McKees Half Falls Rest Area to Open April 6 in Snyder County

The McKees Half Falls Rest Area, located along Route 11 northbound in Chapman Township, Snyder County, will reopen on Monday, April 6. Located approximately 7 miles north of Liverpool, Perry County, and 3 miles south of Port Trevorton, Snyder County, McKees Half Falls has a small picnic area with grills and scenic view of the Susquehanna River, with primitive composting toilets. Dust Collection Fire at Wood-Mode

Units were dispatched to a fire at Wood-Mode LLC in Kreamer at 2:16 pm on Wednesday, March 25. When Kreamer Vol. Fire Department-Station 120 arrived, firefighters discovered a small fire in the dust collection system.

According to Kreamer Fire Chief Shannon Moyers, "The fire was contained to the piping and the 'baghouse' by the facility's sprinkler system. Firefighters extin-



guished the remaining fire within minutes. Crews were on scene for approximately 2 hours completing overhaul and assisting Wood-Mode maintenance staff."

Employees were evacuated from the building by the time firefighters arrived. Employees were dismissed at 3:00 pm. The factory was fully operational for normal scheduled work the following day.

Kreamer Fire Department was assisted at the scene by Reliance Hose Company of Middleburg, Dauntless Hook and Ladder Company of Selingsgrove, Fremont Fire Department, New Berlin Fire Department, Mifflinburg Hose Company, and Freeburg Fire Police. Damage was estimated at approximately \$10,000.00 per Wood-Mode staff.

The Last Weekend in March Only Sunday Was the Day of Racing

Comparing the 2025 early season races in March to this year things are quite different, with close to ten races scheduled at different tracks this year, with the 2025 season races and nine races getting run, while this year five were run. In both years Lincoln speedway managed to get one race in the month of February, both races 410-sprint car events. In 2025 Port Royal did the best with four races run, two for the Short Track Super Series Modifieds, two 410-sprint cars and two for the super late models. Lincoln speedway got two shows run two for the 410-sprints and one each for the 358-sprints and wingless sportsman. BAPS got three shows in one for the 410 sprints and two for the limited late models, Lincoln, Port Royal and Baps all run on Saturday night, Williams Grove did not get a show in, having three races scheduled and all three getting weathered out. This year Lincoln got two 410 sprint car shows in with one race for the 358-sprints, Williams Grove got one race in their season opener on a Sunday March 22nd with Lance Dewease scoring the 410-sprint car feature win over Dylan Norris, with 28 cars signed in, with last Friday night show getting rained out, the Sunday 410-sprint show drew a field of 28 cars. Port Royal only got one of their four scheduled races, with the 410-sprint drawing a field of 38 cars with Danny Dietrich getting the win over Chase Dietz, while Trevor Feathers won the super late models feature over Gregg Satterlee. Lincoln speedway got two races in with 410-sprint car feature wins going to Chase Dietz over Kyle Moody on March 8th., with 28 cars on hand, while Freddie Rahmer won over Anthony Macri, with a field of 32 cars on hand for the March 14th show, the 358 sprint car races went to Cody Fletcher with only 14 cars on hand. BAPS Motor speedway got three races in with two races for the 410-sprints, Anthony Macri scored the win over Chase Dietz on March 15th a Sunday show which drew 27 cars, Last Sunday Troy Wagaman Jr score the win over Freddie Rahmer, with 30-cars on hand, the 358-sprint feature was won by Cody Flether over Derek Locke, with 27 cars on hand. In the March 8th show the limited late models raced with the sprints with Gene Knaub scoring the feature win over Coleby Frye, with a field of 27 drivers on hand, March 21st the Limited late models again had a field of 27-racecars on hand with 16-year-old Treyton Lee scoring the feature win over Defending champ Scott Palmer. Last Sunday Bedford speedway opened its 90th season of racing with the super late models and Modifieds of the Short Track Super Series. The Modifieds drew a field of 29 cars with Danny Creeden scoring a last lap pass for the win over Alex Payne and Danny Bouc. In the super late model feature Justin Weaver drove to the win over Trevor Feathers, with 26 cars on hand for the opening race. Also of note PPMS speedway near Pittsburgh ran a 410-sprint and super late model show back on March 21st with Aj Flick getting the sprint win and Michael Norris getting the super late model feature win, Winchester speedway in Virginia ran a limited late model show on March 14th with Kyle Hardy getting both the limited late models and Crate late model feature win another race for the Crate late models had Kyle Hardy getting that feature win.

