## Selinsgrove Celebrates National Farmers Market Week



The Selinsgrove Farmers' Market joins markets across the country in celebrating National Farmers' Market Week from August 2-8. The festivities will include a flower and gardening demo, raffle, and live music. Our market, which operates every Saturday, May through November, will be celebrating on Saturday, August 8, with a fun schedule to include:

- 10 a.m. – 10:30 am – The Greensmith, mother-daughter duo, will be presenting a floral design demonstration with garden commentary
- 10:30 a.m. – 12:30 pm – Music with Larry Smith
- 11 am – Proclamation from Selinsgrove Mayor, Jeff Reed
- All day – Raffle with a chance to win a market goodie bag!
- All day – Kids' scavenger hunt around the market with Art by Chris

The Selinsgrove Farmers' Market operates every Saturday from 9 am to 1 pm from May through November. It is located in The Commons, on the corner of Market and Pine Streets in downtown Selinsgrove. We are a non-profit, volunteer-run market supported by Selinsgrove Projects, Inc.

National Farmers Market Week is an annual celebration of farmers markets coordinated by the Farmers Market Coalition, a membership-based 501 (c) (3) nonprofit organization that supports farmers markets nationwide through training, technical assistance, and network-building. This year, the campaign is centered on the essential role that farmers markets play in the food system as demonstrated by the coronavirus pandemic.

The Selinsgrove Farmers' Market began in 2008 and joined Selinsgrove Projects Inc. in 2015. Currently, it hosts 11 farmers throughout the season selling a wide variety of products, including duck and chicken eggs, raw milk cheese, maple syrup, meats, vegetable and house plants, fresh produce, berries, wine, craft beer, and flowers. The market hosts over 25 vendors overall expanding offerings to homemade soaps, candles, knits, art, and more.

This year, our market has faced additional costs for supplies in response to the COVID-19 pandemic and has seen our small businesses struggling to make revenue. The farmers market developed a safety plan to keep vendors and customers safe to include social distancing barriers, hand sanitizer at vendor tables, and mandatory masks for vendors (and strongly encouraged for all patrons). We also saw an increase in interest from small businesses to join the market this season.

"While it has been a challenging season this year to reopen during the COVID-19 pandemic, we've seen a silver lining in that our customer flow has increased, and we are still able to provide an opportunity for local farms and businesses to expand their sales," said Sara Lauver, Chair of the market committee.

Dressler's Farm, a longtime farm at the market, is also an approved site to accept the Senior Farmers Market vouchers, offering another opportunity to the community for access to healthy and local foods.

"Farmers markets are essential to the life and livelihood of millions of shoppers and tens of thousands of farmers," says Ben Feldman, Executive Director of the Farmers Market Coalition. "But farmers markets don't happen by accident. It takes the planning, organization, and execution of dedicated individuals and community organizations. That work is harder than ever and farmers markets and the vendors who sell at them need all the help they can get."

# Susquehanna Announces Phased Move-In Plan

Susquehanna University has announced revisions to its move-in schedule as part of its ongoing health and safety initiatives.

Susquehanna will begin the semester with 25% of its students in residence halls, then progress to 50% before moving in all of its students. First-year and transfer students will move in as originally planned in mid-August, while returning students will follow in two-week increments. All students will be required to test negative for COVID-19 before arriving to campus.

"We have been watching prudently and planning ardently for the return to campus, as well as learning from the successes and mistakes of others. As much as we want to welcome students back to campus, we want even more so to complete the fall term together, which is why we've adjusted the move-in schedule," said University President Jonathan D. Green.

As outlined in its Return to Campus Fall 2020 Plan, the university has updated procedures to accommodate a residential learning environment during the global health pandemic. Among other safety measures including COVID-19 testing for faculty, staff and students, the plan also prescribes members of the Susquehanna community to maintain a safe physical distance, wear face coverings in classrooms and other public spaces, greatly enhance their health and hygiene practices and, when needed, allow flexibility for remote instruction for faculty and students.

"We are committed to fulfilling our mission to educate students for productive, creative and reflective lives of achievement, leadership and service in a diverse, dynamic and interdependent world. Part of that commitment is to do all we can to keep all members of our community safe and healthy," Green said.

