## Skill and Training Affect Outcome of Airplane's Emergency Landing on Routes 11/15

June 6, began with a calm morning of Saturday chores and yard work in Selinsgrove. Suddenly, around 9:15 am, the sputtering of an engine overhead signaled distress. Several people called 911 to report the incident.

As flight instructor Douglas Beach of Lancaster and student pilot Michael Yoder of Quarryville spent the early morning practicing landings and take-offs at Penn Valley Airport, they did not realize how quickly that practice would become a real experience.

As they were leaving the airport, the single-engine aircraft, a Beechcraft B19 Musketeer, experienced engine trouble. Beach, the flight instructor, tried several measures to control the situation. The engine quit above the Selinsgrove bypass. Fortunately, the usually busy road-

way was free from traffic, providing the perfect runway. Beach safely landed the plane on a stretch of Routes 11/15 near the Route 35 interchange and pulled into the emergency median between the usually heavy traffic-filled four-lane road. No one was injured and the airplane was not damaged. Training, skill, and clear thinking averted a tragic ending.

Local law enforcement responded to the scene. Selinsgrove Police Officer Chris Baker and Shamokin Dam Police Chief Scott Davis arrived at the scene to discover Beach and Yoder unharmed after the emergency landing.

Chad Aucker, Technical Services Director at Central Susquehanna Regional 911, noted that the Federal Aviation Administration was contacted and gave permission to remove the undamaged aircraft and transport it to the Penn Valley Airport. The plane will be examined to determine the cause of the accident. The airplane is owned by Smoketown Flight Center LLC in Lancaster.

After receiving specific instructions from the FFA, Keller's Towing removed the airplane from the highway. The emergency landing caused only a brief disruption; the highway reopened shortly after crews cleared the scene.

"This incident serves as a reminder of the importance of preparedness, training, and the coordinated response of emergency services. From the initial notification through

the resolution of the event, responders from multiple agencies worked together to ensure the safety of those involved and the surrounding community. Incidents such as these demonstrate the value of ongoing training, established emergency plans, and strong partnerships between public safety agencies," stated Chad Aucker.

Then Aucker added, "We are grateful that the aircraft landed safely and that no injuries were reported. We would like to recognize the professionalism of the crew onboard, dispatch personnel, law enforcement, and all supporting partners who contributed to a successful outcome. While aviation emergencies are uncommon, today's response highlights the dedication and readiness of our public safety professionals who stand prepared to respond whenever and wherever they are needed."

## Resurfacing Project on Route 522 in Snyder County

Drivers are advised that a resurfacing project has begun on Route 522 in McClure Borough and Spring and West Beaver townships, Snyder County. Starting on Thursday, June 11, a Pennsylvania Department of Transportation (PennDOT) paving crew will perform a mill and resurface operation on Route 522 between County Line Road in West Beaver Township and Route 235 in Spring Township. Drivers can expect single lane conditions with flagging between the hours of 6:00 AM and 6:00 PM, where work is being performed. Work on this project is anticipated to be completed on Thursday, June 18, weather permitting. Drivers should be alert, slow down, expect delays in travel, and drive with caution through the work zone.

## Appalachian Late Models Speedweek is in Action with Four Shows to Wrap up the Series

Two races got in the books over the weekend with one race scheduled for Port Royal last Saturday night getting rained out and will not be made up. The two races that were run were Clinton County on Friday night and Potomac speedway in Maryland on Sunday night. Sunday night BAPS speedway had a 410-sprint along with Extreme Stock with the general admission set at only \$5 to get in and all indications are that the place was full of fans. Even Danny Dietrich had to weigh in on track. It might be better off to charge less to get in to get more fans to the racetracks, it may not be able to be done all the time but on occasions might not be a bad idea.