So far this season 410-sprint car winners have been Chase Dietz with two, single wins going to Lance Dewease, Danny Dietrich, Freddie Rahmer and Troy Wagaman Jr, 358 sprints has Cody Fletcher with two wins, super late model wins going to Trevor Feathers, Justin Weaver and Michael Norris, Limited late model wins going to Gene Knaub, Treyton Lee and Kyle Hardy, with two Crate late model feature wins going to Kyle Hardy.

The month of April will see four more big car racetracks open with this Friday Big Diamond, with their main divi-

sion Small Block Modifieds, along with Crate sportsman Modified and Roadrunners. They run most of their races on Friday nights with a Thursday night special for the USAC sprint in June, they also have a special race for the limited late model class coming up on Friday May 8th Selinsgrove speedway opens up on Friday April 10th with a show of 410-sprints and Super late models, they have a mix of Friday, Saturday and Sunday racing events with two Thursday night races also on the schedule. The break down is fourteen Friday night races, Five Saturday night races and three Sunday night programs. The 410-sprints are Eight times, with the super late models having 14 races, the limited late models have eleven shows, and the street stocks eleven races. Other divisions that will race at Selinsgrove the 305-sprints thirteen times, East Coast wingless sprints four times, Wingless Sportsman three, 360-sprint and four-cylinder two times each. Hagerstown speedway in the state of Maryland has cut back their schedule for the 2026 season with only sixteen races set for the speedway. Fourteen races will be held on Saturday with one race on Sunday and one on Friday. Hagerstown will run types of late modes, with four races for the super late models, nine for the limited late models and ten for the crate late models, they will also have six races for the 305 sprints, they also run two other support divisions. Sunday April 12 Clinton County open its season, with 20 races schedule another track that has cut back on their schedule races from in years past. After the Sunday show the track will switch back to its regular Friday night of racing, with a special for the limited late model class on Tuesday August 4th during the annual fair races. They will again run the Phil Walter Classic for the 410-sprints on Saturday August 15th. Clinton County will also have two other 410-sprint car races on Friday June 12th and Friday July 10th. The track has ten events for the 305-sprints six for the limited late models, along with the super late model Speedweek show on Friday June 5th. Twenty races for the Pro-Stocks and four-cylinder classes nineteen for the 270-micro sprints, along with two each for the East Coast wingless sprints and Legends, and three for the Junior sprints. Other

SPORTS NEWS

THE VIEW FROM HEAR

Our Spring sports season is now in full bloom and early results are hard to read. The first four Selinsgrove softball games have had a lot of runs scored in lopsided endings. Credit Grove (2-2) for scheduling-up out of conference. They opened with powerful Blue Mountain and lost 19-1. Closer to home they beat Juniata 13-2 and Milton.

Teagan Richter ended the Juniata game with a three-run homer in the fifth inning and finished with five RBIs. Winning pitcher Addie Kolak had more hits herself (3) than she allowed (2). The Seals continued their winning ways by doubling up Milton 12-6 behind homers from Molly Hess and Sadi Bigger. Hess scored two runs with 3 RBIs.

They ventured back to coal country to play a very good Minersville nine and lost 17-5. If the Selinsgrove girls can stay positive, these early games against tough teams will pay off in the end.

The Mifflinburg girls have high hopes of a D4 title and beyond this year. They got off on the right foot and left arm of Taylor Stewart in beating Danville 5-2. Brook Gessner's two-run single broke a fifth inning tie. Stewart retired 13 of the final 14 Danville hitters. Anna Pachucki was 2 for 4 with a double and two runs.

The Lady Cats (2-0) won a pitcher's duel in the cruelest way for Warrior Run. Both teams combined for only four hits. The Fluman sisters had the only hits for Mifflinburg, Amelia had two and Aubrey one. Amelia scored the only run of the game with two outs in the bottom of the seventh inning on a wild pitch.

Freshman Olivia Dorman arrived on the scene for Middle-West as advertised. The nationally acclaimed softball player homered and had three RBIs to lead the Mustangs in a 17-6 rout of Newport. Lia Stoltzfus added a double and two ribs.