First-year and transfer students will register for blocks of time to move in between Tuesday, Aug. 18 and Thursday, Aug. 20. Seniors will return Sept. 5 and 6, and all other students will return Sept. 19 and 20. Susquehanna will prorate housing and meal costs based on students' move-in date.

Classes are scheduled to begin on Susquehanna's campus Monday, Aug. 24. Returning students — sophomores, juniors and seniors — will attend classes remotely until they arrive on campus.

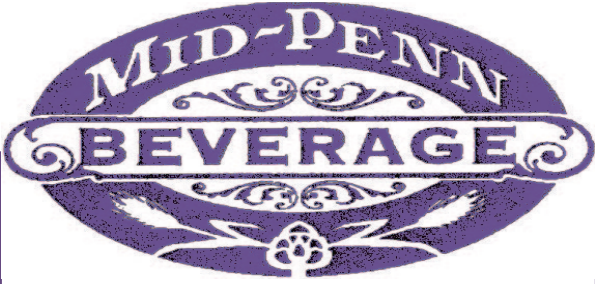

### Orpha Meiser: Don't Let Age Slow You Down

Hometown Heroes impact us in many ways. Orpha Meiser of Mt. Pleasant Mills was nominated by Nancy Watson. Nancy says, "The Lord touched my heart. Orpha needs to be recognized. She is an example for others that at any age you can do something for others."

Orpha's is never idle. Over the past 40 years, she estimates that she has made at least 60 quilts. "My daughter Janet Ferster of Richfield has the first two I ever made," she says. "All my children, grandchildren, and great-grandchildren each have several quilts that I made."

But, initially Orpha was not always thrilled about quilting. "Well, years ago I had an aunt that quilted and wanted me to quilt too. But I said, 'That is the slowest thing that you can do!'"

At the time, Orpha was working at the sewing factory in Mount Pleasant Mills side seaming dresses. For 30 years she worked in various sewing factories in the area.

"Then one day, I decided I would start quilting. I never thought I would make this many!" Orpha exclaims. "I never sold any but I have given many to family members."

In the evenings after her children were grown, Orpha would work on her quilts "to pass the time and you have something to show for it!" she adds with a chuckle.

Her favorite pattern is the one she is currently working on—a girl with a bonnet and umbrella. She has made that design at least eight times. Her second favorite is the Dahlia pattern. She has made train quilts for her great-grandsons, Penn State quilts, and many other designs. Her grandson Bradley Ferster claimed a duck quilt after he spotted it in her quilting frame.

"Her family is #1. Orpha's life is centered around her family. That is what keeps her going," notes friend, Nancy.

Being craft-oriented runs in the family. Orpha's mother at the age of 86 made braided rugs for all her children and grandchildren one year for Christmas. Her daughter, Sharon, was also a talented and skilled seamstress that made intricately sewn table runners, doilies, house dresses, and dolls. Sharon even made her own wedding gown, veil, and her bridesmaid dresses. Daughter Norma Meiser also makes her own clothes. Orpha's daughter, Janet, is very involved in mission work and involves her mother in various projects.

Orpha has often used her sewing talents to help others. Within the past two years, she has sewed 240 pillowcases for foster children. She provided the labor to sew, iron, and package the pillowcases for distribution. A bible verse was later added to each one.

"I thought it was the easiest job I ever did," she says. "And, I was doing something for children in desperate need. It will let the foster children know that someone cares."

Orpha has also sewed patches together for quilts. Some were lap quilts for nursing homes and others were quilt tops for wherever there was a need. In addition to sewing patches, she has made tied quilts and assembled the top, batting, and backing of quilts. They were distributed by Niemond's Independent Church in Richfield. "I appreciated being able to sew these quilts to help those in need."

She also tied quilts and made seat belt protectors for cancer patients. These were sent to Evangelical Community Hospital in Lewisburg.

"I also made hundreds of tote bags that were distributed to various organizations for their mission work," adds Orpha.

In addition to the sewing that she does to benefit others, Orpha still finds the time to make her own curtains, pillow coverings, and other items around the house. She love to show visitors all her creations.

