Our market, which operates every Saturday, May through November, will be celebrating on Saturday, August 8, with a fun schedule to include:

urday from 9 am to 1 pm from May through November. It is located in The Commons, on the corner of Market and Pine Streets in downtown Selinsgrove. We are a nonprofit, volunteer-run market supported by Selinsgrove Projects, Inc. National Farmers Market Week is an annual celebration of farmers markets coordinated by the Farmers Mar-

ket Coalition, a membership-based 501 (c) (3) nonprofit organization that supports farmers markets nationwide through training, technical assistance, and networkbuilding. This year, the campaign is centered on the essential role that farmers markets play in the food system as demonstrated by the coronavirus pandemic.

The Selinsgrove Farmers' Market began in 2008 and joined Selinsgrove Projects Inc. in 2015. Currently, it hosts 11 farmers throughout the season selling a wide variety of products, including duck and chicken eggs, raw milk cheese, maple syrup, meats, vegetable and house plants, fresh produce, berries, wine, craft beer, and flowers. The market hosts over 25 vendors overall expanding offerings to homemade soaps, candles, knits, art, and

This year, our market has faced additional costs for supplies in response to the COVID-19 pandemic and has seen our small businesses struggling to make revenue. The farmers market developed a safety plan to keep vendors and customers safe to include social distancing barriers, hand sanitizer at vendor tables, and mandatory masks for vendors (and strongly encouraged for all patrons). We also saw an increase in interest from small businesses to join the market this season.

While it has been a challenging season this year to reopen during the COVID-19 pandemic, we've seen a silver lining in that our customer flow has increased, and we are still able to provide an opportunity for local farms and businesses to expand their sales," said Sara Lauver, Chair of the market committee.

Dressler's Farm, a longtime farm at the market, is also an approved site to accept the Senior Farmers Market vouchers, offering another opportunity to the community for access to heathy and local foods.

Farmers markets are essential to the life and livelihood of millions of shoppers and tens of thousands of farmers," says Ben Feldman, Executive Director of the Farmers Market Coalition. "But farmers markets don't happen by accident. It takes the planning, organization, and execution of dedicated individuals and community organizations. That work is harder than ever and farmers markets and the vendors who sell at them need all the help they can get. "

munity safe and healthy," Green said First-year and transfer students will register for blocks of time to move in between Tuesday, Aug. 18 and Thursday, Aug. 20. Seniors will return Sept. 5 and 6, and all other students will return Sept. 19 and 20. Susquehanna will prorate housing and meal costs based on students'

Classes are scheduled to begin on Susquehanna's campus Monday, Aug. 24. Returning students — sophomores, juniors and seniors — will attend classes remotely until they arrive on campus.

Orpha Meiser: Don't Let Age Slow You Down



Orpha Meiser of Mt. Pleasant Mills stands by the guilt that she is making for her great-granddaughter, Sophia Jane Waltenbaugh, who turned 3 on April 25, Orpha's birthday too! Hometown Heroes impact us in many ways. Orpha Mei-

ser of Mt. Pleasant Mills was nominated by Nancy Watson. Nancy says, "The Lord touched my heart. Orpha needs to be recognized. She is an example for others that at any age you can do something for others. Orpha's is never idle. Over the past 40 years, she estimates that she has made at least 60 quilts. "My daughter Janet Fer-

ster of Richfield has the first two I ever made," she says. "All my children, grandchildren, and great-grandchildren each have several quilts that I made." But, initially Orpha was not always thrilled about quilting. 'Well, years ago I had an aunt that quilted and wanted me

to quilt too. But I said, 'That is the slowest thing that you At the time, Orpha was working at the sewing factory in Mount Pleasant Mills side seaming dresses. For 30 years she

worked in various sewing factories in the area. Then one day, I decided I would start quilting. I never thought I would make this many!" Orpha exclaims. "I never sold any but I have given many to family members."

In the evenings after her children were grown, Orpha would work on her quilts "to pass the time and you have something to show for it!" she adds with a chuckle.

Her favorite pattern is the one she is currently working ona girl with a bonnet and umbrella. She has made that design at least eight times. Her second favorite is the Dahlia pattern. She has made train quilts for her great-grandsons, Penn State quilts, and many other designs. Her grandson Bradley Ferster claimed a duck quilt after he spotted it in her quilt-

"Her family is #1. Orpha's life is centered around her family. That is what keeps her going," notes friend, Nancy. Being craft-oriented runs in the family. Orpha's mother

at the age of 86 made braided rugs for all her children and grandchildren one year for Christmas. Her daughter, Sharon, was also a talented and skilled seamstress that made intricately sewn table runners, doilies, house dresses, and dolls. Sharon even made her own wedding gown, veil, and her bridesmaid dresses. Daughter Norma Meiser also makes her own clothes. Orpha's daughter, Janet, is very involved in mission work and involves her mother in various projects.

Orpha has often used her sewing talents to help others Within the past two years, she has sewed 240 pillowcases for foster children. She provided the labor to sew, iron, and package the pillowcases for distribution. A bible verse was later added to each one.

"I thought it was the easiest job I ever did," she says. "And, I was doing something for children in desperate need. It will let the foster children know that someone cares."

Orpha has also sewed patches together for quilts. Some were lap quilts for nursing homes and others were quilt tops for wherever there was a need. "I also made hundreds of tote bags that were distributed to various organizations for their mission work," adds Orpha.

In addition to the sewing that she does to benefit others, Orpha still finds the time to make her own curtains, pillow coverings, and other items around the house. She love to show visitors all her creations.

