It was served on a first come/first serve basis. People remained in their cars and the meals were brought to them.

The hot meals consisted of a half chicken or a pulled pork sandwich and included baked beans, macaroni salad, homemade cookies, and a drink. Todd Meyers, a Selinsgrove Area High School English teacher and his wife Julia cooked the platters.

This is the second outreach to the students and their families by the Selinsgrove Area Education Association. On March 31, the members hosted a food distribution that provided more than 200 bags of food to those in need.
