

Danny Dietrich had to come from deep in the field to place 8th in the feature to win his second Grove 410-sprint title, Dietrich was 185 points behind Freddie Rahmer going into the night, with Rahmer not qualifying for the feature, Danny raced from his 19th starting spot to the spot he needed and won the title by 10-points. Right now, in the Hosehead sprint car series point standings Anthony Macri leads the way with 22 wins and 1973 points Dietrich is second with 12-wins and 1722 with Brent Marks 10-wins and 1382. Bridgeport speedway will be the site for the next three 410-sprint car races, followed by BAPS Motor speedway for the final race of the local season on Saturday November 12th. Talk about a hot driver check out the run by Big Block

Modified driver Matt Sheppard of Waterloo, N.Y. who over the last month has won all of the big Modified races, starting with Fulton 200, Super Dirt week at Oswego, Port Royal Speed showcase event and last weekend the Orange County Eastern States 200. The money he has earned just over four weekends amounts to over \$200,000 and is now close to \$800,000 for the season. Super Matt has now over 40-wins for the season, with a few events left on his schedule including the race at the world Finals in Charlotte, N.C. next month.

Last weekend the Pass 305-sprint series drew a field of 51-drivers for the final race of the season at Port Royal speedway. Kenny Heffner looked to been his way to the feature win and the \$800-plus winners share when he and second place Drew Ritchey both got caught up in a wreck with two other cars they were about to lap, which handed the win over to Logan Spahr over Garrett Bard. Dillan Stake won his sixth limited late model feature of the year and also scored his first ever track championship. Bap's speedway which also ran on Friday night had Gio Scelzi score the feature win over Justin Peck. It was the third 410-sprint at Baps this season with four other races falling victims to rain outs, Danny Dietrich and Brent Marks also have wins at Baps. Kyle Lear scored the win in the limited late model class, but the week before Steve Lowery won the divisions track title, with his consistent runs as he did not win a feature there all season out of the 14-races on their schedule. The Wingless sportsman feature went to Craig Perigo over Steve Wilbur and Billy Brian Jr., Kameron Morral won the 600-micro feature with Selinsgrove driver Brice Harro placing 6th and Middleburg driver and Clinton County champ Trevor Teats 11th. Over 100 drivers were on hand for the final event at Path Valley

This coming weekend with a bit of a travel trip fans can choose between seeing three different sprint car divisions at Bridgeport speedway in New Jersey or the super late models and Big Block Modifieds at Georgetown speedway in Delaware. Fall Turkey Season Approaches

The excitement of turkey hunting doesn't have to wait for

Pennsylvania's fall turkey season, an annual opportunity to pursue the state's only big-game bird among the changing colors of the autumn woods, kicks off Saturday, Oct. 29 in 19 of Pennsylvania's 23 Wildlife Management Units (WMUs.)

The fall season is closed in WMUs 5A, 5C and 5D. For the remaining WMUs the season lengths are as follows: WMUs 1A, 1B, 4A, 4B, 4D and 4E – Oct. 29-Nov. 5; WMU 2B – Oct. 29-Nov. 18 and Nov. 23-25; WMUs 2A, 2F, 2G, 2H, 3A, 3B, 3C, 3D and 4C - Oct. 29-Nov. 12; WMU 2C, 2D & 2E - Oct. 29-Nov. 12 and Nov. 23-25; and WMU 5B - Nov. 1-3. Hunters are advised the three-day Thanksgiving season again will run Wednesday, Thursday and Friday where held.

As a reminder, no single-projectile firearms may be used in the fall turkey seasons. Hunters may use shotguns and archery While fall turkey hunters no longer are required to wear fluo-

rescent orange, the Game Commission highly recommends the use of orange, especially while moving Season outlook

During the fall season, any turkey - male or female - can be harvested. Female turkeys make up about 60% of the fall

When turkey populations are below-goal in a given WMU, the fall season length is reduced there to allow more female turkeys to survive to their spring nesting season. Turkey populations in many WMUs were measured below the management goal. Therefore, in 2021, season length in

15 of the 21 WMUs was shortened, or closed, and the use of single-projectile rifles and handguns was eliminated. The 2021 statewide fall harvest (6,800 turkeys) was 20% lower than 2020. Statewide fall hunter participation (81,500 hunters) was 19% less than 2020.

But things are looking up.

Turkey reproduction in 2021 and 2022 was above average across many WMUs.

"This typically results in larger fall flocks," said Game Commission wild turkey biologist Mary Jo Casalena. And there's plenty of spots where hunters can put themselves

in good position to take a bird. Expect to find turkey brood flocks concentrated on available

food sources, such as areas with acorn production or agricultural areas," Casalena said. Casalena also encourages hunters to cover a lot of ground to find available food sources. When abundant food is found,

determining turkey movement patterns around that food will improve hunter success. Hunters during fall turkey season share the woods with hunters participating in many other hunting seasons. But fall turkey hunting has proven remarkably safe. 2021 marked the fifth year since 2012 with no hunting related shooting incidents while fall

2016, 2018, and 2019. Harvests and reporting

Everyone who purchases a hunting license receives one fall

turkey hunting. The other years with no incidents were 2012,

Successful fall turkey hunters must tag their birds according to instructions provided on the printed harvest tags supplied with

their licenses, then report harvests. Mentored hunters under the age of 7 may receive, by transfer,

a fall turkey tag supplied by their mentor. The turkey must be tagged immediately after harvest and before the turkey is moved, and the tag must be securely attached to a leg until the bird is prepared for consumption or mounting.