Dorman's heroics weren't enough in an 8-4 loss to Susquenita. Dorman went 3 for 4 with a homer and two doubles. Middle-West got well quickly in an 11-0 shutout over Shik as Kylie Mitch was in control inside the circle. Cali Sauer, Kady Wagner and Katie Zimmerman each had two hits and two RBIs in the victory.

Lewisburg softball is off to a slow start in losing 12-10 to Sullivan County and 8-1 to Jersey Shore.

I'm not sure who schedules the Spring sports for Selinsgrove but like the softball team, they opened with two rugged teams. The Seals were shutout by 11-0 by Williamsport. Penn State baseball recruit Deshawn White hit two home runs in going 3 for 3 with three runs and RBIs. Grove didn't have a hit in the five inning game.

Andrew Gesumaria's two hits including a triple weren't enough for Grove as they fell to Wyoming Valley West 7-3. The Selinsgrove bats woke up late against Mifflinburg as they scored eight runs in the sixth to tie the game at 11-11. I have to question the Cat's pitching when you can't close the door with an eight run lead? Jake Beddall's two-run double pulled the Seals within two and three straight walks tied the game before it was called for darkness.

Kaiden Kmett was able to close the door in relief for a Mifflinburg 5-4 lid-lifting win over Shik. Brennan Snyder's two-run double and closer Kmett were the difference.

Middle-West beat Loyalsock 7-1 behind Colton Aumiller's pitching and two RBIs each from Braxton Smith, Max Trawitz and Alex Trojan. Warrior Run came to Beaver Springs and handed the Mustangs their first loss 8-2. Middle-West outthit the Defenders with Kyle Shupp and Smith having two hits each but Warrior Run played longball with two round-trippers.

Middle-West (2-1) hosted Montoursville next and Shupp was the first hitter for Middle-West. He rapped a single and that was the first and last hit the home team had in losing 12-0.

Lewisburg baseball (0-3) got off to a rocky start in losing 18-1 to Loyalsock, a team Middle-West handled earlier 7-1. Giving up 16 hits and committing five errors is not a good recipe for winning baseball games. They followed with losing a closer game 7-5 to Montgomery. Landen Wagner had a three-run homer against Mount Carmel in an 18-8 loss.

Lacrosse continues to be a sport that is growing locally. I knew nothing about the game and thought John Hopkins invented it and only yuppies played it. That was until my daughter started dating a guy who grew up on Long Island and was an All-Conference LAX player in college and assistant coach at Cal.

Lewisburg is the defending D4 champion in Lacrosse but lost eight starters from last year's team. This will be a rebuilding year but the Dragons have solid players to build around with Ava Motto, Lauren Hetherington and Adreeyana Ren. They lost their first two games but beat Mifflinburg 12-5.

Mifflinburg coach Liam Holohan has a very young team with good athletes. The Cats have 14 of the 19 rostered

players listed as freshmen and sophomores. Another trip to Districts could be in the offing.

Middle-West first year coach Lonnie Wagner has an untested team with only five players with experience. Maci Tittle and Kyli Hockenberry will be the ones to drive this team to a couple wins.

The Selinsgrove girls LAX team looks like the best team in our four school area. Experience alone with eight returning seniors bodes well for the Seals. Coach Andrew Howell will lead his team to the top of D4.

There should be some really good track and field teams around these parts. The Lewisburg girls fell short by seven points of winning a team title at states last year. The good news is they return plenty of stars from that team for a legitimate chance to win it all at States.

The team is led by five Div 1 recruits headed by future Penn Staters and state champions Teagan Osunde (javelin) and Baylee Espinosa (1600 & 3200). The third future Lion is jumper Lydia Delsite by way of transfer from Moon Township.

The other outstanding veterans are Maddy Moyers (sprints) and Emma Bolton (jumper). Caroline Blakeslee, Lauren Schwartz and Kate Batkowski will also add unheard of depth for a high school track team.

Middle-West coach Jason Gemberling is looking for senior leadership on both his boys and girls squads. Leading the girls will be Carly Faulhaber, Emery Peters and Maddie Bonsall in sprints and relays. Ashlyn Hoffman and Olivia Stroup running mid-distance and relays and Leigha Wenger in the field events.

