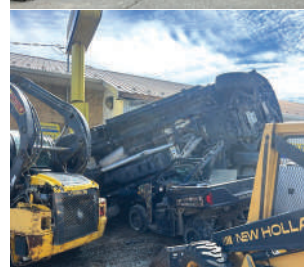
building and landed on top of the truck bed of the 2019 Ford F550 service truck parked at the business.

Keister used his lap and shoulder belts. He suffered a suspected minor injury and refused to be transported to a medical facility.

"We are glad that the driver was okay. The damage can be fixed," said Phillip Roush, store manager. B&R Farm Equipment, located at 15171 Rt. 522 in Beavertown, is owned by Kay and Kenneth Roush.

In addition to PA State Police, Beavertown Rescue Hose Company, Beavertown Rescue Hose and Reliance Hose EMS, and Stahl Bros. Towing responded to the scene.



On Saturday afternoon, March 21, 2026, B&R Farm Equipment experienced damage when a driver fell asleep at the wheel and struck several outdoor equipment machines and the building.

The vehicle driven by Ryan Keister, 39, of Middleburg was traveling southbound on Route 522 at the 15000 block in Beaver Township in Snyder County. The 2022 Ford F-150XLT traveled off the south side of the highway, struck a ditch and seven pieces of outdoor equipment machines including a dumpster at the B&R Farm Equipment property. Then, the Ford truck became airborne and struck the building. The truck came to an uncontrolled stop on its driver's side against the

# SPORTS NEWS

THE VIEW FROM HEAR  
BY RON BOLT

The easiest sport to win a PIAA state championship is Field Hockey followed closely by football. The most difficult, both boys and girls Track and Field. How do I know this? There is only an average of 90 schools in three classifications of field hockey and six tiers in football. Track and Field has an average 305 teams in two classes. The odds don't lie.

The PIAA hands out too many state titles across as many as six classifications. Ten years ago the PIAA added one or two classes to most girls and boys sports teams in an effort to provide a better competitive balance. They did this despite falling enrollments at all Pennsylvania schools.

Way back in 1998 you had to earn your state title as only two were handed out in softball and baseball. Basketball had three champions in 1983 when school enrollment was at its highest peak.

Since 2010, Cross Country, golf, lacrosse and volleyball have each added another title for both boys and girls teams. I understand the proliferation of more girls playing sports and the opportunity to play different sports each season... lacrosse, volleyball and wrestling. I think it's great that these opportunities exist today but it also weakens the core high school sports.

Imagine the two girls that played Jr High basketball and decided to wrestle when they got to high school. The high school hoops team would not be as good without those two. I remember way back, when two of the best athletes in my class who I played Little League and Teener baseball with didn't play in high school. They played tennis and golf instead of baseball in the Spring.

Club sports are also affecting high school teams with their travel leagues. If there's a scheduling conflict in baseball, I guarantee the family will forgo the high school game because of the money investment they have with the club team.

The number of high school students has declined 15% since 2000 and future projections have enrollments dropping further due to demographic changes and an older population base in Pennsylvania.

These are just some of the reasons the PIAA should consider making it more difficult and rewarding for teams to win a state title. The class you are assigned is based on male and female enrollment in grades 9,10 and 11 and adjusted every 2-3 years. The non-profit PIAA(?) divides the number of male and female students by the number of schools that participate in that sport.

The football example is 555 schools in PA have a varsity team. 555 divided by 6 = 92 average number of schools for six divisions, 1A to 6A. If a school has a male enrollment in grades 9-11 of 1-143 they are in 1A, 144-216 2A, 217-295 3A, 296-423 4A, 424-619 5A and 620-9999 6A.

If you have three tiers in football you would have 185 teams in each division. This would also help in regular season scheduling as it would be easier to play all your games against schools in your state classification and get rid of the crazy point ranking system we have in district qualifiers.

People will say a team with more students will have an advantage. Mifflinburg won this year's D4 3A title with by far the fewest male students in 3A, in fact had they had two less boys in grades 9-11 they would have played in 2A.

