Statewide Stay-at-Home Order Extended Until May 8 Keep Community Safe

Governor Tom Wolf and Secretary of Health Dr. Rachel Levine announced that the statewide stay-at-home orders issued on April 1 to protect Pennsylvanians and mitigate the spread of COVID-19 will be extended until Friday, May 8 at 12:01 AM. The initial order was set to expire on April 30.

"It is clear that our early and aggressive efforts to mitigate this spread of this highly contagious and deadly virus are working. While we begin to seek ways to move forward, it's imperative that we continue to take strong precautions to protect Pennsylvanians and ensure that our health care system is not overwhelmed," Wolf said. "I am so proud of this commonwealth and the resilience of my fellow Pennsylvanians, and I urge you to continue to stay calm and stay home so that we can all stay safe."

'We are starting to see a downward trend in the number of positive cases throughout the state, which is definitely encouraging," Dr. Levine said. "We need to proceed carefully to make sure the strides we've made in combatting this virus continue to move forward. Extending our statewide order until May 8 will ensure that we don't overwhelm our health system, while helping our econo-

Non-life-sustaining physical business closures remain in effect and all life-sustaining businesses and state ser-

Individuals are permitted to leave their residences for tasks essential to maintaining health and safety.

Wolf recommended that Pennsylvanians continue to wear masks when leaving the house for life-sustaining reasons. Dr. Levine recently signed an order directing protections for critical workers who are employed at businesses that are authorized to maintain in-person operations during the COVID-19 disaster emergency.

At this time, law enforcement will continue to focus on ensuring that residents are aware of the order and informing the public of social distancing practices rather than enforcement.

A new system is available to provide unemployment assistance to individuals who are self-employed, contractors, gig workers and others who do not traditionally qualify for Unemployment Compensation, according to Senator John R. Gordner (R-27). The Pandemic Unemployment Assistance (PUA) pro-

Acceptable documentation includes copies of recent paycheck stubs, bank receipts showing deposits, tax returns and 1099 tax forms, bill notices to customers, statements from recent customers, business licenses, contracts, invoices and building leases.

The new PUA system is separate from the regular Compen-Unemployment sation system. Claimants for PUA should only apply through the PUA Portal.

Question: Alice can you please explain why Medicare

Part D drug plan coverage is not that great, and what President Trump is doing to help?

Answer: I will try to make some sense out of some of the key points to lower drug costs directly related to Medicare Eligible Citizens. Most of the proposals fall far short of the goal to lower drug costs. Require drug ads to include the price:

One of the ideas is to require drug makers to disclose list prices in advertisements. Many experts say that they don't think that would have a significant impact on pricing and spending.

End the patent games:

Another idea is to give the Medicare Part D insurance plans more flexibility to negotiate discounts on drugs that are still under patent or don't have any competitors. Patents allow the drug makers to recoup the millions of dollars invested for research and development. Over the years, the drug makers have found ways to hold on to the patent protections much longer. Trump said, "our patent system will reward innovation, but it will not be used to protect unfair monopolies."

Persuade other countries to pay more:

I think we are all aware that many medications can be obtained cheaper from Canada. One of Trump's key proposals would involve pressuring other countries to raise their prices for prescription medications. In the United States we have the highest costs for prescription drugs. Many foreign countries have negotiated lower prices from the drug companies. It is believed that foreign companies should share in the pricing because the innovation benefits the whole world. It is unclear whether other countries would be willing to raise their prices and in turn lead to drug companies lowering prices in the

President Trump is taking a stab at tackling this complex problem of high drug costs.

However, many of Trump's proposals are light on details and will need action by Congress to become a reality.

For 2020 Medicare Part D enrollees will have the Brand name drugs reduced to a 25% cost share in the "Donut Hole". Let me put that into perspective for you. Humira and Taltz are routinely advertised in the Evening News timeslot. A Medicare Part D enrollee would have a 25% co-pay in the "Donut Hole" of around \$1250 a month. Yes, you read that correctly! The total cost of those Medications each are over \$5000 a month.

Explaining Medicare Part D plans and the related costs is extremely difficult. I always tell our clients to hold on and fasten their seat belts. Sadly, as we all get older, things that should be clear, simple, and less expensive, are just the opposite. Any improvement and positive moves to lower drug costs I believe are more than welcomed by all.

Govenor Wolf Grants Extension For License To Carry Permits

Permits that expired March 19 or after will now have until May 30 to renew.

Based on direction from Governor Wolf's office, the Pennsylvania State Police released the following information about expired or expiring license to carry firearms permits:

• Permits that expired on March 19, 2020 or later have been extended to May 30, 2020.

• In Pennsylvania, an individual 21-years-old or older may apply for a license to carry firearms by submitting a completed application to the Sheriff of the county in which they reside or, if a resident of a city of the first class, with the chief of police of that city. The Sheriff has 45 days to investigate and determine an individual's eligibility to be issued a license, which is valid

• A license to carry firearms is required to carry a firearm concealed on one's person or in a vehicle. Any person who carries a firearm concealed on or about his person except in his place of abode or fixed place of business without a valid and lawfully issued license commits a felony of the third degree.

"This is very good news for all 67 Pennsylvania county Sheriff's offices," said PA Sheriffs' Association President, Timothy Chamberlain. "Sheriffs have been trying to balance the need of protecting Pennsylvanians from this coronavirus and the rights of gun owners. This extension will help everyone affected.'

Chamberlain, also the Sheriff of Columbia County, said that some counties have suspended license renewals, while others have gone to appointments or mail-in options. Anyone wishing to renew their permit should check their county Sheriff's office social media pages. Most of them have information on their current policies listed there.

"I applaud the Sheriffs of Pennsylvania who have made some really tough decisions in these challenging times," said Tom Maioli, Jr., PA Sheriffs' Association Executive Director. "I think I speak for everyone that we are all anxious to get back to business as usual."