Mifflinburg only had four seniors on last year's 8-2 team and have many terrific tracksters returning. Makenna and Makayla Fogle with Lock Haven bound Jazzy Doebler will lead the sprints and relays. Lyla Moyer, Parice Shuck and Natalie Gemberling will be leading hurdles and jumps and Emily Aikey and Laurel Ramsey will be tossing the metal.

Depth and experience will propel the Grove girls team in track and field. Grove finished 7-1 in 3A last year and according to coach Mike Stebila after a fantastic winter track season he expects nothing less. Bella Furgison will be anchoring the field events with do-it-all Lake Dent running and jumping. Relays will be handled by Mikayla Martin, Gigi Veach, Kala Hoke and Kiana Kruskie.

On the boys side, expectations are high with Selinsgrove with a young but talented group. Seniors that will help their younger teammates grow are Matt Stebila in jumps and hurdles and Bobby Kruskie, Michael Andretta (distance and relays). Noah Walter, Brett Rice, Wyatt Teats and junior Jack Piecuch in sprints and relays. Chase Carter will thrive in the throws.

Both Selinsgrove teams got off to good starts in sweeping their quad matches with Brookville, Bellefonte and East Juniata.

The boys team in Lewisburg lost a lot of point production to graduation. Last year's team finished 5-0, won 2A districts and finished third at states. Distance runners have always been a strength at Lewisburg and this year will be no different.

Justin Nolt, Grayson Barner, Hugh Ikeda Shields and Riley and Blake Gulden-Luthi will keep the Green Dragon distance running dominant.

Improving Middle-West's 1-7 record from last year is the Mustangs first goal and after that everything else will fall into place. Achieving this goal will fall on a deep and talented group of relay and distance runners. They consist of Wyatt Nelson, Connor Stoltzfus, Grant Boop, Lincoln Hoffman and Nathan Straub.

First year Mifflinburg coach Jonathan Fetterolf will be looking at three seniors to provide a bunch of points, Larry Murray with his legs, returning state medalist Chace Aikey with his throws and Chase Yoder running and jumping.

Two brothers that toed the rubber at Mifflinburg Area are pitching at the Division 1 level. Cade Dressler is at Virginia Commonwealth University (16-11). Cade has appeared in eight games with one save and a 5.02 ERA in 14.1 innings pitched. Younger brother Troy is at Wake Forest (20-8) having appeared in eleven games, the most of any pitcher on staff. Troy started out as a reliever but just recently had two starts and sports a 4.10 ERA and a 3-1 record with 43K's in 26.1 innings pitched. Con-

tinued success and health to the Dressler boys.

I am sure you have heard about or seen the ending to the Duke/UCONN game to go to the Final Four. It was an incredible ending to a game UCONN had no right to win. It was the first time a #1 ranked team led by at least 15 points at halftime and lost in a March Madness game. First time in 135 games ...ever. 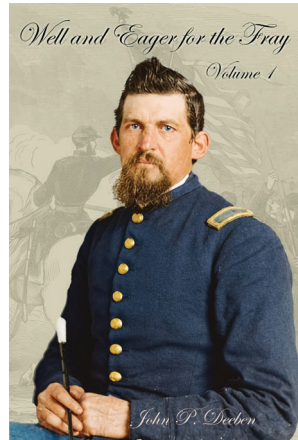
But to Ed, the 3 most important things in life, are Family, Family, and Family... an idea that he leaves all of us with, which we embrace each and every day.

SCHS Presents Program on Letters Written by Civil War Soldiers

The Snyder County Historical Society is proud to offer another interesting historical program on Sunday, April 12 at 2 pm at Emmanuel Lutheran Church in Middleburg. John Deeben, historian, government archivist, and genealogist, will discuss letters written by Civil War soldiers acting as war correspondents to local newspapers. These letters showcase a first-hand account of life on the battlefield.

The program, "Well and Eager for the Fray: Vol. 1 and Vol. 2" is based on the books of the same name written by John Deeben. According to the book description, "These soldiers had a story to tell. While most of them typically corresponded with family and friends, apprising loved ones of their well-being and recounting military adventures, many also wrote for a more public audience. Acting as impromptu field correspondents, they penned reports to hometown newspapers on a regular basis, keeping communities informed of their activities, conveying news about the fate of neighbors, and perhaps most importantly, providing relentless support for hometown morale. Above all else, they voiced unwavering belief in the just and righteous nature of the Union cause."

