Fire Damaged Unoccupied House in Kreamer

On Wednesday, March 4, 2026, at 1:44 pm Kreamer Fire Department was dispatched to a structure fire at 80 Vine Street in Kreamer. According to reports the fire company found the structure fully involved with fire on all three floors of the unoccupied home. Heavy smoke was noted throughout the area.

Squad 120 (Kreamer) arrived and advanced the initial attack line. Engine 50 (Reliance Hose Company) provided an additional attack line and a backup line. Tower 80 (DH&L) arrived and vented the north side of the roof with some fire suppression and overhaul work. Engine 30 (Freeburg) provided water supply from a Kennedy St. hydrant and Squad 100



(Fremont) provided Rapid intervention services. As precaution ambulance units also responded.

The 5 Fire Departments with approximately 30 firefighters were on scene for just over 2 hours. No injuries were reported.

According to Kreamer Fire Chief Shannon L. Moyer, "The 80 Vine street fire is still under investigation by the Pennsylvania State Police Fire Marshals Unit. The home was being remodeled at the time of the fire, and was insured. The owner did lose a few personal items that he moved into the home. The insurance company is still working on their determination of the property (as of press time).

SPORTS NEWS

THE VIEW FROM HEAR

The PIAA state tournaments were not kind to our local schools. The bright spots were two medals on the wrestling mats and one win in basketball. This reinforces how difficult the games and matches get when you step out of district play and onto the larger stage where the competition is much better.

The Lewisburg boys basketball team got off to a fast start in their first round state playoff opener and rolled Big Springs 70-54. This was the Dragons 17th straight win. Lewisburg led 24-6 after the first quarter and never looked back.

Well-balanced scoring has been their recipe for success all year as five players reached double digits in points. LJ Tucker led the Green with 21 including five treys. Cooper Mowry had 13 and Cortland Michaels 12. Nazir Meredith and Rebra Jemama each had 10 points to round out the great teamwork. Lewisburg played Pope John Paul on Tuesday in the second round.

The Mifflinburg boys basketball team lost their first round game in states 74-50 to the buzzsaw that is (24-1) Riverside. Brennan Snyder led the Cats with 18 points followed by Cheeky Griffith's 12 and JP Marr's 11. The Wildcats finished their year at 16-8.

Defense wins championships and it helps when you have a Div 1 star of the future on your team. Bonner-Prendie High School, led by Corey Francis, beat Selinsgrove in the first round of the 5A state playoffs 68-35. Francis scored 28 points and the B-P defense held Grove to single digit points in three of the four quarters.

The score was 28-23 at halftime but Prendie came out pressing on defense to start the second half. They outscored the Seals 11-0 in the first ninety seconds of the third quarter. Selinsgrove ended a successful season at 17-9.

All three teams were rewarded for their regular season success. Seal's leading scorer Xavier Jackson was named Heartland Div 1 player of the year and his coach Justin Keiser was voted coach of the year. Lewisburg had Nazir Meredith, Cooper Mowry and Leon Tucker II named first team all-stars in Div II. Leon Tucker was chosen as Div II coach of the year. Mifflinburg has Jackson Griffith and Chad Martin as Div III all-stars.

The first round of states saw Lewisburg's season end at 13-13 after losing to (20-5) Penn Cambria 51-40. Five seniors finished their basketball careers with Lewisburg after four straight trips to States.

The Green Dragons got it to 34-32 behind Teagan Osunde's 14 points but poor foul shooting did Lew in as well as Cambria scoring the last seven points of the third quarter.

The young Lady Cats of Mifflinburg were outscored 24-8 by an Allentown Central Catholic run in the first half that led to a 60-43 loss. Avery Reibosome led the Cats with 17 points and Parice Shuck had 12. Mifflinburg turned around last year's record of 4-18 to finish this year at 15-11. Big

things lie ahead for this young dynamic team.

Honors were bestowed for our local girls teams. Div I all-stars are Madi Merrell of Selinsgrove and Izzy Walter from Middle-West. Div II first teamers include Ava Motto and Teagan Osunde from Lewisburg and Mifflinburg freshman Avery Reibosome.

To say only two medals from Hershey is a disappointment would be an understatement. Congratulations to Miff's Bradley Wagner and Lew's Landen Wagner. Bradley Wagner brought home his third medal in three years from States. He took third place and was coached by this year's 2A coach of the year Derek Reber.

Landen Wagner placed sixth at 152 lbs and earned his second medal after finishing eighth last year. He ended his wrestling career second in all time wins at Lewisburg with 147 victories, second only to Mifflinburg's coach Reber who had 164 wins at Lewisburg. Landen will be hanging up his singlet as he is playing baseball at Susquehanna next year.

My takeaways from Hershey is that our local wrestlers under-performed for various reasons. The Lehigh Valley has always been a hotbed of high school wrestling in Pennsylvania. District 4 historically has been a distant second and to have only one state champ (Montoursville's Gage Wentzel) in either class is disappointing.