Three different drivers held the lead-on Friday night at Clinton County with pole sitter Gregg Satterlee leading the first fifteen laps until Winner Trevor feathers got the lead on lap sixteen restart, followed by Matt Cochran who also got past Satterlee on the restart. Feathers was quoted as saying "I expected to see him come back on me and try a slider and when I looked to the inside, I saw a blue car and thought who was that. Cochran had a good car and I have been told he runs good at Clinton having racing there a number of times in his career". Cochran led laps 21-22-23 before Feathers got the lead back on laps 23 and led the rest of the way in the 40-lap feature. It was Trevor's first ever late model Speedweek win and his second win at Clinton County in two races. Trevor won the Fall Clash race their last fall and now is two for two in races he has run at Clinton. "I like the smaller tracks it puts the driver in control and there is less of air push to worry about like on the bigger tracks". Feathers went on to win the race by 3.724 seconds over Dylan Yoder who was having a side-by-side battle with Cochran for that spot. Trevor liked the battle he had with Cochran." We raced side by side for three laps and never touched him. He gave me room and I gave him room. It was fun racing against him, and he was using a limited late model motor which was running good. Cochran Noted how good it was." We were having motor trouble but kept working on it and it performed great tonight. That was a ton of fun out there leading and racing for the lead". Dylan Yoder had his best run in a while and was happy with his second place." We finally had the car working to the way I like it, plus I like racing at Clinton County it is a fun little track to race on". Gregg Satterlee faded to fourth after leading the first fifteen laps, Bryan Bernheisel was fifth followed by Jakob Piper, Hayes Mattern, Tyler Emory, Joe Petyak and Justin Weaver who came from the 23rd starting spot. Four Limited late model drivers raced with super, with Cochran third JR Toner placed 12th and Joe Luck was 15th, Maddox Smith did not make the show. 29 drivers signed in for the night's action.

Sunday at Potomac Justin Weaver took advantage of Kyle Hardys misfortune to go on and win night two of the series races, it was also his first ever late model Speedweek win. Hardy lead the first eleven laps before mechanical issues ended his night. Weaver took over and was never challenged and won the race by 1.516 second over New York driver Chad Homan with Bryan Bernheisel third then came Jamie Lathroum, Tyler Emory in fifth the

rest of the top ten were Jonathan Raley, Jakob Piper, Iowa driver Troy Morris, Joe Petyak and Nick Love in the top ten. The race was slowed nine times for cautions with the race lasting 34 minutes with 14 starters running at the finish. 24 drivers signed up with at least 12 drivers racing their limited late model against the super late models. The points look like this after two races Justin Weaver 1446, Bryan Bernheisel-1444, Tyler Emory-1407, Jakob Piper 1391 and Joe Petyak 1366. Those five drivers all have top ten runs in the two races run so far. Four more races to go with the final event to be held at Lincoln speedway this Saturday June 13th. For the fourth year in a row Selinsgrove Ford of Selinsgrove is the title sponsor for the series.

Sunday night at BAPS 32 410-sprints were in action and in only his fourth time in the car. Cameron Smith of Spring Grove drove the Jacob Allen owned number 1A, to the feature win holding off Danny Dietrich with Lance Dewease, Chase Dietz and Brandon Rahmer in the top five. Tyler Ross, Buddy Schweibinz, Logan Rumsey, Freddie Rahmer and Brock Zearfoss were in the top ten. This was the sixth 410-sprint race run at BAPS this season with Chase Dietz scoring three wins, and Anthony Macri, Troy Wagaman Jr and now Smith scoring the other wins Williams Grove had the All-Star sprint in action on Friday night with Troy Wagaman scoring the feature win over Danny Dietrich, Brady Bacon, TJ Stutts and Chase Dietz. None of the regular All-Star drivers made it to the top ten to finish with Kalib Henry and Cale Thomas placing 17th and 18th in the final run down. The win for Wagaman Jr was his second Grove win of the season. He is the second driver to record the second win the other is Lance Dewease, singles wins have gone to Steve Snyder Jr, Justin Peck, Kasey Kahne, David Gravel, Logan Rumsey. The Grove is back in action with the 410-sprints and the 358-sprints The All-Star sprint were set to be at Lincoln on Saturday night but that event was rained out and may not be rescheduled. Selinsgrove ran their third 410-sprint car show last Thursday night with Brock Zearfoss of Jonestown Pa getting the feature win over Chase

Dietz, Troy Wagaman Jr, Cameron Smith and Ryan Taylor. Zearfoss is the third winner in three events with AJ Flick and Mark Smith other winners. Mike Walters is back racing the Knoebel #77 after a brief medical issue kept him out of the car. Mike placed eighth in the feature on Thursday night. . 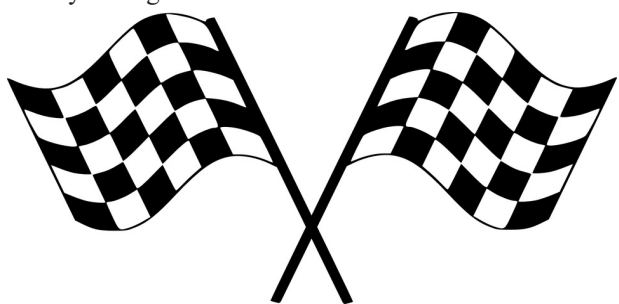
Geesean causing Mitch to spin out bringing an end to his night.

