Fire at Apex Homes Destroys Frame Shop



Fire crews responded to a blaze at Apex Homes of PA, a custom modular manufacturer, located at 7172 Route 522 in Middlecreek Township on Saturday, May 3, 2025. The fire caused an estimated \$5 million in damages.

A driver passing the area reported the blaze at 7 am. The call came in as a building fire at facility. When Kreamer Fire Department Chief Shannon Moyer arrived on the scene he reported "flames through the roof" of the facility's 50-foot by 100-foot frame shop that was attached to the main production and office area.

Kreamer Fire Department crews sprang into action. They set up for aerial master stream operations. Reliance Hose Company advanced attack lines into the structure. The remainder of the first alarm crew assisted with fire attack, ventilation, water supply, and aerial operations.

A second alarm was requested for additional tankers and two additional Engine Companies. Fortunately, no one was working at the facility when the

blaze occurred. Lynn Kuhns, President of Apex Homes, arrived at the manufacturing plant during the firefighting efforts.

The frame shop was destroyed. According to Chief Moyer, the fire spread 30 feet into the main building,



"Seeing the growth in these kids and knowing they have a safe supportive place to be each day, well, it's the reason we're here." The REC hopes that extending the Drop-In Program to include the summer months will create a continuity of service for the families that already rely on the REC during the school

"The curriculum-based summer camp program we developed and operated over the past seven years served so many needs in our community," said Kelly Feiler, President of the REC. "Most importantly, it provided kids with a safe, enriching, educational, and supportive summer experience. To continue the program in that way without municipal tuition support, we would have to decrease the number of kids we could enroll and, at the same time, increase the cost to families, many of whom are already struggling. The Limited late model feature had a pile up early. Taken out was Tyson Mowery of Selinsgrove, Pa., Dan Zechman of Littlestown, Pa, and Daulton Bilger Mechanicsburg, Pa. The limited feature was won by Lane Snook of Mifflin, PA who drove to his third overall win of the season and first ever at Selinsgrove. Lane, a former gokart racer, adds his name to the list of drivers that has won on the 1/5-mile Kart track and the big ½ mile during his career. Casey Steinhoff of Millville led a good part of the feature and settled for third, with Coleby Frye coming back from a flat tire to get second. Frye, who pulled double duty, ran with his super late model that ended with a flat tire. Andrew Yoder again did double duty but had problems with his super late model dropping out of the race early, while he placed fourth in the limited feature. Andrew Yoder leads the limited late model points over Ryan Zook of Mifflintown, PA by ten-point Lane Snook is third back by 70 on the leader Yoder. Brad Mitch leads the Roadrunners points over Nate Stroup, Keith Bissinger and Jake Jones.

Clinton County tried their best to get a complete program in but rain hit the speedway just as the 270-micros were on the track for their feature. The 270-micro feature will be made up this Friday May 9th. The event was a special for the Laurel Highland 305-sprints with time trials starting the night which went to Kasey Weaver of Evertt, PA with a time of 12.623. Heat wins went to Jared Zionkowski of Wyalusing, PA, Weaver in heat two, John Braim of Turbotville, PA, third heat win with the consolation going to Kolby Weaver, Kasey's brother. The Nittany 40-lap feature will be made upon Friday May 23rd, that night will have two features for the 305-sprints, other features to be made up in the next couple of weeks for the Pro-stocks and

Williams Grove, which lost the tune up show, will now set the stage for two days of WOO sprint car feature action this Friday and Saturday night. Friday night's feature winner will collect \$12,000 for the win while the Saturday winner will collect \$15,000. The bragging rights for the Morgan Cup will be on the line to see if the trophy stays at the Grove. TJ Stutts scored the win last year or will it head to North Carolina home of the WOO series. The Morgan Cup has been contested since the 2011 racing season. The WOO series drivers have won the cup seven times with six times for the PA Posse drivers. The race was not held during the 2020 racing season. David Gravel will lead the WOO series drivers into the Grove leading the points and having scored six series feature wins so far this year Logan Schuchart is second in

points with one feature win on the series, other drivers with wins on the series Carson Macedo and Michael Kofoid with two. Each single wins going to Sheldon Haudenschild, Gio Scelzi and Bill Balog. Anthony Macri leads the Grove standings with his two feature wins, getting two wins on the night of a make-up and regular feature.