"Don't let age slow you down," advises 82-year old Orpha wisely. "Do what you love doing whether it is cooking, canning, or sewing and share your gift with others."

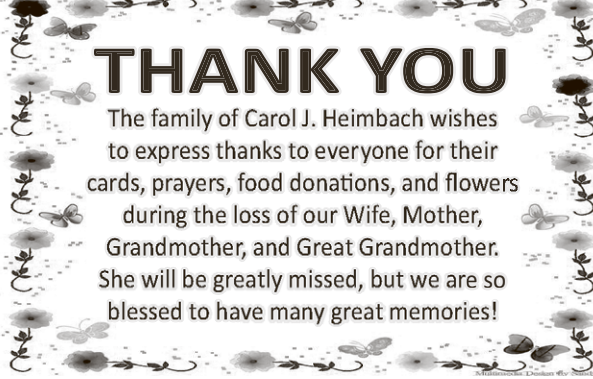

## Area Penn State Chapter Cancels 2020 Pig Roast

The Greater Susquehanna Valley Chapter of the Penn State Alumni Association is cancelling its annual pig roast event this year because of the ongoing coronavirus pandemic.

The GSV chapter made the decision out of an abundance of caution and concern for area alumni and all pig roast guests and vendors. Held annually in New Berlin since 1980, the pig roast attracts hundreds of Penn State alumni and friends for a day of fun, food, and fellowship. Every year the event features appearances by the Nittany Lion mascot and Penn State cheerleaders.

Chapter President Curt Rothermel says chapter leaders deeply regret having to cancel the event, but believe it's the right and responsible thing to do.

"There's nothing we like better than connecting face to face with other Penn State alumni," Rothermel said. "But right now, the most important thing for all of us is to stay safe and healthy."

The pig roast is the chapter's biggest annual fundraising event. It helps support academic scholarships for area students attending Penn State, as well as the University's football season.

Rothermel noted that the decision to cancel complies with Gov. Tom Wolf's executive order prohibiting outdoor gatherings involving more than 250 people and with University guidelines for events involving the cheerleading squad. It's also consistent with earlier chapter decisions to cancel its monthly meetings since April, its annual outing at Knoebel's amusement park, and its annual wine tasting event.

"When the time is right, we look forward to resuming our normal schedule of meetings and activities," Rothermel said.

In the meantime, Rothermel urged area alumni to stay safe and healthy. He pointed alumni to coronavirus information for the Penn State community at [virusinfo.psu.edu](http://virusinfo.psu.edu).

## DANNY DIETRICH AND JEFF WEAVER HAVE GREAT WEEKENDS

Two drivers that race at different speedways, but have had great success over the years, but had fantastic weekends. Jeff Weaver of Loch Haven scored two wins and a second place finish in the three classes he raced in Friday Night at Clinton County speedway, while Danny Dietrich of Gettysburg scored 410-sprint feature wins at three different speedways over the weekend. For Weaver who is a second generation driver has been winning races in the 270 & 600 micros classes for a few years, scored the feature win in the 305-sprint class Friday night. This was his second win in the sprints, getting a 305 win at Path Valley a few weeks back. Jeffrey Weaver Sr. started his racing career back in the late 80's racing in the late model class winning one feature at Clinton County in 1989, before he raced sprints cars, where he finished out his racing career. When children came along it did not stop racing it just put things in a different direction, with daughter Sierra, and son Jeff racing in the quarter midgets, and now both of them still racing with Sierra in the 600-micros, and Jeffrey racing 270, 600 micros and 305-sprints. Last Friday night Jeff just about accomplished a three-peat when he first won the 270 feature then scored a 305 sprint car win, before leading some of the 600-micro feature before Garrett Bard passed him and went on to win the feature. With the Clinton County Schedule still having five nights scheduled when all three divisions will be in action, can Jeff come back and get all three wins. Check this out this Friday, also on August 21st, and in September on the 4th, 11th and Saturday the 19th.

