TMAC Wins WOO LM Thrilling Return; Zook Wins First Selinsgrove Limited Feature

Selinsgrove, PA- After a seven-year wait, the World of Outlaws Late Models Presented by DIRT Vision returned Friday night to Selinsgrove Speedway, and the fans got a show worthy of the wait. Watertown, New York's Tim McCreadie captured his second career Selinsgrove Ford Super Late Model victory, while Mifflintown's Ryan Zook earned his first career Creekside Autosales Limited Late Model feature win.

A season-high 39 Super Late Models signed in for the Sand Hill Showdown. During qualifying, Mooresville, North Carolina's Nick Hoffman tied Hayes Mattern's track record with an 18.151-second lap to earn quick time honors and a \$500 award.

The 45-lap main event began with McCreadie and Hyndman's Drake Troutman on the front row. McCreadie led early while Troutman stayed within striking distance. Behind them, Port Royal rookie Lane Snook battled Mason Zeigler, Hoffman, and Tristan Chamberlain in a fierce fight inside the top five.

Troutman eventually found momentum on the high side and powered around McCreadie on lap 11 to lead his first career laps at Selinsgrove. McCreadie refused to let him pull away, however, keeping the gap within half a second as the leaders entered lap traffic. The first caution flew when Chamberlain suffered engine trouble on the frontstretch.

On the restart, Troutman continued to hold the lead while McCreadie searched for speed around the top side. Hoffman worked back around Snook and pressured Zeigler for third before another caution slowed the field when current points leader Gregg Satterlee came to a stop.

With 12 laps remaining, the battle intensified. McCreadie repeatedly challenged Troutman around the outside, with the pair nearly making contact several times. Finally, with seven laps to go, McCreadie used the cushion to drive past Troutman and reclaim the lead for good. The 2006 World of Outlaws champion went on to collect his 41st career series victory and his second career Selinsgrove triumph. Troutman finished a strong second ahead of Zeigler, Daulton Wilson, and Hoffman.

"It's always fun to race close to home," McCreadie said in victory lane. "Selinsgrove treats you really well. This might have been the best track I've raced on here."

The Creekside Autosales Limited Late Models also drew a season-high car count with 30 entries for their 20-lap feature. Daulton Bigler grabbed the early lead over Jake Moser while Zook quickly worked his way toward the front. By halfway, Zook erased Bigler's advantage and used the high side to take the lead.

As the leaders navigated lap traffic, Bigler closed back in and nearly made contact with Zook during an intense three-wide battle. A caution reset the field, and on the restart Middleburg's Andrew Yoder charged into second place before suffering a flat right rear tire that sent him into the wall.

That set up a three-lap shootout. Bigler gave everything he had trying to run down Zook, but it wasn't enough as Zook drove away to score the first Limited Late Model win of his career. Bigler, Shaun Miller, Tyson Mowery, and Treyton Lee completed the top five.

"The start of the year hasn't been good," Zook said. "These guys on my team bust their tails for me."

Selinsgrove Speedway returns Saturday, May 30, featuring the Selinsgrove Ford Super Late Models, USAC East Coast Sprint Cars, Creekside Autosales Limited Late Models, and PASS 305 Sprint Cars.

Selinsgrove and Port Royal Speedways had Quality Racing Shows on Thursday and Saturday

