## Middleburg Community Pool to Open May 30

Splash Splash! The Middleburg Community Pool will open May 30! The pool management will offer open swim, swim lessons, special events, and family-friendly programming throughout the summer months.

After a disconcerting announcement in March by the Middleburg Area Recreation Association (MARA) about closing this community resource due to rising costs and financial losses over several years, area residents exploded with dismay, anger and frustration. There was rally by residents to raise funds to keep it open. Facebook filled with suggestions.

In response to community concerns and fundraising efforts, MARA sought a solution. MARA recently released a statement on Facebook announcing "a new partnership with the Greater Susquehanna Valley YMCA (GSV YMCA) to manage operations of the Middleburg Community Pool for the upcoming summer season."

The GSV YMCA will oversee the day-to-day management of the pool, including staffing, programming, and general operations. "This collaboration is designed to enhance the overall pool experience while ensuring a safe, welcoming, and well-maintained environment for all visitors."

In the partnership agreement, MARA will retain full ownership of the swimming pool including maintenance of the facility while the YMCA oversees the day-to-day management of staff and operations.

MARA reiterated the importance of the Middleburg Community as a cornerstone of summertime activity in the community and its commitment "to preserving that tradition while strengthening operations for the future."

Established in 1965, Middleburg Community Swimming Pool has served the community for over 61 years. MARA expressed "The Middleburg Community Swimming Pool has been a place where families gathered, children learned essential water safety skills, and local students gained meaningful employment opportunities."

Due to generous support from several donors, the pool will remain open this season. However, ongoing fundraising must be undertaken to ensure the long-term sustainability of the pool facility to offset pool maintenance, operational costs, and to ensure that the pool remains open for the future.

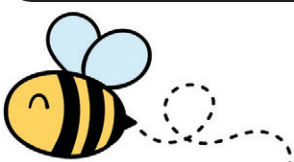

Not sure what all happened but Linda's speedway and McGrew Pub speedway. Both tracks got their micro-sprint racing programs last Friday somehow beating the rain. Linda's is located near Jonestown while McGrew is located on the inside of BAPS Motor speedway near York Pa.

The WOO Sprints will be at Lincoln Speedway this past Tuesday, before they head to Williams Grove for the two-day show. Chase Dietz will lead the local charge against the travelers after his fourth win of the year at Lincoln on Saturday and followed that up with his second win of the season at BAPS on Sunday night. Kasey Kahne will be driving the Macri #39 for the local shows. Last year this event was rained out both days. Going into these races, leading the way for the WOO series, is defending champ and current point leader David Gravel of Waterdown CT. In sixteen starts, David has four wins, eleven top fives and fourteen top ten runs. Carson Macedo is second in points, 70-behind Gravel and one feature win. Michael Kofoid is third with 104 points back. Kofoid also has four wins this season, fourth in points is Donny Schatz 128 back and has one feature win, and in fifth is Sheldon Haudenschild with one feature win and is 152 back. Looks like the series will bring a solid field of seventeen drivers added to all the local talent it should be three great nights of racing

for the 410-sprints.

Coming up at Selinsgrove speedway on Thursday May 14th for the first time since the 2021 season will be the World of Outlaws super late model series. The series first race was set for 2012, but rain wiped out the event, so they came back for the 2013 season with a two-day show, brought in by then promoter Charlie Paige. Gregg Satterlee won the first race, and Darrell Lanigan won the second night. 204 was another two day show with Tim McCreddie and Lanigan winning the two races, 2015 was a one-day show with Lanigan again coming away with the victory. 1016 was the legend's son Billy Moyer Jr scored the win, 2017 local driver Jeff Rine won the event 2018 the win went to Chris Madden and 2019 Darrell Lanigan won again, 202 was cancelled because of Covid-19 2021 was rained out. In the nine features that the WOO series Darrell Lanigan has four wins with single wins going to Gregg Satterlee, Moyer Jr, Jeff Rine, Chris madden and Tim McCreddie. McCreddie is back racing with the WOO series and will be on hand for this event. The biggest field of driver happened in 2016 with 42 drivers on hand with the following year it was down to it's lowest at 27. Rick Eckert was a series driver back then and had a total of three third place runs during that time. Behind Satterlee was Vic Coffey and Jeff Rine, Lanigan first win was followed by Eckert and Matt Cochran of Williamsport. Following Tim McCreddie win was Shane Clanton and Eckert. Lanigan's second win was followed by Eckert and Clanton. Lanigan's third win was followed by Clanton and Chase Junghans. Moyer Jr's win was followed by Eckert and Eric Wells. (Wells is now in the chassis building business calling his chassis Infinity Chassis). Jeff Rine's win was followed by Chris Madden and Devin Moran. In 2018 it was won by Chris Madden followed by Devin Moran and Mike Marlar. 2019 was won by Lanigan for the fourth time followed by Ricky Weiss and Brandon Sheppard. Still with the series from that time period are drivers Dennis Erb Jr, Brent Larson. Tyler Erb was on the series in 2018 and is back on the series for this season. Mentioned before Tim McCreddie is back on the series. He is a former champion.

