Crash 6:24 p.m. February 5, on N. Susquehanna Trail at its intersection with Park Road, in Monroe Township. A 1994 Dodge Dakota driven by Autumn M. Dietrich, 19, of Mifflinburg, was traveling south in the right lane of N. Susquehanna Trail at its intersection with Park Road. The Dodge Dakota ran the steady red light and subsequently struck a 2025 Toyota Rav4 driven by Tuyong Yang, 42, of Selingsgrove, in an angle style impact. The Toyota Rav4 was then pushed into a 2023 Kia Soul driven by Keana A. Witmer, 31, of Mahanoy City, who was preparing to turn left onto N. Susquehanna Trail from Park Road. All vehicles came to rest after the second point of impact. No injuries were reported. Dietrich was cited for failure to stop at red signal.

The Toyota Yaris traveled off the roadway after exiting a left curve. The Toyota Yaris traveled off the east shoulder and continued north with the right front tires mired in the soft packed snow. The Toyota Yaris continued forward and struck a blue and white historical marker sign with the front of the vehicle. After impact with the sign, the Toyota Yaris continued to travel north and struck trees and brush before coming to rest. Minor injuries were reported.
Fatal Crash 5:50 a.m. February 10, on SR 35, east of Cherry Hill Road, in West Perry Township. A 2024 Hyundai Tucson driven by Meghaan M. Yates, 42, of Mt. Pleasant Mills, was traveling north on SR 35 and a 2012 Dodge Ram 1500 driven by Aaron M. Alderfer, 38, of Richfield, was traveling south on SR 35. The Hyundai Tucson exited the northbound lane and entered the southbound lane and subsequently struck the Dodge Ram 1500. The Hyundai Tucson came to rest on the southbound shoulder of the roadway, facing southwest. The Dodge Ram 1500 came to rest off the roadway on the northbound side, facing southwest. Yates was not wearing her seat belt and was ejected through the front windshield of the vehicle. Alderfer was not wearing his seat belt and was extricated from his vehicle. Alderfer was taken to Geisinger Medical Center via Life Flight with severe injuries. Yates was pronounced dead at the scene.

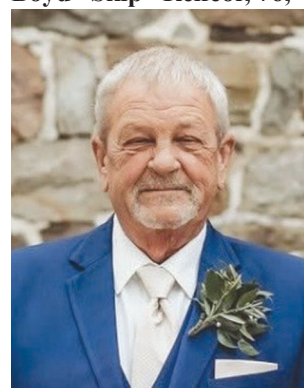

SPORTS NEWS

THE VIEW FROM HEAR

The two true signs that spring is near; MLB spring training has started and the winter sports season playoffs have begun. Basketball and wrestling districts kick off this Friday. In order to qualify for districts our four schools had some unfinished business to attend to and they all did pretty good with some exceeding expectations.

Middle-West girls basketball finished their season on a very high note in winning their last two games to finish 4-18. The Mustangs snapped a 12 game losing streak in a 47-42 OT win over Neumann Regional Academy. It was senior night in Middleburg as the three seniors were a huge factor in the victory.

Izzy Walter had 23 points, Emma Wagner 15 and Cali Sauers hit an important three. They then traveled to Newport and notched a 33-31 win. Walter had 14 points, 12 rebounds and 5 steals and Sauers had 9 points and 6 steals. Way to finish strong ladies.

The Dragonettes finished their regular season by winning their last three games. Lewisburg handed Muncy only their second loss all year with a convincing 47-24 win. Coming out of halftime with a five point lead, Lew held Muncy scoreless in the third quarter to take a 30-13 lead. Teagan Osunde and Lauren Schwartz each scored 12 points.

Against Jersey Shore a slow start turned into a 46-29 win as Ava Motto led all scorers with 14 points. Osunde's double-double of 13 and 12 with four dimes was key. Osunde outscored Montoursville all by herself 29-28 in the 51-28 team victory. Teagan added 13 rebounds and 5 steals. Lewisburg hosted Milton Thursday night in districts.

Mifflinburg secured their spot in districts with a 43-22 win over East Juniata. The heavy lifting was done by Avery Reibsome with 20, Mia Reibsome's 11 and Parice Shuck's 10 points. The Lady Cats continued their best play of the year at the right time in knocking off Line Mountain 45-32. Parice Shuck led all scorers with 19 and Avery had 10 with Lyla Moyer chipping in another 9 points.