Hoffman and Tim McCreadie were the heat race winners for the WOO series and Lane Snook of Port Royal and Mason Zeigler of Chalk Hill Pa won heat for the locals and regional driver. Un- like the 410-sprint that has a PA posse versus the WOO sprint is a normal thing. On the late model end it is not that way, but this first round did have some new players on the local and regional end doing good jobs. Mason Zeigler, who did win the Rookie of the Year honors with the Lucas Oil series in the 2018 season, is now racing a more local and regional schedule, winning the regional series ULMS title and the Fall Clash title during the 2025 season. Jeff Rine of Danville won a B-main along with WOO series and a driver from Bakersfield Calif., Ethan Dostson, the feature had Drake Troutman from Hyndman Pa but is a WOO regular leading most of the laps in the 45-lap feature. In the end, Tim McCreadie took home the win his second WOO series win at Selinsgrove, Troutman was second with Mason Zeigler third, Lane Snook was seventh with Kyle Lee of Mercersburg was 14th with Andrew Yoder Middleburg 17th, Justin Weaver of Clear Spring Md 18th, Dylan Yoder of Middleburg 20th and Gregg Satterlee, who was running seventh until a late race mechanical knocked him out of the race, was 21st in the feature. Two other Pa drivers, Danny Snyder 24th and Jeff Rine 25, Rine ran into trouble just before the race started was an earlier exit in the feature. Quick Note Sunday night at Bedford speedway Mason Zeigler made a pass with eight-lap to go in the feature to win the 40-lap feature at Bedford speedway, beating WOO regular Daulton Wilson who led 32 laps of the feature. Lane Snook had another good night racing against some of the best travelers in the business with a tenth-place finish. The WOO series will have some big money in their next four races with the make-up event at Marion Center on Wednesday May 27th for \$30,000 to win, followed by Wayne County for \$12,000 to win on Thursday followed by a two day show at Mansfield speedway for two nights of racing paying \$12,000 to win on Friday. Then the big event on Saturday May 30th paying \$57,000 to win and getting this one \$5,700 just to start the race.

Going back to Selinsgrove, the tracks crew did a great job with the speedway, and all drivers were impressed with the smooth and very racy track. They also received some food brought in by the speedway for the night. I am looking forward to a return visit by the series for the 2027 season. The next event for Selinsgrove will take place on Saturday My 30th with the super late model racing for \$5,000 to win along with the limited late models, PASS 305-sprint and the East Coast Wingless sprints. Saturday the go-kart track held a special race that drew over 340-karts. It was a long day but good to see the support for the go-kart track. More special races for the go-kart track will happen during the summer months, with the next planned race set for Sunday June 7th. A special money race, the Firecracker special on Friday July 3rd. Special race for the 270-micros will come up on Sunday July 19th for the Roger Folk memorial, plus go-karts.

Saturday at Port Royal a strong field of 46 410-sprints was on hand for the Kauffman Classic, which paid the winner \$15,000. Seven High Limit drivers were on hand to get ready for this weekend's three-day show. Chase Dietz is the driver to beat right now. He had a great night at Port cashing in the big money 410-sprints and placing third in the ESS 360-sprint car race. Chase was not done he went out and scored the feature win Sunday night at BAPS speedway for his third win of the season there to go along with his four wins at Lincoln speedway and his first now at Port Royal. So far this year in 410-sprint racing at Port, there have been five different winners in five feature races, Danny Dietrich, Jake Karklin, Ryan Smith, Brock Zearfoss and Dietz. That number could grow with three nights of racing this weekend. Friday night pays the winner \$10,000, along with Wingless Sportsman. Friday night another \$10,000 to win show with the limited late models and on Sunday the biggest paying race of the season on the local scene with the winner getting \$1000,000

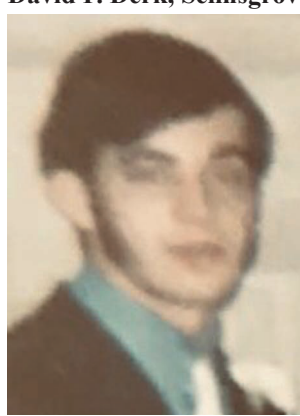

Paulson donates the red, white, and blue flowers and prepares the pots with potting soil, fertilizer, and plants geraniums, petunias, begonia, spikes, and ageratum to create the display. He adds to the patriotic flair of the display by placing American flags in the planters. The planters decorate each side of the memorial's columns with one in the middle.

