Three nights of 410-sprint car racing with the High Limit racing series on hand starting last Thursday night with Anthony Macri scoring the feature win worth \$10,000 scoring one win for the PA Posse. A field of 49 drivers was on hand for the show with Justin Whittall getting second with Brenham Crouch, Danny Dietrich and Rico Abreu placing in the top five. With the second placed finish Justin Whittall inched closer to Port Royal's track title, with his closest rival, Logan Wagner, not having a very good night. In the PASS 305 sprints, Nick Swighart scored his second win of the season and with that he took the track championship with Kenny Heffner, Josh Spicer, Jim Pattock and Fred Arnolds in the top five. Logan Spahr placed sixth. Going into the feature, Logan was just five point behind Sweigart and ended begin 45 out in second place. Kenny Heffner, Mike Melair and Doug Dodson placed in the top five. The PASS group had seven features during the season with Sweigert winning two along with Timmy Bittner. Single wins went to Kruz Kepner, Doug Dodson and Josh Spicer. Friday night, The High Limit series turned the table on the Posse with Aaron Reutzel scoring the \$10,000 feature win over Anthony Macri, Brent Marks, Ryan Smith and Parker Price Miller. This time 50-drivers were signed in for action, still two Posse drivers made the top five Macri and Ryan Smith. Justin Whittall just did enough to finish ahead of Logan Wagner to clinch the track championship. His first ever at Port Royal. Whittall had 6050 with Wagner at 5805, the rest of the top five were Brock Zearfoss, Michael Walter of Selinsgrove and Gerard McIntyre. Also, in action on Friday there was the final point race for the tracks Limited late models. Lane Snook just about had the point wrapped up going into the feature and he put an exclamation point on the title by winning his fourth feature of the year there and his seventeenth overall for the season. Spike Morre, Jaxton Garman, Brad McGinnis and Andrew Yoder were in the top five. Snook ended the season with 3035 to 2760 for Ryan Zook, Jaxton Garman 2550, Matt Murphy 2380 and Eric Irvin at 2210. Other feature winners during the season were Kyle Hardy, Andrew Yoder, Dillan Stake, Brad McGinnis and Tyler Bare. Saturday non-point for the final night of racing at Port Royal but up for grabs was the winner share of \$58,000 for

Sunday night the second of the FALL CLASH series for super late models were in action at the called Action Tracks USA which located in Kutztown PA, and is a wide 1/5-mile racetrack. The track usually runs smaller cars like the 660-micros, slingshots, and sometimes other small division classes. Some people would say the track was too small for late models, but they would have been wrong, it was quite a show with the twelve drivers that showed up to race. The 60-lap feature only had one caution flag for a stopped car. Trevor Feathers of Winchester VA scored the feature win over Mason Zeigler. Mason was having the perfect night until the feature, he set Fast time with a clocking of 112.051, won his heat race and won the 6-lap dash. But Feathers got the best of him at the start and never looked back scoring the win in the Cameron/Mann #72. The track in the past has tried other big cars on the 1/5-mile oval with success like the 410-sprint and the big block Modifieds, not sure if there will be another show next year at the Kutztown track, but I hope so it was quite the show. The next race for the Fall Clash series will take place this Friday night with a co-sanctioned event with the ULMS series. This event for the Clash drivers is a show up point's event. The next official points show will take place at Clinton County Speedway on Saturday September 20th along with the Laurel Highland 305- sprint and open four-cylinders