The headline at the state championships was the anticipated showdown between Bo Bassett and Montgomery's Brandt Harer. Bassett pinned the guy who has the most high school wins in PA history at 214-3. Bassett ended his career at 170-0. It should be fun to watch Bo wrestle at Virginia Tech and Brandt at Rutgers.

On the college wrestling mats, Selinsgrove grad Nate Schon wrestling for Drexel in the EIWA league championships beat Miff grad Emmanuel Ulrich. Ulrich wrestles for American University and lost to Schon in the quarterfinals 4-3. Schon later lost in the finals but qualified for the NCAA national tournament in Cleveland next weekend. Lehigh won the team title followed by Navy and Bucknell.

Penn State will have all ten of their wrestlers in Cleveland for the championships. The Nittany Lions had eight wrestlers in the BIG finals and won seven of them! Just when I think they will be challenged, they raise their level of intensity and totally dominate the field.

Not since John Wooden's UCLA basketball teams in the late 60's into the 70's has there been a bigger dynasty in college sports than this current Penn State wrestling reign. There are no signs of it ending any time soon. The national tournament next weekend will be interesting with Oklahoma State qualifying all ten of their wrestlers as well for March Matness. More on this next week.

March Madness will start before I talk with you again. Unlike the wrestling championships, basketball is wide open. I haven't looked at the Top 25 rankings until now and it turns out my Final 4 are the four highest ranked teams. I was just basing my guesses on the few games I've watched. Believe it or not, the team I have clearly watched the most is the Fordham Rams and they are not getting invited to the dance.

I see Duke, Arizona, Michigan and Florida being in the Final 4 before the brackets are released. I reserve the right to change these after the brackets are set. The one team that could be left out with a 31-0 record right now before their conference tourney is Miami of Ohio, where Mrs. Bolt went to college. For my sake and the sanity of a 68 team field, you have to invite Miami even if they lose in the MAC tourney. Akron is the favorite to win it.

Why can't Penn State find any suc-

cess with their men's or women's basketball teams? Every school in the Big Ten has either their men's team or women's team ranked in the current Top 25. Some have both. The only schools that don't have a ranked team are Northwestern, Rutgers, Washington, Indiana and Penn State.

Those five schools out of eighteen may not sound like a big deal but Indiana has had both of their teams end up in the top 12 within the last three years. The Northwestern men went dancing in '23 and '24. The Rutgers and Washington men's teams were 3-1 against Penn State this year.

I know that Penn State AD Pat Kraft wants to have the premiere athletic program in the country but he's not going to attain this goal without winning programs in hoops. Don't bother calling Iowa State for coaching help as their women's coach has been there for thirty years and T.J. Otzelberger would be crazy to leave his seventh ranked men's team.

I'm not a big fan of Spring training baseball but it does get you excited knowing the real games aren't that far off. I am really enjoying the World Baseball Classic. I watched every pitch of the USA vs Mexico game this week and it felt like a playoff game. The fact Paul Shenes started for team USA didn't hurt either.

I think the Phillies are going to take a step back this year. They haven't improved their team and all their stars are a year older. I truly believe the Pirates will have more wins than Philly on August 15th. My fear is that the Bucco's will not try and improve their team in August and possibly make some trades to save money. Philadelphia will do the opposite and add to their roster for another playoff push.

There's a new record that I think might be as impressive as Joe Dimaggio's 56 game hitting streak. Shai Gilgeous-Alexander with the Oklahoma Thunder broke Wilt Chamberlain's 126 consecutive games record of scoring at least twenty points. Among Jim's enjoyments were fishing and playing cards. His most precious moments were spending time with his daughter and grandson.

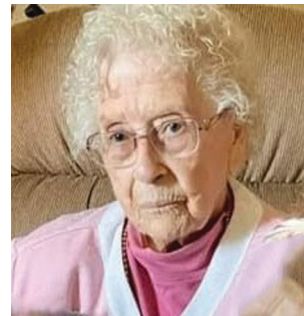
Jim is survived by his daughter, Kathy Messimer; grandson, Dylan Messimer; numerous nieces and nephews; and his grand furbaby, Taz.

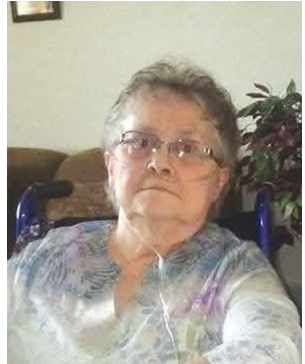
From the mouth of one of his surgeons, "Frank was tough as nails and believed in Jesus." He battled five different kinds of cancer and never complained once.

