

Garage Fire Extended to Commercial Building Fire

On June 2, 2025 a garage fire was reported in Monroe Township at 2340 N. Susquehanna Trail. Central Susquehanna Regional 911 dispatched the call. Hummels Wharf Fire Chief Chris Eppley arrived to a working garage fire in the rear of the building, with apparent extension to the main structure- a commercial building. Hummels Wharf Engine arrived quickly knocked the fire down through the failed garage door. Shamokin Dam Squad 90 and H&L Rescue 80 performed primary searches of the entire building. DH&L Tower manned the front of the building while Americus Hose Tower 54 manned the rear side of the building. A hole was cut into the metal roof of a second-floor space above the martial arts business. Multiple attack lines were deployed from Union Township Engine 70. Crews worked diligently together to limit the fire damage to main commercial building. There were no injuries.

The commercial building, The Golden Strip Plaza, is located along the Golden Strip Plaza, across Routes 11/15 from the Red Robin in Monroe Marketplace. It has many businesses including Asian Massage, Clearwater Swimming Pool Company, and Warrior Concepts Martial Arts. The right north-bound lane of Routes 11/15 during the emergency response. In addition to Hummels Wharf, mutual aid fire departments responding to the call included Dauntless Hook and Ladder, Shamokin Dam, Fremont, Freeburg, Kreamer, Americus Fire Company, Kratzerville Volunteer Fire Company, Point Township and Union Township.

Appalachian Late Model Speedweek Starts this Weekend for a Whole Week of Racing, Eight Races in Ten Days

Friday night, for the third year in a row, Clinton County Speedway will host the opening round of the 2025 LM Speedweeks followed by Saturday night at Port Royal and Sunday at Hagerstown Speedway. After a Monday off, they return to Path Valley on Tuesday June 10th with another night off on Wednesday, and then back to Selinsgrove Speedway for a Thursday June 12th event. It wraps up then by Bedford speedway on Friday June 13th, Lincoln Speedway on Saturday June 14th and it all comes to an end on Sunday June 15th at Bridgeport Speedway in New Jersey. Five tracks will be paying winner \$5,000 to win while three will pay the winner \$6,000 to win. They included Selinsgrove, Bedford and Bridgeport. Again, this year, Selinsgrove Ford is sponsoring the Appalachian Speedweek with \$5,000 going to the point champion.

The series is in twelve years of racing having started in the 2009 season and run until the 2017 season. Then after a five-year absence it was revived by Jim Bernheisel and his team in the 2023 season. This will be the third year that this team oversees LM Speedweek.

Looking back at Clinton County for the last two years, in 2023 Jason Covert scored the feature win over Gregg Satterlee, Austin Berry, Andrew Yoder and Tyler Emory. Port Royal followed up with Jared Miley getting the win over Tyler Emory, Kyle Lee, Rick Eckert and Jeff Rine. Hagerstown Speedway was next with Gregg Satterlee getting the win over Kyle Hardy, Drake Troutman, Tyler Emory and Dylan Yoder. Tuesday, the next week, the show had all the racing in at Path Valley, until the rain stopped the show just before the feature. All drivers received the same payout and points for what was finished on the program. Bedford was rained out on Thursday but got their Friday program in with Tyler Emory winning over Rick Eckert, Dylan Yoder, Jason Covert and Gregg Satterlee. The final that year was held at Selinsgrove with Gregg Satterlee, getting the win over Tyler Emory, Rick Eckert, Eddie Carrier Jr. and Dylan Yoder. Tyler Emory was the 2023 series champion followed by Gregg Satterlee, Rick Eckert, Dylan Yoder and Kyle Hardy.

The 2024 Speedweek series again started out at Clinton County with Tyler Emory getting the feature win over Drake Troutman, Matt Cosner, Gregg Satterlee and Andrew Yoder. Saturday at Port Royal Gregg Satterlee won the race over Hayes Mattern, Ross Robinson, Coleby Frye and Dylan Yoder. Sunday at Hagerstown it was Satterlee again with the win over Tyler Emory, Trevor Feathers, Dylan Yoder and Drake Troutman. Tuesday event at Path Valley went to Rick Eckert, over Mason Zeigler, Gregg Satterlee, Dan Stone and Coleby Frye. Selinsgrove was next with a Thursday night who with again Rick Eckert scoring the win over Coleby Frye, Gregg Satterlee, Hayes Mattern and Matt Cosner. Friday night Bedford again suffered a rain out, Saturday at Lincoln speedway Dylan Yoder got the win over Jason Covert, Kyle Hardy, Matt Cosner and Justin Weaver. The Sunday final last year was held at BAPS Motor speedway with Gregg Satterlee winning over Kyle Hardy, Dylan Yoder, Justin Weaver and Gene Knaub. Satterlee won the points title.