No racing action for Port Royal this Saturday, they will come back in action on Saturday May 17th with the 410-sprints and a special for the super late models paying \$5,000 to win. Then the weekend of May 23-25 Port runs the three-day Bob Weikart Memorial for the High Limit sprint car series with the winner of Sunday May 25th racing collecting \$75,000 to win after two preliminary nights on Friday and Saturday. Limited late models are part of the Friday and Saturday show with \$1,500 to win Friday and \$2,000 to win on Saturday, with the wingless Sportsman cars racing with the 410-sprints on Sunday. Big Diamond Speedway, which did not race last Friday they had a monster truck show. They will be back in action this Friday with the 358-Modifieds racing for \$6,000 to win along with the 602-crate sportsman Modifieds racing for \$3,000 to win and their Roadrunner class.

One other track that did beat the rain on Friday night was Bedford Speedway which ran a program of limited late models which was won by Devin Weyandt over Kyle Lear, and Brin Benton. Bedford will be back this Friday with a program for the super late models. The final run up before the WOO super late model's series rolls into town on Sunday May 18th for \$20,000 to win race. Two nights before that Marion Center Speedway will hold a two-day show with winners' payout of \$12,000 and \$30,000 to win races on Friday and Saturday May 16-17.



Culver. "This legislation requires data for calculating CTE equipment grant funding to be set by June 1st prior to the school year in which the allocation will occur. This change allows schools to budget and make purchases strategically based on the funding they know is available, rather than having to estimate and be reimbursed - not always fully - for equipment already purchased."

Culver noted that the change enacted by SB 315 aligns the equipment grant calculation timing with similar changes made for basic education, special education, and regular CTE funding as part of the 2024-2025 state budget.

The passage coincided with Career and Tech Ed Day events organized by Culver as Chair of the Senate Education Committee. More than 20 of the Commonwealth's CTE schools set up displays in the Capitol's East Wing Rotunda, with students highlighting their programs and skills. Earlier in the day, Culver and Senate Education Committee Minority Chair Sen. Lindsey Williams (D-38) hosted a press conference featuring a CTE student and administrator, followed by a public hearing exploring the importance of career and technical education for Pennsylvania's workforce and economy.

"It is incredibly fitting that Career and Tech Ed Day culminated with the Senate passing this important, bipartisan bill," Culver added. "We heard directly from students and educators about the amazing work being done in CTE programs, and this legislation provides practical support they need. I know from speaking with CTE schools and PACTA how valuable this change is, and I thank my colleagues from both sides of the aisle for their affirmative votes.

Senate Bill 315 now goes to the House of Representatives for consideration.

District Attorney Heath W. Brosius has announced the sentencing of Jacob Robert Ciccolini (Pronounced "chick-o-lee-nee") by President Judge Lori Hackenberg on May 2nd 2025. Ciccolini was sentenced to fourteen (14) months to four (4) years in State Prison followed by six (6) years of supervision for the charge of arson which is a Felony of the 2nd Degree in Pennsylvania. The charges result from an incident which occurred at a farm along the New Berlin Highway on June 9, 2023 where a barn was completely destroyed by fire and some animals

During the sentencing hearing, the victim who is also the owner of the farm gave an emotional statement and remarked "you can't have a farm without a barn." She spoke of the strain of waiting on the resolution of the criminal case and expressed appreciation that Ciccolini was being sentenced to state prison. Ciccolini made no statement at sentencing. DA Brosius commented "I'm grateful to the victim for

enduring the long stressful process to get this case to a resolution, what she has been through is unimaginable. I also want to compliment the Pennsylvania State Police and the first responders who helped secure the scene and ensure no further property damage, we are lucky to have these professionals serving our community."





cused on the importance of quilt documentation.

Memories fade over time and from generation to generation. Old photographs without subject information are frustrating when trying to identify people long gone. Quilts are no different. Many are handed down from mother to child - eventually, memories fade, and no one remembers who lovingly made the quilt or when. Helene stressed the importance of put-

ting labels on the back of quilts that include the quilter's name, year and for whom the quilt was made, and its title.