'Don't let age slow you down," advices 82-year old Orpha wisely. "Do what you love doing whether it is cooking, canning, or sewing and share your gift with others."

"There's nothing we like better than connecting face to face with other Penn State alumni," Rothermel said. "But right now, the most important thing for all of us is to stay safe and healthy."

The pig roast is the chapter's biggest annual fundraising event. It helps support academic scholarships for area students attending Penn State, as well as the University's football season.

Rothermel noted that the decision to cancel complies with Gov. Tom Wolf's executive order prohibiting outdoor gatherings involving more than 250 people and with University guidelines for events involving the cheerleading squad. It's also consistent with earlier chapter decisions to cancel its monthly meetings since April, its annual outing at Knoebel's amusement park, and its annual wine tasting event.

Two drivers that race at different speedways, but have had great success over the years, but had fantastic weekends. Jeff Weaver of Loch Haven scored two wins and a second place finish in the three classes he raced in Friday Night at Clinton County speedway, while Danny Dietrich of Gettysburg scored 410-sprint feature wins at three different speedway's over the weekend. Last Friday night Jeff just about accomplished a three-peat when he first won the 270 feature then scored a 305 sprint car win, before leading some of the 600-micro feature before Garrett Bard passed him and went on to win the feature. With the Clinton County Schedule still having five nights scheduled when all three divisions will be in action, can Jeff come back and get all three wins. Check this out this Friday, also on August 21st, and in September on the 4th, 11th and Saturday the 19th.

Danny Dietrich started last weekend with a win Friday night at Williams Grove speedway in the 410-sprint car feature, where he collected his first grove win of the year. Dietrich is sitting in the second spot in the track points, and looking to repeat his title from last season, he now has scored 26 career feature wins at the Grove. On Saturday plans had called for the Gary Kauffman owned team to head to Port Royal to race the Living Legends night, but some issues were discovered during the day so the team then headed to Lincoln were Danny beat his brother Billy to score his third win of the season there. For Danny that was his 49th career Lincoln speedways win, where he now sits seventh on the all time win list at Lincoln, along with his one-track title back in the 2012 season. Dietrich completed his great weekend with a win at Trailways speedway on Sunday in the Armin Hostetter Memorial race honoring the late promoter of the speedway. Dietrich was happy to be back in his grove with his third win of the weekend. "It is great to be back on top again, we did this with two different cars and two different motors. We have a good short track program with two wins on short tracks like Lincoln at Trailways". For Dietrich it was his sixth win of the season, which now his second in the Champion Racing Oil Central Pa Sprint car Series, 18 points behind Freddie Rahmer 671-653, who has four wins so far. Anthony Marci is third in points with 569 points and four wins and then it is Kyle Larson with seven wins and 528 Lance Dewease with 3 wins and 523. The rest of the top ten are Brent Marks, Ryan Smith, Dylan Cisney, Brock Zearfoss, and Brian Montieth.

What has been rumored for a few weeks now is now officially announced that the ULMS series race that was to be run at Lincoln speedway on Saturday August 22nd called the Billy Vacek and Huey Wilcoxon Memorial race will now move to Thursday night August 20th and will also be an official WOO late model series race, paying the winner \$12,000 to win, and \$1,000 to start. This will be the first trip for the WOO late model series to Lincoln speedway since the 2005 season, that race also in August Tim McCreadie picked up the feature win. In last years inaugural Billy Vacek Memorial Rick Eckert scored the \$6,000 feature win over a 39-car field. This will be now a four race weekend for the traveling series, with a Friday night race August 21st at Williams Grove, followed by a Saturday night show at Sharon speedway in Hartford Ohio, and will wrap up with a Sunday show at Ériez speedway, the other three races will pay the winner \$10,000 to win.

### Overview Of PennDOT Projects In The Valley

The CSVT river bridge is nearing completion. The construction of the bridge will be completed by the end of this year. However, the bridge won't be in use until 2022. The pavement for the northern section is currently under construction. The pavement is planned to be completed in 2022 and that is when the northern section of CSVT will be open to the traveling public.

Microsurfacing projects are scheduled for this year in Snyder and Union Counties. Microsurfacing extends the life of an existing pavement by sealing the pavement. Microsurfacing in Snyder County includes SR 35 and SR 104 near Mount Pleasant Mills and SR 1019 (11th Avenue) in Shamokin Dam. Interstate 80 in Union County will be microsurfaced in both the eastbound and west-

A milling and overlay project in Middleburg will oc-cur during the evening hours. The intersection of Routes 522 and 104 will be milled and overlaid in August.

#### Bridge Replacement Project on Route 2010 in **Snyder County**

A bridge replacement project will begin on Route 2010 (Neitz Valley Road), approximately 1 mile south of Freeburg, in Washington Township, Snyder County. On Wednesday, July 22, Neitz Valley Road will be closed between Route 2003 (Ebenezer Church Road) and Route 2007 (Produce Road), while a Pennsylvania Department of Transportation (PennDOT) department force crew begins work on the bridge replacement. The work will include removal of the old bridge and replacement with a precast concrete Box Culvert, new approach paving, roadside grading, and guiderail improvements. A detour using Ebenezer Church Road, Route 2008 (Lenig Road), and Produce Road will be in place. Work is expected to be completed by mid-September of 2020, weather permitting. Motorists should be alert, slow down, and expect delays in travel.

#### **District-Wide Raised Pavement Marking** Replacement Project

A district-wide raised pavement markings (RPMs) project in Union, Northumberland, Montour, and Columbia Counties, is set to begin next week. Beginning Monday, July 27, a PennDOT contractor will install new RPMs on Interstate 80 and Routes 15, 54, 554 and 125. 
