The Mifflinburg football team won its first outright District 4 3A championship in school history! The Wildcats beat Montoursville for the second time this season in winning 35-12. Mifflinburg previously shared a district title with Shamokin in 2002 because there were no district playoff games way back when. Shamokin won the 4A district title this year. I wonder how many sons last week repeated what their fathers did 23 years ago?

Team balance all year is what led this year’s team to the district title. Miff coach Cody Botts said “I really believe our front seven and our defense as a whole hasn’t gotten the love our offense has. Our offense is explosive and scores a lot of points, but I just really think our defense has been an anchor for us all year. They’ve done a good job against run-heavy teams and they continue to play for each other week-in and week-out.”

The stability on offense to move the ball by running or passing makes it difficult to stop the Cats prolific offense. All-star QB Chad Martin ran for 67 yards and 3 TDs and threw for 156 yards and another TD. All-stater Larry Murray had six catches for 138 and a TD.

Botts added, “These kids deserve this, they worked their butts off to be here. Everyone put in the work to be here and I’m proud to be their coach. I think this is a big in-

dication of what is to come in the future. I love them to death and I’m looking forward to being their coach for a long time.”

Mifflinburg will play host to a very talented and rugged Scranton Prep Friday night in Milton. Prep beat previously undefeated Berwick 42-7 for their opportunity to play the Cats. Contrary to what I’ve been hearing, you don’t need a turf field to host a state playoff game. The PIAA prefers you secure a turf field nearby, due to the unpredictable end of season weather.

I know Mifflinburg is planning on a new all-sports turf field in the near future. It would be a shame if Mifflinburg decided to play their football games on this new field. The venerable Wildcat stadium might seem outdated but the memories and views are strong and it would be a shame to move only the football venue somewhere else.

Lewisburg boys soccer is still undefeated (22-0-1) as they shutout Devon Prep 2-0 to reach the state semi-finals. Gabe Pawling pitched his 18th scoreless game of the year with five saves. who and where they will play their first round game.

Penn State could not get a stop on defense once again when it counted most, the opposing team’s last drive. Indiana’s Omar Cooper defied gravity and physics by somehow tapping a toe in-balance after an amazing catch in the endzone with 36 seconds left in the game. The 27-24 win by the #2 ranked undefeated Hoosiers handed Penn State its sixth straight loss.

Like previous games this year with Oregon, Iowa and Northwestern, the Lions defense failed again with the highest paid D-coordinator in college calling the shots. It’s time for a new regime and that can’t start soon enough.

There are differing reports seemingly every other day of who the next football coach will be. Alabama’s Kalen DeBoer and Texas A&M’s Mike Elko remain at the top of Penn State’s list. Why Penn State would not hire either is all about timing and not money. Money will not be an issue as there will be an infusion of cash coming from a California pension fund of all places.

Both Bama and A&M will be in the college playoffs which begin December 19th. Signing Day for incoming high school seniors is December 3rd. The bigger issue is the transfer portal which is only open from January 2nd to the 16th. The CFB championship game is 1/19/26.

This is why I believe Louisville’s Jeff Brohm or Missouri’s Eli Drinkwitz will be Penn State’s next coach as I doubt either school will make the playoffs. Penn State will have to replace 55 to 70 players from this year’s roster and the portal will be the best way to stay relevant for next year. Many high school seniors have already de-committed their verbal pledge after James Franklin was dismissed. Franklin will also poach players from the roster that still have playing eligibility, wherever he ends up coaching.

Penn State could bite the bullet and write next season off to get one of their two top guys they really want. Don’t expect any news until after the playoff teams are announced 12/7.

