did... The Moravian, Lutheran and Reformed religious leaders allowed the people to celebrate the holiday as they had done in their homelands. One part of it that was new to me is their celebration of the "Second Christmas," the day after Christmas, December 26th. This was celebrated as a day for relaxation, visiting and eating. I found this interesting, as we learned when we lived in the Czech Republic that there they celebrate for three days. But for them it's December 24th, 25th and 26th.

SASD Police Department Provides Safety and Security

Mark Wolfberg retired as Selinsgrove Area School District Police Chief effective August 14. In 2018, he was instrumental in establishing the department under the direction of Superintendent Chad Cohrs. He hired retired PSP officers with 25 years of experience. Wolfberg himself had 30 years of service. So, the newly formed department consisted of experienced officers.

"The Selinsgrove Area School District is thankful for the leadership and determination that Mark Wolfberg exhibited during his time as SASD Police Chief," said Superintendent Frank Jankowski. "He has been an integral part of enhancing our approach to school and community safety, while maintaining the focus on school operational needs."

PA Law Act 55 permits public schools to hire police officers to work for the schools. Currently, the law allows the school district to select the level of law enforcement that best serves the needs of the district. Those options included: Security Guards that can be armed by do not have arrest powers, Police Officers that are armed with arrest powers, or contract with the local municipal police to provide School Resource Officers (SRO).

"At Selinsgrove, our district chose to hire former police officers and retired troopers from the PSP. All officers in the Selinsgrove Area School District Police Department are in uniform and have full arrest powers. They are employees of the school district," explained Wolfberg.

Officers must follow all of the PA laws of criminal procedure and undergo the same annual training required for all municipal police officers. In addition, they are required to attend and complete a 40-hour course designed for school policing. An additional step in the hiring process requires the Court of Common Pleas Judge (Judge Hackenberg or Judge Piecuch in Snyder County) to approve the individual's application prior to granting the approval for that individual to act as a school officer.

"We have made summary arrests as well as misdemeanor and felony arrests here at SASD," reported Wolfberg. "We have full arrest powers anywhere on campus and any street bordering the district. We also have arrest powers on the school bus regardless of the location of the bus."

The school police also deal with traffic complaints in addition to their normal school police duties.

When the department was established, the district professional staff assisted with resources for the newly formed department. Art teacher, Christy Beiler, designed the patch for the officer's uniform and the Consumer Sciences class sewed the patches onto the police uniforms. Staff helped to create the design for the fully marked police car. The IT department helped with software needs in-house.

The initial 2018 department consisted of Mark Wolfberg, Mike Connelly, and Troy Hickman. Wolfberg emphatically stated, "We did it. We did it right. We asked for help. Our mentor was Jim Martin. He is the current Police Chief at Central Columbia, but he is a former retired Major in PSP." Then Wolfberg added, "To this day we still meet regularly. He is very knowledgeable. He helped to get on the right track and to stay on the right track."

Within CSIU 16, all school districts have school police that meet regularly to discuss current issues and tactics. Many state agencies provide training, resources, and grants.

"At Selinsgrove, every day the police officers visit every building on campus and check doors. There is a physical presence in every building, every day. The officers act as a deterrent (to crime)," explained Wolfberg. Upon request they will talk to students in various classes at various levels. They often eat lunch with the students and interact with students on the playground at recess. They attend most sporting events, provide safety for graduation, and other events as requested.

"I am really proud of how the department has grown from nothing to a fully operational police department with well-trained school police officers," said Wolfberg. "The staff here are fully-trained and dedicated. They will take action when necessary to protect students, staff, and visitors on campus. The police department is the newest addition to the district and the police department plays an important role for the Selinsgrove community."

Last year, Chief Wolfberg recommended that Troy Hickman be promoted to the position of Sergeant. In that role, he became second-in-command and was able to make administrative and operational decisions. Hickman has performed in that role for over a year.

In August 2023, Chief Wolfberg announced his retirement as Police of Chief and recommended that Sgt. Hickman be promoted to Police Chief. During the August 14 school board meeting, the Selinsgrove Area School Board accepted Chief Wolfberg's retirement and appointed Sgt. Troy Hickman as new Chief of Police for SASD.

"The department will continue to grow and evolve. It will continue to provide the necessary safety and security for years to come," said Wolfberg. The 2023 department consists of Chief Troy Hickman, Kirk Renn, Darryl Fisher, Bill Lee, Gary Martinez, and Nate Fisher.

"At the school board meeting, I gave Troy my Police Chief badge. And, in surprise, the police officers presented me with a Retired Police Chief badge." Wolfberg was deeply touched by the gesture.

"The district is very grateful and appreciative of Mr. Wolfberg's efforts in establishing the police department, and building and leading the department," noted Jeff Hummel, Business Manager.

Mark Wolfberg may have retired as Chief of Police; however, his role within the district continues. He remains at the Transportation Coordinator and Safety Director for the Selinsgrove Area School District.

Jersey Shore, Selinsgrove, and communities throughout the area are grieving the death of Max Engle, 17, a talented football player who died a week after collapsing on the field at Harold L. Bolig Memorial Stadium in Selinsgrove from a head injury. For 10 minutes trainers and EMTs worked on Engle. He was taken by ambulance from the field and rushed to the hospital.

Engle, a senior at Jersey Shore Area High School, collapsed during a timeout of the Jersey Shore/Selinsgrove game. There was just 11.4 seconds of play left and the score was tied 21-21. Both teams agreed to call the game at a tie out of respect and support. Selinsgrove School District coaches and players joined in support with the Jersey Shore team in prayer at midfield led by Tate Sechrist, Bulldogs fullback.

