The volunteers started their duties by 8 am in a non-stop production!

"I like making doughnuts so I can eat some once in a while," joked 94-year old Seneca B. Kratzer. Plain are his favorite.

The dedicated volunteers cranked out 450 dozen of the cake-like confections available in plain or sugared. Linda and Paul Zechman were the Dynamic Duo of sugar-coating when I stopped by. They rolled and covered the doughnuts in sugar while they are warm. "We love to help the fire company," said Paul.

Boxes filled with doughnuts lined the tables in the dining room of the fire company. They were available for pick-up throughout the day. Any extras of the 5400 doughnuts made, and there were not many, were sold the following day.

"The doughnuts are awesome," reported John Jordan. "They melt in your mouth!"

"Proceeds from Doughnut Day benefits the Ladies Auxiliary," explained Terra Rheam as she placed sugar orbs into boxes. "The proceeds will be used to update the kitchen

and dining room. Additional proceeds will be donated to the Rescue Hose Company for any equipment or safety needs."

Volunteers and community are an important aspect of the Rescue Hose Company. "We appreciate all the support the community gives us with each event throughout the year," said Rheam.

Youth In Philanthropy Grant Applications Available



High School students from Midd-West, Shikellamy, Selinsgrove, Danville, and Warrior Run school district, serving as youth grant-makers through the Central Susquehanna Community Foundation's (CSCF) Youth in Philanthropy (YIP) program, met at the Regional Engagement Center recently to discuss their needs assessment surveys that they conducted in their schools and communities. To apply for a grant, the students will be accepting letters of interest online now through March 6, 2020.

High School students from Midd-West, Shikellamy, Selinsgrove, Danville, and Warrior Run school districts are serving as youth grant-makers through the Central Susquehanna Community Foundation's (CSCF) Youth in Philanthropy (YIP) program. This year, more than 150 students from eleven school districts are participating in the program. Each school district group has the responsibility of granting up to \$5,000 to youth-related projects. The funding was provided through a variety of funding sources including donations from established funds at CSCF and individual donors.

YIP make philanthropic values, principles and traditions come alive for young people and communities. The goal of the program is to provide meaningful engagement in the workings of the CSCF and to encourage interest and understanding of philanthropy. In addition, the students provide valuable input on the needs of youth, a perspective that is helpful to CSCF.

Throughout the school year, students develop a set of funding priorities determined through needs assessment surveys that they conducted in their schools and communities. Students use the information collected to review and vote on grant applications.

The students met at the Regional Engagement Center recently to discuss their needs assessment surveys that they conducted in their schools and communities. This information will be used to review and vote on grant applications. To apply for a grant, the students will be accepting letters of interest online now through March 6, 2020. Following the letter of interest, some applicants will be selected to participate in short interviews conducted by the students.

Decisions will be announced via email on March 31, 2020. Information on each school's target areas for grant-making can be found at www.csgiving.org, click "partners" and then click "Youth in Philanthropy". If an organization wishes to apply to more than one school, a separate letter of interest will need to be submitted for each.

The CSCF invests charitable funds to benefit Snyder, Union, Northumberland, lower Luzerne, Columbia, and Montour counties. In order to be eligible to receive a grant from the Foundation, an organization must hold a 501(c)3 nonprofit status or be a governmental organization. Question: "Alice, can you please tell me what a Medicare Part B drug is?"

Answer: Medicare Part B drugs are medications given in a clinic, doctor's office, or hospital outpatient setting. Some common examples of Medicare Part B drugs are medications used in a nebulizer, chemotherapy, Insulin that is used in (Insulin pumps only), immunosuppressant drugs, certain oral anti-cancer drugs, most intravenous infusions, some bone density infusions, and of course immunizations, like the pneumococcal vaccine and the influenza vaccine.

You pay 20% of the Medicare-approved amount for these covered drugs, and the Medicare Part B deductible applies.

A standard Medicare Supplement or Medigap plan will pick up that 20% payment.