Two big nights of racing this weekend at Selinsgrove speedway with racing on Saturday night for the super late models racing for \$10,000 to win with \$800 to take the green. In an unsanctioned show titled the Thrill on Sand Hill, the track couldn't have been better. Other divisions in action will be the PASS 305-sprints and Street Stocks. So far this year Rick Eckert and Gregg Satterlee each have two wins at Selinsgrove with single wins going to Andrew Yoder, Mason Zeigler and Ross Robinson. Eckert led the point standing over Shaun Jones going into the weekend. In 305-sprint action there have been six different winners in six races with Doug Dodson, Kruz Kepner, Logan Spahr, Paul Moyer, Ken Duke and Mike Melair showing feature wins. Kruz Kepner is the points leader over Ken Duke. Street stock's winner so far has been Jason Geeseman with four wins Brad Mitch with two wins and a single win for Steve Kent. Brad Mitch is the points leader over his son Aiden. Sunday will be the running of the Jim Nace Memorial along with the Limited late models. The Nace Memorial will pay the winner \$15,626 to win with \$800 to take the green. It will be interesting to see if any High Limit drivers will show up as they race on Friday and Saturday at Lernerville Speedway and have Sunday off from racing. You might have to show up to figure this one out. There are a lot of extra monies on this night with Chrystal Nace giving \$300 to the fast-time driver of the night, plus paying \$100 to all the heat winners, plus more stuff for drivers and fans. Also, a Fireworks display will be held on both nights. Danny Dietrich is leading the 410-sprint points over Blane Heimbach and Austin Bishop. The limited late models will also be racing for some extra money in their program, with Lane Snook leading the points over Andrew Yoder and Zach Kauffman. 410-sprint winners so far this year have been Danny Dietrich and Chase Dietz with two each. In limited action, Snook has four feature wins with single wins going to Coleby Frye, Andrew Yoder and Jared Fulkroad. The last time the Jim Nace Memorial was run, Brent Marks scored the win on September 16th, 2023. Before that Anthony Macri had won the race three years in a row.

SUN Tech and SEDA-COG Partner to Deliver Summer Trades Training for Adult Learners and Strengthen the Regional Workforce

New Berlin, PA – SUN Area Technical Institute, in collaboration with the SEDA-Council of Governments (SEDA-COG), recently completed a free, hands-on Customized Training Course designed to strengthen the regional workforce in the construction trades. The course ran from June 23 through July 10, 2025, and focused on Carpentry, Electrical, and HVAC fundamentals for

adult learners throughout the region. Funded by a grant from the U.S. Department of Treasury through the Pennsylvania Department of Community and Economic Development (DCED), this three-week training program was tailored to meet the specific needs of local employers, with an emphasis on weatherization and housing rehabilitation.

Developed and delivered by SUN Tech instructors with

skilled trades experience, the course provided hands-on instruction in key technical areas, including residential wiring, electrical troubleshooting, HVAC system basics, framing, drywall installation, and energy-efficient weatherization techniques. Participants also received essential safety training and explored real-world applications relevant to the job market. At the conclusion of the course, each participant received a tool bag stocked with the tools they learned to use throughout the training. This not only reinforced the hands-on learning they received during the course but also equipped them with the foundational tools needed to pursue employment or further education in the skilled trades.

“We’re proud to provide this opportunity to help our community members gain valuable, in-demand skills,” said Abigail Eichner, Federal Programs Coordinator at SUN Tech. “Collaborative programs like this make a meaningful difference—not just for participants, but for the employers who rely on a skilled workforce.”

To accommodate a wider range of participants, the training was offered in both daytime and evening sessions, allowing flexibility for those balancing work and family commitments. This summer marked the third time SUN Tech and SEDA-COG partnered to deliver the customized training course, with continued positive feedback from participants.

SEDA-COG and SUN Tech actively gathered input throughout the program to ensure instruction remained practical and relevant. The success of this session, and previous courses, has paved the way for future training initiatives.

Looking ahead, SUN Tech remains committed to expanding its adult education programs. While no additional classes are currently scheduled in the fall 2025 term, updates and announcements about upcoming offerings will be shared on the SUN Tech Facebook page. Future courses will focus on a variety of skilled trades and other in-demand fields based on the evolving needs of local employers.

A researcher of judicial politics and statistics for the social and behavioral sciences, Zorn is also currently the principal investigator for two projects supported by the National Science Foundation — including one that examines how the roles played by judges’ positions in the legal/judicial hierarchy impact their decision-making.

Lewisburg beat Midd-West 3-1 as Elliana Rupert had two goals and Tia Berge two assists before lightning forced the game to be called early. Cady Shoeman had two goals and Tia Berge two assists and a goal as the Dragons (3-1) shut out Shik four zip. Midd-West turned a third quarter scoreless tie into a 3 goal lead in under one and a half minutes and beat Danville 4-0. Audrey Resseguie had two goals and an assist.