The Quilt Index, an on-97,000 quilts, is maintained by Michigan State University and provides the user with the quilt image and available information about that quilt: maker, materials, pattern, size, and dating if known. Quilt and textile historians and pattern designers find this index invaluable. Access is free to the website at www. quiltindex.org.

Anytime headaches or series of headaches interfere with the quality of your life, you should see your doctor. If you suddenly feel like you're having the worst headache of your life, call 9-1-1 immediately. This could be a medical emergency.

Drew Bobb's completed Eagle Scout project enhances Veterans Memorial in Station Park, McClure. It is the latest Boy Scout Eagle Scout project to honor the hometown heroes. The McClure Veterans Memorial is one of the patriotic treasures of this town.

Drew Bobb undertook a patriotic project to both honor our nation and to create a legacy at the Veterans Memorial in Station Park in McClure. The monument serves a reminder of those who have served our country. Drew chose this project because he wanted something that would have profound meaning and that would last a long time. Drew demonstrated his dedication to both community service and honoring our nation.

Drew attended a McClure Borough Council meeting to discuss what meaningful projects needed to be performed. Drew choseto complete a patriotic project for the Borough. Drew coordinated with the McClure Borough Council throughout the project, planning with them in the choice of stone. The stunning, black granite stone was imported from India. They also partnered together on the wording to be engraved on the stone.

Andrew Benner, McClure Borough Council President, explained the meaning behind the words chosen for this monument. The front side of the memorial proudly displays the seals of the Armed Forces: United States Army, United States Navy, United States Air Force, United States Space Force, United States Marine Corps and United States Coast Guard. Underneath the seals the words, "Our Country Called, Our Town Answered" are engraved. These words are "a reminder that true leadership is about stepping up when duty calls, serving others selflessly, and answering challenges with courage.

Engraved on back side of the memorial are the words "A Grateful Community Remembers Those Who Serve And Have Served InThe Armed Forces" with two seals representing KIA*WIA and POW*MIA above the wording.Benner notes that these words are "a testament to the enduring impact of service and the deep respect owed to those who dedicate themselves to a greater cause.

Five inner flags representing the five branches of the military service and an outer row of flags flutter around the perimeter of the memorial adding to the display. A dusk to dawn spotlight showcases the flags in another Eagle Scout project performed by Cameron Klingler.

After planning and ordering the stone through the Borough, Drew worked with his father, Scoutmaster Andy Bobb, Asst. Scoutmaster Norm Rigel, and other members of Troop 408 to prepare the ground so that a half-moon shaped concrete pad could be poured. The ground had to be dug to a depth of 3 feet to be able to hold the 2-ton monument. Drew oversaw the placement of the stunning, black granite stone by a crane to create a monument at

Shamokin Man Sentenced to State Prison for Retail Theft

District Attorney Heath W. Brosius has announced the

sentencing of Donald J. Ponatoski of Shamokin by Presi-

dent Judge Lori Hackenberg on May 2, 2025. Ponatoski pled guilty to Retail Theft by Under-ringing for five (5) different incidents at Wal-Mart in Monroe Township between February and April 2024.Ponatoski purchased several sets of sports cards while scanning a separate bar code taped under his finger. The separate bar code was for items of lesser value. This is the crime of Retail Theft by Under-Ringing Merchandise in Pennsylvania. Ponatoski was able to steal over \$900 worth of merchandise from Wal-Mart utilizing this method of theft, but he paid the entire amount back prior to his sentencing. During the sentencing hearing, Ponatoski apologized

for the thefts, identified a drug problem in his past, and told Judge Hackenberg he was using this conviction as a turning point in his life. He also explained his prior criminal offenses as not representing the man he was today. He requested the Court sentence him to a period of probation, which was within the standard sentencing guidelines for this offense, instead of a term of incarceration.

Judge Hackenberg highlighted that this retail theft occurred at a time when Ponatoski was on supervision for different crimes committee. She then sentenced him to one (1) month to twenty-four (24) months in State Prison.

DA Brosius commented "Retail theft crimes are taken very seriously in Snyder County by law enforcement and the Court. There may be places in this Commonwealth where people convicted of retail theft never see jail time and may not even be prosecuted, Snyder County is not one of those places."