A Medicare Advantage plan or Part C requires you to pay that 20%. Medicare Advantage plans do have a cap on annual medical expenses, typically in the \$3,400 to \$6,700 range.

Tax Time Offers Opportunity To Help Pennsylvania's Military Families

Individuals filing their 2019 Pennsylvania personal income taxes can help Pennsylvania's military personnel and their families by donating part or all of their refund to the state's Military Family Relief Assistance Program (MFRAP).

The program, administered by the Pennsylvania Department of Military and Veterans Affairs (DMVA), provides grants of up to \$3,500 to Pennsylvania members of the armed forces and their families who have a direct and immediate financial need as a result of circumstances beyond their control. The tax form includes instructions on how to donate.

"Pennsylvanians are known for their strong support of our military and are always generous when it comes to contributing to the Military Family Relief Assistance Program to help our service members and their families in need," said Maj. Gen. Anthony Carrelli, Pennsylvania's adjutant general and head of the DMVA. "All it takes to help a military family that is facing an unforeseen financial crisis is checking the block for MFRAP on your tax form."

Examples of how the grants helped service members in 2018-19 include:

- A service member and her five children had flooding in their basement and the situation led to mold problems. The estimates for repair exceeded \$5,400. She was in financial ruin due to already investing over \$5,000 trying to fix the problems herself before receiving a \$3,500 grant.
- A service member needed to have a new gas boiler installed in the home. The unexpected expense was over \$7,000, which created a financial crisis for the single parent. The service member received a grant for \$3,500.
- A service member was in the process of medical retirement and was faced with a \$2,200 per month loss of income. In addition to the income loss, the service member had moving costs and a car repair estimate that they were unable to afford to pay. The service member received a grant for \$3,500.

Since the program began in 2006, more than \$1.9 million has been donated by individuals filing their Pennsylvania personal income tax returns and through private donations.

"The MFRAP program exists specifically to take care of our service members and families, so qualifying service members should not hesitate to apply for assistance," said Carrelli. "For anyone needing assistance, the DMVA is always ready and available to assist with the application process."

Members of the armed forces who are residents of Pennsylvania are eligible to apply for assistance while they are serving on active duty for 30 or more consecutive days with the Army, Army Reserve, Navy, Navy Reserve, Air Force, Air Force Reserve, Marine Corps, Marine Corps Reserve, Coast Guard, Coast Guard Reserve, or the Pennsylvania Army or Air National Guard.

All members of the armed forces who were discharged for medical reasons are also eligible to apply for assistance for up to four years after a medical discharge.

In addition, reserve component service members (including Pennsylvania National Guard members) and their families may be eligible for a grant for a period of up to three years after release from a qualifying active duty tour.

The program also applies to certain family members of eligible service members who are Pennsylvania residents. Applicants must show that they have a direct and immediate financial need as a result of circumstances beyond their control.

In addition to the check-off box on the Personal Income Tax form, contributions can be made directly by sending a check to the Military Family Relief Assistance Program, c/o Department of Military and Veterans Affairs, Bldg. 0-47 Fort Indiantown Gap, Annville, PA 17003.

Donations are tax deductible to the extent authorized by federal law.

Middleburg Bank Robber Sentenced To State Prison

District Attorney Mike Picuch (pronounced "pea-YET-sue") has announced the sentencing for Gregory Scott Null, who committed a bank robbery in Middleburg in June 2016.

Null entered a bank in Middleburg wearing a black hooded sweatshirt and demanded money from one of the tellers. Brandishing a handgun, he threatened to kill the teller. He obtained about \$2,000.00 before fleeing by car. He was apprehended a few days later in Georgia after committing another bank robbery there.

He was convicted and sentenced for that crime and then extradited back to Snyder County in March 2019. Null pleaded to Robbery and Carrying a Firearm without a License in Snyder County Court on January 13, 2020, and was sentenced on February 19, 2020.

