On February 2 of every year Punxsutawney Phil, the esteemed weather prognosticator, will make his annual prediction on the length of winter. On Groundhog Day, thousands will gather on Gobbler's Knob in Punxsutawney Pennsylvania to witness his prediction. In his paper he proclaimed Punxsutawney Phil to be the one and only weather prognosticating groundhog. Thus, Phil became a renowned weather forecaster and his fame has spread throughout the world.

For over 133 years Punxsutawney Phil has been a weather prognosticator. All other groundhog weathermen are denounced as imposters! Each summer Phil drinks a magical punch during the Annual Groundhog Picnic. This mysterious Groundhog Elixir magically adds seven more years to his life. Typically, a groundhog's life span is 6-8 years. Punxsutawney Phil is also the heavy-weight of groundhogs weighing 20 pounds and measuring 22 inches long. The average groundhog weighs only 12-15 pounds and is 20

Punxsutawney Phil even has his own special vehicle called the "Philmobile." Question: Alice, will the Coverage Gap or Donut Hole eventually close and just go away??

Answer: Not exactly, Mostly, Sorta! The Donut Hole will never be eliminated from your Medicare Part D prescription drug plan coverage. Some members of the press or Medicare advocates often mention that the Donut Hole or Coverage Gap will be "eliminated." However, what they mean is that this year, after you meet your drug plans initial coverage limit, your brand name drug purchases will cost a fixed 25% of retail while you are in the Donut Hole. 



Should local and county governmental units and public schools eliminate the use of earned income, occupation and per capita taxes by increasing real estate property taxes? Yes, it would lower tax collection expenses, make tax collection easier and be fairer to taxpayers. Here's why:

Pennsylvania has a regressive tax system where the tax burden falls mainly on the lower and middle income taxpayers, not on those with higher incomes. At the State level, the flat-rate personal income and sales taxes are examples.

At the local level, the per capita tax is an example of a regressive tax. However, the earned income tax is also regressive, but it is levied only on the working class. Both of these taxes are unfair. In order for Pennsylvania to adopt a progressive taxation sys-

tem, such as a graduated income tax, a constitutional amendment would be necessary. Our surrounding states, Maryland, New Jersey, New York, Ohio and West Virginia, have already done that. Like it or not, the tax that is closest to being progressive is the

higher property taxes than the owners of smaller parcels of land with smaller structures. If property taxes were eliminated, the higher taxes on the larger estates would be shifted to working class taxpayers unless property taxes were replaced by a progressive tax at the

property tax. Think about it! The owners of large estates pay

Area given that no elk ever have been harvested in this season.




