

100 Years of Education at Midd-West High School

MCs Sam and George Rood were joined by state and local dignitaries including PA Senator Lynda Schlegel Culver, PA Treasurer Stacy Garrity, Rep. David Rowe (R-85), Snyder County Commissioners Joe Kantz, Adam Ewig, and Chuck Steininger, Midd-West School Board members Terry Boonie, Victor Abate, Chris Nesbit, and Heidi Stroup and Midd-West administrators Superintendent Joe Stroup, Dr. Dane Aucker, Director of Curriculum, Instruction, & Technology, and Principal Ed Gunkle to celebrate the 100th Anniversary of Midd-West High School.

The stadium at Middleburg High School was filled with the entire Midd-West School District student body ready to celebrate 100 Years of Education in the school community. The kick-off celebration was a pep rally with approximately 2,000 enthusiastic students in grades K-12.

7th grade students, George and Sam Rood, were the MCs for the Midd-West High School Centennial Celebration. They were terrific presenters with their energetic style; providing a fun and fact-filled scripted dialogue to explain the event. Sam and George Rood described how Governor Gifford Pinchot opened a brand-new Middleburg High School 100 years ago. "We're not here today because of just one person. We're here because so many teachers, students, and helpers have worked hard for over 100 years to make our community great. It's taken a lot of teamwork to get here!" noted George Rood. The celebration was held exactly 100 years to the day that the school was dedicated by Gov. Pinchot on September 19, 1925.

Gov. Josh Shapiro sent a proclamation stating, "Tradition and quality are two hallmarks of Midd-West High School, and it has consistently upheld those values while evolving and innovating throughout the years, this school has been a cornerstone of Snyder County." It concluded by stating, "As Governor, and on behalf of all Pennsylvanians, I am happy to recognize and rededicate Midd-West High School for their 100th anniversary."

Sam Rood introduced Sen. Lynda Culver in kid-friendly terms. "She helps to make big decisions for our schools and our state. She was elected to do this job in 2023, and before that, she worked hard helping people as a state representative. Now, she's in charge of a special group in the PA Senate that helps make schools even better!"

Sen. Culver presented a citation to the administration. It stated, "Designed and built by John F. Stetler & Son on eight acres of land donated by Willis Hassinger, John R. Kreeger, Mrs. G.E. Barnes, and the estate of Michael Schoch." The building contained an assembly room, a science department, three classrooms, a domestic science department, and two vocational training rooms. "Dedicated staff members, and support from the community have built a strong foundation for the school's tradition of academic excellence and have prepared it for success in the future."

George Rood introduced Rep. Rowe with a fun fact. "David went to Southeast Asia to teach and help people as a missionary. He went to a university in Taiwan and learned to speak Mandarin Chinese!" Rep. Rowe then greeted the students in Mandarin.

Rep. Rowe presented a citation from the House of Representatives. Afterwards, he commented, "It was so exciting to celebrate this momentous day for the Midd-West School District... The

next generation is our future and that future is bright in Snyder County."

PA Treasurer Stacy Garrity described her background as being the first to graduate college in her family. She is a businesswoman and retired U.S. Army Reserve Colonel who served 30 years in the Army and was deployed three times to Iraq. Stacy worked as a cost accountant at Global Tungsten & Powders Corp., a global supplier of refractory powders in Towanda, and worked her way up to become the first of two female vice presidents at the company. She is the first person from rural PA to serve as a state row officer in 44 years. She encouraged the children to work hard and to follow their dreams. "If I can do, you can do it. You can do anything that you want to do. And, don't let anybody including yourself tell you that you can't!"

During the 100 Years of Education celebration, Superintendent Joe Stroup noted that Pennsylvania "has been a place of bold ideas, creative thoughts, and people who make a difference in the world. That same spirit still exists right here in Midd-West." He concluded by saying, "We look forward to the new chapters that you will add to our history through your achievements, your creativity, and your Mustang spirit." Then he announced the Midd-West Centennial Adventure.

The Midd-West Centennial Adventure is an engaging, educational, and community-centered way to honor 100 Years of Education in the district. The scavenger hunt allows students and friends to explore local history through interactive challenges, fostering curiosity, civic pride, and a deeper connection to their community.

Students will gain a deeper appreciation for local history, develop problem-solving skills through riddles and puzzles, and engage in meaningful conversations about their community.