He was preceded in death by his parents, step-mother Helen Folk; an infant son; and numerous aunts and uncles.

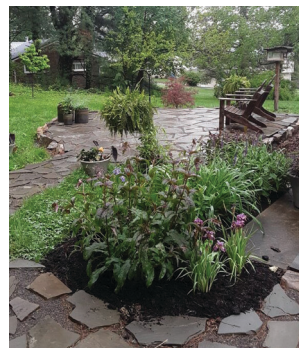
Bill was a member of the VFW, Legion Post # 5640 and 201.

It was a great day in Mifflinburg on Monday as it was the first day ever that Mifflinburg hosted two state playoff games the same day and the weather was just as good as the results. The town showed up as well and fans were four/five deep all around both fields. Well done Mifflinburg.

Deuces were wild and Taylor Stewart was very tidy on the mound in the 10-2 win over Kutztown. Stewart gave up nine hits in the complete game win on just 76 total pitches. Stewart averaged less than 10 pitches per inning over the first six frames. Compare that to two different Kutztown pitchers who gave up 12 hits but threw a combined 133 pitches.

The Lady Cats put the game away with five runs in their home fourth inning. Amelia Fluman, Anna Pachucki, Mia Reibsome and Lainey Miller all had doubles in the inning, but the most important at-bat in that inning and the game wasn't a hit.

With one out and consecutive doubles to score a run, freshman Ava Fry turned a 1-2 count on her to an eleven pitch walk. That walk by Fry turned the batting order over to all the above .400 hitters who took turns mashing. Double, double, walk and a single followed to make it 6-1 Mifflinburg.

Fluman, Reibsome, Miller and Brooke Gessner all had two hits and Fluman 2 runs and 3 RBIs. Mifflinburg faced defending state champion Pine Grove on Thursday for a trip to the Final Four.

Meanwhile, as the softball team was icing their cake, a half mile to the east the baseball team had its hands full with Notre Dame-Green Pond. Down 2-1 in their home third inning, Miff hung a crooked number to take a lead they would never relinquish.

Cat's catcher Jaden Boyer led off the inning reaching first on an error. Larry Murray laid down a bunt for a hit putting runners on first and second base. Brennan Snyder then tried to lay down a sacrifice bunt but failed on two attempts. Down in the count 0-2 Snyder ripped a single to center field driving in Boyer. JP Marr followed with a two-run single up the middle. Marr then scored on Mason Schneck's line drive that was mishandled by the center-fielder putting the Cats up 5-2.

Miff got the winning run playing small ball. Chad Martin walked to lead off the fourth inning and promptly stole second base and moved to third when the ball got away. Boyer hit a sac fly to center and Martin scored the sixth and deciding run.

Starting pitcher Kaiden Kmett got the win going five innings. Cole Reibsome had to work to get this save. ND-GP started the sixth inning with two singles, Reibsome came on in relief and gave up another single, loading the bases with no outs.

Reibsome got a force-out at home on a grounder to second. Another fielder's choice scored a run but resulted in another out. Cole hit the next batter, loading the bases again. Reibsome got out of the jam with a flyout to center. Expect Reibsome to start against Trinity in Thursday's quarter-final round. He's been in total control on the mound this post season with two wins and a save.

Selinsgrove boys LAX won their third straight D4 title by beating Bellefonte 9-6. Ben Bucher had four goals and Nash Fordyce and Finn Bolick added two goals each. Grove (14-4) has won thirteen straight and open

states by playing Abington Heights.

The Grove girls LAX season came to an end by being upset by Danville 12-6 in the D4 finals. The top-seeded Seals beat Bellefonte twice in the regular season.

Another stick-sport has started its final quest for Lord Stanley. The NHL finals began this week and ABC can't be happy with Vegas playing Carolina, small markets and sunbelt teams. That's ABC's problem.

These are absolutely the two best teams in hockey and they both dismantled really good teams to get here. Vegas swept the seemingly unbeatable Colorado Avalanche. Carolina lost only one game so far in the playoffs going 12-1. Carolina had more than twice the number of shots on goal than the Canadiens who they just swept to play for the best trophy in sports.

The New York Knicks are on an incredible run in this year's NBA Playoffs. They have won all eleven of their playoff games by an average of 19.5 points. They opened this year's NBA championships on Wednesday in San Antonio against Wemby and the Spurs.

