Young 22-year-old Dawson Walls was second; Dawson is in his full year of driving limited late models, after racing micro-sprints before that. For Dawson, it was his best effort to date with his second-place run. Chad Smith was third, with Tommy Slanker and Skylar Taschek, with Dawson Walls dad Michael sixth. Tommy Slanker has the number 94 on his silver late model to honor his dad and Uncle Dale who ran those colors and number back in the day. Scott Dellinger who his second winged super sportsman feature of the year at Baps holding off a strong running Kenny Edkin who drove from his sixteenth starting spot to a second-place finish. Third were Matt Ondek, Troy Hockenberry, and Timmie Barrick in the top five. Dave Dietz was credited with the street stock feature win after the first and second place cars were DQ in post racing inspection. Also, there was the passing of Ed Clark of Selinsgrove PA. Ed raced in a stock class at Selinsgrove. He was better known in his racing days as "Ralph Kramden" from the Honeymooners. He was 81 years old.

Port Royal, PA - Parking in Kish Bank victory was a battle of attrition Saturday night at Port Royal Speedway. When the dust settled and the rain ultimately came, it was Jake Karklin who would come out on top as the winner on Saturday night.

Karklin would start alongside Derek Hauck for the 25 lap A-main event in Weikert Livestock 410 sprint car competition. Trouble would start right out of the gate as Karklin would get a bit out of control on the start of the race which stacked up multiple cars behind him and would bring out the red flag.

A field that originally started with 24 cars would be whittled down to just 14 remaining once the field retook its shape.

Though Karklin was at the start of the accident, he was able to keep his car going and would maintain his pole position.

As the field fired back off, it was Derek Hauck who would jump out to the race lead.

As Karklin began to reel Hauck in and a battle for the lead began to take shape, Hauck's sprint car would lose power and slow to a stop on the front straightaway, brining out the caution flag and giving Karklin the lead.

With 22 laps remaining, Karklin would lead the field to green with Ryan Smith and AJ Flick tight on his tail to battle for the top position.

Karklin was able to keep Smith at bay over the next 10 laps, and as he caught lapped traffic, Smith's machine would also slow and see him exit the track giving Karklin a much more comfortable advantage over the now third running Doug Hammaker.

Though the breaks kept coming Karklin's way

seemingly, the driver of the 5K would once again slip up in turns three and four. Though he was able to keep the car straight ultimately and not bring out a caution flag, his multi-second advantage over Hammaker was now erased to under 0.8 seconds.

Karklin would get back hard on the throttle in an attempt to keep Hammaker out of arms' reach as Hammaker continued to close the gap in the closing laps.

The final break would fall Karklin's way for the night though, as rain would fall quickly onto the racing surface making the track unraceable and ultimately the night unsalvageable for the teams and the fans.

As there were only 3 laps remaining in the A-main, the race was deemed official and Karklin was ruled the night's winner.

The win is Karklin's first win in a 410 sprint car at Port Royal Speedway that sees him taking the winner's share of \$5,000.

Hammaker would take a career best finish of 2nd and AJ Flick would round out the top 3.

Buddy Schweibinz was the night's hard charging driver for going +15 from his 23rd starting spot.

Unfortunately the River Rock Campground limited late models and Penns Valley Meat Market 305 sprint car A-main events were not able to be completed and will be made up when both series return on April 18th.

Port Royal Speedway will be back in competition on April 11th with the PA Posse 410 Sprint Car Series racing for \$6,000 to win and the Penske Racing Shocks super late models.

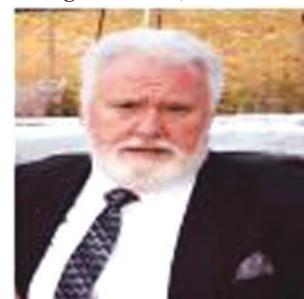

He leaves behind 3 loving children: daughter, Tammy and husband, Bryan Walter, and also 2 sons, George J.

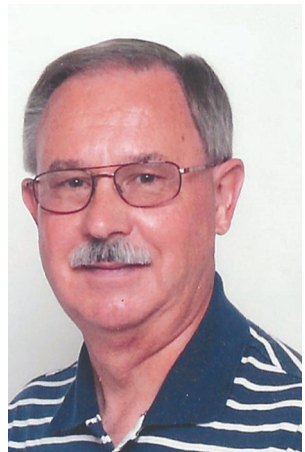

Voters are reminded that they may bring printed materials—including the Voters Guide or their personalized Vote411 selections—into the voting booth for reference.

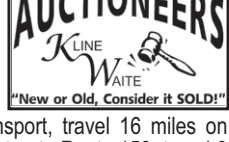

THE VIEW FROM HEAR

Let's put a bow on the college basketball season after UCLA and Michigan won their national titles. The Big Ten continues to distance itself from all the other conferences in college sports. They are the first conference to win three national titles in the same year in three sports with three different schools.