So far this year Bobby Pierce is the defending series champion. He has seven feature wins. Nick Hoffman is next with five wins, followed by non-regulars Brandon Shepard and Hudson O'Neal with two wins each. One-time winners Chris Madden, Mike Marler, and WOO regular Ryan Gustin. Fifteen signed drivers are expected. On hand for the show drivers Bobby Pierce, Nick Hoffman, Ryan Gustin, McCreddie, Dennis Erb Jr, Tyler Erb (NO Relation), Ethan Dotson, Dustin Sorenson, Tristan Chamberlain, Drake Troutman, Bret Larson and rookies Trey Mills, Logan Zarin, Eli Johnson and Daulton Wilson.

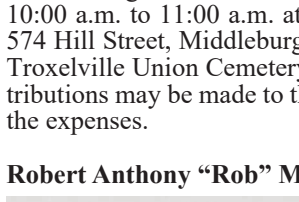

# Work Study Program at Mid-West Partners with Local Businesses

This school year, Payton has been enrolled in the Mid-West High School Work Study Program. She spends her time at Hair Express Salon in Beaver Springs learning the tricks of the cosmetology trade. Stacey Briggs was contacted by Work Study Advisor, Denya Burris, to see if she was interested in participating in the program, working with a student for three hours a day/ 4 days a week.

The practice session started with Payton asking her mother how she wanted her hair cut and how she wanted it to look and feel. Payton ran her fingers through her mother's hair checking length and texture. Stacey prompted her with additional questions to ask about styling. Then they headed to the shampoo bowl before the haircut.

Scissors clicked as Payton Zechman cut her mother's hair under the guidance of her mentor, Stacey Briggs of Hair Salon. Stacey would raise Payton's arm adjusting the angle while explaining the reason for the adjustment.

"I have learned an immense amount of information in this short time," states Payton enthusiastically. "For example, the difference a minor angle change can make in a haircut. And, the fact that when doing a universal cut, you must drag the hair straight out from where it grows to ensure that every hair is the same length. I feel rewarded when I learn a new technique and execute it well. I feel challenged by the number of possibilities any future clients could ask for."

According to Stacey, "Payton did so well and showed so much interest her work study placement; we applied to the State Apprenticeship Program to further Payton's education."

Stacey explained the work study and apprenticeship training. "Payton is learning all practical skills as well as the theory of cosmetology and state laws. I am Payton's teacher in a salon setting instead of attending Cosmetology school. It is the same education, just with one-on-one instruction."

This apprenticeship is the first one for the Mid-West Work Study Program and was approved by the district. Hopefully, it's the first of many such opportunities in other fields as well.

Payton is required to complete 2,000 hours of instruction under the supervision of a licensed cosmetology teacher. Stacey fulfills those requirements. "I have not taught cosmetology in many years, so teaching again has made me aware of many techniques that became second nature to me."

"It has been rewarding to help and see Payton grow in this profession," added Stacey.

The Work Study Program at Mid-West High School is gaining in popularity as more students explore their options in the workforce. The students "gain work experience in a real-world setting with supervision provided by MWHS faculty and a job site mentor." "We currently have 35 students in the class, which is the largest group ever at Mid-West High School," exclaimed Mrs. Burris. "We are starting the placement process for next year's Work Study students. Students in Work Study have the opportunity to gain hands-on experience in the work force while earning school credit. Each student is placed in a job that aligns with their current future career goals."

Payton intended to pursue cosmetology at SUN Tech but did not get accepted into the program due to the large number of applicants. "I have always had an interest in cosmetology as a profession. From a young age I was always getting into trouble for cutting my own hair and getting into make-up." So, Payton explored the option of the Work Study Program and applied.

The mission of the Mid-West Work Study Program is "to empower students with real-world skills and experiences through dynamic partnerships with local businesses and organizations. We strive to bridge the gap between classroom learning and the professional world, fostering a culture of innovation, responsibility, and lifelong learning."