The scavenger hunt officially began on September 19 and runs through November 22. Coin clues will remain active until all 108 commemorative coins are found. Each student in the district received a pack of playing cards after the assembly.

Each card in the deck features a QR code that unlocks historical challenges and clues tied to local landmarks and events. The cards serve as a timeline, guiding students through 100 years of Midd-West history. For high school students, new clues will be released every Saturday, leading them on a hunt for commemorative coins hidden throughout the community. Elementary and middle school students will enjoy age-appropriate challenges with coins hidden in or around their school buildings.

The adventure is also open to everyone -- students, staff, families, alumni, and community friends. The Snyder County Historical Society is offering decks of Centennial playing cards for a \$10 donation, with all proceeds going toward replacing the roof on the 1908 Snyder County Soldiers Monument. Supporting our veterans and preserving our history is a meaningful victory for those who served.

The assembly concluded when Sam Rood announced that one shiny coin was hidden under a seat for each school. The lucky finders could keep the coin. Let the game begin! And, then a photo was taken to commemorate the 100th anniversary of Midd-West High School.

Williams Grove has Tune up Race for This Weekends National Open, Lincoln almost Beat the Rain

Friday night Williams Grove had a format that the World of Outlaws will be using this coming weekend for the National Open, with time trials heat a Dash and feature. A nice field of 29 410-sprint cars drivers were on hand with a few High Limit drivers also in the field. Justin Whittall had fast time on the night with a time of 16.665 sec., with the three heats going to Whittall, Freddie Rahmer and Jaison Pursley. Rahmer also won the dash with Ryan Newton the B-main winner. Freddie Rahmer got an early jump on the field with Brett Marks in hot pursuit. Marks got by Rahmer before ten laps were complete and went on to win the 25-lap feature. This was his 21st career win at the Grove and first of the year for the Myerstown driver. He is also traveling this year with the High Limit series. Marks was the National Open winner back in the 2023 season. Freddie Rahmer settled for second with Brock Zearfoss, Cameron Smith and Troy Wagaman Jr in the top five. Going into this weekend for the final two nights of points racing for the grove 410-title, Wagaman Jr has a 65-point lead over Freddie Rahmer. In 358-sprint car action, Dylan Norris scored his ninth career win and fifth of the season in the 20-lap feature. Norris had to chase down early leader Chase Gutshall before getting the lead and walking away for the win. Norris had already clinched the track title in the division and was given some awards before the nights racing action got started.

Williams Grove will have two days of WOO sprint car action with the Friday night program with \$12,000 up for grabs for the Friday night winner in the 25-lap feature. The Saturday night feature winner will collect \$75,000 for the winner. This will be the 63rd running of the National Open, which dates back to the first race in the 1963 season. Indianapolis 500 champion Gordon Johncock won the first national open. He is from Hasting Michigan and was followed by Ohio USAC standout Larry Dickson. Dickson won the race in the 1964 season ending event. It was not until the 1967and 1968 season that a local driver named Bobby Adamson scored the national open win. The biggest upset came in the 1969 open when Gene Vaener of Selinsgrove, driving a back-up Gary Wasson sprint to Mitch Smith scored a surprise victory. Kenny Weld won three in a row starting in the 1971 season Steve Smith Sr scored the win in the 1974 season before Bobby Allan won it in 1975. In the1978 season it became a part of the World of Outlaws series event. The only time it was an All-Star series race was in 1981 with Smith Sr getting his second Open win. All time Great sprint car driver Steve Kinser won his first open in the 1990 season and followed it up with a win in 1992. In the 2022 opener, Lance Dewease found victory aboard the Kreitz #69k, with Brent Marks winning in 2023 and last year the win went to Carson Macedo. The race is set for Saturday October 5th and will have a Sunday rain date of October 6th if needed. A strong field of Outlaws will be on hand led by current series point leader David Gravel, Sheldon Haudenschild, Carson Macedo, Logan Schuchart, Michael Kofoid, Donny Schatz and others along with then local talent like Chase Dietz, Danny Dietrich, Freddie Rahmer, Brock Zearfoss, Troy Wagaman and others. One driver that will be missing and a would be favorite to win, is Anthony Macri who was hurt in a crash a few weeks back at Eldora Speedway. He will not be racing this weekend.