In 2012, the perennial backup and Harvard grad went on a February tear for the Knicks that landed him on the cover of TIME magazine.

He was injured in March and never returned to the Knicks. Lin played for six more teams after the Knicks but you never heard his name mentioned again because he was no longer a New York Knickerbocker.

If the Knicks were to win another NBA title after years of futility the celebration in the city would be nothing like we've seen in the past. Those past New York celebrations down the "Canyon of Heroes" would pale in comparison to this.

Madison Square Garden, celebrities courtside and a fun team to watch in the greatest basketball city ever is the reason the Knicks are New York's favorite team...today, 20 and 56 years ago.

Many sports fans in New York City have the football Giants as their favorite team in town. Coaching, skilled players and team cohesiveness go a long way in determining your success on the field. Team camaraderie in the locker room and off the field are important as well.

It's quite possible the drama between Giants QB Jaxson Dart, a Mormon from Utah, introducing our president at a political rally will blow over. It's also possible the response from the Giants young defensive end Abdul Carter who is Muslim and from Philly will alter team chemistry. Let's hope the two young stars put this behind them.

Locker rooms in American professional sports are a players' sanctuary. You play cards before a game and relax with teammates over a beer or two after a long game. You talk about family and replay the just completed game in your minds. It's also the place you resolve disagreements away from the press and certainly not on social media.

Sports stand alone and are generally agreed to be a uniting force. For a few brief but wonderful hours, people of different religions, races, sexualities, genders and political leanings can come together. They forget about the ugliness around them in the real world and are grateful for a win.

Negotiations on a new MLB labor agreement have started this week behind closed lawyer office doors. Baseball owners want a salary cap along with a salary floor where every team must spend a minimum amount on player salaries. The owners and MLB want more parity so the big spending Dodgers, Yankees, Blue Jays, Braves and Phillies aren't in the World Series every year.

The Union is calling this salary cap a means for owners to control costs and increase profits at the expense of the players.

The current standings after the Memorial Day holiday is a good barometer as to which teams are good and bad. All the teams have played more than a third of their season and if you look at the initial payroll numbers MLB offered to the player's union this week, four out of six divisional leaders are below the \$171.2 payroll floor. Cleveland, Tampa Bay, Milwaukee and the Athletics all are among the lowest eight payrolls in MLB and are in first place in their divisions.

This won't help the owners and MLB get the salary floor and cap they are seeking. There are many other issues that need to be addressed and resolved before a new bargaining agreement is signed by both sides. Baseball remains the only professional sport without a salary cap and will remain so after the new agreement.

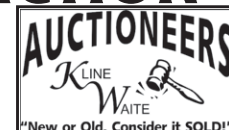

Congratulations to Class of 2026 Central PA USBC Hall of Fame inductees- Karen Nogle, and posthumously to the families of Curtis Englehart and Wayne Roush. Each inductee or their family received a citation from Rep. David Rowe (R-85), a certificate from Central

PA USBC, and a clock/plaque from Central PA USBC. Rep. Michael Bender presented the citation on behalf of Rep. Rowe and Rep. Borowitz.

2026 Hall of Fame inductee, Karen Nogle, bowled in the junior leagues at Super Bowl 522. She bowled with fellow inductee Wayne Roush in YABA and tournaments. After graduation, she moved to the adult leagues, bowling Monday and Wednesday nights at Mifflinburg.

After marriage, Karen and Mark bowled on Sunday nights with his parents, Ginny and Ray. They bowled at Super Bowl 522 in leagues, making lifelong friends in Snyder County. Karen also bowled in leagues at Faxton Lanes, Williamsport and Midway Lanes in Danville. Traveling to State and National tournaments are fun adventures for

Karen. She has been to 16 National tournaments from El Paso to Niagara Falls. It has never been just about the prize money; it's more about the experiences, the places to explore, and the memories made with friends and family. "She's having a party!"

In 2022, Karen and her team set a new Best Bowl house record for Women's High Team Game and High Team Series- all bowled on lanes 1 & 2. Karen rolled a 714 that night. Her highest average was 190 in the Wednesday Nite Owl League at John Wilcox Lanes, where she also recorded her personal high game of 274. She has had three 700 series and has been an Association member for more than 40 years.

Her Pap, Dayton Walls Sr., was inducted into the Hall of Fame in 1986. Since then, several family members have followed: Aunt Marty Girvin (1998), her mom Jean Walls (2014), Aunt Kay Kiester (2022), and Aunt Dot Leitzer (2024) as well as "Mom" Zimmerman and "Aunt" Peach Gehrler. Karen is honored to join them with her induction into the CPBA Bowling Hall of Fame.