I am sure most of you have heard of or watched the movie Hoosiers. Up until 1997 the state of Indiana only had a single-class state tournament for high school basketball. In 1954 Milan high school with an enrollment of 161 beat Muncie high school with an enrollment over 1,600. That's what memories and movies are made for.

March is made for madness because of college basketball and wrestling. The older coaches are thriving in this tournament. When NIL arrived a few years back a couple of great and successful coaches walked away from coaching due to the new rules and bidding for players to come play for them.

It turns out the legends like Tom Izzo with Michigan State, Rick Pitino at Saint Johns and John Calipari at Arkansas have figured this new NIL recruiting out. Instead of hitting the AAU circuit and in-home visits for recruits, they have their program's General Manager write a check for the players they want.

You still have to make the right decisions on who you pay to bring on campus or you'll be like a couple of basketball bluebloods who made that mistake. Kentucky paid a record \$22M for this year's team and didn't make it out of the first week. Kentucky spent twice as much money than the highest paid team playing in the Sweet 16, Michigan. Total NIL basketball payoffs this year for the teams in the Sweet 16 ranges from \$7.2M to \$11M.

North Carolina is the other mighty basketball program that came up short. Expect both the Tar Heels and Wildcats to have a new head coach soon.

The Big Ten is reaping the benefits of the NIL era in all sports. Not only have they won the last three football titles with three different schools, they have six out of the sixteen teams still playing basketball. The vast number of well-heeled BIG grads all over the world from the largest schools in the country has led to great success in this NIL era.

The Big 10 didn't need NIL to become the most dominant conference in wrestling. They have been the best league over the last two decades and it goes deeper than just Penn State winning their fifth straight national team title. A rising tide raises all boats is so true for the Big Ten.

I said it in the Fall and most people don't agree but Oklahoma State will be challenging Penn State sooner than you think. Unfortunately Penn State will not schedule them in a dual meet as long as David Taylor is the Cowboys coach. It appears as if Cael Sanderson's biggest recruit and star when Cael took the job at Penn State burned a lot of bridges when he left to coach Okie State. David Taylor was an assistant to Sanderson and a driving force behind the Nittany Lion Wrestling Club.

My takeaways from the national wrestling tournament was the number of great freshmen stars and the big upsets in the finals. There were also way too many stoppages of action and brick tossing which was a reflection of some very poor officiating.

Major League Baseball had opening day this week and I am more than ready for the season to begin after the World Baseball Classic. There are going to be some disgruntled fans when they find out more games are going to be streamed this year. Netflix has joined Peacock, Apple TV and Amazon Prime in exclusive broadcasts of certain games. Here's a quick look at the local favorite teams.

There weren't many changes with the Yankees and they should improve on their 94 regular season wins from last year. Ben Rice and Austin Wells will be bigger contributors and Ryan McMahon at 3B will be a lot better. The health of returning starting pitchers Gerrit Cole and Carlos Rodon in May/June will determine the Yankees post-season fate.

The Orioles will be vastly improved and their offense gained some pop by getting Pete Alonso and Taylor Ward. Gunnar Henderson is their best overall player. Two rookies to keep an eye on are Samuel Basallo and Dylan Beaver.

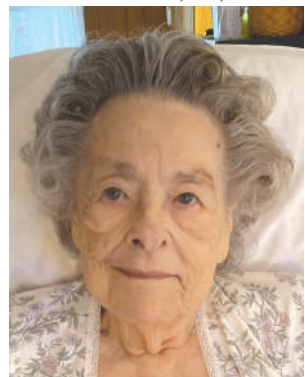

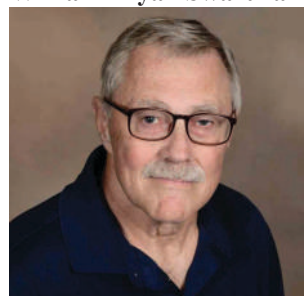

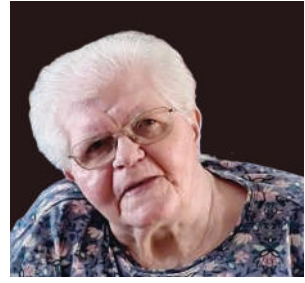

# Margie Krebs' Philosophy Is To Live Fully, Give Back, & Serve Others

At 90, Margie Krebs of Beavertown puts the Nifty in the Nifty 90's! She is always on the go! She embraces her philosophy to live fully, to give back, and to serve others daily and with every fiber of her being.