Memorial Day is a time to reflect on the bravery and sacrifice of those who died while serving in the United States Military. Memorial Day is a day dedicated to visiting cemeteries and attending memorials to honor the service of those who paid the ultimate sacrifice for our country.

The Snyder County Soldiers and Sailors Memorial located in Middleburg has recently been refurbished by Boy Scout Ethan Bobb. The building is 18 square feet at the base and 48 feet high. At the front of the building there is a canon placed at each corner. The inner room is a sanctuary lined with marble walls dedicated to those who served enhanced by beautiful stain glass windows. 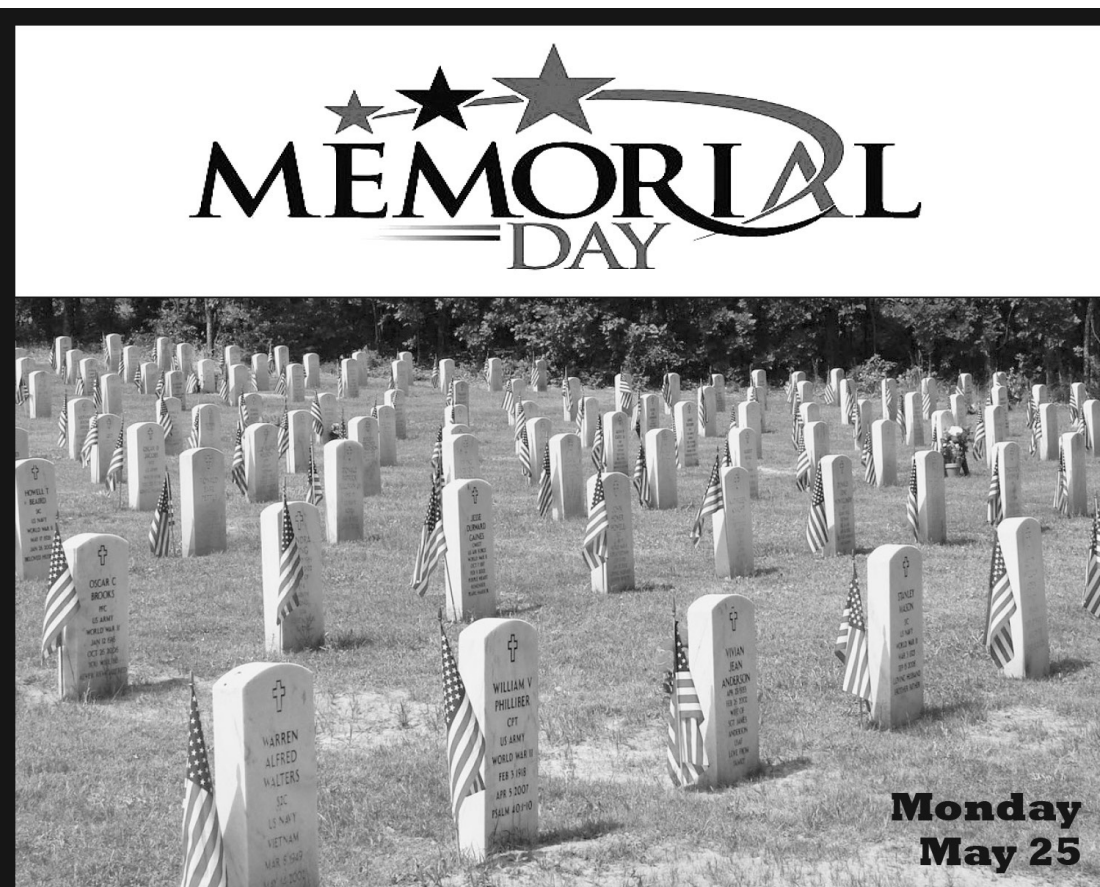

Although my health is declining rapidly due to my old age, I still believe a graduated income tax, based on a taxpayer's ability to pay, is needed in Pennsylvania to make taxation more equitable for all taxpayers.