In addition to Hair Express, the current businesses that are partnering with the MWHS Work Study Program this year include: Geisinger Lewistown, Geisinger Danville, Rockland Academy, Middleburg Elementary School, Middleburg Borough, Schick's Garage, Bingaman and Son Lumber, Big Country Radio, Troutman's Meat Market, Old Mill Coffeeshop, Millerstown Animal Hospital, Weis Markets, Len Krauthem's Auto Sales, Companion Animal Hospital, Kreamer Feed, Wood-Mode LLC, Klme's Custom Woodworking, MWSD IT Dept, Coles Hardware Cherry Hill Hardwoods, and Shalom Salon and Spa.

"I definitely recommend work study. This program introduces you to the real world before you are thrown out to sink or swim. It also opens doors you didn't even know existed," explained Payton. "It is an opportunity to discover and explore your career options. You are given first-hand experiences in your placement; you are able to decide whether you truly enjoy this career or not before you plan the rest of your life on it!"

According to Advisor Mrs. Denya Burris, "Work Study is a combination of hands-on learning in a job setting and classroom work. Students begin a working position in the beginning of the year and sustain that career for the length of the school year." Students work a minimum of 12 hours per week, Monday-Thursday.

# Wildlife Art Contest Underway

It's time to break out the paint brushes and easel. The Pennsylvania Game Commission is accepting works for its 2027 Working Together for Wildlife Art Contest, with entries due by July 31, 2026.

The 2027 featured category is Pennsylvania shorebirds. Qualifying submissions must include at least one of the following species: American golden-plover, black-bellied plover, buff-breasted sandpiper, dunlin, greater yellowlegs, killdeer, lesser yellowlegs, long-billed dowitcher, pectoral sandpiper, piping plover (Great Lakes population), red knot, ruddy turnstone, sanderling, semipalmated sandpiper, short-billed dowitcher spotted sandpiper, upland sandpiper, whimbrel, white-rumped sandpiper, and willet.

Unlike previous years, this year's contest is restricted to paintings. One or more shorebirds can be featured in an original, full-color, horizontal or vertical painting with a horizontal or vertical image of 14x20 inches or 20x14 inches, leaving no important subject matter within one inch of outside border, due to cropping. The painting must have a 2-inch white border or mat, unframed but signed. The total project size should not exceed 18x24 inches or 24x18 inches. To protect anonymity during judging the signed name will be covered.

All submissions for the 2027 contest must be submitted online at <https://www.pgcapps.pa.gov/WorkingTogetherforWildlife-Form> by 4 p.m. on July 31. Artists may submit more than one work, but for each submission, there is a nonrefundable \$50 entry fee. Artists 18 and younger can enter for free.

All entries will be reviewed and evaluated by a committee of qualified Game Commission personnel.

The artist whose painting is selected for the 2027 Working Together for Wildlife fine art print series will receive \$5,000, plus 25 artist proof prints. The winning artist must pencil-sign up to 200 limited edition fine art prints produced from the original painting, with signing conducted at the Game Commission's Harrisburg headquarters, and the artist receiving the cash award after the prints are signed.

In addition, cash awards will be presented to other top-finishing artists. The artist submitting the second-place painting will receive \$1,500; third place, \$1,000; fourth place, \$800; and fifth place, \$500. In the event of a tie, the awards for the two places will be combined and split evenly.

Participating artists will have the chance to view entries after final selections are made.

Official rules about the contest are available on the Contests page of the Game Commission's website. Each artist must be a Pennsylvania resident. For further information, contact the Game Commission 1-833-742-9453 (1-833-PGC-WILD).

Founded in 1980, the Working Together for Wildlife program has raised over \$2 million for wildlife management and research across the Commonwealth.

"Revenues received from the sale of signed and numbered prints help finance wildlife research and management programs in Pennsylvania, meaning participating artists not only have a chance to take home winnings, but to help fund wildlife conservation through their work," said Lauren Ferreri, who leads the Game Commission's Bureau of Information and Education. "By inspiring artists, engaging the public and allowing both to help benefit wildlife, the Working Together for Wildlife program continues to promote the Game Commission's role in wildlife conservation and serves as an important reminder that we all can make a difference."

# PEMA Director Commended Regional 911 System & Celebrated Public Safety Telecommunicators Week

On April 14, 2026, the Pennsylvania Emergency Management Agency (PEMA) highlighted the life-saving investments in Next Generation 911 (NG911) and celebrated National Public Safety Telecommunicators Week, which was held on April 12-18.