Gregg Satterlee, Jeff Rine and Tim McCreadie each have two Speedweek titles: Gregg in 2013 and last year Jeff Rine in 2015 and 2017 McCreadie 2012 and 2014. Josh Richards was the 2009 champ, Rick Eckert was next as 2010 champ, Austin Hubbard 2011. Then Kenny Pettyjohn in 2016 and Tyler Emory 2023. It is not just a PA thing! Champion drivers have come from other states like West Virginia was Josh Richards, Virginia was Tyler Emory, Delaware had Austin Hubbard and Kenny Pettyjohn from New York. Tim McCreadie, from New York, won twice and four from Pennsylvania: Gregg Satterlee twice, Jeff Rine twice, Rick Eckert once, so for five from the Keystone state. In the 2024 series, close to 100 different drivers participated in the seven events that were completed.

Port Royal had a neat format for the Pass 305-sprints

on Saturday night with them running twin features for the traveling group. With a field of 50-drivers on hand, they split the field in half and ran two heats with the first 25-drivers that made up the first feature then heats three and four made up the second group of 25-drivers. They did their usual pill draw for the first six in each heat with everyone else lined up behind them. The first feature went to Timmy Bittner of Beach Creek, PA who has won other series 305-sprint features, but this was the first time he won a feature with the PASS series group. He did so over Mickle Melair, Nick Sweigart, Doug Dodson and Mike Alleman. The second feature went to Kreamer PA driver Kruz Kepner. Kepner, who picked up his first ever Port Royal feature, won over Logan Spahr, Kenny Heffner, Drew Young and John Walp. In the 410-sprint car feature, Chase Dietz of Hanover PA driving the John Stehman #23 scored his first ever Port Royal feature win. He won over Mike Walter of Selinsgrove, Devin Adams, Brock Zearfoss, and Justin Whittall. The East Coast Wingless 360-sprint was also on hand with Stave Drevicki scoring the feature win over Mike Miller, Cameron Smith, Christian Bruno and Bobby Butler. Both the 410 sprints and the East Coast sprints ran their feature non-stop. A total of 104-sprint cars were on hand with 34-410-sprints, the above-mentioned 50-305-sprints and 20 of the East Coast Wingless sprints mentioned.

Selinsgrove gave it their best shot but the persistent drizzle would not let up and the program of super late model, limited late model and street stock was cancelled, the bike races for the kids has been reset for Friday July 11th This Friday the track will honor Kramer Williamson with the annual Kreamer Cup Race for the 360/358 sprints, the 410 sprints will be there for their second show of the year and the East Coast Wingless 360-sprint will be on hand this Friday. The first challenge race (360's against 358's) was won by Derek Locke back on April 26. Locke was using a 358-engine to beat the other drivers in the field, Josh Weller and Ryan Taylor were next using 360 engines. In the lone 410-sprint feature, Chase Dietz scored the win over Jake Karklin, Danny Dietrich, Gerard McIntyre and Austin Bishop. It won't take long for the 410-sprints to back at Selinsgrove on Sunday June 15th, Father's Day. They will be joined by the Pass 305-sprints for that Sunday show. On a side note, after Selinsgrove cancelled, driver Lane Snook of Mifflin PA made his way to BAPS Motor Speedway, started last in the 27-car field and went on to win the limited late model race. He also went on Sunday to Bedford to pick up another feature win. He has a total of six feature wins already this year. Matt Murphy and Ryan Zook made it to race at Hagerstown in the limited class but neither driver made out as well. Snook did not do bad for a kid who just turned 17-years-old.

Drivers, Put Down the Phone, ‘Paul Miller’s Law’ Effective June 5

Drivers, put down the phone while driving, ahead of the June 5 effective date for “Paul Miller’s Law,” which makes it illegal to use a hand-held cell phone while driving.

Effective June 5, 2025, the law - known as “Paul Miller’s Law” - prohibits the use of hand-held devices while driving, even while stopped temporarily due to traffic, a red light, or other momentary delay.