John P. Deeben compiled an anthology of letters written by soldiers specifically for publication in two local Northumberland County newspapers, the Sunbury Gazette and Sunbury American. The letters bring to life the story that people in our area played during the Civil War. Deeben's full-length Civil War publications, "Well and Eager for the Fray: Vol. 1 and Vol. 2," are now available on Amazon and Sunbury Press.

The program is free to the public. Located at 100 East Main Street in Middleburg, Emmanuel Lutheran Church is handicapped accessible. Light refreshments served after the program.

Following the program, attendees are invited to an informal viewing of the Snyder County Soldiers Memorial that has been repaired under the supervision of Ethan Bobb for his Eagle Scout project. A formal Open House will be held at a later date. Bobb will be on-hand to answer questions about the restoration that has been completed.

Lee Knepp on behalf of the Snyder County Historical Society noted that the mission of the "SCHS is to educate the public as to what we are celebrating (during America-250PA), to give us a greater understanding and appreciation of our history in general, and especially this year... the founding of our Nation."

Teen's Eagle Scout Project Revives Snyder County Soldiers Memorial

What began as a daily glance out a school bus window turned into a nearly \$200,000 effort to restore one of Snyder County's most meaningful historic landmarks.

Seventeen-year-old Ethan Bobb, a senior at Mid-West High School and Life Scout with Troop 415, has completed his Eagle Scout project — a restoration of the Snyder County Soldiers Memorial in Middleburg. The work not only preserves a deteriorating structure, but also renews a space that honors generations of local veterans.

"I drove past it every day on my way to school," Bobb said. "I always wondered what was inside. When I finally went in and saw how rough it was, it just stuck with me. I couldn't let it keep getting worse."

The Snyder County Soldiers Memorial dates back to the post-Civil War era, when it was established by the Grand Army of the Republic. Built of stone and filled with panels bearing the names of local service members, the building stands as a quiet but powerful reminder of the county's deep military history.

Inside, that history is overwhelming, "It really makes you realize how many people from this area served," Bobb said. "You see all the names lined up next to each other. It's humbling."

For Bobb, who has no personal military service experience, the project became something deeply personal anyway. "You recognize the last names," he said. "Names you hear around here all the time. It connects you to the people who came before you."

But before any repairs could begin, there was a significant hurdle: figuring out who even owned the building. "The hardest part was tracking down ownership and getting permission," Bobb said. "For a while, it kept getting passed around, and nobody really knew who was responsible."

Eventually, ownership was confirmed with the Snyder County Historical Society, which partnered with Bobb to move the project forward.

From there, the scope quickly grew. The building had suffered years of water damage from a failing roof. Concrete at the entrance was crumbling. Interior ceiling tiles were deteriorating. Windows needed attention, and the entire structure required cleaning and preservation work.

Without intervention, Bobb said, the damage would have only worsened. "We knew if we didn't fix the roof, more water would keep getting in," he said. "That would lead to more damage inside, and eventually the building could be lost."

With help from local contractors including T. Ross Construction, along with volunteers and community support, the project tackled major structural and cosmetic improvements.

Work included replacing the roof, repairing and pouring new concrete, painting window areas, installing plexiglass protection, and conducting extensive interior cleaning. The final phase — replacing deteriorated ceiling tiles — was recently completed, officially wrapping up the project.

In total, the effort approached \$200,000 in value, with funding raised through community donations, events like chicken barbecues, and partnerships with local businesses. Dan Bobb, Ethan's father said, "He actually 'over fund-

raised' with more money raised than was needed, so the scouts will donate to the historical society's memorial fund."

Now, Ethan Bobb says, the memorial is once again a place worthy of the names it holds. "It's about making sure this is here for the future," he said. "These people deserve to be remembered."

The restored building stands not only as a tribute to past service, but also as an example of present-day commitment — a young person stepping up to preserve history.

The Snyder County Historical Society plans to showcase the completed work during a public program on April 12 at 2pm, nearby Emmanuel Lutheran Church in Middleburg, where the memorial will be open following the presentation. Ethan is planning on attending the April 12 open house at the memorial.