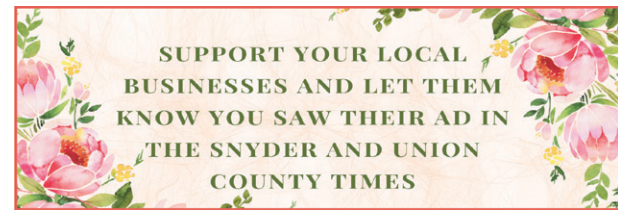

A River Rat's Ramblings: 1957 Spring

It's the middle of March. The river ice broke up at the end of February. Happened mid-week and I had to be in school instead of standing on the river bank, listening to old time river rats telling stories of what ice out was like when they were kids; some of them were talking of the late 1800's. Some told of helping to build coal flats in the spring, 30' long, 8' wide with the boat sides sawed from a white pine log with a 30' clear span 24" high and 2" thick. The bottom boards were 8' long, 6" to 8" wide and 1 1/2 inches thick. These boards had to be clear span also (no knots). The bottom of the boat had additional bracing as these flats were filled with coal or other freight. The river rats that helped build the flat also worked on that same flat, digging stove coal from the river in the summer months. They were paid \$1.00 a day for a 10-hour day.

The owner of the flat usually operated a coal yard and might have several flats working a coal bed. Each flat had three or four-men diggin' coal all day long, seven days a week. The commercial hand digging of coal lasted until the advent of the internal combustion engines, which were used to power commercial dredging of coal on the river. It still took a handful of river rats to operate the commercial dredging of coal, but there were some that transitioned from the river to jobs over town.

In 1957, there were still three coal dredging outfits on the Isle of Que that operated from May until October or as

river levels and weather conditions permitted. Most of the shoreline ice cakes have melted by now and just yesterday, I was poking around where we had dumped a wheelbarrow full of apples and found some nightcrawlers at the bottom of the pile.

I'm thinking that maybe this weekend it's time to start fishing for suckers on the river. You need to remember, in 1957, there were no bait shops to buy nightcrawlers, which means the ground needed to be warm enough to dig worms. An apple pile or a pile of leaves would usually produce enough in a week or two.

The Houseworth crew from Port Trevorton will bring their coal dredging outfit up river and set up their barges at our boat landing. Our house is one of three properties that have road access to the river; road access to the river is necessary for the dump trucks to haul the coal from the barges.

March is a goofy time of the year. Too early to take the boat out because the river is too high to scrounge good junk from the heads of the islands. It's also too high for serious fishing other than carp and suckers. Last weekend, we made dough bait and went up the canal to the wash out and fished for carp. The best part of that is not fishing but building a fire and making "Pepperywood tea," which in hindsight, was God awful!

Middleburg Community Pool to Close

Last week, on March 3, the Middleburg Area Recreation Association Board (MARA) announced that the Middleburg Community Pool would be closed immediately after a unanimous vote. MARA cited rising expenses.

According to the announcement, "Despite recent attempts to manage rising expenses, including staff wages, chemicals, repairs, routine maintenance and the facility's overall deteriorating condition, the pool continues to operate at a financial deficit that makes ongoing operation unsustainable. Revenue generated during the short operating season is insufficient to cover the pool's regular operating budget."

Richard Bickhart, treasurer of MARA, explained that the Middleburg Community Swimming Pool has been operating in the red for the past three years in the amount of \$129,000. There projected loss for 2026 would be at least \$30,000. He cited repairs and state regulations for lifeguards are adding to the costs.


Facebook exploded with comments after the notice expressing frustration, anger, and memories. Many questioned the lack of community awareness of the dire straits and offered numerous fundraising options. Another poster noted that fundraising would have to be ongoing to meet the projected \$50,000 funds needed annually. Others suggested more volunteers and asking local businesses for donations. One questioned, "This is so upsetting! I wonder if there's anything the community can do to change this decision?"

Middleburg Community Swimming Pool posted in response, "We understand this is upsetting news. Also please understand that grants that we have applied for do not go towards the daily running of the pool. Grants are used for maintenance and fixing the pool. They cannot be used for the daily running, paying employees, or paying for chemicals."

Middleburg Community Swimming Pool also acknowledged the fundraising suggestion. "We are asking for people to form a community fundraising group that are willing to help with fundraising throughout the year. The best way to do this is to form a public meeting and have people come and talk." Perhaps the community could form a Friends of Middleburg Community Pool and assume a major role in the fundraising efforts.

Established in 1965, Middleburg Community Swimming Pool has served the community for over 60 years. MARA expressed "The Middleburg Community Swimming Pool has been a place where families gathered, children learned essential water safety skills, and local students gained meaningful employment opportunities."

MARA further noted "This decision was not made lightly. The pool has long been a valued recreational resource for Middleburg and surrounding communities. We are deeply grateful for the decades of support from township and borough partners, local businesses, families, and volunteers who have helped make the pool a cornerstone of our community."