It's no big secret that the very wealthy and the very profitable large corporations do not like paying taxes, and it's no secret that working class taxpayers in Pennsylvania are paying more than their fair share of taxes. The sales tax and the earned income tax are just two examples of many taxes that are insults to our intelligence.

Did you ever hear about the millionaire who temporarily had all of the toilets in his mansion, except one, disconnected because tax assessment in his state is based on the number of toilets in a residence.

I still believe that school consolidation is needed in Pennsylvania so that the number of school districts in a county does not exceed one. The excess number of administrators is driving tax increases to excess. In addition, school districts, local and county government should be able to use a graduated income tax for their revenue.

I also believe that county government should operate fire protection with paid professionals. The same should also apply to police protection. Both of these services need better locations with shared taxation by all of the county's taxpayers, not just a few local communities.

Yes, I still believe that a community college should be located in Snyder County to serve poorer students in this area and beyond. This is a rural area with many poorer families that need and want affordable higher education.

The district four playoffs have begun and the track and field championships are this weekend in Shippensburg. Let's see how our schools ended their seasons and the potential to extend them further.

Lewisburg's Baylee Espinosa is the defending state champion in both the 1600 and 3200. She set a D4 record at the district meet by more than 10 seconds. Espinosa also broke the district record she set last year in the 1600. We are all expecting big things in Ship from the Penn State bound runner.

Dragonette Lydia Delsite by way of Moon also stamped her ticket to states in winning district titles in both the long and triple jumps. Lewisburg won the girls 2A district title running away by 43 points over Hughesville.

Grove's Bella Ferguson won the shot put by 12' with a throw of 45' 9 1/2". On the track, Gigi Veach won the 400 and Lake Dent the 800. Selinsgrove's foursome of Kaia Hoke, Caitlyn O'Neill, Veach and Dent won the 4x400.

The Lewisburg boys won the 2A 4x800 relay with Justin Nolt, Jack Johnson, Hugh Ikeda Shields and Grayson Barner bringing home gold.

Mifflinburg's Larry Murray has been a busy athlete. Last week he committed to Susquehanna to continue his football career and scored the winning run to beat Selinsgrove in baseball. Murray also won the district gold medal in the long jump.

Mid-West's Grant Boop won the 3A 3200. Wyatt Nelson took first in record time in the 800. The Mustangs continued their dominance in the longer runs while taking first in the 4x800 relay. Connor Stoltzfus, Wyatt Portzline, Lincoln Hoffman and Nelson brought the gold to Snyder county.

Matthew Srabila took gold in the 300 IH and will be looking for a medal in Ship.

Here's a list of all the other local state qualifiers. Mid-West's Ashlyn Hoffman and Stoltzfus in the 800 and Nelson, Stoltzfus, Ian Hall and Portzline in the 4x400 relay.

Lewisburg's Annika Shields, Espinosa, Maddy Moyers and Kate Batkowski in the 4x400 and Shields in the 800. Gwynn Rowe (shot), Ella Vance (javelin) and Hugh Ikeda Shields in the 1600.

Mifflinburg will also be represented by Makayla Fogle, Jazzy Doebler, Cadence Yoder and Makenna Fogle in the 4x100. Parice Shuck in the triple jump, Chase Aikey (discus) and Larry Murray in the 100 to go along with his long jump.

In addition to the above-mentioned Grove girls is McKayla Martin running the 100 hurdles.

The Selinsgrove girls LAX team will be playing Dan-

ville for the district title next week. The Seals handled Mifflinburg 13-3. Danville beat Lewisburg 14-8 to reach the finals.

Mifflinburg softball finished their regular season undefeated with two non-league wins over teams with a combined 6-28 record. Taylor Stewart twirled a one-hit 11-0 shutout over Penns Valley. The Cats led 9-0 after three due to Brooke Gessner's two-run triple and Amelia Fluman's two-run double, part of Fluman's four RBIs. They beat South Side 7-0 as a tuneup for districts.