For those who pass the building now, it's no longer just something seen in passing. It's a story — of service, sacrifice, and one teenager who refused to let it fade away.

Snyder County President Judge Announces New Work Release Option for Female Inmates

President Judge Lori Hackenberg recently announced a collaborative initiative between the Snyder County Probation Department, Snyder County Commissioners and Corrections, and Columbia County Prison officials to establish a work release option for female inmates from Snyder County.

This initiative marks a significant step forward in expanding rehabilitation opportunities and addressing a long-standing gap in programming for female inmates within Snyder County. Through partnerships with neighboring counties, including Mifflin County and Columbia County, Snyder County has worked to create a viable pathway for eligible female inmates to participate in structured work release programming.

"At its core, this initiative is about fairness, opportunity, and public safety," said President Judge Hackenberg. "Providing female inmates with access to work release programming not only promotes accountability but also supports successful reintegration into the community."

At this time, one female inmate from Snyder County has been approved for participation in the program and will be transferred to Columbia County Prison to begin the process. Officials anticipate that this partnership will serve as a model for future placements as additional eligible individuals are identified.

Work release programs are designed to allow eligible inmates to maintain employment while serving their sentence, fostering responsibility, financial stability, and a smoother transition back into the community.

A River Rat's Ramblings: April 1957

The transition to spring has made a big difference in my attitude.

Tim, dad and I went trout fishing last weekend on Penns Creek and had a great time. This was the first time Tim or I ever fished for trout on a creek this big. I have to admit it was a learning experience for both of us. First was realizing you don't just step in the creek and start fishing, it's deep and swift. A boot full of water was the first lesson. It was early morning; both the air and water were quite chilly when I needed just one more step to get the perfect spot. I never did fish that spot. When you do something dumb like that, you try not to call attention to yourself, even though you want to cry because the water is soooooo cold. I didn't make a sound, just walked back to shore, emptied my hip boot and fished with an ice-cold foot for the next three hours, until my body heat started to warm the remaining water in my boot.

Dad gave me my next lesson, "Jimmy, you have to fish where the fish are." What he meant was, the trout were on the bottom of the creek, among the rocks, not up in the water column with the current. I needed to put more split shot on my line to get my worm down to the bottom among the rock and trout. With that much weight on my line, I could cast halfway across the creek, but as soon as you do that, your bait ends up on one side of a rock and your split shot on the other. This results in a snag that usually ends up with you losing your whole rig when your line breaks trying to get it loose from the snag. After losing two more rigs, I figured out that fishing a weighted rig directly down-

stream results in a few fish and fewer snags. A lesson I think dad wanted me to figure out for myself (lesson learned)!

Tim and I also decided dad knew what he was doing as he almost had his limit and we each had two fish. Dad always fished with a split bamboo fly rod and never fished more than 25 feet away from where we stood. When we started to fish closer, we found we had more control of our bait, fished at a slower pace and the important part...we started catching fish.

We went to Weikert several times that spring. The lessons learned from this trip contributed to our future success. Thanks Dad! Tim and Jim.

