THE VIEW FROM HEAR

The high school winter sports teams are in full swing and I predict our schools will once again win four District 4 titles this winter. I picked four to win Fall district titles and hit it right. Lewisburg boys soccer (state champs) and their girls XC team. Grove field hockey and Mifflinburg football also won D4 championships.

I'd like to put a lid on the Fall season with those student-athletes named first team All-Stars. Lewisburg PHAC-III first teamers are Jaylen Walker (WR) and Ethan Long (LB).

Mifflinburg had QB Chad Martin, Cheeky Griffith and Larry Murray (WR), Landon Tucker and Xavier Croll (OL), Landon Moser (LB), Griffith (CB) and Murray (ATH). Chad Martin was also named PHAC-II Player of the Year.

Wrestling season is here as Penn State continues to get better if that is possible. Tye Boyer was officially named the head coach at Midd-West, and Selinsgrove and Mifflinburg began their seasons with strong starts.

Boyer picked up his first win as his Mustangs beat Juniata 36-25. Evan Maneval sealed the victory with a 50 second pin in the final match. Grove dominated Shamokin 69-3 with 10 bonus point wins. The Seals then traveled to the Jarvis Tournament in Athens and took the team title. Jack Peters went unbeaten with three tech falls and a pin.

Mifflinburg placed third behind PA wrestling powerhouses Emmaus and Connellsville at the prestigious Top Hat tournament in Williamsport. Ben Straub and Landon Tucker both took gold medals home for the Wildcats.

On the hardwoods, the Lewisburg boys basketball team is looking for big results this year. They are off to a 3-0 start with their strong post play inside and sharpshooters outside. Cooper Mowry hit five treys to lead the Dragons 58-41 over Shamokin. Lewisburg followed that game by beating North Schuylkill 51-43. Lewisburg finished their week off beating Jersey Shore 64-42. Leon Tucker had 24 points with Jaylen Walker and Nazir Meredith adding 10 points each.

Grove started their season with a 61-45 win over Holy Redeemer. Xavier Jackson scored 21 points and Mac DeFazio had 13. Selinsgrove made a valiant effort in the fourth quarter but fell short 57-52 to Mount Carmel. DeFazio ended with 15 and Jack Piecuch came off the bench for 14 points.

Midd-West is looking for a better season with all-star D'Zani Coley leading the way. Coley had 16 points in the Mustangs 65-44 loss to Line Mountain. Abram Sellers chipped in with 14 points.

Mifflinburg came back from a 5 point halftime deficit to beat Montoursville 64-62. Chad Martin scored 12 of his 17 points in the third quarter. Cheeky Griffith led all scorers with 29 and Grady Brubaker added 16. Mifflin County erupted for 29 points in the third quarter to hand Mifflinburg their first L 79-60. Martin had five 3's for the Wildcats.

Jackson Griffith scored his 1,000th career point in a 70-45 win over Danville. In doing so Cheeky made the Griffith name the First Family of Mifflinburg basketball. His sister Riley and father Scott are also members of the Mifflinburg 1,000 point club. His mother and coach Kelly

scored 1K points at Wellsboro.

The Selinsgrove girls have gotten off to a surprisingly slow start in losing their first three games. They lost to Upper Dauphin 50-20, Southern Columbia 37-24 and Jersey Shore 36-25. They hosted the Angela Wolfe Memorial tournament and held Southern scoreless in the first quarter of their first game but only scored 2 points of their own in the second quarter. They eventually lost 37-24 and were beaten by JS 36-25 in the consolation game.

Lewisburg girls had a strong second half in beating Danville 40-37. Addy Shedleski had 11 rebounds and 7 points. The Dragonettes fell to Hughesville 58-30 after the Spartans jumped out to a 24-3 lead.

Mifflinburg got off to a fast start in beating Juniata 37-33 and Warrior Run 46-29. The Reibosome sisters, Mia and Avery, combined for 24 points in the W over Juniata.