Pennsylvania already enforces a texting-while-driving ban that prohibits drivers from using mobile devices to send, read, or write text-based communications while their vehicle is in motion. Beginning June 5, 2025, law enforcement will begin issuing written warnings for violations of Senate Bill 37. Law enforcement will have the ability to issue summary citations to violators beginning June 6, 2026.

“Paul Miller’s Law is about saving lives,” said PennDOT Secretary Mike Carroll. “Your choices behind the wheel can change lives forever. Make the safe choice. Put your phone out of reach and don’t text and drive. One text, one glance down – it could kill someone. And it’s not worth it.”

Under Paul Miller’s Law, drivers can still use their phones to alert emergency responders and, if they are using hands-free technology, to make phone calls, use a GPS, and listen to music.

“The Pennsylvania State Police will enforce the new law to its full extent,” said PSP Commissioner Colonel Christopher Paris. “Distracted driving is not a minor offense. Just one second of inattention can result in irreversible consequences. We urge all drivers to stay focused behind the wheel.”

“Focusing on the road while driving is one of the best ways to ensure your safety and the safety of those around you,” said PA Insurance Commissioner Michael Humphreys. “Safe driving can also help reduce the cost of your insurance as insurers factor your accident and driving history into their ratemaking. We encourage consumers to speak with their insurance provider to learn more about the

benefits of safe driving, the discounts they could receive, and how they can start saving today.”

“As the Prime-Sponsor of Senate Bill 37, now Act 18 of 2024, seeing this law go into effect is incredibly rewarding knowing it will save lives,” said State Senator Rosemary Brown (R- Lackawanna, Monroe, Wayne). “It’s important that drivers remember that the cell phone has become the most consistent, repetitive, and lengthy distraction behind the driver’s wheel causing significant public safety concerns. This law will change behaviors and save lives.”

The law is named for Paul Miller, Jr., who was tragically killed in a crash with a tractor trailer in 2010 in Monroe County, as the result of a distracted driver who reached for their phone while driving. Since his death, Paul’s mother Eileen Miller has become a national advocate for stronger laws to curb distracted driving.

According to PennDOT data, in 2024 there were 9,950 crashes involving a distracted driver, resulting in more than 6,000 injuries and 49 fatalities. Distracted driving crash data is believed to be underreported due to many drivers’ reluctance to admit to being distracted at the time of a crash.

If you are the driver, follow these steps for a safe drive: If you are expecting a text message or need to send one that can’t wait, pull over and park your car in a safe location before using your device; Ask a passenger to be your “designated texter.” Allow them access to your phone to respond to calls or messages; Do not engage in social media scrolling or messaging while driving; Cell phone use is habit-forming. Struggling to not text and drive? Activate your phone’s “Do Not Disturb” feature, silence notifications, or put your phone in the trunk, glove box, or back seat of your vehicle until you arrive at your destination.

Cell phone use is not the only distraction while driving. Anything that takes your attention away from driving, your eyes off the road, or your hands off the wheel is a distraction. Driver behavior is the leading factor in 83% of the crashes that occur annually in Pennsylvania. These behaviors include driving distracted, impaired, or aggressive.

They have a good time heckling each other and occasionally bowling well. Her team has won the Women’s Association Tournament. Alicia has bowled several 700 series and currently holds an all-time high average of 210.

Alicia has served on the Central PA USBC Board of Directors for the last eight seasons, helping with events and fundraisers.

Congratulations, Alicia Beachy-Trelease on becoming the newest member of the Central PA USBC Hall of Fame! Bowling continues to bring entertainment and fun to her life.

2025 Hall of Fame inductee “Butch” Feaster is a big sports fan of- fast cars, softball, and baseball. He is especially into major sports being a Phillies fan, and likes hockey and bowling. He also enjoys Penn State wrestling and Bucknell basketball.

In 1985, Butch and a friend were talking sports and decided to start a bowling team. “Funny thing is...we won the championship that year. I was elected league president that year and my passion for bowling began!”

At his first association tournament that year, he and his partner won Doubles. He has been attending state tournaments for 36 years. Butch has participated in the PA Senior Championships since 2010. “I was fortunate to bowl on the 2019 State Championship team.”Other honors include several sanctioned 300 games, too many 299 games, and never enough 700 series, many league high average trophies, and Lewisburg Lanes first 600-700 sweeper tournament winner.