Saturday at Lincoln Speedway, they tried to beat the incoming rain but lost the show just before the 410-feature was called. That feature, along with a makeup feature for the 358-sprints, will be made up on Saturday October

18th. The point battle there is also coming down to Troy Wagaman Jr and Freddie Rahmer, with Wagaman up by 35-points over Rahmer. Dylan Norris has a 20-point led over Jayden Wolf for the 358-sprint title which will also be decided on the night of October 18th. Lincoln will host the World of Outlaw sprint car series on Saturday October 11th. Before the rain came and ended the program, Troy Wagaman Jr set fast time in time trials with a clocking of 12.885 seconds off the track record held by Greg Hodnet of 12.577. Dallas Schott, Kyle Moody and Billy Dietrich won the three heat races with Ryan Newton the consolation. Three 358-sprint heats went to Scott Merriman, Logan Spahr, and Cody Fletcher, a field of 29 410-sprints and 21 358 sprint were on hand.

In other sprint car news, the High Limit series raced at Bridgeport Speedway on Saturday night with the feature getting cut short in laps due to rain coming in at feature time. Danny Sams, who lives in Florida, won over Gio Scelzi, Brent Marks, Rico Abreu and Aaron Reutzel. 29-drivers signed in for the night's action. At Path Valley Speedway on Sunday, a field of 39 drivers signed in for the night's action with Tanner Thorson getting the feature win over Brady Bacon, Gio Scelzi, Danny Dietrich and Ashton Torgerson. A wild heat race had six of the ten starters getting involved in an accident with four cars flipping over. That heat race ended up having four cars to race with Brock Zearfoss one of the cars that flipped and credited with a fifth-place finish. This meant that he made the feature, but unfortunately the car could not be repair and Brock had to watch the feature instead. The WOO sprint car series was racing Saturday night at Sharon where 54 drivers signed in for action and when it was done, 60-year-old Dale Blaney, driving the family owned #10 scored the upset win over the traveling series with Michael Kofoid, Sheldon Haudenschild, David Gravel and Logan Schuchart in the top five.

Other tracks that did not make it out for racing because of the weather were Winchester Speedway in Virginia, Hagerstown Speedway and Potomac Speedway both in Maryland. The race at Hagerstown was to have the PASS 305-sprint along with Limited Late models, while the race at Potomac was part of the Fall Clash Super Late model series. Potomac is considering a make-up date for the Fall Clash series race. The next race for this series for super late models will take place on Friday October 17th at Hagerstown Speedway. Selinsgrove will be back in action on Friday October 10th with the 410 sprints and the 360/358 sprint car challenge race. The 410 sprints will be racing for \$7,300 to win while the 360/358 sprint race for \$3,073, the race is in the Memorial race for Kramer Williamsons. So far this year Danny Dietrich and Chase Dietz each have two feature wins with Anthony Macri one win all with the Nace Memorial race. In two 360/358 sprint car race Derek Locke and Michael Walter have scored feature wins.

Lewisburg girls tennis beat Mifflinburg 5-0. Morgan Strieby beat Miff’s Rhyann Kurtz in a 10-8 tiebreaker. Miff lost to Montgomery but #2 doubles with Lucy Turner and Breonna Zimmerman have been playing well together.

The Grove tennis girls lost twice to Central Columbia and undefeated Danville. Alexis Hoot lost an exciting #1 singles match in a 10-6 tie-breaker. The #2 doubles team of Ashlyn Lehman and Emily Longacre took a 6-2 win over the vaunted Danville girls.

We have arrived at the best sporting time of the year. Football is fully in motion, the NBA is holding media days and the NHL is playing pre-season games. MLB started their postseason this week and the WNBA will soon be over.

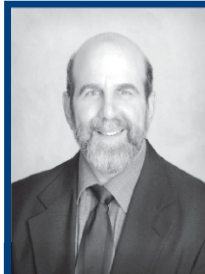

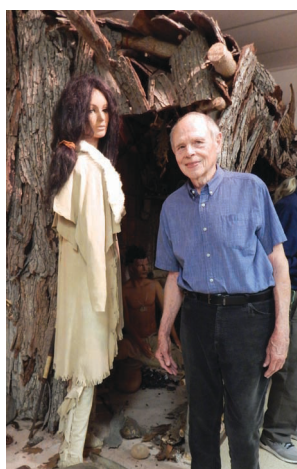

John Snyder Presents Metate to the Snyder County Historical Society

On Sunday, September 21, 2025, John Snyder of Freeburg donated a 5000-year-old metate used by Native Americans to the Snyder County Historical Society. The metate is a stone bowl used to grind grains, nuts, and other food. The grain is placed in a concave surface and ground by the use of another stone tool called a pestle. Thanks to Mr. John Snyder of Freeburg this amazing artifact was immediately placed in the museum collection exhibit of Native American Indians in the Roush Museum room.

