

The feature was rained out after all qualifying was completed on Friday May 9th, another program for the 305-sprints will also be run along with Pro-Stocks 270-Micro sprints and four-cylinders.



Washington Township, Snyder County Partners with Freeburg and Fremont Fire Departments for Enhanced Emergency Response

In an effort to improve emergency response times and provide more efficient service to residents, Washington Township in Snyder County has officially restructured its fire protection plan. Effective immediately, the township will now be served by two primary fire departments: the Freeburg Fire Department and the Fremont Fire Department. This move comes with a clearly defined coverage plan and a formal operational partnership between the two organizations.

Under the updated service plan, the Fremont Fire Department will now be the primary fire service provider for the portions of Washington Township closest to Mt. Pleasant Mills, including Route 104 and continuing down Route 35 to Summit Road. The Freeburg Fire Department will serve as the primary department for the remainder of the township. This reallocation is aimed at ensuring faster, more geographically appropriate emergency responses throughout the area.

As part of this restructuring, the departments have entered into a formal operational agreement. Any emergency incident larger than a local alarm in Washington Township, the Borough of Freeburg, or Perry Township will now receive a joint response from both departments. This agreement enhances resource availability, particularly during weekday hours when volunteer staffing may be limited.

In addition, both departments will share key resources, such as fire police, and may explore shared administrative duties in the future. These efficiencies could also strengthen their eligibility for regional grant funding, helping both departments continue to grow and modernize

To further enhance service delivery, both fire departments have updated their box cards-the dispatch protocols used to assign fire units to emergencies. These updates now include mutual aid from

surrounding fire departments if they are closer or better positioned to respond. This ensures that residents receive the fastest response possible, regardless of fire district lines.

Despite working closely together under this agreement, both the Fremont and Freeburg Fire Departments will retain their own identities and remain in control of their own finances, maintaining the traditions and leadership

ment, both departments will be training together and building a strong foundation for future en-deavors," added Freeburg Fire Chief Curtis Wray. "Our chief staffs have worked hard to develop an agreement that will always ensure the residents receive the best possible service when they call 911."

This reorganization reflects a proactive strategy to address future public safety needs while continuing to prioritize quick response, service quality, and community collaboration. Residents will begin seeing the benefits of this partnership immediately through joint training exercises, increased coordination, and a stronger emergency presence across township and municipal

The proposed plan also provides openings, door clearances, and a clear flow around the space for a wheelchair. CDBG FFY 2023 and FFY 2025 funds estimated in the amount of \$239.354.82 will be used for this project.

The purpose of the Public Hearing is to discuss the Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) program in general, the needs of the County and the County, 'obo' Selinsgrove Borough and Penn Township's, performance under the previously funded CDBG Program years, and to discuss the required Three – Year Community Development Plan of the Snyder County, Selinsgrove Borough and Penn Township.

Snyder County and Snyder County 'obo' Selinsgrove Borough and Penn Township, is expected to receive an allocation of approximately \$443,970 of FY 2025 CDBG funds from the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. The following types of activities may be eligible for funding under the CDBG Program: water and sewer line replacement and improvements; housing rehabilitation; construction of affordable housing; construction/reconstruction of public/community facilities; recreational facilities; public services that are new or provide quantifiable increases in the delivery of services; street improvements; historic preservation; removal of architectural barriers; code enforcement; economic development; acquisition and relocation; clearance and demolition; and general admin istration, planning, audit if required, and preparation of the CDBG application.

If Snyder County and Snyder County 'obo' Selinsgrove Borough and Penn Township would undertake activities that result in the displacement of families or individuals, then the County's policy for minimizing such displacement would be in effect. Snyder County and Snyder County 'obo' Selinsgrove Borough and Penn Township is responsible for replacing all low- and moderate-income housing units that may be demolished or converted as a result of the use of CDBG funds.

In April, Bonnie Swinehart, author of the "Benjy" book series visited Middleburg Elementary School to share the joy of reading and her love of writing. During her visit, she talked to the students about where to find inspiration for a story and offered tips on how to make

stories come to life. Swinehart also read a small part of her story, Benjy and the Belsnickel, to the students.

According to Swinehart, "After many hours of work and research, my dream of publishing a children's chapter book came true with the release of "Benjy and the Belsnickel," a book inspired by the wretched Belsnickel character and stories of my parent's childhood memories growing up around one-room schoolhouses in the 1930s."

Belsnickel is related to the folklore of German-speaking Europe. Belsnickel is described as being dressed in black from head to toe, porcupine quills in his hat, a whip in his hand, and bells that jingle with every step.He carries a switch in his hand to scare children into making better decisions, but Belsnickel also has pockets full of cakes, candies, and nuts for good children.

Benjy and the Belsnickel tells the tale of Benjy, a lovable eleven-year-old in the 1930s, who just can't seem to help himself from pulling pranks and letting people down. His target is most often Miss Nettie, the schoolmarm at the one-room schoolhouse where he gets into more trouble than she's willing to tolerate. Maybe he's pulled one too many practical jokes...because everyone keeps telling him he's going to get a visit from the Belsnickel. Although Benjy believes the Belsnickel is just an old Pennsylvanian folktale told to scare kids into better behavior, deep down he fears the grim legend is real. When the Belsnickel comes knocking, Benjy quickly learns he is no fable.

Swinehart explained different aspects of the writing process. One important concept is that all stories must have a beginning, middle, and end. She also discussed knowing your audience- who you are writing for and what do you want them to feel. She encouraged using action words and painting a picture in your mind of your story.

Swinehart helped the students to imagine the scene. "I read portions of my books while asking the kids to close their eyes. After reading an action scene from my books, I asked them if they were able to see the picture I painted. Many, many, hands went up."

For Jaxon Smith the author visit was an interesting experience. "I liked hearing her read the stories that she wrote."

Another second-grade student eagerly exclaimed, "I liked to hear about the books she wrote because I love reading!I enjoyed listening to a little part about Benjy and the Belsnickel!"

"The visits were great. The students were very engaged and interactive and I hope they learned some things that will encourage them to read, write, and believe in themselves," said Swinehart of her visits."I hope somebody's life was touched like mine was to chase their dream."