Miff finished their regular season by coming from behind to beat Milton 38-34. The Reibsome twin towers combined for 29 points and 14 boards. Shuck crashed the glass for 8 boards. Mifflinburg hosted Danville Thursday night in the first round of districts.

The Middle-West boys ended their season with the same bad luck they had all year. They were down 14 in the first quarter but went to the break only one point behind Central Mountain. Mountain's team depth prevailed in the second half in beating the Mustangs 62-51 despite 14 from Adam Sellers and 11 from Hezekiah Prinsloo. Middle-West finished their year off 2-20 after losing 60-48 at Milton for Milton's first win of the year.

The Lewisburg boys (20-4) upset #1 seeded Warrior Run 67-61 in the semis of the PHAC tournament. Frosh Cortland Michaels had 21 points and Cooper Mowry hit 5 treys and totaled 19 to hand the Defenders their second loss of the year. Lew's defense by Rebira Jemama and Nazir Meredith in the paint was a huge factor as well.

The Dragons won the PHAC tourney title for the first time after beating Southern Columbia 57-52 in the title game. Once again, Jemama's defense on Southern's leading scorer was key as well as the team staying cool as the other side of the pillow when trailing late. Michaels finished with 15, Leon Tucker 12 and Jemama 11 along with his shutdown D.

Lewisburg has an opening round bye for the start of their 4A districts. The #5 seeded Wildcats in 4A traveled to #4 South Williamsport Thursday for their first round game. Selingsgrove, the 3 seed in 5A hosts Bangor on Friday night.

Mifflinburg ran away with the Southern sectional title they hosted and are sending eleven wrestlers to districts in Williamsport this weekend. Miff sectional champs were Collin Roman, Bradley Wagner, Ben Straub and Landon Moser. Roman got revenge on Warrior Runs #1 seed Kael Majcher who got a tech fall on Roman a month ago. Roman pinned him in the sectional finals. Moser also avenged a tech fall from Southern's Braylin Smith, ranked #8 in the state with a 3-2 OT decision.

Four other Wildcats lost in the finals to take second. Griffin Walls, Jack Gramly, Lane Kenamond and Landon Tucker all took silver medals home. Tucker decided to forfeit his final match so as not to risk a previous injury. Landon Shemory, Gradyn Shuck and Wesley Smith all took fourth place and advanced to Williamsport.

Middle-West's Charley Paige won gold at 145 in OT over the Cats Kenamond. Mason Kerstetter and Evan Maneval both took silver medals for the Mustangs. Lewisburg is sending four to districts in second place finishers Landon Michaels and Nolan Altoft. Colton Lyons and Landon Wagner took third place for the Green Dragons.

The Selingsgrove boys wrestling team starts their march to Hershey this weekend in Williamsport as well. On the girls side, Selingsgrove finished in seventh place at districts and Mifflinburg was ninth. The top five finishers will be moving on to Regionals held at Milton on 2/28. The Grove girls moving on include Elizabeth Varner, Tatianna Myers and Aislynn Weller. Mifflinburg has four wrestlers going to Milton. Avery Edison, Skyanne Little, Taylor Stewart and Autumn Dersham will be trying to get to Hershey.

The Ohio State/Penn State #1 vs #2 wrestling clash could have been so much more. In my opinion Ohio State coach Tom Ryan decided to sit out three of his best wrestlers to protect their high seeds for post season tournaments. It's been reported that all three wrestlers are still nursing injuries.

Penn State completely dominated the Buckeyes in winning nine of the ten matches in the 36-5 dismantling. I'm not saying Ohio State would have won if those three guys wrestled but the score would have been a bit closer. Throw in the fact the first two matches could have gone either way, the Buckeyes will be a formidable team in both the BIG and National championships. It still remains that coach Ryan was a coward last Friday night.

It was a tough Sunday afternoon of sports on TV. The NBA All-Star game, the Daytona 500 or golf from Pebble Beach? I settled on Sweden vs USA in curling from Cortina, Italy. I miss football. In hindsight I should have watched the Daytona 500 as Michael Jordan's team won the race and I could have sated two sports on one screen.