Nathan Horst assisted on both goals over Benton with Parker Eppley and Abram Sellers the benefactors. The Mustangs also shutout East Juniata 11-0, Mifflinburg 4-0 and Milton 4-0. Derek Wert has been making more saves than Bruce Sutter.

Miff soccer (2-4) picked up a W over Loyalsock 2-0 with goals from Warrick Beachy and Dylan Seigel. They returned home and lost 5-2 to Montoursville.

The Lewisburg girls soccer team has a rare 1-4 record early on. Kate Batkowski scored twice in the first six minutes but Grove's Madi Merrell had two goals and an assist in a 3-2 Seal win. The Dragons played Southern tough and held a two goal lead until the undefeated Tigers scored three straight goals... the last one coming in OT.

Midd-West is also off to a slower than expected start at 0-2-1. Improvement came in their last game by tying Williamsport 2-2 with Adie Yerg and Ava Atkins tallying goals for the Mustangs.

Mifflinburg girls tennis is struggling early on but is showing progress. The early season schedule is tough with losses to Montoursville and Milton. Better results to come. The Lewisburg girls have opened 4 and 3 after losing to Danville and Hughesville. Grove girls are looking to find their groove after starting 2-3 and losing a heart-breaker to Shik.

Coming up short against undefeated teams was the theme for last week's high school football games. Midd-West lost to Warrior Run, Lewisburg fell short to undefeated Bloom 35-24 and Selinsgrove edged better in losing to Jersey Shore.

Midd-West lost to a well balanced Warrior Run team. Despite being down 33 points, Kyle Shupp got the Mustangs on the board with an 89 yard kickoff return for six. Shupp also ended the scoring with a rushing TD. The Mustangs visit Loyalsock this week in what should be a very entertaining game.

The Dragon's Nick Coleman totaled over 200 all purpose yards and Jaylen Walker continued his high flying ways in pulling down two aerial TD's. Unfortunately, Bloom's QB Wyatt Brosious threw for 176 and ran for 199 yards and three TD's to lead the Panthers.

Lewisburg, looking for their first win, led 18-14 at halftime. They were outscored 21-6 in the second half. Dragon coach Eric Wicks said "we have to do a better job coaching." Bloom made the halftime adjustments and contained Lewisburg with solid defense in the second half.

Selinsgrove coach Matt Wenrich sees improvement from his squad after a rugged three game stretch to open the season. "I think from last

week to this week we have taken a step forward" Wicks said after losing 49-6 to an undefeated Jersey Shore.

Moving forward, the Seals must improve their run defense after giving up 685 yards on the ground the past two games. No team wants to start 0-3 but Wenrich seems optimistic about next week's matchup against a winless Central Mountain.

When you gain 416 yards on offense and only give up 40 yards from scrimmage in the first half you would think you have the game under control. You would also think a team should be leading by more than six points with that disparity in yardage. That is what Mifflinburg faced on their trip to tradition rich high school football in coal country.

The first drive of the second half is always the most important one in any football game. Mt Carmel's first second half drive came 14 yards short of tying the game with Mifflinburg. The Red Tornadoes drive stalled on downs and the Wildcats took over from there with a 13 play, 86 yard march that culminated with a 13 yard Larry Murray TD run.

The eight other Murray touches resulted in 233 more yards and another 3 touchdowns including 52 and 78 yards TD receptions and a 63 yard TD run. Miff's offense set a school record of 618 yards and hope both sides of the ball continue their dominance when they visit undefeated Montoursville this week.

Which coach gets fired first...the Giant's Brian Daboll or Miami's Mike McDaniel? Just because you were a great coordinator doesn't make you an average head coach. Speaking of the Giants, two years ago it was Saquon, last year it was Daniel Jones. What is their management team and more importantly their fans thinking now?

Speaking of management, Eagle's GM Howie Roseman continues to tinker with his roster and improve his team by trading for backup running back Tank Bigsby. Is AJ Brown going to be traded next? Only Howie knows but don't be surprised.

Coverage of college football is becoming more like cable news covering politics. ESPN/ABC has aligned itself with the SEC and FOX is all about the Big Ten. I don't have a problem with that seeing that ESPN paid a lot of money to air SEC games and FOX owns the Big Ten Network. My issue is when either network compares the best players in the country they are only focusing on those that play in the league they broadcast.