Her teaching career spans several subject areas and grade levels. "Through the years, I have seen former students, now adults, parents and grandparents. We share stories and memories. What a blessing!"

Margie began her career by teaching English at Middleburg High School and general music at Penns Creek and Perry-West-Perry Elementary Schools.

When she was transferred to West Snyder High School to teach vocal music, they produced two concerts a year. She will occasionally talk to some of her singers who remind her of various songs they sang. "One former student often remembers the time we sang the 'Hallelujah Chorus.' He was so touched by that music," said Margie.

"I also directed six musicals. There were lots of hours of preparation and rehearsals but so worth the time and energy... They were memorable experiences."

Later, Margie served her school family in another way. She earned a master's degree in counseling. She became a guidance counselor at West Snyder High School. "Recently, a former student thanked me for helping her get a part-time job with a local business. That job, she said, became her lifetime career and she was grateful for that earlier experience," noted Margie. Another student became a teacher because of Mrs. Krebs. "I never knew that but consider it an honor. Teaching is an awesome responsibility. We may never know the influence we have on students. Hopefully, always in a positive way."

"I love to learn and when I graduated from high school, I had interests in several fields. I chose music and English. But nursing was a close second," explained Margie. "So, I started nursing school as an older student. I retired in 1997 as an elementary counselor and finished the nursing education at Geisinger Medical Center. I worked as a nurse in the hospital and then two nursing homes. After I retired from these, I substituted as a school nurse in the Mid-West School District and Selinsgrove School District."

For 15 years Margie served as the camp nurse for the 5th Grade Outdoor Education program at Camp Mount Luther. The program was 2 nights and 3 days. Many students had never stayed overnight or away from home. So, some experienced homesickness. One evening close to dark, a boy came to Nurse Krebs with a stomach ache. "I opened a can of ginger ale. I poured some for him and some for myself and we sat and talked. He was tired after a busy day first day and finally decided to go to his cabin to sleep. In the morning, he and I celebrated. He made the first night!"

Well, the second night was repeat of the first night. More ginger ale, more talking, and more listening on Margie's part. "Again, I checked with him at breakfast. He smiled and exclaimed, 'I made it!' But, added quickly, 'Today, we go home.'"

At lunchtime Margie walked around talking to the students and congratulating them on a successful camp adventure. The boy grabbed Margie by the arm at smiled at her. "You remind me of my grandma."

"What a compliment! I'm guessing his grandmother listened, encouraged, protected, cared, and guided. At that moment I knew it was all worth sleeping on a hard bed, sitting with those who were homesick or sick, getting up at 4 o'clock in the morning to walk through the woods to give a student his medicine and being on call around the clock," Margie recalled.

Recently, a young man, pushing a baby stroller, stopped at Margie's stand at the Beaver Fair. "He said his older son had a scout outing at Camp Mount Luther. When he heard Camp Mt. Luther, he said he thought of me. He said he was sick at camp and I took care of him."

"I loved teaching; I loved counseling; I loved nursing and I still do. I love people and I love life. I'm still teaching. I teach piano at a private school. I substitute as a school nurse for Middle-West School District. And, I still use my counseling skills as I care for kids." When former or current students recognize Margie, it is always a bonus and warms her heart.

When asked why she still works, Margie sometimes jokes that she "has to work support her addiction". She has a passion for sewing! She buys sewing machines, fabric and sewing notions. She attends sewing classes to learn new techniques and new ideas. She makes quilts and many other needful things.

However, the reason she still works is because she loves people. "I'm loyal to the school district where I taught for 33 years. I have a work ethic that my parents taught me," she said.