Danny Dietrich started last weekend with a win Friday night at Williams Grove speedway in the 410-sprint car feature, where he collected his first grove win of the year. Dietrich is sitting in the second spot in the track points, and looking to repeat his title from last season, he now has scored 26 career feature wins at the Grove. On Saturday plans had called for the Gary Kauffman owned team to head to Port Royal to race the Living Legends night, but some issues were discovered during the day so the team then headed to Lincoln were Danny beat his brother Billy to score his third win of the season there. For Danny that was his 49th career Lincoln speedways win, where he now sits seventh on the all time win list at Lincoln, along with his one-track title back in the 2012 season. Dietrich completed his great weekend with a win at Trailways speedway on Sunday in the Armin Hostetter Memorial race honoring the late promoter of the speedway. Dietrich was happy to be back in his grove with his third win of the weekend. "It is great to be back on top again, we did this with two different cars and two different motors. We have a good short track program with two wins on short tracks like Lincoln at Trailways". For Dietrich it was his sixth win of the season, which now his second in the Champion Racing Oil Central Pa Sprint car Series, 18 points behind Freddie Rahmer 671-653, who has four wins so far. Anthony Marci is third in points with 569 points and four wins and then it is Kyle Larson with seven wins and 528 Lance Dewease with 3 wins and 523. The rest of the top ten are Brent Marks, Ryan Smith, Dylan Cisney, Brock Zearfoss, and Brian Montieith.

What has been rumored for a few weeks now is now officially announced that the ULMS series race that was to be run at Lincoln speedway on Saturday August 22nd called the Billy Vacek and Huey Wilcoxon Memorial race will now move to Thursday night August 20th and will also be an official WOO late model series race, paying the winner \$12,000 to win, and \$1,000 to start. This will be the first trip for the WOO late model series to Lincoln speedway since the 2005 season, that race also in August Tim McCreadie picked up the feature win. In last years inaugural Billy Vacek Memorial Rick Eckert scored the \$6,000 feature win over a 39-car field. This will be now a four race weekend for the traveling series, with a Friday night race August 21st at Williams Grove, followed by a Saturday night show at Sharon speedway in Hartford Ohio, and will wrap up with a Sunday show at Eriez speedway, the other three races will pay the winner \$10,000 to win.

One of the most renowned announcers in the region was

Frank Sagi, who announced at a number of speedways, but is most famous for announcing at Hagerstown speedway, located in Maryland. His son Alan for the fourth straight year is putting on a race at the speedway in his honor called the Frank Sagi Tribute race with special guest former late model drivers Denny Bonebrake, Sam Nalley and Larry Gorman. Gorman raced a number of years at Selinsgrove speedway, driving his own #100, also the Apple house #41 and the Keister 711. Alan is having ten Guaranteed qualifying races at area speedway with Jason Covert-Trailways, Gregg Satterlee-Baps, Dan Angelicchio Cumberland, Logan Roberson-Winchester speedway, Bedford speedway won by Matt Sponaule. Five other races will be run at Potomac and Williams Grove speedway this Friday August 7th, then Saturday night at Port Royal speedway on the 8th, with Path Valley on Friday August 14th and the final qualifier for Selinsgrove on August 15th, before the race on Sunday August 16th.

Steve Drevicki of Reading is the current USAC East 360 point leader over Chris Allen Jr.

Who do you know who is a healthcare worker, an emergency responder, a teacher, or another essential worker? Who do you know who is more vulnerable to the disease? Tell us who you wear your mask for.
- Sign on to the COVID-Safe Pledge in support of public health AND the economy. You can sign as an individual or as a business. Encourage local businesses to take the pledge. Signatories may also want to wear, download, and/or display orange ribbons as a symbol of our community goals during this challenging time: health, prosperity, unity, and courage.

The mask messages promoted by the campaign appear in memes, on signage, and as part of public service announcements created for radio. Some include: "Whatever the phase, Yellow or Green, Your Mask Must Be Seen (on your face!)." "Masks help keep our businesses open!" and "No shirt, no shoes, NO MASK -- no service. Wear the mask!". Masks are a simple and key tool to help reduce the spread of the COVID-19 Coronavirus. The CDC now recommends cloth face coverings over the nose and mouth whenever you are around people from another household. As the US Surgeon General notes, masks don't take away our freedom, but ensure greater freedom for us to go out and do more. An important piece to note about mask wearing is that simple cloth masks protect others. The best way to protect those around you and to show that the community cares about each other is to wear a mask.

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