Moving up the payscale slightly, the NFL acronym is often referred to as ‘Not For Long.’ New York Giant’s coach Brian DaBoll was fired this week after winning NFL coach of the year in 2022. The New York football

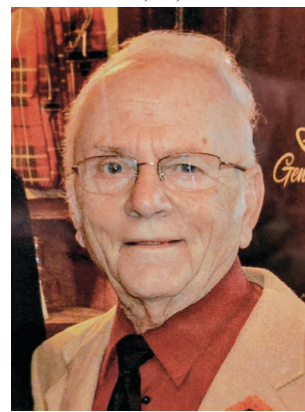

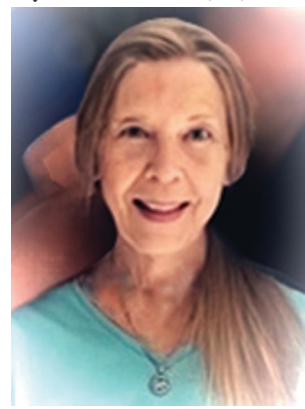
In addition to his parents and his wife of 62 years, John was preceded in death by a brother-in-law, Richard Herbst.

# 2025 Engine Expo Held in Beavertown

Sputtering sounds permeated the air as visitors milled around the displays at the Beavertown Oil Lease #1 Museum in Beavertown, billed as the “Snyder County’s Largest Oil Field Engine Collection.” Held on October 3-4, 2025, the 2025 Engine Expo-an outdoor event sponsored by Beavertown Oil Lease No. 1 and the Straight Pipe Engine Club showcased 15 oil field engines with an additional 30 farm hit-and-miss engines on the grounds. The featured engines were produced in Pennsylvania including engines manufactured in Williamsport, Grove City and Shippenburg.

Tom and Karen Wagner have a permanent display at 239 Chestnut Street. Many friends joined them by setting up exhibits as well. The internal combustion community collects a vast array of small and large engines. The collectors preserve pieces of history and love to share information with the public. Tom Wagner explained his collection by saying, “I do it for the love of engines. At this Expo we compare, sell, and trade.”

“Oil Field Engine” refers to any sort of internal combustion engine used as a power source in the production of crude petroleum. Oil field engines were used to pipe oil from oil wells. The oil field engines ran off the natural gas from the wells. Pennsylvania manufactures included Bessemer Gas Engine Company in Grove City, Joseph Reid Gas Engine Company in Oil City, and Bovaird & Seyfang Manufacturing Company in Bradford and Oil Well Supply Company in Oil City.

A hit-and-miss engine is a type of stationary internal combustion engine. According to Wikipedia, the name comes from the speed control on these engines; they fire (“hit”) only when oper-

ating at or below a set speed, and cycle without firing (“miss”) when they exceed their set speed. They make a distinctive putt-putt sound.

Produced from the 1890s through approximately the 1940s, they peaked in the 1930’s until more modern designs began to replace the hit-and-miss engines. Some of the largest engine manufacturers included Stover, Hercules, International Harvester (McCormick Deering), John Deere (Waterloo Engine Works), Maytag and Fairbanks Morse.

“On the farms, hit-and-miss engines were used to pump water, grind feed, cut wood, run the blacksmith shop, work the cider press, run the washing machine...anything that needed power,” explained Tom Wagner.

Throughout the day, trucks pulled in as exhibitors arrived to set up. The sputtering got louder and puffs of smoke drifted across the display area. Visitors mulled around, taking pictures, and asking questions.

“These are Adult Toys,” exhibitor Darrell Steele of McClure exclaimed as he hustled around setting up his Economy 5-horsepower Farm Engine. “When you drag the first one home, you are hooked! Best \$1000 I ever spent! And, now there’s 25 and adding!” he chuckled. “I have four boys. When I am dead, I will give 10-12 to each one. They love it!”

Steele added, “We want to get this Expo event going and make it an annual or semi-annual event. People love history.”

Rick Reitz was browsing and checking out the engines. Mike Woodling, of Beaver Springs, was explaining how his 4-horsepower Domestic saw, made in Williamsport, was used to cut firewood. Reitz commented, “I always find this event interesting.”

Clair Drumheller, of Kreamer, sat in the shade, a woodfire burning near him, as he displayed a model engine. “I like the old motors. I have about 40 of them.”

A crowd gathered around owners Carl Hest and Ryan Hest as Mark Mahoney helped to get their rare 15-horsepower Witte Industrial started. Soon, the machine began to putt-putt. It came from a sawmill in Montoursville. According to Carl Hest, his