"And, I believe God gave me the opportunities to learn, to study, and to use these skills to help others. I tell people that if I quit everything it would like poking God in the eye and saying, 'I'm done.' That would be wrong. I'd be wasting what He has given me, throwing it away." Then she added emphatically, "I'm not done yet!"

"I truly believe that we grow old when we stop living. And then, we literally...stop living."

In addition to all of her school activities, Margie has continued to give back to the community as well. In 2011, Margie became director of the West Snyder Community Choir. The choir performed at many Memorial Day events, Christmas shows, and more. She was always researching new themes, information about composers about why they wrote the words to the music. Margie tried to connect the words to the music to draw in the audience.

Margie also directs the annual carol sing at the tree lighting in Beavertown. Margie is actively involved with the Beaver Community Fair by being the Superintendent of the Craft Department. "At last year's fair, I heard another volunteer say, 'We do this for the kids.' That is worth every minute, every hour, every day of time and energy."

"I do have strong feelings about keeping busy and serving until I no longer can. I feel very blessed," said Margie. "I firmly believe that, after retiring, one should continue to live and move. I do have a strong feeling about volunteering, working until the last breath."

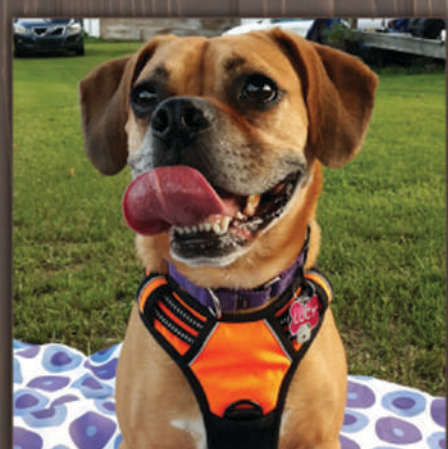

# Beta Sigma Phi Donates to Five Barley Loaves

On February 5, 2026, Beta Sigma Phi of Middleburg hosted Darla Webb of the Five Barley Loaves Food Pantry that ministers to western Snyder County. The group learned about the organization and its mission. Members also generously donated food items to the food bank.

Five Barley Loaves was established in 1983 by local churches. Initially, the food was distributed from the Center Street location in Beaver Springs. Then it moved to Route 522 Beaver Springs. It is currently located at 6 West Specht Street in McClure.

The monthly food distribution at Five Barley Loaves is a Drive Thru Food Bank. Boxes of food are pre-packed. When the clients pull up, they pop their trunks and the food is placed inside their vehicle. No one has to exit their vehicle. Five Barley Loaves Food Bank is held the last Friday of month from 10-11 am, except in the months of November and December. During those months, it is distributed earlier due to the holidays.

Food is provided to residents of western Snyder County. The program is income based. During 2025, there were 980 families who received food with 2645 people being served. Of those being served, 1/3 are senior over 60, 1/3 are adults, and 1/3 are children 18 and under.

Currently, there are 120 households enrolled each month. A special program was also established to assist elder folks over age 60 that is also age and income based. They receive the regular food box plus additional cheese and packaged food. Elder Share is administered by the USDA.

"It works out fine. It always does," said Webb. "By providing food, clients then have more funds to purchase prescriptions and other needs."

In the winter months, clients receive more canned goods with fresh fruits and vegetables distributed seasonally.

Temporary Emergency Food Assistance is available for people in need during the month due to health issues, loss of employment, fire, lost housing, new families moving to the area, and financial need. Contact the Union Snyder Community Action Agency or call Darla Webb directly at 570-658-6278.

Approximately 16 dedicated volunteers assist with the monthly distribution and help to prepack the food. No staff members receive any compensation for their service. "My volunteers are amazing," exclaimed Webb. Five Barley Loaves only closes when the Middle West School District is closed.

In addition to grants, the food bank also depends on donations from groups such as Beta Sigma Phi, Boy Scout food drives, local churches, businesses and individuals. Conestoga and its employees have been very generous supporters with food collections/donation. In November 2025, Conestoga generously donated 120 turkeys for the Thanksgiving distribution.

"We are supported by the community for which we are thankful," noted Webb.