The new rules of NIL (college athletes being paid for their Name, Image and Likeness) has allowed the Big Ten conference to separate themselves from all other conferences. Big Ten schools are big, smart, affluent, prestigious and their graduates are spread all across the country.

The UCLA win over South Carolina in the title game was overshadowed by the theatrics the UConn coach displayed in Carolina's previous game. Geno Auriemma was way out of line with his displeasure of Carolina coach Dawn Staley not shaking his hand pre-game, if in fact that was the reason as Geno claimed. Videos show them both shaking hands before the game.

I don't care if he has the most career wins in women's college basketball history, you don't act like a petulant child. I actually came to respect Auriemma after his early, cocky years at UConn. Geno has a history of berating other hall of fame coaches. If he's not getting the headlines he will take it by doing what he did with Staley. You don't walk off the court before the game is over without acknowledging that the other team and coach were better than you.

The Michigan win over UConn in the men's championship was not an easy watch in the first half unless you appreciate great defense. Michigan won 69-63 after scoring ninety or more points in their previous five games in the tournament. Big Blue proved it could win any type of way.

The 33 points Michigan scored in the first half were all from the

paint or from foul shots. They shot just 2 for 15 from 3-point range but their size, depth and physicality was too much for UConn to handle.

Did you know that all five of their starters were not on the Michigan campus last year? They all transferred in from other schools. There is hope for your favorite team as the transfer portal for college basketball opened up this week.

This is why coaches have different models on how to build their rosters. Some take the top-rated high school recruits for the one and done athlete that will go to the NBA after one year. This is what Duke is currently doing and past John Calipari teams did. This year's tournament showed it's more difficult with one or two great freshmen on a team to beat the older and more veteran built teams.

Michigan this year and other teams pick and poach players they want through the transfer portal. Illinois took a team to the Final Four with six players from the Central Balkan region.

Expect new North Carolina coach Michael Malone to recruit that same Balkan region heavily as he builds his team for next year. Malone used to coach NBA star Nikola Jokic when he was with the Denver Nuggets. Jokic's agent has over forty players he represents from the Balkans region that play professional basketball in the Adriatic League.

These players can make more money playing college basketball in the States and I am sure Malone has already reached out to them. College hoops has always been transactional. Ten years ago it was signing a letter of intent, today it's about money and signing an NIL deal.

I really like the way Penn State football is reconnecting their current players with past Nittany Lions. I realize past players have always returned to Good Ole State for games and special events. This feels different as they are making a concerted effort to bring the football family closer. I'm not sure if new coach Matt Campbell was the impetus for this but someone should get credit.

Locally we had the Lewisburg girls track and field team sweep a tri-meet with Danville and Mid-West and the boys split in losing to Danville and beating the Mustangs.

It's no surprise that defending state champ Baylee Espinosa won the 1600 and 3200 and helped the 4x400 relay team take first place. Kate Batkowski was also a triple winner in the 300IM hurdles and ran a leg in both the 4x400 and 4x800 relays. Mid-West's Carly Faulhaber took first in the 100.

Justin Nolt took three golds for the Lewisburg boys. Nolt won the 1600, 3200 and 4x800. Connor Stoltzfus won the 400 and Wyatt Nelson the 800 for Mid-West. These two also combined with Lincoln Hoffman and Parker Eppley to take first in the 4x400 relay.

Lewisburg and Mid-West traveled to Cumberland Valley last weekend to compete in the 34 school field at the esteemed Bruce Dallas Invitational. Espinosa won the 3200 and Stoltzfus finished just .33 seconds behind the winner in the 800. The Lewisburg boys finished fourth in the team race and the Lewisburg girls finished third.

Props to the Miff LAX team as they handled Wyoming Area 17-5. Dalton DeLong had six goals and Brayden Hommel added three for the Cats first win of the year.

Mifflinburg remains undefeated on the diamond in both baseball and softball. Pitching was an afterthought in the first inning of the boys 17-5 win over Hughesville. Nine combined runs were scored by both teams in the first frame. The Spartans never scored again and

the Cats tacked on another 13 after a pep-talk from fired up pitching coach Steve Hackenberg.

JP Marr went 4 for 5 and scored three runs. Brennen Snyder went 2 for 4 with four runs and two ribs. Cole Reibosome was 3 for 5 with two runs and four RBIs.

Mid-West got a huge 4-2 win over Central Columbia. Emma Wagner was 2 for 4 and Katie Zimmerman's two-run double was clutch. Kylie Mitch allowed ten hits but didn't issue a walk with 7 K's. The Mustangs combined for four homers in handling Shamokin 17-4. Olivia Dorman had two of them and a double and Cali Sauer and Wagner went back to back long balls.

Mifflinburg finished the week undefeated at 5-0. Taylor Stewart and Mia Reibosome combined on a one-hit 12-0 shutout of Shamokin. 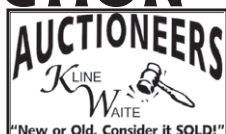
Coy Thomas Arnold Achieves Eagle Scout Rank