Congratulations, Karen Nogle on becoming the newest member of the Central PA USBC Hall of Fame! Bowling continues to bring entertainment and fun to her life.

2026 Hall of Fame inductee Curtis Englehart grew up in a bowling family. He began bowling at the young age of 9 and continued throughout his life. Following graduation, Curt worked at East End Auto Sales in Mifflinburg, working on cars and doing auto body. Later, he worked at B-Z Motors and he also began working part-time at Mifflinburg Lanes. He moved to full-time at the Mifflinburg Lanes until the lanes closed in 2008.

During that his time at the lanes, he made a lot of friends, and enjoyed helping to coach those who wanted to enjoy the sport and improve their bowling skills. He had the opportunity to prepare and oil the lanes for PBA Regional events and met some of the greatest bowlers in history.

After the closure of Mifflinburg Lanes, Curt worked for his friend, Andy Neuer, at Imperial Lanes. He did for a few years before deciding to turn his hobby and lifelong knowledge of auto body into a full-time business. It was Curt's attention to detail that made him extremely talented at his profession.

While bowling in the West End Merchants League, his team won three consecutive league championships in 1990, 1991, and 1992. Curt was part of the championship team in 1989 with Boop's Livestock in the Buffalo Valley League. Curt participated in multiple PA State Bowling Tournaments as well as local tournaments including the 700 Club Sweepers. He had a career high game of 299, numerous high 700 series and held over a 200 average.

All of Curt's kids grew up learning the sport and went on to become very successful bowlers themselves. Although Curt passed away in 2013, his legacy and the family tradition continue full circle as two of his grandsons now bowl at Best Bowl on Saturday mornings.

Curtis Englehart was inducted posthumously into the Central PA-USBC Hall of Fame. His award was accepted by his family.

2026 Hall of Fame inductee, Wayne Roush, began his bowling career at the age of 12 and quickly fell in love with the sport. Over the next 43 years, he spent countless nights at the lanes, bowling multiple times each week alongside many great friends and family members. Wayne joined the Thursday Night Men's Early League, where he would remain a dedicated member for the next 38 years.

Wayne received many awards throughout his bowling career. His highest average was 223, in the Monday Night Men's Early League in 2008. Over the years, he bowled an incredible 18 perfect games and recorded a high series of 826.

Wayne was named Bowler of the Year five times. The first four honors came in four consecutive seasons from 2001-2005. His final Bowler of the Year honor came during the 2024-25 season, which was sadly cut six weeks short. He also held the league's high average four times from 2001-2005.

Wayne was part of the four Thursday Night Men's Early League championship teams, winning titles in the 1995-96, 1997-98, 2006-07, and 2024-25 seasons. His team won the 2024-25 league championship shortly after his passing.

One of Wayne's proudest moments was having the High Game Award named after his father. He went on to win that award at least


The Buffalo Valley Community Band will perform at 1:00 pm.

# Shambach Terminated as EMA Director, Applications Being Accepted Now

Snyder County Commissioners terminated the employment of Snyder County Emergency Management Director Derick Shambach effective immediately as of June 2. The vote was unanimous.

In 2005, Shambach began his career in Snyder County as a 911 dispatcher. In 2009, he was promoted to the role Snyder County EMA Director. In 2024, Shambach experienced health issues and worked temporarily from home for a time. Upon his return, he worked from an office on the first floor of the Courthouse.

In recent months, complaints from first responders and county employees voiced concern about Shambach's unresponsiveness, support, and absences. Several members of the Local Emergency Planning Committee resigned in frustration.

During his role as EMA Director, Shambach secured a drone, radios, and a customized mobile command center for the department. The 46-foot mobile command unit has not been made operational since its purchase two years ago. It was recently discovered that the electrical components were damaged by condensation and would cost \$34,500 in repairs.

The Commissioners released a statement regarding the personnel change at the EMA Coordinator position for Snyder County. "The Snyder County Commissioners Board chose to change the leadership of the County's EMA Department. It has become evident that our County needs to make a change and we look toward the future to manage our many Emergency Assets to their fullest potential."

Chad Aucker is currently fulfilling the duties of the

position until the Board takes official action to name an interim director. The official action to name the interim director will be considered for ratification at Tuesday's Commissioner Meeting.

The Board of Commissioners are accepting applications and resumes for a full-time EMA Director, until June 16.