Null has an extensive criminal history including another armed bank robbery in Georgia for which he is currently serving a prison sentence. President Judge Michael T. Hudock imposed a sentence of 6 to 20 years, and chose to have Null serve his sentences concurrent with his George sentence. DA Picuch had argued for Null's Snyder County sentences to run consecutively.

"I want to compliment the members of the Middleburg Police Department and the Barrow County (Georgia) Sheriff's Office who, with the brave assistance of the bank employees, brought Gregory Null to justice," said DA Picuch.

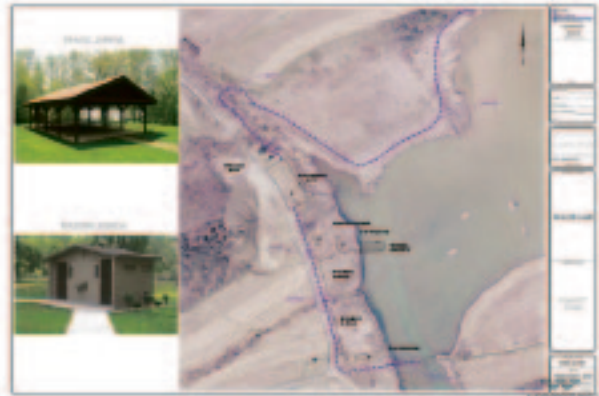

Community Suggestions For Faylor Lake

The Snyder County Commissioners along with the County Conservation District and Planning Department held a meeting on Monday, February 17 at the Middlereek Area Community Center (MACC) in Beaver Springs. The purpose of the meeting was to gain public input into the creation of a Master Plan for the county-owned Faylor Lake Recreational Area.

According to Lincoln Kaufman, Snyder County Planning Director, "The public meeting is one of the steps necessary to submit for Pennsylvania Department of Conservation and Natural Resources (DCNR) grant funding for any potential improvements. While nothing is set in stone at this point, many ideas were shared which include the addition of parking, restrooms, picnic areas, the completion of the trail around the lake, horseback riding, kayaking, the use of electric motors, and a trail linking the MACC to the lake to name a few. Environmental education programs and opportunities were also discussed."

In the meantime as the grant application is underway, the Snyder County Conservation District continues to work on the creation and maintenance of the trail system. Other projects include a Boy Scout project submitted by TJ Straub to clear invasive plants and trees from a portion of the property and improvements for fire truck access along the western shore.

"The Master Plan will also be used for potential funding for the creation of a Greenway and Open Space Plan and the upcoming update to the County Comprehensive Plan," explained Kaufman. "Meetings are also being scheduled with Chip Grose from the Pennsylvania Department of Environmental Protection to discuss potential permitting and with Wes Fahringer of DCNR to review the grant application." The grant application to the state will be submitted on April 15.

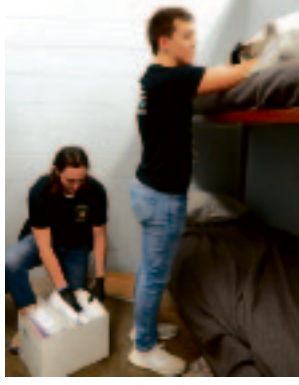

The race course includes wooded terrain, the breast of the dam, and a short stretch through the lake using the old road bed. The race will either be 3.5 miles or 7.5 miles depending on the course. Career Opportunities At SUN Area Tech

The Career and Technical trades are an increasingly important aspect of employability in today's workforce. SUN Area Technical Institute in New Berlin currently has 316 students enrolled which showcases the increased demand for qualified workers in the trades.

SUN Tech offers career and technical education that gives students the tools they need to succeed in the competitive world of work. Students train using the latest techniques and cutting-edge, industry standard equipment. SUN Tech students can earn certifications which not only boost their résumé but indicate a high level of competence.

On February 21, SUN Area Technical Institute opened its doors and offered the opportunity to explore three classroom settings: Advertising Art & Design, Electrical Systems Technology, and Criminal Justice as part of Career and Technical Education Month. SUN Area Technical Institute is "Training Today's Students For Tomorrow's Jobs...in 19 Different Skills."