“Our 911 system is the foundation of emergency response, from answering calls to dispatching police, fire and emergency medical services to help those who need it. The Shapiro Administration has prioritized intentional investments in both the technology and the people, noted PEMA Director Randy Padfield.

Pennsylvania’s NG911 system is designed to support regional support among counties so they work together ensure that all individuals who contact 911 for help receive the same standards of service and care regardless of which county’s 911 center answers the call.

During PEMA Director Randy Padfield visit, an incident on February 20 was discussed and highlighted the success of the NG911 system and how efficiently the 911 teams worked together.

On February 20, Mifflin County 911 center experienced a surge in emergency calls. To ensure callers reach a 911 telecommunicator quickly, calls are automatically routed to an overflow queue shared by multiple PSAPs during times of high call volume. One call was answered by staff at the East Central Emergency Network (ECEN), the consolidated PSAP serving Columbia and Montour counties.

In the meantime, Shift Supervisor Jake Showers, with Central Susquehanna Regional CSR 911, which serves Snyder, Union, and upper Northumberland counties, noticed on the shared computer-aided dispatch system that ECEN dispatch was experiencing a delay in reaching Mifflin County 911. Following protocols, the CSR dispatcher contacted Mifflin County directly to provide rapid assistance to the caller. The event highlighted the partnership and efficient collaboration and data sharing among Pennsylvania PSAPs to support the public in emergency situations.

“I’m proud of how our team and regional partners worked together to ensure this call was handled quickly and effectively,” said Josh Penepacker, 911 Manager at Mifflin County Office of Public Safety. “This incident not only demonstrates the strength of Pennsylvania’s Next Generation 911 System but also shows the dedication and teamwork of the 911 Professionals across three different counties to ensure that every call for help is answered when it matters most. The success of the North Central Region phone system would not be possible without the continued support from our state and local partners.”

“This incident is one of many that highlights the ongoing technology-sharing efforts among North Central PSAPs over the past decade. Through the consolidation of 911 centers and the integration of regional phone systems, CAD, radio communications, and logging recorders, we continue to advance collaborative solutions that enhance interoperability, strengthen regional resilience, and support our ability to address staffing shortages while managing daily operational demands and workflows,” said Chad Aucker, CSR Technical Services Director and PA APCO President.

“This level of progress would not be possible without the continued support of our local and state government partners, as well as our industry partners, Pennsylvania Chapter of APCO International, and Pennsylvania National Emergency Number Association. Their advocacy for critical funding and commitment to advancing public safety communications play a vital role in making initiatives like these both achievable and sustainable,” noted Aucker.

Fees collected through monthly phone bills help cover county costs associated with 911 services, including personnel, technology, training, facilities as well as ongoing technological advancements and operations of the statewide NG911 system. Since 2015, the surcharge has been essential in supporting support the planning, coordination, testing, and implementation of NG911 service across the Commonwealth. The NG911 infrastructure prepares individual county PSAPs to provide many of the services that callers have come expect, such as Text-to-911 and the routing of emergency calls to the appropriate 911 center.

In April 2025 the initial phase of the NG911 project was completed when all 61 PSAPs were connected to the system. This phase modernized the infrastructure that delivers emergency calls to PSAPs across Pennsylvania.

Pennsylvania is one of only 13 states that operates fewer PSAPs than there are counties. This consolidated approach allows 911 services to be delivered in an efficient and cost-effective manner, through the sharing of technology and resources across jurisdictional boundaries.

“National Public Safety Telecommunicators Week (NPSTW) honors the 911 community for their dedication to the critical life-saving services they provide every day. NPSTW also recognizes the hard work of 911 telecommunicators who are there for us whenever and wherever emergencies happen, whether that’s in our homes, at our schools or on our roadways,” states 911.org.

“They are tasked with meeting rigorous NENA standards—capturing vital information within 90 seconds and coordinating dispatch while expertly managing high-stress situations. It requires a unique set of skills and a deep commitment to public service to excel in this demanding role,” said ECEN Day Shift Lead Phil Yoder.

In Pennsylvania, telecommunicators process approximately 14 million calls for assistance every year. In last year’s statewide survey, counties reported that on average, one in five telecommunicator positions was vacant.

As the NG911 system continues to develop in Pennsylvania, this an excellent time to explore a fulfilling career as a 911 telecommunicator in your county. These critical positions typically offer competitive benefits, opportunities for advancement, and a rewarding career serving your local community. All the required training is provided at no cost to the applicant.