Miff walked their way to an opening round 10-0 win over Wellsboro as Taylor Stewart threw a five-inning no-hitter. The Wildcats only had five hits themselves with catcher Gessner having three of them. They were issued 10 walks and 16 wild pitches by the much younger Hornets.

Undefeated Mifflinburg plays Hughesville this Thursday in the second round of districts that has been an issue in recent memory. Let's hope they've learned a lesson from the past...playoffs are a different game.

Selinsgrove softball had to win two of their last three games to qualify for districts, as it should be, more on that later. Grove lost to Williamsport 6-1 and Central Mountain beat the Seals 9-4 ending their postseason chances. Against Mountain Sadie Bigger went 3 for 4 with a dinger and Molly Hess was 3 for 4 with a triple.

Lewisburg lost 12-1 to Shik where Meg Mitchell and Siani Turner had four of the Dragons five hits. Shik finished their regular season with a 4-15 record but are still playing in a 5A district game.

Shik is playing in the 5A subregional district tournament because of the lack of schools that big in D4. High school playoffs in all sports need to have a minimum level to attain in order to qualify for the post-season. There are 12 different districts in the PIAA and they each make their own rules for district qualification.

There's an even worse scenario in district 3A where a 6-13 Greenwood is playing 1-17 York Catholic for a district title. Participation Trophies don't help anyone once

they reach double-digits in age.

Mifflinburg baseball won 12-11 in the completion of an 11-11 tie against Selinsgrove. JP Marr's fifth hit of the game scored Larry Murray in the eighth inning. Murray also had a homerun and double weeks ago in the same game. Junior Cameron Royer started and won his first varsity game as Mifflinburg ended their regular season with a 4-1 win over Mid-West.

Lewisburg beat Mid-West 8-7 in another completion of a suspended game. The Mid-West loss ended the Mustangs post-season hopes. The game resumed at 5-5 after seven innings. Mustang Braxton Smith's 2-run single put them up two. Mid-West got two quick outs before Lewisburg did what they do best, never give up.

Landen Wagner was the leader again, scoring on Lincoln Ayres' single. Two walks later and the bases drunk, Garrett Glathar had the game winning hit to score two.

Lewisburg finished their regular season winning six of their last seven games. They traveled west to meet their county rival Mifflinburg in the first round of districts. Mifflinburg won seven of their last nine regular season games... something had to give.

The Miff bats and Cole Reibsome's right arm didn't waste any time to show who the king of Union county baseball is. The 11-0 shutout of a very hot Lewisburg nine was clear evidence. Reibsome pitched five innings of one-hit ball and the Wildcats scored six runs in the first two innings. JP Marr continued to rake going 2 for 3 and scoring two runs, every position in the Mifflinburg lineup scored a run. Mifflinburg will play defending district champ Mt. Carmel on Friday for a spot at states and a chance at a district title.

If you didn't realize how big the NFL is and how it dwarfs all the other three major sports leagues, look back at this past Thursday. The NFL revealed their schedule for this year that starts in September.

For twenty-five consecutive nights previous to Thursday you could tune into one or two NBA playoff games every night. The NBA chose to take this past Thursday off so they weren't competing against the televised NFL schedule release. At least I could watch an NHL playoff game instead of the over-hyped schedule release. Live in the moment people.

I realize the NFL is a juggernaut and a cash cow for team owners, broadcasting companies, and the league itself. Their greed continues with a record nine international games this year. Player safety should be a concern as well. They are not playing on manicured fields where the footing is not nearly as stable as what the players are accustomed to in our football palaces.

The San Francisco Forty-Niners are playing the LA Rams in Melbourne, Australia to start their seasons, a great matchup to say the least. It's a sixteen hour flight one way to Melbourne from California. That's thirty-two hours in an airplane. I don't care how young and healthy the players are, the time difference has to affect your body clock. The Niners will travel over 38K miles during the regular season and cross 58 time zones.