The Advertising Art and Design program at SUN Area Technical Institute emphasizes creative growth through instruction in art principles, as well as technology skills, through computer-based projects. "The Advertising and Art Design program teaches various skills to start students on their way to a visual communications career," says Kim McBride, instructor.

Students gain a working knowledge of color, typography, and printing while mastering Adobe software on the Mac and PC. Students may pursue employment in the fields of graphic design, advertising, publishing, web page design, illustration, or photography. The class, at a maximum enrollment of 18, was involved in a myriad of projects. Artwork displayed throughout the classroom showcased the students' efforts.

"I plan to further my education in graphic design," explains Destiny Walter, a Mid-West student. "I enjoy creating something out of nothing and seeing my designs come to life."

"I came into this program wanting to expand my horizons in photography," says Julia Laubach of Mifflinburg. "And, I have learned what it takes to start and build a successful business."

"I look forward to learning about animation. Currently, I am into illustration and want to become a cartoonist," says Sam Carlson as she designed a poster for a state competition using her computer. "It is amazing to use the resources available with this program. You can learn at your own pace."

The Criminal Justice program teaches entry-level skills and knowledge required for employment in careers including police officer, security officer, correctional officer, 911 dispatcher, store security and military police. The program offers job shadowing experiences, featured guest speakers, and field trips. The program also uses state of the art law enforcement equipment to create real life experiences.

"In the Criminal Justice program, students not only receive classroom instruction but hands-on experience with current criminal justice employees in the tri-county area," explains instructor, Kale Geiswite.

The class focuses on law enforcement skills such as traffic stops and handcuffing to corrections where "we discuss cell searches and inmate transport" adds Geiswite. Other instruction highlights courtroom procedures and legal knowledge regarding PA laws.

Oscar Machorro of Selinsgrove and Gary Degroat of Mifflinburg were conducting a search of an inmate cell looking for unauthorized contraband that Geiswite had hidden in the cell. "The goal is to educate students on common ways an inmate may hide contraband and to understand where things may be hidden."

According to the website description, "Criminal justice is the second largest employer in the Susquehanna Valley and offers entry level salaries ranging from \$ 20,000 to over \$75,000 annually."

Another of the 19 programs offered at SUN Tech, is Electrical Systems Technology. Electrical Systems Technology students gain hands-on experience in developing electrical skills used in residential, commercial, and industrial installation, design and repair. Students can pursue a career as an electrician's helper, residential wireman, construction electrician, automation tech, and appliance repairman.

"There are a lot of opportunities for employment for students completing the program," explains instructor Van Reichelderfer. "We learn house wiring, electrical codes, motor controls, and study 3-phase power and 3-phase transformers."

Co-op opportunities with local employers such as Thermal Product Solutions (TPS) in New Columbia and contractors SRS Electric in Hummels Wharf are also available. The local unions have been visiting the program to encourage prospective employees to apply. Reichelderfer says, "Probably, the best opportunity for students would be to work for one of the three local electrical unions."

Some students plan to further their education by attending the Georgia Lineman School or Thaddeus Stevens School of Technology, or Penn College of Technology. Jonathan Aurand of Selinsgrove is one of those students planning to attend Lineman School in Georgia. "I like doing electrical work. There is a new challenge every day. We have to figure out how things work and learn how to troubleshoot problems."

"The average age of an electrician is 56 years old," notes Reichelderfer. "So, in the upcoming years there will be a lot of retirements and that means a lot of jobs will need to be filled!"

"Jobs paying family sustaining wages can be difficult for youth to find, but with a technical education students can earn high wages and a great jump start on a career," says Hain.

Linda Mitchell explained the process as "A Labor of Love."