According to Snyder, this is the account of how the metate came into his possession. On September 10, 2004, John Snyder purchased this metate from Sandy and Mike Mengel of Mt. Pleasant Mills for \$600. Sandy was given this historical treasure by her father, Wilson Reitz. Mr. Reitz of Sunbury had a

neighbor that he did many favors for over the years. This man was one of the excavators during the creation of Shikellamy State Park Overlook around 1954. (The Shikellamy Overlook opened in 1960.) While excavating he dug up three of these grinding stones, took them home, and put them in his backyard.

When Wilson visited his friend and neighbor, he admired these ancient artifacts. Since Wilson was such a good neighbor, the man asked him if he would like to have one of the grinding stones. Wilson, of course, said he would! He selected the biggest one! There was only one of the pounding stones (pestles) intact- the others were in pieces. The man said Wilson could have the one in perfect condition. "So, that is how this artifact came into the possession of Wilson Reitz of Sunbury."

In 1974, when Wilson Reitz died, the grinding stone was given to Sandy Reitz Mengel. Sandy and Mike Mengel displayed the stone on the hearth of their fireplace. In 2003, they built and downsized into a smaller home in Heister Valley and no longer had the room to display the grinding stone.

So, in 2004, Sandy called her friend, John Snyder, and asked if he wanted to purchase the stone. "I jumped at the chance to own this treasure as I have admired it for years. Two hours later, the stone was in my general store and local history "museum." I am very proud to be the present caretaker of this historical treasure." He also noted, "I was thrilled when I could buy it. It was always my favorite piece."

Now, on September 21, John Snyder donated the grinding stone to the Snyder County Historical Society. "I feel that the metate belongs here at the Snyder County Historical Society Museum because it is so historic." It will now be shared with the public.

During the presentation, Kim Mattern, museum curator, explained that he estimated the metate to be about 5000 years old and used by the Woodland Indians at Shikellamy Park. It was a natural, stone formation that the Indians did not have to carve. They kept it and used it. "It is the largest

metate that I have ever seen, outside of a museum." The pestle was donated with the metate but it was not used with the metate. A loaf stone is used to grind in a metate. The pestle has marks on it so it can be held without slipping.

Mattern brought two other, smaller metates from his personal collection that were used for comparison during the presentation. After the program, attendees closely examined the metates.

Celebrating the 106th Anniversary of the Graybill Reunion

The Graybill Reunion celebrated its 106th Anniversary September 6, 2025 at Graybill's Grove, located at 6216 Heister Valley Rd. in Richfield. All community members, relatives, and friends were invited to attend the picnic and program.

"It's something that I look forward to each year. I enjoy spending time with the Friends of Graybill's Grove Committee and planning this annual picnic and improving the Grove," said Gloria Brubaker.

Graybill's Grove, originally known as Womer's Grove, was preserved as a woodland and park in the early 1900's. In August 1918, the Irvin Graybill family from Paxtonville invited some friends to a picnic at the Grove, which was during World War I and the flu epidemic of that era. After a pleasant day, they decided to invite other families and friends to gather again the next year. Over 300 people showed up for the first Graybill Reunion in September 1919. In 1924, Mr. Womer decided to sell the Grove to the newly formed Graybill Reunion Association. The Association raised funds to add the pavilions, refreshment stand and other improvements. The Graybill Reunion, school and factory picnics, and many other family gatherings were held at the Grove since then.

"I am a Snyder but I don't have much Graybill blood," explained Brent D. Snyder. "However, this grove had once been Womer's Grove before it was transferred to the Graybills. The

Womer's are very much a part of my family as my paternal grandmother was a Womer. She was born in the house on the property adjacent to the grove. She came to the first Graybill Reunion in 1918 when she was 6 years old. She lived to be 105 years old." Then Snyder added, "The mystery is how and why the transfer occurred."

In 2004, under the direction of Eleanor Snyder, a new group formed to tackle restoring the trees at the Grove and maintaining the grounds. Over forty trees have been planted since then, many with the hard work of Wade and Eleanor Snyder, and Esther and Bill Sheaffer.

