

Four of the founding members were direct descendants of Captain Conrad

According to Patty Wetzel, Regent, "The chapter's name honors the memory of the interpreter of the Six Nations of the Indians and White Settlers of Pennsylvania. Conrad Weiser lived for some time among the Mohawks and learned their language, customs and manners. He was a trusted friend of Chief Shikellamy, who gave the Isle of Que to him in exchange for a rifle. The provincial government granted him thousands of acres of land on the bank of the Susquehanna River, where many of his descendants lived, giving the name of Weiserburg to the present town of Selinsgrove.'

Today, the chapter has 33 members who meet seven months out of the year at the Susquehanna Valley Country Club in Hummels Wharf, usually on a Saturday at 11am. They always have a speaker who presents a program on many different topics such as historical, educational or patriotic.

In order to become a member of the NSDAR you must have a direct lineage to a Revolutionary War ancestor. Prospective members should visit the DAR.org website and request to become a member.


Blessing of the Water

District Attorney Mike Piecuch (pronounced "Pea-YET-Sue") announced that the state Supreme Court has affirmed Craig L. Poust's rape conviction


In January 2018, Poust was convicted by a Snyder County jury for the substance-facilitated sexual assault of a 16 year old girl at his Port Trevorton residence in 2012. For that crime, he was subsequently sentenced to 10-15 years in state prison. This sentence is being served consecutively to the sentence of 8 to 18 years he received for his October 2016 conviction on weapons and drug

Poust appealed the convictions in both cases, and in both cases the Superior Court rejected his appeals. The Pennsylvania Supreme Court has now also denied Poust's appeal of his rape conviction.

DA Piecuch said, "I am gratified that the Supreme Court has affirmed the jury's guilty verdict. This validates the courage of all the women who spoke up about Craig Poust's crimes.

Craig Poust is still facing additional charges, along with Chanel H. Kantz, for allegedly committing two substance-facilitated sexual assaults in 2014.





Go Ask Alice

Question: Alice, what is the part B deductible? I just got a bill from one of my providers. I am confused because my Medicare Statement says I have satisfied the deductible for 2019.

Answer: The part B deductible in 2019 is \$185. You must pay all Medicare approved costs until you meet the yearly Part B deductible. After your deductible is met, Medicare pays 80% for Part B services. Most people that keep Medicare as their primary, also pair a Medicare Supplement with it. Those quarterly statements that mention your deductible amount can be very misleading. When your statement says you have met the deductible, I tell people that is only in theory. You must actually pay the bills that get mailed to you from those providers. Medicare doesn't know if you have paid your provider.

I teach our clients an exact method for keeping deductible records concise and organized. Buy a cheap folder. Inside on the flap write down the dates of service and the amounts you pay for each provider. Don't worry, you only need to document your first \$185 of provider service bills. When a random bill comes into your house, what do you do? You go to your folder, and see if your documented total that you have paid has reached \$185. If you have paid that out already my advice is to just wait that bill out. It was probably sent out before payment was received. If you still have some deductible left to meet, then you probably need to pay that provider.

I hope this clears up the mystery of the Medicare notices and the deductible. One last peculiar occurrence is that occasionally a provider never bills or missed billing for a service while in that deductible phase. I believe that rare occurrence will be happening

less and less.



Selinsgrove Speedway Mourns Loss Of Maynard Boop & Tommy Spriggle

Selinsgrove Speedway is mourning the loss this week of a pair of sprint car champions at the historic oval, sprint car owner Maynard Boop of Mifflinburg and sprint car driver Tommy Spriggle of Harrisburg.

Boop, age 99, was the owner of the famed Boop's Aluminum Special No. 1 sprint car that broke records and stunned the sprint car ranks at Selinsgrove and across the nation from 1976 through 1982.

Overall his mounts scored 111 sprint car feature wins along with numerous track and series titles.

The Boop's car was the Central Pennsylvania KARS owner champion mount in 1977, 1979 and in 1980 while it also scored the KARS driver titles in 1979 and 1980. At Selinsgrove Speedway alone, the Boop's No. 1 took

the 1982 track title with Dillsburg's Lynn Paxton at the wheel while taking 10 wins on the season. Paxton/Boop also won the Selinsgrove Jack Gunn Me-

morial in 1981, scored a Labor Day win in 1982 and also beat the World of Outlaws Sprint Cars Series at the oval The last of Boops 111 overall career owner wins also came at Selinsgrove Speedway, with Randy Wolfe at the


wheel in October, 1982. Spriggle, age 75, was the 1977 Selinsgrove Speedway sprint car track champion.

Spriggle and his No. 42 super sprint campaigned for decades at Selinsgrove Speedway and around the region before competing regularly later in his career in the 358 sprint car ranks.

His son Alan is also a former regular 358 sprint campaigner at the Snyder County oval.