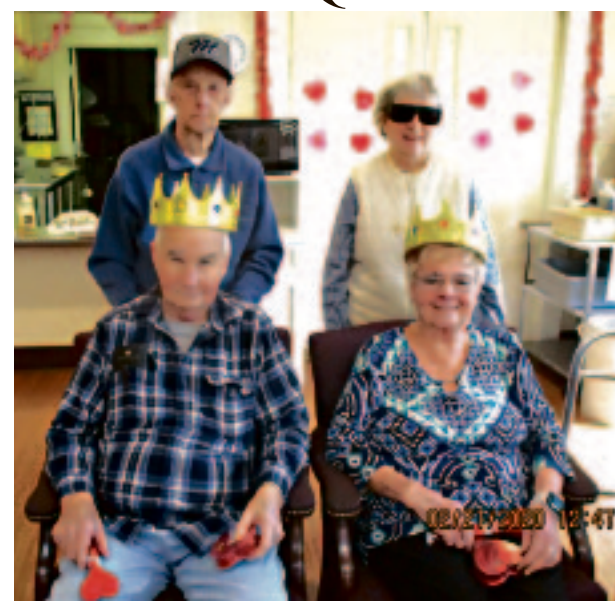
Boxes lined the tables in the dining room of the Rescue Hose Company. Throughout the day people stopped by to pick up their orders.

New Additions At Mid-West Agricultural Lab

The Agricultural Learning Lab at Mid-West has had many positive things happen since its beginning... harvesting wheat, corn, and creating a pasture system to name a few. None however, were as exciting as what happened on a very cold February 21st morning.

Daisy, one of the yearling ewes at the school farm, successfully gave birth to twin lambs! The lambs, a buck and a ewe, were born at approximately 6:30 am. Students excitedly processed the lambs by drying them, treating umbilical cords to ensure health, and helping them acclimate to their new world. FFA member and sheep expert Colette Hoffman stated, "It was such a privilege to be on site for the first lambs born at our school farm."

Meanwhile, a less experienced Jenna Snook, stated, "I've never had experiences with lambs before, it was so cool to see how Colette and Joe helped process the babies by nurturing them and getting them to drink and bond with their mother."

FFA student Farm Manager Joe Hostetler even got the middle school student body involved with the process by creating a survey with Instructional Technology Specialist Mr. Snyder's help. Middle School students voted on a list of potential names with the most votes determining the names for the lambs- Dusty (male) and Skittles (female).

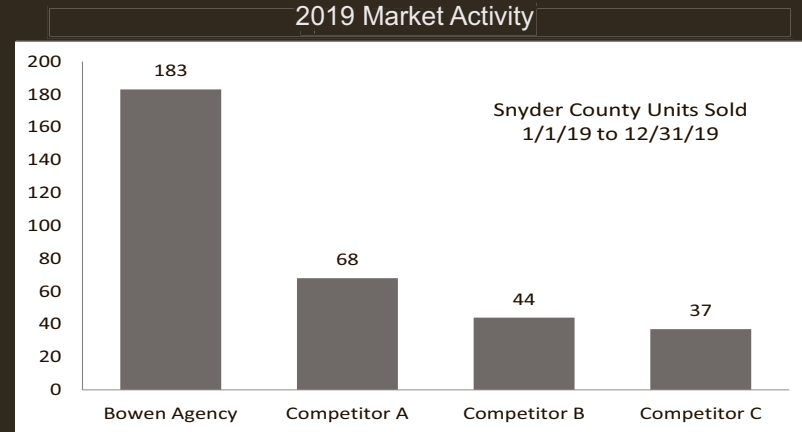
The next step for the lambs regarding their health will be some hands-on Veterinary Science applications where the students will administer the proper vaccinations,

supplements, and nutritional feeding programs. These experiences are invaluable real world applications and are under the guidance of Agricultural Education Instructors and a local veterinarian.

These lambs will be incorporated into the Mid-West FFA program serving as Supervised Agricultural Experience (SAE) projects to provide both educational and financial opportunities. Students interested in the FFA program are encouraged to speak with FFA advisors, current FFA president Tony Royer, or with Mid-West High School guidance counselors.