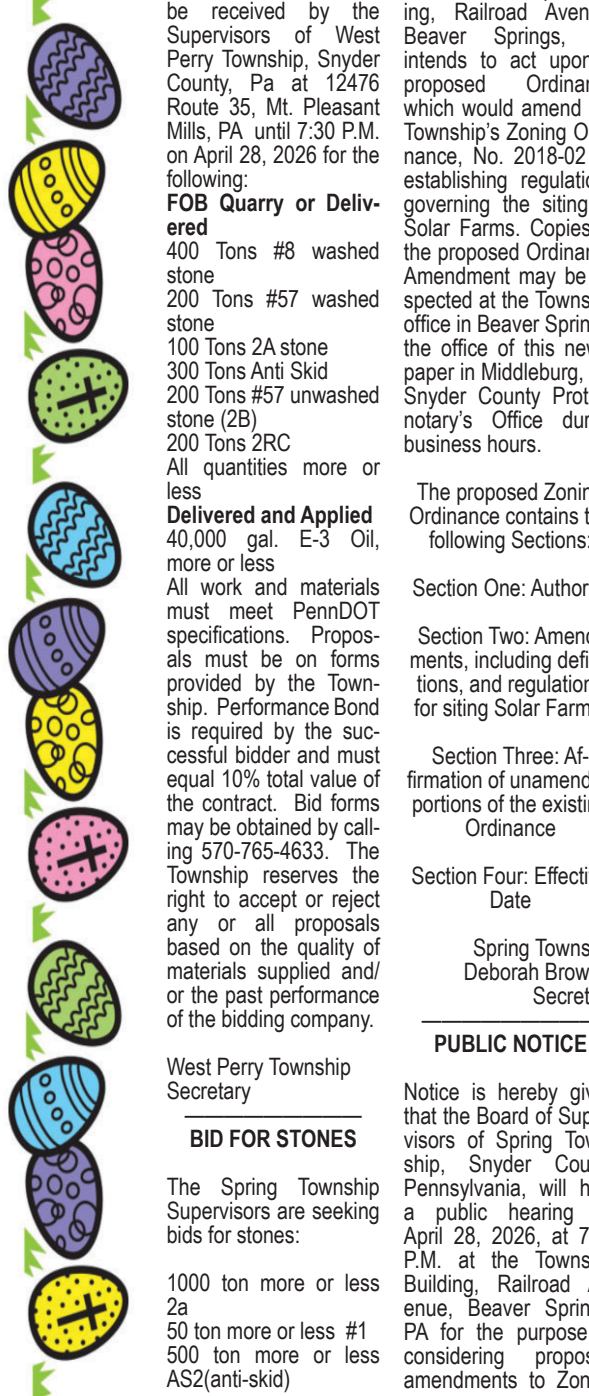

Annie Knight Gregory's Grave Marker To Be Honored by Conrad Weiser DAR

A wreath laying event for Annie Knight Gregory, the last Real Daughter of the NSDAR and a member of the Conrad Weiser Chapter will be held on Saturday, April 11 at 1 pm at the Union Cemetery on University Avenue in Selinsgrove.

Annie Knight Gregory was the daughter of Revolutionary War Soldier Richard Knight. Richard was 10 years old when he bravely stepped into the ranks, as

militia, and continues on the roll until December 5, 1814. Richard Knight was married three times, and at the time of his death in January 1850; he was 83. He was survived by three sons and two daughters. Annie was a young girl of about 7 when her father died. Annie remembered her father as a tall man of dignified military bearing. "All Daughters of the American Revolution (DAR) are descended from Revolutionary War patriots and soldiers. Imagine, though, joining the DAR through the Revolutionary War service of your own father. This was the distinct privilege of a Real Daughter. Not to be confused with the 'daughter of a Revolutionary war soldier or patriot,' a Real Daughter was distinguished because she was a DAR member as well as the actual daughter of a soldier or patriot." Annie Knight Gregory was the last surviving NSDAR Real Daughter. Annie was also the youngest "original" Daughter in the National Society of the Daughters of the American Revolution. She joined DAR#21323, on November 4, 1897. Annie was born on March 23, 1843 in Liverpool, PA when her father was 76 years old. She attended Freeburg Academy, a select boarding school. On November 25, 1863, at the age of 18, Annie Knight married Benjamin Franklin Gregory of Selinsgrove, Pennsylvania. He was a banker employed at First National Bank. They had two sons. The older, Harry Knight Gregory, was born on December 4, 1865, and became a prominent lawyer in the New Castle, Pennsylvania. Forrest Ever Gregory was born April 27, 1868, and was a businessman in Williamsport, PA. The couple was married for 45 years until Mr. Gregory's death in 1907.

On her 100th birthday Annie received greetings from President Franklin D Roosevelt. At Annie's death on December 17, 1943, she was NSDAR's last surviving "Real Daughter" and a member of the Conrad Weiser Chapter. During her lifetime she served as Second Regent of the Conrad Weiser Chapter. On November 15, 1938, she broadcast a message over radio station WRAK of Williamsport as part of a program arranged in her honor by the Lycoming Chapter of DAR and PA DAR officials. In 1940, Annie also forwarded a message by transcription to the National DAR being held in Washington D.C.

The public is invited to a wreath laying ceremony in honor of and remembrance of the last surviving "Real Daughter of NSDAR" Annie Knight Gregory's grave in Union Cemetery in Selinsgrove. The ceremony will be held on Saturday, April 11 at 1 pm.