Susquehanna football is once again playing their best football in the playoffs and are in the Elite 8. They shut-out Eastern 29-0 in the third round of the Division III playoffs. The River Hawks never allowed Eastern QB Brett Nabb, MAC player of the year, to get untracked. SU's defense created three turnovers and held Eastern to 158 total yards. They play John Hopkins this Saturday at noon.

Props have to go out to the Southern Columbia football team in winning their 15th PA state football championship. This was their eighth title in the last nine years. Another more amazing football story is Curt Cignetti and his turn-around of Indiana football.

Before Cignetti arrived in Bloomington, IN the Hoosiers had the worst record in the history of college football. In less than two years he has IU in their second college playoffs and are currently the top ranked and only undefeated team in major college football. How and what he has done has flown under the radar. Remember all the publicity and clicks Deion Sanders got at Colorado just for a winning record?

Closer to home, Penn State has finally hired their new coach for next year ... and way beyond. Matt Campbell left Iowa State for a blueblood program with more resources and bigger expectations. What took so long?

The week started with the real possibility of getting BYU's coach, Kalani Sitake, until the cookie crumbled. Sitake's a really good coach but in my mind was not a good fit. Penn State ended the week by hiring Campbell, an eastern Ohio native who coached at Toledo before Iowa State.

This would have been the best hire a week after firing James Franklin. It is made all the more satisfying after a debacle of a hiring search that took more than fifty days.

The great news kept coming the next day when Penn State retained interim coach Terry Smith and signed him to a four year contract as assistant head coach. Smith is a great recruiter and has a personal connection to current players on the roster. It might take a year to get back to the CFP but when Campbell gets the Nittany Lions to the title game he can call up his college roommate and Eagles coach Nick Sirianni to celebrate.

Speaking of the College Football Playoff, they might get it right one of these years. Coaches always talk

about the process when trying to put a winning team on the field. The selection committee for the CFP needs to change their process. The goal is to get the twelve best teams in the end.

I don't have a problem throwing a bone to one Group of Five schools (5 conferences that are not the SEC, B1G, ACC or Big 12). You don't give them two! I have a better chance of going a month without eating a slice of pizza than Tulane or James Madison have of winning two playoff games. You have to win four games for the title unless you are one of the four schools with a bye.

The reason we have this mess is the CFP bylaws state the five highest ranked conference champions receive an invitation. Duke won the ACC with an 8-5 record and weren't even ranked. Tulane was the AAC champ and ranked #20 and James Madison won the Sun Belt conference and were ranked #24.

Notre Dame has a legitimate complaint for not making the playoffs. Miami and Alabama would as well if they didn't make it. By no means am I lobbying for the Irish. What I don't understand is why Notre Dame was ranked higher than Miami for all of the CFP rankings until the last one after neither team played a game.

I know Miami beat ND in their first game of the year head to head. They both had two losses and Miami's were to lesser teams, but Notre Dame was ranked higher than The U in all four weeks leading up to the final rankings. ESPN and the CFP reduced Notre Dame to a plot twist in their silly weekly television show. It felt like Notre Dame was being set up for disappointment.

All four teams that lost in their Power 4 conference title games dropped at least one spot in the final CFP rankings, except one. Alabama was boat-raced by Georgia 28-7 in the SEC title game and stayed at #9 and ND went from #10 to #11...Notre Dame rushed for more yards in the SEC title game than Alabama did! Miami went from #12 to #10.

Notre Dame has decided to take their golden football home and are refusing to play in a bowl game. Iowa State and Kansas State have also turned down bowl game invites. Bowl games as we know them will cease to exist. Unless you're playing in a CFP game, players will not want to risk injury in a useless Pop-Tarts bowl.

The playoffs are going to expand in the near future to sixteen teams and possibly twenty-four. 24 would be a huge mistake. This will reduce even further the number of schools a bowl could choose from. I have a simple solution for all the bowl games.

Have your bowl game as a school's first game of the year. I realize Pasadena has better weather than Columbus, OH in January but we are talking survival for all the guys wearing colorful blazers. You will be able to attract top teams that will be willing to play another great team from another conference with the expanded playoffs. There will be less chance of what Texas is complaining about this year when they lost to Ohio State.