Most the repairs needed due to the damage caused by the 2023 hail storms have been completed. The refreshment stand was rebuilt and extended. There are new posts at the long picnic pavilion and the Shirk's pavilion as well as new roofs on all the buildings. In 2026, Friends of the Grove hope to focus on the forest and grounds that make up the Grove. Work on the Shirk pavilion is being considered as well as a solar powered battery system for lighting. Some visitors suggested designating space for horseshoes and cornhole games and to provide access to the Spring and other trails through the Grove. The Grove is maintained by the Friends of Graybill's Grove and owned by the Richfield Community Center.

New volunteers are needed and invited to join to continue these efforts. Follow them on Facebook. Donations to preserve Graybill's Grove are gratefully accepted. Mail checks to: Friends of Graybill's Grove, c/o Brent Snyder, 169 Snyder St., Richfield PA 17086.

After the buffet luncheon, attendees gathered for a group photo. PC Brass Quintet was this year's musical entertainment and kept toes tapping. The band interjected the program with interesting tidbits about the music, performers and more.

Gloria Fultz introduced the guest speakers-Gladys Gingrich of the Juniata Mennonite Historical Center and Lee Knepp of the Snyder County Historical Society as two excellent resources for historical and genealogical research. Gingrich explained that the Juniata Mennonite Historical Center was dedicated on July 8, 1978. The first director was Noah Zimmerman. The purpose was "to collect records, church building records, Sunday School records, and some ministerial records." Over the years, the Center was upgraded to contain more shelves and vaults. In an effort to interest younger people in history, the Center began offering History Days for school children. They enjoyed Colonial American times with Johnny Appleseed stories, learning how to make paper snowflakes. Depression times featured older objects such as a manual typewriter, rotary phone, and victrola. This year's group will learn about "Slavery and the Underground Railroad."

Some of the interesting things at the Juniata Mennonite Historical Center are bound copies of the Juniata Sentinel, large volumes of genealogy books for most family names in the area, an old Communion cup of Early American pewter with S. Winey engraved on the bottom, Nathaniel Shope's school bell, old quilts, cemetery records, crocks featuring various Menno-

nite churches, and drawing of Fort Pomfret. Located at 37722 Route 35 in Richfield, Juniata Mennonite Historical Center is open Tuesdays 9-4 pm and Saturdays from 9 am- 2 pm. Email jmhistoricalcenter@gmail.com or call 717-694-3211 for more information.

Lee Knepp joined the Snyder County Historical Society in the early 1970's and has served as an officer for 49 years. In 1898, the Snyder County Historical Society formed. It is one of the older county historical societies in Pennsylvania. The SCHS formation is a credit to the leadership at that time. For many years, the SCHS held its program presentations, library, and museum in the basement of Seibert Hall at Susquehanna University. In the late 1970's, the SCHS moved to Middleburg.

"Emmanuel's Church" was built in 1834 as a "gallery church" structure for the Lutheran and German Reformed congregations of Middleburg. In the 1890's, the Lutherans built their own structure in the "French Flats" area of Middleburg. Later, the German Reformed congregation became part of United Church of Christ denomination.

According to Knepp, "In October 1978, the Snyder County Historical Society purchased the church building from the First UCC congregation of Middleburg for its permanent home., thus preserving what I believe to be the oldest existing church structure in the county and which would provide more adequate space for the society's programs, library, and museum."

There were significant expansions and renovations of the building from 1978-1998 to the generosity of the local community and beyond with funding as well as volunteer time and energy. Another expansion and renovation occurred between 1999-2002 to provide improvement to the library and museum facilities.

The Bicentennial Celebration in 1976 "provided an impetus for growth and an infusion of strong leadership of the Snyder County Historical Society." The SCHS was very involved in the planning and execution of activities. "Probably never again, will we witness the level of local participation, both county-wide and by individual communities that occurred for the Bicentennial," said Knepp.

The Snyder County Historical Society Museum is open the first and third Sundays of the month from May to September from noon- 3 pm. The library is open on Thursday from 10 am- 3:30 pm. Other times are available by appointment by calling 570-837-6191 or 570-412-6458 or by emailing: schs@snydercounty.org. Follow them on Facebook- Historical Society of Snyder County.

In addition to the Memorials and sick list of relatives, another person spoke up to praise the local community for coming together to assist in the search for Gary Graybill. Over 330 people responded to the fire departments' request to help in the search. He was found in a cornfield.

The program concluded with the attendees singing, "Blest Be The Tie That Bind."