All foods are accepted, but please check expiration dates. Monetary donations are greatly appreciated and are used to help pay for oil, electric, liability insurance and other miscellaneous items needed to operate the food pantry as well as additional supplies.

"Thank you so much for your donations. Your generosity and support mean everything to our food bank and to the community we serve," said Webb. "We are truly blessed."

Beta Sigma Phi Middleburg was excited to donate to this great cause supporting those in need in our communities. This small but mighty group always donates generously to their chosen service projects.

"I was surprised to learn how many families are being served by Five Barley Loaves Food Bank. Just one more sign that people in our community are in need of help. Please help wherever and whenever you can," said Beta Sigma Phi member, Nancy Stull.

# REC Decides Not to Move Forward with Intergenerational Center Project

The Regional Engagement Center (REC) in Selinsgrove recently announced that it has halted its plan to create a new intergenerational center and would instead continue to focus on providing essential programs, resources, and services at its current facility.

According to REC President Kelly Feiler, the decision to stop pursuing a new building was due to a number of factors including site acquisition and sewer access issues, land development costs, rising construction costs and local municipal partnership concerns.

"While the REC has a tremendous record of serving youth and their families and providing excellent programs for citizens of all ages, we found difficulty in securing a site that made economic sense," Feiler said "There's too much uncertainty, questions about suitable sites, and potential cost that would not be recuperated for years, if ever, to move forward with the project."

The REC had planned to use an earmarked, not distributed, \$2 million state grant and another \$1 million in federal housing funds as the financial foundation for a proposed \$4 million intergenerational center. The center was slated to be a multi-faceted, multi-layered facility designed for enhanced services for the entire community. The original planned structure would have provided housing for seniors but also have room for student programming and space for business development.

"While the REC board decided against continuing to develop a new center, our leadership remains determined and in position to provide excellent services and community resources where they are now located," Board Chair, Melissa Laniewski, said.

The REC currently offers a wide array of programs at its facility. These include Free After School and Summer Drop-In, food distribution, community exercise classes, leadership club, and mental health resources among other programs to engage the community, like the Adult Prom and Community Art Show.

Last academic year, the REC had more than 340 students registered for its after school Drop-In Program. It currently has more than 300 registered this year and is aiming to surpass last year's mark, Feiler noted. The program provides students with a safe place to gather, enjoy a meal, gain help with homework, learn leadership skills, and enjoy recreational opportunities.

"There are so many avenues available for the REC to have a positive impact on the region's quality-of-life right where we are," Feiler said. "We will be thoughtful and progressive in our efforts to add new programs and offer meaningful assistance to the community at large."

"The REC has a robust menu of programs and services that it now offers," said Board member, Robert Bertram. "Instead of incurring a slew of up-front building and site preparation costs that may not ultimately resolve outstanding issues and would require bridge loans, we think it best to direct our energy toward making the programs at our current facility even better and more accessible."

The original construction plan called for the repurposing of the Selinsgrove Inn into the new center. However, the Inn was sold prior to the REC being preliminarily awarded the federal and state monies. As a result, various other sites both in Selinsgrove and in nearby communities were considered, yet each raised potential site development and construction issues that were unresolvable, Feiler said.

Feiler confirmed that the REC will notify both the federal Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) and the State Budget Office, the governmental entities that awarded the grants, that the board has decided against moving the project forward. Feiler also expressed their appreciation of former U.S. Senator Bob Casey, former state Sen. John Gordner, Sen. Lynda Schlegel Culver and local officials for their belief in and support of the project.

# Free Workshop for People Joining Medicare



The Weis Center for the Performing Arts will welcome Jazz supergroup Artemis on Friday, March 27 at 7:30 p.m. at the Weis Center, just days after their Carnegie Hall appearance. Founded by pianist and composer Renee Rosnes in 2017, ARTEMIS—named for the Greek goddess—is a multinational, multigenerational ensemble of jazz instrumental virtuosos. Its current lineup includes pianist Renee Rosnes, trumpeter Ingrid Jensen, tenor saxophonist Nicole Glover, bassist Noriko Ueda, and drummer Allison Miller.