Within 10 days of harvest, turkey hunters must report harvests to the Game Commission, either by going online to the Game Commission's website, www.pgc.pa.gov, calling toll-free or mailing in a prepaid postcard.

Hunters reporting their turkey harvests over the telephone can call 1-800-838-4431 and follow the prompts. Hunters will need to have their license and their copy of the harvest tag in front of them when they make the call. Hunters should record the sup-

plied confirmation number for the turkey reported. All hunters reporting harvests are asked to identify the WMU. county and township where the bird was taken.

Additionally, hunters may harvest a turkey that has been legbanded for research purposes, and if so, they should follow the instructions on the band. The Game Commission leg-banded more than 800 turkeys last winter in a continuing effort to track turkey populations.

Handling harvested birds

Pennsylvania recently saw a wild turkey test positive for Highly Pathogenic Avian Influenza (HPAI). While turkeys are highly susceptible to the influenza virus, their behavior and habitat use place them at less risk of contracting the disease compared to waterfowl, shorebirds, raptors and avian scavengers.

"This isn't a concern in terms of affecting the entire turkey population," said Game Commission Wildlife Management Bureau Director Matthew Schnupp, "but occurrence will be impossible to predict."

Turkey hunters, and others hunting birds, should take HPAI precautions when handling harvests. In doing so, they not only protect themselves, but help reduce the risk of this extremely contagious disease spreading to other birds. Bird hunters should:

Harvest only healthy-looking wild birds.

Wear gloves when handling any wild birds.

Wash hands with soap and water or an alcohol-based hand

sanitizer immediately after handling wild birds. Dress harvested wild birds in the field. · Change clothing as needed, especially if visibly soiled or if any

wild birds came in contact with clothing.

Change clothing, including footwear, before coming in contact with any pet birds or domestic poultry.

Wash all equipment, tools, and work surfaces with soap and water, then disinfect with a 10% household bleach solution. Allow to air dry or rinse after 10 minutes of contact time. HPAI can infect humans, though just one human HPAI case

has been reported in the United States during this outbreak. Any sick or dead domestic birds should be reported to the Pennsylvania Department of Agriculture at 717-772-2852. Sick

or dead wild birds should be reported to the Game Commission at 1-833-PGC-WILD or online using the Wildlife Health Survey tool at www.pgcapps.pa.gov/WHS. AUCTION

Teen Driver Safety Week

Teen Driver Safety Week was observed on October 16-

22 but is important every day. "Motor vehicle crashes are a leading cause of death for

teens," said PennDOT Deputy Secretary for Driver and Vehicle Services Kurt Myers. "Parents and teachers have an important role to play in helping new drivers establish safe driving habits. From 2017 to 2021, there were 81,364 crashes involving

at least one 16- to 19-year- old driver in Pennsylvania, resulting in 480 fatalities. 66 percent of those crashes involved a teen driver driving too fast for conditions (25,721 crashes), driver inexperience (8,707), driver distraction (12,411) or improper/careless turning (13,092). There was a total of 53,673 crashes with one or more of these factors

The risk of a crash involving any of these factors can be reduced through practice, limiting the number of passengers riding with a new driver, obeying all rules of the road, and using common sense.

"Setting a good example in the driver's seat is one of the most important things you can do as a parent or caregiver of a teen driver," said Colonel Robert Evanchick, commissioner of the Pennsylvania State Police. "Positive examples include eliminating distractions in the vehicle, obeying the speed limit, never driving while impaired, and remembering to buckle up every time."

PennDOT suggests that parents consider the following recommendations to help their children become safe and responsible drivers: • Set a good example with

your own driving habits.

Have regular conversations with your teen about safe driving skills before they get their learner's permit.

Establish a parent/teen driving contract.

Ride with your teen occasionally after they receive their license to monitor driving skills.

Enforce observance of speed limits and other rules of the road.

· Strongly encourage your teen to avoid distractions behind the wheel, such as talking or texting on their cell phone.

 Limit the number of passengers they have in their vehicle. State law prohibits 16- and 17-yearolds with a junior license from driving with more than one unrelated passenger under the age of 18 years old for the first six months. After the first six months, a junior driver shall not drive a vehicle with more than three unrelated passengers under 18 years old.

· Limit dawn, dusk, and nighttime driving until your teen gains more experience and enforce a curfew. Remember, state law prohibits 16- and 17-year-olds with a junior license from driving be-tween 11:00 pm and 5:00

• Gradually increase the amount of time/distance your teen is permitted to

"Driving a car requires experience, skill, and unfactors that improve with repetition and training,' said Acting Department of Education Secretary Eric Hagarty. "Through driver education training programs, teenage drivers receive valuable instruction that prepares them to get behind the wheel, keeping themselves, their passengers, and fellow drivers safe on the road."