Oct. 20 Voter Registration Deadline

Secretary of the Commonwealth Al Schmidt reminded Pennsylvanians today that the deadline to register to vote in the Nov. 4 municipal election is just weeks away. Ensuring that our elections are conducted freely and fairly, and that every eligible voter can make their voice heard, are top priorities of the Shapiro Administration.

“The races on the ballot in a municipal election may not receive the same attention as a presidential election, but they are important to the everyday lives of Pennsylvanians,” Schmidt said. “It only takes a few minutes to register to vote. Once you are registered, you can then exercise your fundamental right to vote and let your voice be heard on Nov. 4.”

- Oct. 20: Last day to register to vote in the municipal election
- Oct. 28: Last day to apply for a mail ballot
- Nov. 4: Municipal Election Day. Polls are open from 7 a.m.-8 p.m.
- 8 p.m. Nov. 4: Deadline for your county elections office to receive your completed mail ballot
- Eligible voters will have the opportunity to cast a ballot for judicial races and local government positions this November. The department’s candidate database lists county and statewide judicial candidates running for office.
- To be eligible to register to vote in the Nov. 4 municipal election, a person must be:
 - A U.S. citizen for at least one month before the election,
 - A resident of the election district in which the person plans to register for at least 30 days before the election, and
 - At least 18 years old on or before Nov. 4.

Pennsylvanians who are already registered to vote can check their registration status online. They can also update their voter record with any name, address, or party affiliation changes online.

Eligible Pennsylvanians can also get a voter registration application at the following locations:

- their county voter registration office,
- county assistance offices,
- Women, Infants & Children (WIC) program offices,
- Armed Forces recruitment centers,
- county clerk of orphans’ courts or marriage license offices,
- area agencies on aging,
- county mental health and intellectual disabilities offices,
- student disability services offices of the State System of Higher Education,
- offices of special education in high schools, and
- Americans with Disabilities Act-mandated complementary paratransit providers.

In 2023, all PennDOT driver and photo license centers began offering automatic voter registration, which provides eligible Pennsylvanians with a convenient way to apply to register to vote when they obtain a new driver’s license or ID card or renew their existing identification. The Shapiro Administration launched the automatic registration initiative as part of its continued commitment to ensuring free, fair, and secure elections.

Registered voters can also request a mail ballot online. Mail ballot applications must be received by a voter’s county elections board by 5 p.m. Oct. 28. Completed mail ballots must be received by county election offices by 8 p.m. Nov. 4.

The Department’s voter information website, vote.pa.gov, is available in English, Spanish, and Chinese and offers a polling place locator and contact information for county elections offices. It also includes tips for first-time voters, mail-in and absentee voters, elderly and disabled voters, and members of the military.

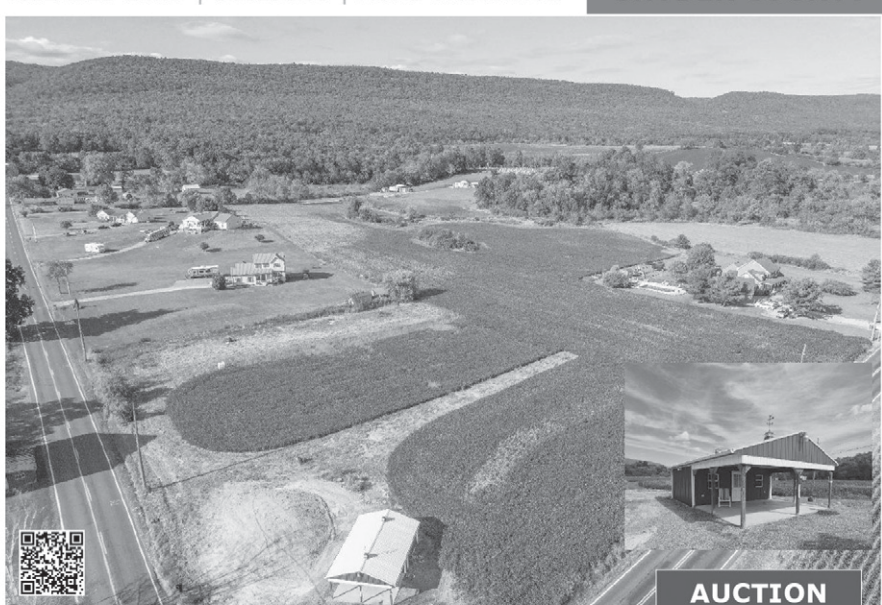