Communities united in support of the young player and his family. Donations were collected. Many wore orange in support of Engle as well as tee shirts representing Engle's #4 jersey.

A September 16 update posted by the family stated, "We would like to begin by sharing our immense gratitude and appreciation for the love and support given to our family in this difficult time. The huge outpouring of thoughts and prayers have been of great comfort to us during this time. Max has been fighting hard throughout this week, but he needed to move on to fulfill a greater purpose. On Friday, September 15th, he joined the Lord and those who loved him and have gone before him. Please know he felt all your love and prayers."

The family also remembered Max as warrior on the football field, his respect for coaches, and his loyalty. "Through his life, he has tried to bring people together. We feel he has been bringing people together during this time of uncertainty. We choose to believe he is proudly smiling at this unification of community. The generous gifts you have bestowed upon our family will be used to honor Max as well as to move forward a message of togetherness, community and love."

Max was a warrior on the football field and fought hard to earn a place amongst his Brothers in Orange. He had respect for his coaches and competitors. Above all, was his loyalty to his teammates. We are thinking of them during this time and are also praying for all those who have been affected by this tragedy. Max was lucky to have a close group of friends that were like family. We are holding them close to our hearts."

The family also shared their gratitude for having Max in their lives. "Our family feels immensely blessed to have spent 17 beautiful years with Max. It is difficult not to feel cheated, but we are trying to focus on how fortunate we are to have had him in our lives. He will be greatly missed every single day and we know he will be with us in everything we do."

Although Max's next adventure is not what we thought, we know he is doing greater things than we had hoped for him."

Selinsgrove Superintendent, Dr. Frank Jankowski, stated, "Like all who have known Max Engle or know his story, the SASD was greatly saddened by the news of his untimely passing. Something to lean on during such a tough time is the incredible grace and faith being exhibited by the Engle Family. For the Engle's to be in the midst of such a family and community tragedy and still be able to exhibit such leadership is a blessing to everyone they have impacted. God bless Max, his family, and the Jersey Shore Community during this difficult time."

Jersey Shore High School Principal also shared his thoughts with the Bulldog Nation. "At this time, I ask that we all take a moment of reflection remembering Max Engle as a friend, brother, neighbor... As our family.



Free Car Seat Checks Ahead of National Child Passenger Safety Week

The Pennsylvania Department of Transportation (PennDOT), Pennsylvania State Police (PSP), and Pennsylvania Traffic Injury Prevention Project (PA TIPP) are encouraging drivers to take advantage of free car seat checks across the state as the agencies mark National Child Passenger Safety Week (CPSW) from September 17 through September 23. Additionally, Saturday, September 23 has been designated as "National Seat Check Saturday."

"Seat belts are your best defense in a crash, but they were created for adults," said PennDOT Secretary Mike Carroll. "It's important that parents and caregivers take time this week to ensure they are using the right car seat or booster seat for their child's size and age."

Car seat checks will be held across the state the week of Child Passenger Safety Week. Visit PA TIPP's webpage for a list of events.

PSP personnel certified as Child Passenger Safety (CPS) technicians will be conducting free child seat fitting events across the state. Caregivers can have their car seats checked for suitability, receive instruction on the proper installation, have seat(s) installed, learn to properly harness a child in a seat and check seats for recalls. A full list of local free car seat fitting events is available on PSP's website.

"Properly installed child safety seats save lives, and it's vital that Pennsylvania's youngest passengers are safe when traveling," said PSP Commissioner Colonel Christopher Paris. "We encourage parents and caregivers to have their seats checked by a certified child passenger seat technician to ensure proper installation."

According to national statistics, car seats can reduce the risk of fatal injury by up to 71 percent for infants and 54 percent for toddlers; however, 46 percent of car seats and booster seats are installed or used incorrectly. From January through June 2023, PSP members conducted 525 child safety seat inspections and discovered 207 incidents of misuse. PSP completed more than 1,000 checks in both 2021 and 2022 and found misuse rates of up to 40 percent.

To advance their public safety missions, PennDOT and PSP invest in community resources across the state. PennDOT funds resources such as training and educational materials for more than 200 fitting stations across Pennsylvania. In coordination with CPSW and Seat Check Saturday, local police will focus on proper child seat usage during a statewide CIOT Child Passenger Safety enforcement running from September 10 through September 23. In addition, each PSP Troop has designated walk in days where drivers can have their child safety seats checked free of charge year-round.

Pennsylvania's primary seat belt law requires all occupants younger than 18 to wear a seat belt when riding anywhere in a vehicle. Children under the age of two must be secured in a rear-facing car seat, and children under the age of four must be restrained in an approved child safety seat. Children must ride in a booster seat until their eighth birthday.

A secondary law also requires drivers and front-seat passengers 18 or older to buckle up. If motorists are stopped for a traffic violation and are not wearing their seat belt, they can receive a second ticket and second fine.

Because of the potential dangers associated with air bag deployment, children 12 and younger should always ride buckled in a vehicle's back seat.

"Car seats come in many shapes and sizes. The best way to protect your child is to select the right car seat for their age and size and to use the car seat correctly on every trip," said PA TIPP Director Angela Osterhuber. "Child passenger safety technicians are available to help parents learn how to keep their children safe and secure in their car seat."

PA TIPP also offers the following tips:
Select a car seat that is right for the child's age and size.

Fill out and return the registration card for your seat so you'll know if it is recalled because of a problem.

Read and follow the car seat instructions and the vehicle owner's manual for information on correctly installing the car seat in the vehicle.

Use the car's seat belt or the LATCH system when installing the car seat.

Make sure the car seat's harness is correctly adjusted and fits snugly.

Use a tether strap when installing a forward-facing car seat, following manufacturer's instructions.