The NBA has some big issues they are dealing with and must get them resolved. We had the gambling issues at the beginning of the season with active players and a Hall of Fame coach. Teams tanking games to secure a higher draft pick in this year's draft and load management.

NBA teams that tank are basically not trying to win games so their chances of a higher draft pick are enhanced. The fourteen teams that don't make the playoffs have a chance for the first pick in the draft. The more games they lose, the higher the percentage of getting the first pick. Last year the Dallas Mavericks had less than a 2% chance of winning the draft lottery. To the surprise of everyone they got the first pick and drafted Cooper Flagg.

The easiest solution I see is to get rid of the lottery and the NBA draft. The lottery and draft are corporate welfare for sports teams to bring in younger and cheaper talent that could make a difference. If there is no lottery or draft, there's no tanking.

If a college or international player eligible to come into the NBA could choose from among all 30 teams, those 30 teams would have to earn their labor. That is much like high school recruits picking a college to play for.

What separates the NBA from the other professional sport leagues is the scarcity of NBA roster spots. There is also a salary cap which means it would be impossible for any one team to hoard all the good young talent.

Load Management in the NBA is a fancy term for you or me taking a personal day off from work. The players figure that they'll be fresher physically later in the season and throughout the playoffs. Don't forget that they travel in private jets, stay in five-star hotels and have team chefs at their disposal as well as top-notch physical therapy.

When you think about tanking and load management think about a family of four that saved money for over a year so they could attend a game. They enter the arena for the game and realize they should have brought their binoculars with them because they are so far away from the court.

The game is about to start and they notice Lebron or Kawhi or Steph or Durant are sitting on the bench wearing their tailored outfits and not a game jersey. The family came to this particular game to watch a favorite superstar play a basketball game, not to see him on the bench being a cheerleader.

People go to an NBA game to either be noticed or to watch a great player wow you with their skills on the court. It is not fair to the average fan when a perfectly healthy athlete doesn't play due to load management.

The average price for four people to attend an NBA game is \$1,442 which includes parking and a drink. Prices vary widely between teams with the Lakers and Knicks the most expensive and Memphis Grizzlies and Detroit Pistons the most affordable.

I checked Stub Hub for the Sixers Home game against the Timberwolves on Friday 4/3. Four tickets together would cost me \$284 not including anything else. The seats are in the corner and in the highest row. Now imagine if Anthony Edwards didn't play because he wanted a day off.

The winter Olympics are never as exciting as the summer games but this years display has been somewhat underwhelming. I mentioned last week that any event that is won or lost on subjective voting is not a real sport. The US ice dancing team pair that lost gold to the French pair and French scoring judge is a perfect example.

The best thing I've watched aside from the 45-year old snowboarder from Michigan has been curling. I think the attraction is the fact we watch this from our couch and it's the only sport in the Olympics where you and I feel we could compete and win.

Maggie took a lead role in getting the county outreach meetings organized in 2023. These meetings were held between district employees and municipal officials and are now held annually. Maggie also coordinates the district press and sign unveiling events that have been positively recognized by the public.

Maggie has also taken a proactive approach to informing the public and PennDOT employees of our maintenance operations. Maggie took the lead on developing articles on the science of winter, our regional paving crew efforts, and maintenance equipment. She has coordinated with the press for winter service ride-a-longs and coordinated with a local television station to feature articles about line painting operations and PennDOT career paths.

Maggie has further undertaken a proactive approach to photograph and video record garage and maintenance operations to improve overall awareness of the work our employees complete.

- Beaver Township, \$48,136 to purchase a new skid steer to maintain public roads, replacing aging equipment nearing the end of its useful life.
 - Freeburg Borough, \$464,349 to televise, clean, and re-line sewer mains along Market Street to address infiltration and inflow issues in a system over 75 years old.
 - Hummels Wharf Municipal Authority, \$248,500 to repair five problematic sewer main areas in Monroe Township.
 - McClure Borough, \$45,202 to purchase new communication radios and self-contained breathing apparatus to meet modern safety standards.
 - Penn Township, \$103,000 to purchase a new truck with emergency lighting, plow, and salt spreader and enhance the township's emergency management capabilities.
 - Perry Township Municipal Authority, \$385,000 to expand the sewer system and replace the outdated treatment plant to support growth and address failing on-lot systems.
 - Spring Township, \$32,902 to make upgrades to the Little League field, including LED field lighting and a concrete pad for the batting cage area to meet Little League standards and reduce energy costs.
 - Lewisburg Borough, \$61,625 to purchase gym equipment for Lewisburg Area Recreation Park, which serves residents of East Buffalo Township.