International games will continue to grow when the NFL goes to an eighteen game regular season. When this happens, every NFL team will play a game in a foreign country. The scary part is that within ten years, the Super Bowl will be played in another country and that's just not fair to the millions of fans that made the NFL what it is today.

Speaking of not being fair, it's becoming more evident that college football is going to expand to 24 teams from the current 12 team championship format. This will be a big mistake moving forward. I can live with sixteen teams and absolutely no more.

The college football regular season will be relegated to non-importance as all you have to do is qualify with an 8-4 record. Three years ago Florida State went undefeated and didn't make the four team playoff. That would be the grossest overcorrection in modern sports history.

Doubling the size of the CFP would redefine the entire ethos of college football's regular season. The current college football regular season is by far the most exciting of all sports. Every game matters, less so with sixteen teams qualifying but still far ahead of all other sport regular seasons.

Don't look now but the Phillies have won seven series in a row. Don Mattingly has Philadelphia winning at a .750 clip and just might make it to the baseball Hall of Fame after all if he can manage the Phillies to a World Series title.

All prime contractors (and associated subcontractors) bidding on this work are required to have current Pennsylvania Department of Transportation pre-qualifications for all major items of work in the contract at the time of bid submission and throughout the length of the project.

A certified check or bank draft payable to the order of Selingsgrove Borough, or a satisfactory Bid Bond executed by the Bidder and an acceptable surety in an amount equal to ten percent (10%) of the total of the Bid, shall be submitted with each bid. The Bidder shall include the fully completed Non-Collusion Affidavit with the bid. When the Agreement is executed, the bonds of the remaining unsuccessful bidders will be returned.

In addition to the Equal Employment requirements of Executive Order 11246 regarding discrimination, the CONTRACTOR must establish a 6.9% goal for female participation and a 1% goal for minority participation in his/her aggregate on-site construction workforce for contracts in excess of \$10,000.

The Borough of Selingsgrove is utilizing federal funds for this project, and Snyder County has adopted a Minority and Women Business Enterprise (MBE/WBE) plan in accordance with Executive Orders 11625, 12138, and 12432 and a Section 3 Action Plan in accordance with Title 24 Part 75 Code of Federal Regulations. As such, the bidders/offers must submit documentary evidence of minority and women business enterprises and Section 3 business concerns who have been contacted and to whom commitments have been made. Documentation of such solicitations and commitments shall be submitted with the bid.

Moreover, the CONTRACTOR shall strive to meet the MBE goal of 5% and the WBE goal of 3% for contracts of \$25,000 or more. For projects which the amount of HUD or CDBG funding exceeds \$200,000 the CONTRACTOR must attempt to meet the minimum numerical goals of which 25% or more of the total number of labor hours worked by all workers on a Section 3 project are Section 3 workers, per 24 CFR Part 75.19; and 5% or more of the total number of labor hours worked by all workers on a Section 3 project are Targeted Section 3 workers, as defined in 24 CFR Part 75.21. The Selingsgrove Borough, in accordance with Snyder County's Section 3 Action Plan, may provide a bid preference to a bidder who is a Section 3 business concern. MBE/WBE and Section 3 business concerns shall be afforded full opportunity to bid without discrimination. Davis-Bacon and Related Acts apply to this Project.

Bids may be held by the Selingsgrove Borough for up to 60 days from the date of opening for the purpose of reviewing the bids and investigating the qualifications of bidders prior to awarding the contract Selingsgrove Borough reserves the right to reject any or all bids, to waive any irregularities, or to negotiate contract amounts.

A Pre-bid Conference will be held at 10:00 AM on Tuesday June 9, 2026, at the intersection of Walnut Street and South Second Street, Selingsgrove, Pennsylvania.