The funding for these projects was approved by the Commonwealth Financing Authority (CFA). This is an independent agency that holds fiduciary responsibility over the funding of programs and investments in Pennsylvania's economic growth.

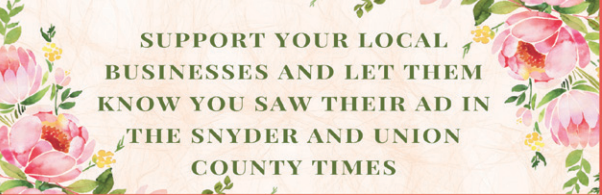

Union-Snyder CAA Launches February Campaign to Stabilize & Grow the Food Hub

Union-Snyder Community Action Agency (CAA) has launched its first annual February Food Hub Campaign, a month-long initiative focused on securing long-term support to stabilize and grow the CAA Food Hub—an essential resource that strengthens food access for thousands of households across Union and Snyder Counties.

The CAA Food Hub was created to address long-standing gaps in food access, including fragmented distribution schedules, uneven food supply, and limited infrastructure for fresh, nutritious food. By centralizing food storage, coordination, and distribution, the Food Hub serves as critical community infrastructure that supports families, seniors, and individuals while strengthening the region's entire food access network.

The importance of that infrastructure became especially clear during last year's SNAP halt and federal government shutdown. As disruptions left many households uncertain about their next meal, the Food Hub helped stabilize access to food by ensuring continuity, coordination, and dignity when traditional systems faltered.

"Moments like last year's SNAP halt reinforced why the Food Hub exists," said Nicole Peterson, Community Impact Director at Union-Snyder Community Action Agency. "Because the infrastructure was already in place, we were able to respond quickly and effectively. This campaign is about making sure that stability continues. Not just in times of crisis, but every day."

Throughout February, CAA will share stories, data, and community perspectives that highlight the Food Hub's impact and the role stable funding plays in sustaining and growing its work. The campaign places a particular emphasis on engaging business leaders, corporate partners, and philanthropic supporters interested in long-term solutions to food insecurity.

Today, the CAA Food Hub supports over 40 food programs that assist thousands of households annually, improving efficiency and maximizing the impact of donated resources. However, like many innovative community solutions, it relies on consistent operational support to remain strong.

"The Food Hub is not a short-term response," added Rachel Herman, Food Security Manager. "It's a system designed to work over time. Stabilizing it now ensures our community is better prepared when challenges arise."

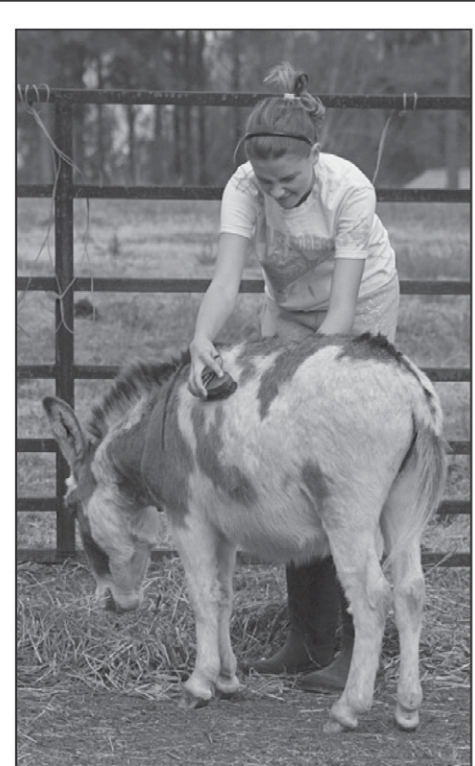

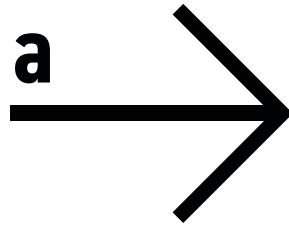


